7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust, may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Urban District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Minyip for the year 1907, that is to say:—In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings and eightpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every allotment of land upon which no building is erected, and to which no water is supplied, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such land.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1907, commencing on the 1st January, 1907, and terminating on 31st December, 1907, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Urban District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land, but in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

(b) For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

(c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings.

(d) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1907, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1907.

(c) Such person as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—
BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, make the following By-law:—

1. For water supplied for domestic or for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to such quantity as would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate payable in respect of the premises so supplied, and for all water consumed in excess of such quantity a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

2. The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled, on payment of the rates on such tenements respectively, to use, without further charge, such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the amount of such rates. Provided that the tenement or tenements not supplied by measure shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust.

3. The occupier of two or more tenements, each of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled to use, without further charge, such a quantity of water at either or both of such tenements as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the total amount at which such tenements if not supplied by measure would be rated.

4. For gas engines, oil engines, and steam boilers, the charge shall be by measure; the minimum amount to be paid to be Twenty shillings. No water will be supplied to such engine or boiler until a meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe of such engine or boiler to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust.

5. For buildings in course of erection, where water is supplied for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the work for a brick building, or shall be fixed by special agreement. For wooden buildings with plastered walls, the charge shall be One pound (£1), and all wooden buildings where no plaster is used, the charge shall be Ten shillings (10s.). Payment in either case to be made in advance.

6. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes, shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water (where not otherwise provided herein) shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons.

8. The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.

9. The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the charges herein made.

Section 2 shall apply, omitting all the words after the word "of" where it appears the second time on the first line down to the word "therein" on the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "a Municipal Council"; inserting after the word "vacant" the words "or not less than six days before the day appointed for holding the annual election"; and omitting the words "the *Government Gazette* and unless otherwise prescribed in two Melbourne daily newspapers and also in" in the fifth and sixth lines; omitting the words "any province or" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting the words "Member or members" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors"; omitting all the words after the word "effect" in the tenth line.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 9 shall apply, omitting the words "electors electoral province or district" in the second and third lines, and "province or district" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality" in both places; omitting the words "electoral provinces or districts" in the twentieth and twenty-first lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality," and omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur, and in line three omitting "Postmaster" and inserting "Officer" in lieu thereof.

Section 10 shall apply, omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur.

Section 11 shall apply unaltered.

Section 12 shall apply, omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Shire of Dundas (or Rosedale, or Violet Town, as the case may be)."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
RECREATIVE PURPOSES AT ANDERSON'S
CREEK.

WE, Henry Squires, Christopher Alexander Blair, John Sloan, John Mullens, and William Sloan, the duly appointed Committee of Management for the Reserve for Recreative purposes at Anderson's Creek, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions :—
 - (a) That he is registered as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management on payment of a fee of 5s. (Five shillings) for each meeting.
 - (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, and shall have thereon his name.
9. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Crown lands bailiff or any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff

or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
