MERCHANT SHIPPING (LOADING OF TIMBER).

RULES MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1906.

AT THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, WHITEHALL.

This 7th day of February, 1907.

Present:

The Right Honorable DAVID LLOYD GEORGE, M.P.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, the Board of Trade hereby approve the classes of ships shown in the annexed Rule I. for the purpose of carrying heavy wood goods as deck cargo, and do hereby make the regulations shown in the annexed Rules numbered II. and III.

The Board direct that these three Rules shall come into effect from the date of this Minute.

RULE I.

CLASSES OF SHIPS APPROVED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CARRYING HEAVY WOOD GOODS AS DECK CARGO.

The classes of ships which are approved for the purpose of carrying heavy wood goods as deck cargo are iron or steel steam-ships having covered spaces, that is to say,

poops, bridges, forecastles or shelter decks, which form part of the permanent structure of the ship, and which comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) The space must be within an erection which extends from side to side of the ship.
- (b) The outside plating must be continuous from deck to deck and throughout the full length of the space.
- (c) The length must be bounded by iron or steel partitions, and the total area of the openings in any such partition must not exceed one-fourth of the area of the partition itself.

RULE II.

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE LOADING OF HEAVY WOOD GOODS AS DECK CARGO.

1. Heavy wood goods may only be loaded in covered spaces which form part of the permanent structure of the ship, and which comply with the conditions specified in the preceding Rule I.

2. Heavy wood goods must not be loaded in any covered space in such a manner as to make the ship unfit, by reason of instability, to proceed to sea and to perform the voyage safely, having regard to the nature of the service for which she is intended.

3. Heavy wood goods must be properly stowed and secured so as to prevent shifting.

RULE III.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PROTECTION OF SEAMEN FROM RISK ARISING FROM THE CARRIAGE OF WOOD GOODS AS DECK CARGO IN UNCOVERED SPACES ON BOARD SHIP.

1. When wood goods are carried in an uncovered space, there shall be fitted on each side of the ship temporary rails or bulwarks of a substantial character for the full length within which the deck cargo is stowed, extending to a height of not less than 3 feet above the line of the top of the deck cargo.

2. The uprights of such temporary rail or bulwark shall be of substantial scantling and be placed not more than 4 feet apart; the heels of the uprights shall extend down to, and rest on, the deck of the vessel.

3. There shall be attached longitudinally to these uprights for the full length of the deck cargo, spars, deals, battens, guard-ropes, or chains, at intervals of not more than 12 inches apart in a vertical direction. If ropes or chains are used, they shall be set-up taut and securely attached to each upright.

4. The temporary rails or bulwarks may consist of closely spaced vertical deals, provided they are properly secured and that there are protected openings at intervals for water clearance.

5. Where light wood is carried in an uncovered space (not being a space forming the top of any permanent closed-in space on the upper deck or a space forming the top of a covered space) and the uncovered space is

bounded by an open rail formed of wood, iron, or steel stanchions and longitudinal rods, battens, or chains, no measures for the protection of the seamen shall be deemed sufficient if the height of such rail exceeds 3 feet 6 inches.

BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1908.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the Shire assessment; minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

(4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any, or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes, only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1908, commencing on the 1st January, 1908, as also the charges for every steam boiler and water supplied from the public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1908.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on the 1st January, 1908, and the 1st July, 1908.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust on the 29th day of October, 1907.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act* 1905, and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which all occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1908:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (d) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Twenty-five pounds and upwards, an annual rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (e) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (f) A minimum rate of One pound sterling and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum. Provided that for any such trough or receptacle situated on or immediately outside land rated together with any house or tenement as hereinbefore mentioned, a rate of Ten shillings per annum only shall be charged.
- (h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and Ninepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January, 1908, and 1st day of July, 1908.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. From and after the 1st day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eight, all troughs or other receptacles for the watering of horses or other stock (unless supplied by meter) shall be supplied with water only by means of a ball tap approved by the Officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose, and affixed in such manner as to automatically prevent an overflow of the said trough or other receptacle. And the occupier of the land or premises on or in connexion with which such trough or receptacle is used shall keep such ball tap in efficient working order. Any occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-Law No. 15.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1908 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the municipal value of such property.
9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, or brick work, and plastering, or if there be no contract thereupon, the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stone work or brick work and plastering.
12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be Ten thousand gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be Fifty thousand gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1908, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1908.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover, the said rates and charges.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 21.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, within the urban district of the Trust during the calendar year 1908:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands, houses, and tenements situated in the urban district of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, to such lands, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1908, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1908; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof; and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of subsection (g) of section (1) of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, shall be charged by agreement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to gardens, or for any other than domestic purposes, shall be at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum, the quantity so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer, when, in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—
 - (1) For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Forty pounds annual municipal value, half ($\frac{1}{2}$) inch diameter. For the domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of Forty pounds or over, a three-quarter ($\frac{3}{4}$) of an inch service may be allowed, at the discretion of the Trust.
 - (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law, shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or the owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable, in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1908, and on the first day of July, 1908. All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this By-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregates or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1908 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust.

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (2s.) Two shillings per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1908, and the first day of July, 1908, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover, the said rates and charges.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notices will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat or wheat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

A by-law of the City of Richmond made under and pursuant to the Local Government Act 1903, by virtue of section 7 of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904, and numbered 60, for regulating for the purposes of the last-named Act the sale of coal in any quantity, and the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet; for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904 of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, and of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904, the Mayor, Councilors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond, order as follows:—

1. By-laws of the City of Richmond, numbered 57 and 59, made under the powers conferred by section 7 of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904, are hereby repealed.

2. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place, sells, or offers for sale—

(a) Coal in any quantity; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers from any vehicle, and every person in charge of any vehicle in which coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet is being carried, or from which it is being delivered to the purchaser, shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles, or parcelled up, covered or enclosed and kept separate and apart in such vehicle. And every such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure shall be labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being carried, or from which it is being delivered to the purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any Inspector who may demand the same, and if it be found on weighing or re-weighing the coal or firewood that the statement of the weight of such coal or firewood is incorrect, the Inspector may impound the weight ticket or note. If such statement of the weight be correct, the person in charge of the vehicle, immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than three-quarters of a mile.

7. When firewood is sold by measure, the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—

9. The keeper of any weighing instrument shall be paid for the use thereof for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the following fees:—

For weighing or re-weighing on a weighbridge any vehicle used for the carriage of coal or firewood in bulk or vehicle, and animal, as the case may be, so as to check the tare weight of the vehicle or of the vehicle and animal ... 3d.

For weighing or re-weighing coal or firewood in any quantity or quantities on any weighing instrument other than a weighbridge—

For every 5 cwt. or less quantity ... 3d.

10. If any person be guilty of any offence or misfeasance, or wilful act of commission or omission contrary to any provisions contained in this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
