WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.—
SOLOMONS (QUARANTINE) REGULATION,
1897.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893).

TO REPEAL QUEEN'S REGULATION NO. 1 OF 1897 AND TO MAKE OTHER PROVISION IN LIEU THEREOF TO PREVENT THE INTRODUCTION OF COMMUNICABLE DISEASE INTO THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS.

(L.S.) EVERARD IM THURN.

1. In this Regulation unless the subject or context otherwise requires—

The Group.

"The Group" means the islands comprised in the Protectorate established by His Majesty in the Solomon Islands:

Health Officer.

"Health Officer" means the Resident Commissioner or any person appointed by him to act as Health Officer under this Regulation:

Vessel in Quarantine.

"Vessel in Quarantine" means any vessel which has not been admitted to pratique or which has been placed in quarantine under the provisions of this Regulation:

Communicable Diseases.

"Communicable disease" means and includes cholera small-pox scarlet fever (scarlatina) oriental plague enteric or typhoid fever typhus fever yellow fever measles and any disease of such a nature as to make it uncertain whether it is one of the aforesaid diseases or not.

Vessels to Proceed to the Harbor of Gavutu or other Port of Entry for Pratique.

2. All vessels entering the Group shall proceed first either to the harbor of Gavutu or to any other place that may hereafter be declared by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the powers conferred by the "Solomons (Fisheries) Regulation, 1907" to be a port of entry and shall be deemed to be in quarantine until inspected and admitted to pratique by the Health Officer.

Quarantine Signals.

3. Every vessel entering the Group shall on arriving within three miles of the coast exhibit a yellow flag at the fore by day and a globular red light by night until such time as pratique shall have been given.

Vessel to Anchor where directed.

4. No vessel in quarantine shall anchor at any place distant more than two miles from the harbor of Gavutu or from any port of entry and every such vessel if so directed shall anchor at such place as the Health Officer may require.

Quarantined Vessel not to Communicate except by Signal.

5. It shall be unlawful for any vessel in quarantine to communicate otherwise than by signal with any island vessel or place within the Group, or to approach within one hundred yards of any other vessel in any harbor at any place within the Group, or for any person except as provided for in this Regulation to leave any such vessel or to transmit any article therefrom, or for any person except the Health Officer and his boat's crew to approach within one hundred yards of a vessel in quarantine at any place within the waters of the Group.

Inquiry by Health Officer.

6. The Health Officer shall approach the vessel on the windward side within speaking distance, but he shall not go on board nor grant the vessel pratique until there shall have been delivered to him a copy of the Schedule hereto attached with the questions therein contained answered in writing and signed by the master and by the surgeon (if any) of the vessel. Such master and surgeon shall answer the aforesaid questions truthfully and upon oath or not upon oath according as may be desired by the Health Officer.

Communicable Disease to be Reported.

7. Every master or surgeon of a vessel which shall at any time have on board any person affected by a communicable disease who shall fail to declare the same by the first opportunity to the Health Officer or who shall attempt to conceal from the Health Officer any person so affected or who shall refuse or fail to bring every person on board such vessel before such Health Officer for inspection at the request of such Health Officer, and the master of any vessel who on the demand of the Health Officer shall fail or refuse to produce for inspection by him the log-book or journal of such vessel, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Contagious Disease to be Reported to Master.

8. Any surgeon of a vessel who shall fail to inform the master thereof of the existence of any communicable disease on board such vessel, and who shall knowingly allow the introduction of such disease into any port or place in the Group, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Answering Falsely.

9. Any person whatever on board any vessel in quarantine or otherwise who shall refuse to answer or shall answer falsely or evasively any question contained in the Schedule hereto or such other questions as may be put to him by the Health Officer shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Health Officer may set apart Quarantine Station.

10. The Health Officer may appropriate or set apart either permanently or temporarily any place or vessel as a quarantine station where any person cargo or baggage may be landed and detained or where any vessel may be anchored in quarantine, and may also temporarily place in quarantine any place or places required for the passage of any person or of any boat or vessel from any vessel or place in quarantine to any other vessel or place in quarantine. Provided that it shall not be compulsory for the Health Officer to set apart or provide any quarantine station as aforesaid.

Health Officer may fix Limits of Quarantine Station.

11. The Health Officer, in any case in which he deems it necessary, may determine a place or places at any greater distance than one hundred yards from any vessel in quarantine or from the boundary of any quarantine station at which guard-posts or guard-boats shall be stationed or warning-signals displayed. At every such guard-post or guard-boat and for every warning-signal as aforesaid a red flag shall be used by day and a green light by night, and any person except the Health Officer entering the space enclosed by such guard-posts guard-boats or warning-signals shall, if thought necessary by the Health Officer, be detained in quarantine and shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Visiting Parties.

12. A visiting party under the charge of the Health Officer flying a red flag by day or displaying a red light by night may proceed as often as necessary as far as the boundary of the quarantine station or as far as one hundred yards from a vessel in quarantine, or subject to the direction of the Health Officer to any safe or convenient spot at or near low water, in order to convey any communication to and from and whatever provisions and other necessities are required by those in quarantine, and shall leave the same in some safe place to be approved of by the Health Officer so that those persons in quarantine may procure such provisions or necessities after the visiting party shall have retired a distance of at least one hundred yards; but any person in quarantine who shall approach or remain within one hundred yards of any of the visiting party, or any of the visiting party who shall approach or remain within the same distance of any person in quarantine, or any person who shall send or take away from a quarantine station when used as such or from any vessel or boat in quarantine any article that has not previously been disinfected as prescribed by the Health Officer, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Vessels in the Group may be placed in Quarantine.

13. When the Health Officer shall from any cause believe that communicable disease exists in any portion of the Group and that any vessel other than those coming from beyond the Group should be placed in quarantine it shall be lawful for such Health Officer to direct that such vessel be placed in quarantine, and such vessel shall thereupon display a yellow flag by day and a globular red light by night and shall thenceforth be dealt with under this Regulation as if such vessel were a vessel

coming from beyond the Group and shall be placed in quarantine, and such vessel may be ordered to proceed to the harbor of Gavutu or to any other place that may hereafter be declared to be a port of entry to perform quarantine.

Signals to be Exhibited at Quarantine Station.

14. When any quarantine station is used as such a yellow flag shall be kept constantly flying at some conspicuous place in such station from sunrise to sunset, and from sunset to sunrise such quarantine station shall exhibit a red light, and the display of such flag or such light shall be deemed sufficient notice that such station and the land or sea surrounding it to the distance of one hundred yards or if guard-posts guard-boats or warning-signals have been placed round the quarantine station that the land and sea from the station up to such guard-posts, guard-boats or warning-signals are in quarantine.

Breaking Quarantine.

15. Every person who being subjected to quarantine shall on any pretence whatsoever leave any quarantine station or any vessel boat or place in quarantine before he shall have been admitted to pratique by the Health Officer shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation. Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Health Officer to permit any person to leave quarantine, under such precautions as such Health Officer may consider necessary, in order to go on board any vessel that has cleared outwards to leave the Group; but any vessel receiving on board any such person or having any communication with the same shall thenceforth be treated as a vessel in quarantine and shall until clear of the Group display quarantine signals.

Embarking in Vessel in Quarantine.

16. Nothing in this Regulation shall prevent any person from embarking in any vessel when in quarantine for the purpose of being a passenger therein or one of the officers or crew thereof. Provided that nothing in this section shall be held to authorize any person who shall have embarked in any vessel for any of the purposes mentioned in this section to quit such vessel or to communicate otherwise than by signal with the shore or any other vessel in any harbor or roadstead in the Group respectively while such vessel first mentioned shall remain in quarantine, and every person so embarking who shall fail to obey any directions and orders which he shall receive in regard to such embarkation from the officer of police or other officer appointed to direct the due observance of quarantine at any place or quarantine station shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

Entering Quarantine Station through Ignorance.

17. Should any person through ignorance stress of weather or other accident land upon or approach within one hundred yards of any quarantine station when occupied as such or within one hundred yards of any boat or vessel in quarantine, or proceed within the space enclosed by any guard-boats guard-posts or warning-signals, such person shall be detained in quarantine at his own expense until he can safely be liberated by the Health Officer.

Health Officer's Crew.

18. All persons belonging to the boat of the Health Officer who shall have been on board any vessel either when such vessel was in quarantine or immediately before such vessel was placed in quarantine shall remain on board such vessel, return thither, or proceed to a quarantine station as may be directed by the Health Officer.

Cargo and Passengers in Quarantined Vessel may be taken away from the Group.

19. In the event of the Health Officer not providing a quarantine station where passengers and cargo may be landed it shall be lawful for any vessel in quarantine to leave the Group with its passengers and cargo notwithstanding that such passengers and cargo may have been received on board for the purpose of being landed or transhipped within the Group.

Vessels in Quarantine to Wait for Health Officer.

20. In the event of a vessel in quarantine arriving at the harbor of Gavutu or any other port of entry during the temporary absence of the Health Officer such vessel shall be and remain in quarantine until the return of the Health Officer and for such further period as the Health Officer may direct.

Cargo to be Disinfected.

21. Before releasing any person cargo or vessel from quarantine the Health Officer may require that all personal effects cargo or the vessel be disinfected in such manner as he may direct.

Expenses of Quarantine to be borne by Vessel.

22. All expenses incurred in the landing of any persons or cargo in quarantine, in the maintenance of persons in quarantine, and in disinfecting cargo effects or the vessel shall be borne by the master and owners of the vessel; and the Health Officer may require security to his satisfaction for such expenses before allowing any person effects or cargo to be placed in a quarantine station or before admitting any vessel to pratique.

Penalty.

23. Any person omitting to do anything required by this Regulation, or doing, or aiding, abetting, or advising the doing of anything prohibited by this Regulation, shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds or to both punishments.

Duration of Quarantine.

24. The duration of any period of quarantine imposed under this Regulation shall in no case exceed or be less than may be provided for by the stipulations of the Venice International Sanitary Convention, and in respect of cases not provided for in such Convention the period of quarantine to be undergone shall be governed by the regulations in force in the Commonwealth of Australia.

25. Queen's Regulation No. 1 of 1897 is hereby repealed.

This Regulation may be cited as "The Solomons (Quarantine) Regulation 1907."

Are there any persons on board your ship affected with any infectious or contagious disease, or has any person died or been ill of a disease of that nature during the voyage?

And (if any) what number? And if any have died or been ill of a disease were their bedding and clothes destroyed?

What number of officers, mariners, and passengers have you on board?

Have you any, and what Bill of Health?

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.—BY-LAW UNDER THE
WATER ACT 1905.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate within the Water Supply District at Ararat as duly defined.

By-Law No. 2.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1907 on the valuation of each tenement built upon or to which water is laid on within the said Water Supply District, with a minimum of One pound sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid, the rate shall be 5 per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.

2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1907.

3. Such person or persons as the said Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat may appoint for that purpose is, or are hereby, authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.—BY-LAW UNDER THE
WATER ACT 1905.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat (herein designated the Council), in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law relating to the supply of water within the Water Supply District as duly defined.

By-Law No. 3.

1. The Ararat Water Supply being for domestic and ordinary use, and for watering cattle or other stock only, all water supplied for other purposes shall be by measure, and the charge for such supplies shall be One shilling per thousand or part of one thousand gallons.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or for manufacturing purposes or for irrigation (which shall mean distribution by any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants or trees without labour) or for water power, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided for in this By-law.

3. The Council may, by notice, intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within the Borough of Ararat using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for, by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglect to comply with such notice, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, the Council may, in the event of failure to comply with such notice, cut off the supply of water to such house or premises either by cutting off the pipes by or through which the supply is taken from the main, or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as such notice is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Council or its officers, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid, shall relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

4. All water supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per thousand or part of one thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be that which, at One shilling per one thousand gallons, would be equal to the quantity which the occupier or owner of the premises so supplied would be entitled to receive in respect of his assessed water rate.

In all cases where water is consumed solely for purposes other than domestic supply, the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten (10) thousand gallons.

All charges for water sold by measure shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

5. The Council may cause a meter to be affixed in any case where it considers necessary, such meter to be provided by the consumer and fixed at his expense. No meter shall be fixed unless approved of by the Council

nor unless it shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons. Syphon pipes will not be allowed, unless the water is supplied by measure.

6. If the meter shall cease registering, the Council shall, during the time it is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

7. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Council the person applying for same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such licence. The Council shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council, without the permission, in writing, of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council, except under the supervision and according to the directions of some officer of the Council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council, of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council. The best galvanized or plain wrought iron piping, &c., of approved quality will only be allowed to be fixed for a service. No service of a larger hose than half (½) an inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Council. The day for connecting private services to the Council's pipes shall be Thursday in each week.

13. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise, as the said Council may deem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the occupier or owner of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

14. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds per day for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

15. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Council.

16. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

17. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

18. If any person supplied with water by the Council does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied, and neither such cutting off of the pipes or cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall release any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

19. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the directions of an officer of the Council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

20. In the construction of this By-law the word "Council" shall mean the "Borough of Ararat," and "he" shall also mean "she."

21. When water is supplied for domestic use—except when paid for by meter or under special agreement—the supply shall be through a separate service-pipe from the main to each tenement or building, unless otherwise agreed upon, and no house or premises shall have any connexion with the pipes or fittings of any other house or premises, whether on the same or separate allotments, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth of less than ten (10) inches below the surface of the ground in streets. Any authorized plumber making connexions in pipes contrary to the provisions of this clause shall be liable to have his licence cancelled.

22. Any officer appointed for that purpose by the Council may, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Council by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Council, and if any person hinders such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and the Council may cut off the supply of water to such house or premises, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall release any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

23. Plumbers laying services from the Council's mains into private grounds:—Pipes, &c.—The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized or plain wrought iron.

24. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

25. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

26. The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 350 feet.

27. Delivery cocks.—All delivery cocks to be high pressure and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern, to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

28. Meters.—All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be provided and fixed unless previously approved by the turncock.

29. Jointing.—All jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only.

30. Trenches to be properly filled in.—After service-pipes have been laid the trench is to be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence which may appear within three (3) months to be immediately made good by the person laying such service.

31. No service-pipe shall be laid for the purpose of connecting with the pipes of the Council unless two (2) days prior notice thereof be given to the Council.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

32. No person shall lay private services and attach the same to the pipes of the Council, or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Council, without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Council to do such work.

33. No private services or extension of same whatsoever shall be laid by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for

whom such work is intended has received the consent of the Town Clerk to execute such work. A charge of Five shillings must be paid to the Council before an asphalt footpath is broken to lay a service.

34. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Council, or otherwise to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him to the Council's office, giving his name and the date when each service was completed.

35. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound workmanlike and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after completion.

36. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the streets, mains, or other property whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Council's water supply. Any water lost by the Council through such injury, together with the cost of all repairs, shall be a charge due by such person to the Council, and if not paid within twenty-four (24) hours after demand being made in respect of such charge, the Council may cancel the licence held by such authorized person. The cancellation of the licence shall in no way debar the Council from instituting proceedings for recovery of any charge so made.

37. Every person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall pay annually the sum of Five shillings as the fee for a licence, and the Borough Council may at any time withdraw such licence, when the same shall be absolutely void, and the name of such person shall be at once struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and his name shall be published in the local papers.

38. The whole of the work herein referred to shall be carried out under the supervision and according to the directions of the Turncock or some person whom the Council may appoint, and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or as to the exact meaning of this specification, shall be referred to the Town Clerk or whom the Council may appoint, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of £300 granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1906-7.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1907, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked B.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for horticultural exhibits will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Two hundred and eighty-seven pounds ten shillings, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1906, and the 31st December, 1906, amounts in the total to less than Twenty-five pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

4. A sum not exceeding Ten pounds ten shillings may be paid out of the above vote to the Royal Horticultural Society for Grand Champion prizes, to be awarded at said society's show in 1907.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of Two thousand pounds (£2,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural and Poultry Societies, 1906-7.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1907, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement, so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-fourth of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and, if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. A sum not exceeding Eighty-two pounds may be paid out of the above vote for medals awarded as Grand National prizes at the Kyneton Agricultural Society's Show.

4. No society located within 20 miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

5. If the sums claimable be in excess of the balance remaining after payment of amounts set out in clause 3, and of the amounts allocated by regulations of 22.8.06, 21.11.06, 28.11.06, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1906, and the 31st December, 1906, must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

4. It must be understood that any society which fails to forward the statement asked for to the Secretary for Agriculture by the 1st March, 1907, is liable to have its claim disallowed.

5. Any society not having a claim on the vote is requested to furnish a nil—return by 1st March, 1907.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

*Pure Food Act 1905.**Health Acts.*

REGULATIONS AS TO INFANTS' FOOD, BREAD, FLOUR, FRUIT, PRESERVATIVE SUBSTANCES, VEGETABLES, OILS, SPICES, AND OTHER ARTICLES OF FOOD, COLOURING MATTER, AND DRUGS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the following regulations prescribing standards for the composition, strength, purity, or quality of infants' food, bread, flour, pastry, preserved fruit, vegetables, edible oils, spices, and other articles of food and drugs, and for the nature and proportion of certain substances that may be mixed with or used in the preparation or preservation of the said articles of food and drugs, and prohibiting or limiting the addition thereto of certain substances, that is to say:—

1. INFANTS' FOOD.

Definition.

Infants' food is food described or sold as an article of food specially suitable for infants of twelve (12) months of age or under.

Standard.

Infants' food shall contain no woody fibre, no preservative substance, and no mineral substance insoluble in acid; and, unless described or sold specifically as food suitable only for infants over the age of six (6) months, shall, when prepared as directed by any accompanying label, contain no starch, and shall contain the essential constituents of, and conform approximately in proportional composition to normal mother's milk.

2. INVALIDS' FOOD.

Standard.

Invalids' food shall not contain boric acid or any similar preservative substance.

3. MEAT EXTRACTS.

Standard.

Meat extract shall contain no preservative substance other than salt or the ordinary condimental substances.

4. FLOUR.

Standard.

Flour is the meal produced by grinding and bolting sound wheat.

5. BREAD.

Definition.

Bread is a porous food substance obtained by moistening and baking flour with provision for the mechanical separation of the dough by air or carbonic acid gas.

Standard.

Bread shall contain not more than one-fifth (0.2) per cent. of ash insoluble in acid and, in the crumb substance (exclusive of crust), not more than forty (40) per cent. of water.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of alum or other foreign substance to dough or to bread is hereby prohibited.

6. CAKES, BISCUITS, AND PASTRY.

Definition.

Cakes, biscuits, and pastry are farinaceous food substances enriched and flavoured with various wholesome substances such as butter or other edible fats, sugar, fruit-compounds, chocolate, or vanilla.

Standard.

Cakes, biscuits, or pastry shall contain no rancid fat substance, nor, unless sold or described as artificially coloured, any colouring substance that would suggest the presence of eggs or chocolate or similar nutritive ingredients.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of preservative substance (including boric acid and salicylic acid) or of harmful colouring substance to cakes, biscuits, or pastry, or to the material from which such articles are prepared is hereby prohibited.

7. RASPBERRY JAM.

Allowed Addition.

Fruit juice or wholesome vegetable juice may be added to raspberry jam for colouring purposes, and in such case it shall not be necessary to indicate by label that the said jam contains such juice or that it is a mixed or compounded jam.

8. PRESERVED FRUITS.

Standard.

Preserved fruit is any sound fruit or fruit substance preserved in a dry state or in syrup, fruit-juice, or water.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of salicylic acid, boric acid, benzoic acid, or other preservative substance (except sugar) to preserved fruit, or to the medium in which it is preserved, is hereby prohibited.

9. VEGETABLES.

Definition.

Vegetables are the succulent clean and sound edible parts of herbaceous plants used for culinary purposes.

Dried vegetables are the clean sound products obtained by the desiccation of properly matured and prepared vegetables under conditions such that no harmful substance is absorbed by or mixed with the vegetables.

Canned or tinned vegetables are properly matured and prepared fresh vegetables, with or without salt, sterilized by heat, and packed in suitable clean hermetically sealed packages.

Standard.

Vegetables, dried vegetables, and canned or tinned vegetables shall conform respectively to the foregoing definitions.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of copper, salicylic acid, boric acid, or other preservative substance, excepting the well-known condimental substances, to dried or canned or tinned vegetables, is hereby prohibited.

10. OLIVE OIL.

Definition.

Olive oil is the oil obtained by expression from the fresh fruit of *Olea Europæa sativa* without the aid of solvents.

Standard.

Olive oil shall be free from rancidity and shall not contain any foreign oil.

11. CINNAMON.

Standard.

Cinnamon is the dried bark of *Cinnamomum zeylanicum* from which the outer layers may or may not have been removed.

CASSIA AND CASSIA BUDS.

Standard.

Cassia and cassia buds are the bark and flower-buds respectively of *Cinnamomum cassia*.

POWDERED CINNAMON.

Standard.

Powdered cinnamon shall not contain any cassia or other foreign vegetable or mineral substance, or foreign colouring matter.

12. GINGER.

Standard.

Ginger is the washed and dried or decorticated and dried rhizome of *Zingiber officinale*.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of exhausted or partly exhausted ginger to ginger is hereby prohibited.

GROUND GINGER.

Standard.

Ground ginger shall not contain exhausted or partly exhausted ginger, or foreign vegetable or mineral substance.

13. CLOVES.

Definition.

Cloves are the dried flower-buds of *Eugenia caryophyllata*.

Standard.

Cloves shall contain not more than five (5) per cent. (by weight) of clove stems.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition of exhausted or partly exhausted cloves or foreign vegetable or mineral substance to cloves is hereby prohibited.

14. MACE.

Standard.

Mace is the dried arillus of *Myristica fragrans* or *Myristica moschata*.

Prohibited Addition.

The addition to mace of the arillus of any other variety of *Myristica*, including *Myristica malabarica* or *Jatua* (Bombay mace), *Myristica argentea* (Wild mace), is hereby prohibited.

15. NUTMEG.

Standard.

Nutmeg is the dried seed of *Myristica fragrans* or *Myristica moschata* deprived of its testa.

GROUND NUTMEG.

Standard.

Ground nutmeg shall not contain foreign vegetable or mineral substance.

16. CIDER AND PERRY.

Definition.

Cider and perry are the expressed juices of the apple and pear respectively with or without alcoholic fermentation.

Standard.

Cider or perry may contain sulphurous acid in a proportion, calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO₂), not exceeding two grains per gallon, but shall not contain foreign essence or foreign flavouring substance or salicylic acid or other preservative substance.

17. COLOURING MATTERS.

The addition of colouring matter containing any of the following substances to any article of food is hereby prohibited:—

Arsenic, antimony, barium, chromium, cobalt, copper, iron, lead, manganese, mercury, tin, zinc, compounds of any of the above-mentioned elements; gamboge, picric acid, other harmful organic substance.

18. PRESERVATIVE SUBSTANCES.

The use in or addition to any article of food of chloroform formaldehyde or other volatile aldehyde, or of preservative substance other than any allowed by the Health Acts or by any regulation made thereunder, is hereby prohibited.

19. DRUGS.

Standard.

Drugs included in the British Pharmacopœia shall, unless otherwise standardized in the Health Acts or in any other Victorian Act or in any regulation made thereunder, be of the standard of strength, quality, and purity set out in the current British Pharmacopœia.

QUININE WINE.

Standard.

Quinine wine shall conform in quinine content to the standard set out in the current British Pharmacopœia, but may be prepared with any wholesome wine.

Any person who manufactures or prepares or sells or keeps for sale any article of food or substance or compound in contravention of the Pure Food Act, is liable, on conviction, for the first offence, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and for the second offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Fifty pounds, and for any subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds or more than One hundred pounds.

These Regulations shall take effect from the thirty-first day of March, 1907.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE BEULAH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

BEFORE any interment shall take place application for permission must be made to the Secretary, all charges paid and information recorded, when an order to the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to be made.

2. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in form Schedule A given, an order obtained and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

3. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.

4. The name, age, last place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

5. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

6. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., from the 1st September to the 30th April; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours will be from Two p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.

7. The charge may be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees, that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

8. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

9. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

13. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

14. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

16. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

17. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

18. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

19. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

20. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

21. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

22. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Thistle Act 1893*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare certain plants named—

Solanum Sodomæum (Apple of Sodom or Kangaroo apple), and

Opuntia monacantha (Drooping Prickly Pear),

to be thistles within the meaning of the *Thistle Act 1890* throughout the State of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Governor's Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 113 and 132 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE FOR A METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant of the Reserve in the City of Melbourne for a Metropolitan Cricket Ground, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a place for playing at cricket, and for conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as to the admission of the public and otherwise as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such regulations as to the admission of the public and otherwise as shall from time to time be made by the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any

public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the *Land Act* 1901, and has vested such lands in Trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such lands, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section. Now, therefore, we, James McLaughlin, Thomas Frank Morkham, Roderick Murchison, James Williamson Skene, George Fairbairn, the Honorable John Emanuel Mackey, the Honorable John Murray, the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, K.C.M.G., and the Honorable William Alexander Watt, the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the City of Melbourne for a Metropolitan Cricket Ground:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—

1st Division—The Pavilion, Members' Grand Stands, Tennis Courts, Press Box and Scorers' Box, and Members' and Ladies' Reserves.

2nd Division—The Public Grand Stand and the enclosure connected therewith.

3rd Division—The Playing Ground.

4th Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. Subject to the direction of the Trustees, the Reserve shall be managed, in accordance with these regulations, by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, but for so long only as the constitution thereof at the date of these regulations remains unaltered in any respect, unless the alterations be made with the consent of the Trustees. Provided always that wherever in these regulations it is provided that any act, matter, or thing shall or shall not be done, with or without or subject to the Trustees' approval or consent the Trustees, if they think fit, may in each of such cases direct the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club to do or not to do any such act, matter, or thing, and the Trustees shall, notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, have full power and authority, after such Committee has been directed as hereinbefore set forth, to do or not to do (as the case may be) any such act, matter, or thing, and any act, matter, or thing auxiliary thereto.

3. Every person shall be admitted to the 4th Division free of charge from sunrise to sunset except as hereinafter provided.

4. Admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Division of the Reserve shall be restricted to Members of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and the Trustees of the Reserve, and to such other persons as may be authorized to enter such part of the Reserve by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, with the approval of the Trustees, subject to these regulations.

5. During the cricket season the Reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than cricket without the approval of the Trustees.

6. The Reserve shall not at any time be used otherwise than for athletic games and sports, without the approval of the Trustees.

7. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

8. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

9. No fires shall be lighted in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club.

10. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, turnstiles, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, or other animals, except as provided in Clause 12.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

13. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure on the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

14. The erection of all new buildings and improvements made or effected upon the Reserve, and all matters relating to alterations and repairs to the buildings and improvements, shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, who may at any time authorize any person to enter and inspect the buildings and improvements, and the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club shall be bound to execute and carry out all such improvements (including buildings), alterations, and repairs as the Trustees may, in writing, from time to time direct.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club first obtained.

16. No person except workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

17. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the 1st or 3rd Division of the Reserve, and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Division of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

18. Applications for the use of the Reserve shall be made to the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and no application for the use of the Reserve for any International, Inter-State, or other cricket or football match or outdoor game of public importance shall be refused, without the approval, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and every such application shall be deemed to have been refused by such Committee, unless it be finally dealt with no later than one month after the receipt thereof by such Committee.

19. Any club or any association or persons that may be allowed to use the Reserve for any purpose shall abide by these regulations, and by any order given by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, or by the Trustees in reference to the Reserve and the buildings, erections, and enclosures for the time being thereon, and such use shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, with the approval of the Trustees, may think fit to impose.

20. The maximum scale of fees which shall be charged and collected by the Trustees for admission to the 2nd and 4th Divisions of the Reserve on such days as it may be set apart for cricket matches or football matches, or any other outdoor games or sports or amusements, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of every person to the 2nd Division during any International, Inter-State, or other important cricket match or other outdoor game, or any minor cricket match or football match or other out-door game or sports or amusements, such a sum as the Trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).
- (b) For admission of every person to the 4th Division during any International, Inter-State, or other important cricket match or football match, or other outdoor game, or any minor cricket match or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements such a sum as the Trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

All moneys collected for admission to the 2nd and 4th Divisions of the Reserve shall be paid into an account in the name of the Trustees, and such account may be operated upon by two members of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club authorized by the Trustees by cheques countersigned by the Chairman for the time being of the Trustees, or by such other Trustee as may be authorized for that purpose by the Chairman.

21. The competing clubs in any cricket match, football match, or other outdoor game (except those designated International or Inter-State) which may be played in the Reserve, may be allowed to participate in the net proceeds of such cricket match, football match, or other outdoor game to such extent as the Trustees approve.

22. The Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club shall, if called upon to do so by the Trustees in each year with the approval of the Trustees, set apart and pay into a separate account called "Improvement Account" a reasonable proportion of the moneys paid by members in the way of entrance fees and subscriptions, and the same shall be expended by such Committee in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve or in connexion therewith, subject to the approval of the Trustees.

23. The approval of the Trustees in any of the matters mentioned in these regulations may be given either specially as the occasion arises, or beforehand by a general authority, in writing, to act for any special time, not exceeding one (1) year, in the manner indicated therein.

24. Public betting in any part of the Reserve (including enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

25. Every person offending against any of these regulations shall on conviction before any Justice be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any other officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff of Crown Lands, officer, servant, or constable, (as the case may be), and taken before some Justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10). For the purposes of this regulation the words "any officer or servant of the Trustees" shall include any officer or servant of the Melbourne Cricket Club.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT AND CITY OF ST. KILDA FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, AND FOR THE RECREATION, CONVENIENCE, AND AMUSEMENT OF THE PEOPLE.

WE, Robert George McCutcheon, Archibald Currie, Harry Browne Gibbs, Edward O'Donnell, Henry Florian Barnett, George Henry Billson, Frederick Wimpole, and Carlo Catani, the duly appointed Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) of the undermentioned reserves in the municipal district and City of St. Kilda for public recreation, and for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such Reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199, *Land Act 1901*:—

Four acres three roods two perches, in the municipal district of St. Kilda, permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 9th January, 1884, as a site for public recreation.

Two acres and thirty-three perches, in the city of St. Kilda, permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 31st March, 1905, as a site for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people.

Nineteen acres two roods twenty perches, in three separate portions, in the city of St. Kilda, temporarily reserved by Order in Council on the 5th June, 1906, for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people.

Four acres three roods thirty-eight perches, in the city of St. Kilda, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 11th September, 1906, as a site for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in any of the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, or other property in any of the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or buildings, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings in any of the Reserves.
4. No person shall bring into any of the Reserves any cattle, horses, goats, or pigs without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
5. No person shall bring into any of the Reserves any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in any of the Reserves, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

7. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in any of the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

8. No vehicle shall be allowed within any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, and no person shall ride or drive in any of the Reserves.

9. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any of the Reserves, or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, cast-off clothing, or dead animals in any of the Reserves, or leave therein any orange-peel, paper, or litter except in the bins provided for the purpose.

10. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance in any of the Reserves shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, and to be prosecuted.

11. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No athletic sports shall be played or take place within any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. All proposed buildings in any of the Reserves shall be constructed in strict accordance with plans to be approved by the Committee.

14. No band of music or entertainment of any sort shall be permitted in any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. Permits for the temporary occupation of sites within any of the Reserves and for any special privileges in connexion therewith shall, if issued, be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Committee; and no person shall occupy any site within any of the Reserves or enjoy any special privilege therein unless the consent of the Committee, in writing, be first obtained.

16. No sand or other material shall be removed from any of the Reserves unless a special permit be first obtained from the Committee. All moneys derived from the sale of such sand or other material shall be expended on the Reserve from which such sand or other material is removed.

17. No assemblies for fêtes or concerts or for the purposes of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place in any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. The fee to be charged for admission of any person to the Reserves shall be such a sum as the Committee shall determine, and shall not exceed in any case the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET GROUND AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST, KNOWN AS THE "EASTERN OVAL."

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballarat East, in respect of the Reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Ballarat East, known as the "Eastern Oval," it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Cricket Ground and for other purposes of Public Recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Town of Ballarat East: And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 200, *Land Act* 1901: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Town of Ballarat East do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Ballarat East, known as the "Eastern Oval":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—

- 1st Division.—The cricket and football playing ground.
- 2nd Division.—The grand stands and enclosure connected therewith.
- 3rd Division.—The bowling green and enclosure connected therewith.
- 4th Division.—The lawn tennis court and enclosure connected therewith.
- 5th Division.—The cottages of the caretakers.
- 6th Division.—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter the first, second, third, fourth, or fifth division of the Reserve except on production of a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

3. The sixth division of the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats in the Reserve, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles therein, nor remove therefrom any soil or gravel.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any tent, booth, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle except on production of a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such cart or other vehicle.

8. Every person paying for admission to the second and sixth divisions of the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of tickets, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

9. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed

from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
 - (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground.
 - (d) Being found in any part of the Reserve and not producing upon demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission has been lost.
 - (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.
10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Council.
 11. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.
 12. Persons renting or hiring any stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures in the Reserve for the occasion of any cricket or football match, musical performances, sports, or shows may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £10, which the Council may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and may, if any loss or damage have occurred, deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.
 13. All dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
 14. No person, club, or association shall enter or use the first, second, third, fourth, and fifth divisions of the Reserve for any physical recreation, shows, or musical performances without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
 15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the second and sixth divisions of the Reserve on such occasions as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, cricket or football matches, sports, shows, musical performances, or other amusements shall be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of each person to the second division, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Three shillings.
- (b) For admission of each person to the sixth division, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
