"AN ACT TO ABOLISH THE SEPARATE
REPRESENTATION IN PARLIAMENT OF PUB-
LIC OFFICERS AND RAILWAYS OFFICERS."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of provisions contained in *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land* (5 and 6 Vict.), also in *An Act for the better government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies* (13 and 14 Vict.), and in *The Constitution Statute* (10 Vict.), do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill, the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to abolish the Separate Representation in Parliament of Public Officers and Railways Officers,"

which was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that by an Order in Council made at the Court at Sandringham House, and bearing date the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and six, a copy whereof is hereto appended, His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING!

At the Court at Sandringham House, the 1st day of December, 1906.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," it is, amongst other things, enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, either by speech or message to the Legislative Council of the said Colony, or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid, that

such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the 13th and 14th years of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act for the better government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies," it was provided among other things that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas by the said Act it was further provided amongst other things that it should be lawful for such Legislative Council as aforesaid from time to time by any Act or Acts to alter the provisions or laws for the time being in force, under the said Act or otherwise, concerning the election of the Elective Members of such Legislative Council and the qualification of the Electors and Elective Members thereof, provided always that every Bill which should be passed by such Council for any of such purposes should be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and a copy of such Bill should be laid before both Houses of the Imperial Parliament for the space of thirty days at least before Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should be signified:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regard Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the 18th and 19th years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria, to establish a constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria":

And whereas the Colony of Victoria is now one of the States constituting the Commonwealth of Australia, as established by an Act passed in the 63rd and 64th years of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled "The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act":

And whereas the Officer Administering the Government of the said State of Victoria has reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled "An Act to abolish the Separate Representation in Parliament of Public Officers and Railways Officers," the same being a Bill concerning the election of the Elective Members of such Legislative Council as aforesaid, and the qualification of the Electors and Elective Members thereof:

And whereas the said Bill has been laid before both Houses of the Imperial Parliament for the space of thirty days:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved and laid before both Houses of Parliament as aforesaid has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by His Majesty:

Now therefore His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to His Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, declare His Assent to the said Bill.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE
GRANT OF £50 AS A REWARD FOR AN IMPROVED MACHINE FOR GRADING POTATOES
AND ONIONS.

A SUM not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved machine for grading potatoes and onions.

2. The reward shall be payable only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall more efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform the work of grading potatoes and onions, but without bruising or damaging same; and which shall also separate each grade ready for bagging.

3. Such machine must be an improvement on any machine for the same purpose that has been used in Australia.

4. One or more trials shall be made of the machine at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working of the machines, at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Fifty pounds (£50), to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the State of the said invention or inventions.

8. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, not later than the 30th November, 1906.

No subletting will be allowed, all work must be carried out in the factory of the Contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the making up of the Coats and Cloaks, and the proofing of the material of which the garments tendered for in this Schedule are made, shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage for a man of £2 5s. and for a woman of £1 per week respectively, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions in the opinion of the Treasurer will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct; and the amount will be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females or more than fifteen boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females and fifteen boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW NO. 155.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under Part 3 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 155, for regulating marine stores, flock factories, &c.

THE occupier or person in charge of any marine store or flock or bedding or furniture manufactory shall cause all rags or other material of a kind commonly used in the manufacture of flock or similar bedding to be thoroughly washed or cleansed, and to be disinfected by one of the following processes within 24 hours of such rags or material's being taken in, or before such rags or materials are taken into such store or manufactory, namely:—

- (a) By being boiled for 30 minutes in a solution consisting of one part of washing soda (carbonate of soda) to fifty parts of water;
- (b) By being subjected to saturated steam for 30 minutes at a pressure not less than 10 lbs. per square inch; or
- (c) By being soaked for 1 hour in a wooden vat in a solution consisting of one part of corrosive sublimate (bi-chloride of mercury) to 500 parts of water, and being afterwards washed in hot water.

2. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Local Government Act 1903* and the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Town of Brunswick, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Town, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. The occupier or person in charge of any marine store, or flock, or bedding, or furniture manufactory, shall cause all rags or other material of a kind commonly used in the manufacture of flock or similar bedding, to be thoroughly washed or cleansed, and to be disinfected by one of the following processes within 24 hours of such rags or material being taken in, or before such rags or material are taken in to such store or manufactory, namely:—

- (a) By being boiled for 30 minutes in a solution consisting of one part of washing soda (carbonate of soda) to 50 parts of water;
- (b) by being subjected to saturated steam for 30 minutes at a pressure not less than ten pounds per square inch; or
- (c) by being soaked for one hour in a wooden vat, in a solution consisting of one part of corrosive sublimate (bi-chloride of mercury) to 500 parts of water and being afterwards washed in hot water.

2. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Town of Brunswick.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH.

BY-LAW NO. 20.

A By-law of the Shire of Numurkah made under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Numurkah, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of such shire, do hereby order and enact as follows:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. By-law No. 6, so far as now unrepealed, and By-law Nos. 11 and 15 of the said shire shall be and are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

3. The contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

4. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished, and every closet shall forthwith be furnished with a double-pan service by the occupier of the premises containing such closet.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the occupier shall cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart, and the council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

6. Every occupier shall forthwith leave or cause to be left in the place of every pan so removed a pan cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the council. The council may, if they think fit, supply and charge for such pan under the provisions of clause 5 hereof.

7. Every occupier shall daily place or cause to be placed in the pan in use at the tenement occupied by him a quantity of suitable disinfectant or deodorant sufficient to effectually disinfect or deodorize such pan and the contents thereof.

8. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

9. No occupier shall deposit, or permit to be deposited, in any closet-pan in use at the tenement occupied by him, any substance whatever other than night-soil or disinfectant or deodorizing material.

10. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of either night-soil or any other refuse except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the council.

11. No person unless authorized in writing by the council of the Shire of Numurkah shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours of Five o'clock in the morning and Eight o'clock in the evening.

12. All privies, earth-closets, and urinals shall be constructed of stone, brick, iron, or wood, and in such a manner as may be approved of by the said council.

13. No privy, earth-closet, or urinal to be hereafter constructed shall be placed within 3 feet of any street, lane, or thoroughfare of a greater width than 12 feet, unless the walls thereof be constructed of brickwork of not less than 9 inches in thickness.

14. No privy or earth-closet, except such as abut upon a street, lane, or thoroughfare of 12 feet or less in width, shall have a trap-door or opening on the said street, lane, or thoroughfare.

15. Access for removal of pans or for cleansing by night-men and others to all privies, earth-closets, and urinals which are now or may be constructed upon premises abutting upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare exceeding 12 feet in width must be obtained from the premises on which such privies, earth-closets, or urinals are placed. Provided, however, that this by-law shall, as to existing privies, earth-closets, and urinals which are in a perfect sanitary condition, apply only where there are any premises abutting upon any such street, lane, or thoroughfare, used as dwelling houses, and access to the front of which dwelling houses is obtained from such street, lane, or thoroughfare.

16. As to any existing privy, earth-closet, or urinal, only such as in the opinion of the shire inspector are in a perfectly sanitary condition shall be allowed to remain for more than three months abutting upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare of more than 12 feet in width.

17. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

18. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

19. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and buried, as herein-after provided, in the manure depot appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and in no other place.

20. No person shall place, deposit, spread, or bury, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited or spread or buried, or assist in placing, depositing, spreading, or burying in any place except the manure depot, to be from time to time appointed by the said council, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, whether by way of manure or otherwise, except as to manure, with the consent and approval of the council or its health officer.

21. Any person or persons removing night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing to the manure depot to be appointed by the council from time to time as aforesaid, shall bury the same in a trench, to be dug out or excavated by such person or persons in such place in said manure depot as shall be appointed by the inspector of the said council, which trench shall not be less in measurement than 3 feet deep by 1 ft. 6 in. in width by 6 feet in length, and such person or persons shall cover the night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing buried in such trench with at least 18 inches of soil at the same time as such burial takes place. Any surplus earth from such excavation, after the burying of such night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, and covering the same with 18 inches of soil, shall be spread evenly and regularly on the surface of such trench.

22. No person shall remove any part of the contents of any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

23. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be any abattoirs or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if any such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

24. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

25. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited, as soon as conveniently may be, in some such box or receptacle, and shall place, or cause to be placed, such receptacle in the street-channel nearest such house or premises, on such days and at such hours as the council shall from time to time by regulation prescribe.

26. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way in to any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

27. No occupier shall by any means place or cause to be placed on or in any footpath, street, or street channel, any house or yard refuse or sweepings.

28. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

29. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

30. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

31. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a quantity of water sufficient in the opinion of the council's health officer for all purposes.

32. Sections 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, and 34 hereof shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Numurkah, and sections 4, 5, 6, 25, and 27 hereof shall apply only to the townships of Numurkah, Nathalia, Wunghnu, and Strathmerton, as at present defined, or which may by any extension hereafter made, be defined as the boundaries of the said townships, and those parts of such shire within 10 chains from the boundary of such township of Numurkah, or within forty chains from the boundary of such township of Nathalia, or within ten chains from the boundary of such township of Strathmerton.

33. All owners and occupiers of premises are required to see to the performance and observance of the above provisions.

34. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such penalty not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BY-LAW NO. 5 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick, made under the provisions of section 31, 32, 33, 35, 253, and 259 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 5, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil and closet pans.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and operate within the area of the townships of Pakenham and Bunyip, in the Shire of Berwick, as may be defined by the Council from time to time.

3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this By-law.

4. Every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart.

6. An annual charge for emptying and cleansing of cess-pans shall be made by a resolution of the Council, under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act* 1890, such charge to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, and to be payable half-yearly, in advance. Failure to pay the said half-yearly charge shall constitute a breach of this By-law.

7. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than three inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public-house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

9. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the Council.

11. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

12. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

13. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other person, save those authorized by the Council, for the removal of night-soil, and no other person, save those authorized by the Council, shall remove any night-soil, except in cases of exemption.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises, which premises may be inspected by the Council or its officers from time to time, or any other person duly authorized by the Council.

15. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom such penalties are sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

16. All By-laws hitherto in force within the Shire of Berwick made under this Act, so far as they relate to any or all of the several things contained in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA.
By-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the northern boundary of the township of Whittlesea with the Plenty River; thence south by the said river to the south boundary of the said township; thence west by the south boundary of the township to Whittlesea Railway fence boundary; thence south by the railway fence about thirteen chains to a line with the road going west from the railway station, crossing the Main Plenty-road, going further west about ten chains; thence by a line at right angles going north a distance of about forty chains; thence crossing the Glenvale-road going east by a road surveyed on the Pint Pot estate, named Fir-street, to the west boundary of the Whittlesea township; thence north by the township boundary to the north boundary of the said township; thence east by the north boundary of said township to the commencing point at the Plenty River.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing By-law was allowed and confirmed by the Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria (it having been first certified that notice of the intention to apply for such confirmation had been given in the Shire for which the same has been made in the manner required by law) this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven.

LONG LAKE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.— PROVISION OF TANKS.

NOTICE TO OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS.

PURSUANT to section 177 of the *Water Act 1905*, notice is hereby given that the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission requires all owners or occupiers of lands within the Long Lake Waterworks District to make provision by dams or tanks for the storage on such lands of water supplied by the Commission for domestic and ordinary use, and for watering cattle or other stock, that is to say:—

The total tank capacity to be provided on every block shall be not less than 2,000 cubic yards per square mile. SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property, valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1907.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

No. 18.—FEBRUARY 6, 1907.—1144.—3.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens, or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.), in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1907 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1907. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1905*, on the evening of Tuesday, 8th January, 1907.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905* and all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or in any manner interfere with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give written notice of his intention to do so to the Secretary of the Trust, and shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering

with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, or any person failing to give such written notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the *Water Act* 1905 or of this By-law, or any other By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay a licence-fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

5. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(1) One-half of an inch diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of Thirty pounds (£30) or under; and

(2) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Thirty pounds (£30);

and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down in any premises, the consent of the Trust shall first be obtained.

6. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine (9) o'clock p.m. and Eight (8) o'clock a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

7. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed, shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. No person shall use any water, or allow any water to run for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit, or otherwise in any manner whatsoever at any time other than between the hours of Eight (8) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit or other means of watering shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or non-feasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under section 345 of *Water Act* 1905.

11. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse

of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

12. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.
