REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND . MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATIVE PURPOSES AT ANDERSON'S CREEK.

W. E., Henry Squires, Christopher Alexander Blair, John Sloan, John Mullens, and William Sloan, the duly appointed Committee of Management for the Reserve for Recreative purposes at Anderson's Creek, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language,
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—
 - (a) That he is registered as a bookmaker by the Com-mittee of Management on payment of a fee of 5s. (Five shillings) for each meeting.
 - (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, and shall have thereon his
- No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Crown lands bailiff or any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff

or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
