CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND JAPAN FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED PERSONS.

APPLICATION OF THE DOMICILE ACT 1861.

THE subjoined despatch, addressed by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, is published for general information, together with the enclosure thereto.

Sir,

With reference to my Predecessor's Circular despatch of the 1st of February, 1901, and your telegram of 20th September, 1906, I have the honour to transmit to you for the information of your Government, and for such publication as may be desirable, a copy of an Order of His Majesty in Council of the 21st of December, 1906, applying the *Domicile Act 1861*, in the case of the Convention of 26th April, 1900, between the United Kingdom and Japan for the protection of the estates of deceased persons.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Domicile Act 1861*, it is enacted that whenever a Convention shall be made between His Majesty and any Foreign State, whereby His Majesty's Consuls or Vice-Consuls in such Foreign State shall receive the same or the like powers and authorities as are hereinafter expressed, it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to direct, and from and after publication of such Order in the *London Gazette* it shall be and is hereby enacted, that whenever any subject of such Foreign State shall die within the dominions of His Majesty and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be rightfully entitled to administer to the estate of such deceased person, it shall be lawful for the Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of such Foreign State within that part of His Majesty's Dominions where such Foreign subject shall die to take

possession and have the custody of the personal property of the deceased, and to apply the same in payment of his or her debts and funeral expenses, and to retain the surplus for the benefit of the persons entitled thereto; but such Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent shall immediately apply for and shall be entitled to obtain from the proper Court letters of administration of the effects of such deceased person, limited in such a manner and for such time as to such Court shall seem fit.

And whereas a Convention between His Majesty the King and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan was made on the 26th April, 1900, and ratified on the 23th October, 1900, whereby it is provided—

I. That whenever a subject of one of the High Contracting Parties shall die within the dominions of the other and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be rightly entitled to administer the estate of such deceased person, the following Rules shall be observed:—

(1) When the deceased leaves, in the above-named circumstances, heirs of his or her own nationality only, or who may be qualified to enjoy the civil status of their father or mother, as the case may be, the Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of the country to which the deceased belonged, on giving notice to the proper authorities, shall take possession and have custody of the property of the said deceased, shall pay the expenses of the funeral, and retain the surplus for the payment of his or her debts, and for the benefit of the heirs to whom it may rightly belong.

But the said Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent shall be bound immediately to apply to the proper Court for letters of administration of the effects left by the deceased, and these letters shall be delivered to him with such limitations and for such time as to such Court may seem right.

(2) If, however, the deceased leaves in the country of his or her decease and in the above-named circumstances, any heir or universal legatee of other nationality than his or her own, or to whom the civil status of his or her father or his or her mother, as the case may be, cannot be granted, then each of the two Governments may determine whether the proper Court shall proceed according to law, or shall confide the collection and administration to the respective Consular Officers under the proper limitations. When there is no Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent, in the locality where the decease has occurred (in the case contemplated by the first rule of this Article) upon whom devolves the custody and administration of the estate, the proper authority shall proceed in these acts until the arrival of the respective Consular Officers.

II. That the stipulations of the Convention shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Majesty, excepting to

those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to India, The Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, The Cape, Natal, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia, and New Zealand; provided always that the stipulations of the Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions, on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given to the Japanese Government by His Majesty's Representative at Tokyo, within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the Convention.

III. That the Convention shall remain in force until the 17th July, 1911.

And whereas within the period prescribed by Article II. the stipulations of the Convention have been made applicable to the Colonies of The Cape, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, and Western Australia, and to India:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that whenever any subject of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan shall die during the currency of the Convention within any of the dominions of His Majesty the King to which the stipulations of the Convention are applicable, and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be rightfully entitled to administer to the estate of such deceased person, it shall be lawful for the Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent, of the Japanese Government within that part of His Majesty's Dominions where such Japanese subject shall die, to take possession and have the custody of the personal property of the deceased, and to apply the same in payment of his or her debts and funeral expenses, and to retain the surplus for the benefit of the persons entitled thereto; but such Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent shall immediately apply for and shall be entitled to obtain from the proper Court letters of administration of the effects of such deceased person, limited in such manner and for such time as to such Court shall seem fit.

BY-LAW NO. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Mount Rouse, made under the 197th section of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting cattle wandering in the streets of Dunkeld. —Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903* is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Mount Rouse.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Rouse have adopted and confirmed a By-law, No. 14, made under Part I. of the 13th Schedule, section 9.

The following clauses have been adopted and confirmed:—

Clause 41.—Relating to cattle being found upon any street without any person being in charge of them, &c.

Clause 42.—Relating to penalty for allowing cattle to wander upon such streets, &c.

Clause 43.—Relating to penalty and sale where cattle impounded.

This By-law shall apply to and be in full force in the township of Dunkeld.

INGLEWOOD HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).
AMENDED BY-LAWS.

1. All by-laws made prior to the date of the making of these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed. Provided nevertheless that nothing herein contained shall abridge or restrict in any manner the rights and privileges conferred upon those life governors who were enrolled as such prior to the making of these by-laws.

2. In these by-laws the word "Contributor" shall have the same meaning as is assigned to that word in the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 1099.

OBJECTS.

3. The Institution is for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid to destitute persons in cases of accident and disease.

4. Medical and surgical aid may also be afforded to persons able to pay for such aid at such rate as the Committee of Management may fix and determine.

5. Should the applications for admission be in excess of the accommodation available, preference shall be given to the sick poor.

CONTRIBUTORS AND LIFE GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

6. Each contributor of £1 and upwards shall be entitled to recommend one patient during the year for every pound contributed in that year.

7. Every contributor of £10 (ten pounds) or upwards of his own money shall be a life governor, and every person who shall by his own voluntary exertions raise by one or more collections in one year the sum of £20 (twenty pounds) or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum shall also be a life governor. No proceeds of any public entertainment of any kind originated or carried out in aid of any charity or charitable institution shall entitle any person to be nominated or enrolled as a life governor or contributor.

8. That every life governor appointed under these by-laws and every contributor of £4 and less than £5 shall be entitled to one vote, and every contributor of £5 and less than £10 (ten pounds) to two votes at all general, annual, or special meetings of contributors. The voting power of life governors to be in addition to any they may possess as contributors, but no person shall have or exercise more than three votes, but no voting by proxy will be allowed.

9. That no person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of contributors to this hospital unless he shall have been a contributor of at least One pound sterling to the hospital within a period of twelve months previous to the time of such meeting being held, or unless the said contribution being the first has been paid at least three months before the meeting at which such contributor wishes to vote, and all contributors who shall allow more than a year to elapse since the payment of their last contribution for the purpose of this clause, their next contribution shall be considered as a first contribution.

10. That for all elections held under clause 25 the voting shall be by ballot in the usual manner or through the post.

11. That contributors and life governors desiring to vote by post may, on application personally or through the post to the secretary or his deputy at the hospital office, Inglewood, obtain postal ballot-papers.

12. Such ballot-papers shall be initiated by the secretary or his deputy and sealed with the corporate seal, and shall be returnable to the secretary or his deputy through the post up to the hour fixed for the closing of the poll on the day of the election, and shall be by such secretary or his deputy placed in the ballot-box at the polling booth on the day and within the hours of such election.

13. That the president for the time being shall act as Returning Officer at all elections, but should he from any cause be unable to perform any of the duties devolving upon him, such duties shall be performed by the vice-president for the time being, or by any member of the Committee of Management duly appointed to do so.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

14. The affairs of the Institute shall be directed by a committee consisting of ten contributors; and the said committee shall elect at their first meeting from amongst themselves their president, vice-president, and treasurer.

15. The committee shall be elected by the contributors and life governors in accordance with these by-laws, but no person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting unless he or some one duly authorized on his behalf shall have given notice in writing to the secretary fourteen days before the date of such meeting of his intention to stand for such election as member of committee. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above conditions and to fill up any vacancy which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of.

16. Except as hereinafter provided, all contributors shall be eligible for election as members of committee, but no paid officer of the Institution shall be eligible for election on the committee.

17. No person under contract to the hospital shall be eligible to sit on the committee during the consideration of his tender or the period of his contract, and no person holding any office or place of profit under the corporation or concerned or participating in any wise in the benefits or profits from any contract or other work done under the authority of the same shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such committee.

18. The committee shall include all the officers named in clause xiv. hereof. It shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital (the same being not repugnant to the by-laws), present a report to the annual general meeting, and

manage the affairs of the hospital generally; and may from amongst themselves from time to time appoint house and other committees, give the same power to perform such duties as may not be contrary to Act of Incorporation, and may also from time to time alter or discontinue such committees.

19. The committee shall meet for general business on the Thursday on or before the full moon in each month, and adjourn such or any meeting as may be deemed expedient. Special meetings of the committee shall be called by the president or secretary, or upon the requisition of any three members of the said committee to the president or vice-president, such requisition to state the object of such meeting, and no other business but that stated shall be entertained. At any meeting four members to form a quorum, the president or vice-president to be chairman, and in their absence the meeting shall elect a chairman. The chairman to have, in addition to his own vote as a member of committee, a second or casting vote.

20. Should vacancies occur in any of the offices mentioned in clause xiv., or in the office of member of committee or auditors, the committee may supply such vacancies for the remainder of the year.

MEETINGS.

21. On the last Thursday in July in every year a meeting of contributors and life governors shall be held for the reception and adoption of the annual report and balance-sheet, and for the transaction of any other business of which notice has been given in the advertisement convening such meeting, and for the election of two contributors not members of committee as auditors for the year.

22. The general committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at each annual meeting, which report shall be presented at a special meeting of the committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting.

23. At all meetings of contributors the president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall take the chair, but in the absence of both these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

24. At all meetings the chairman shall have a deliberative vote and also a casting vote when the numbers are equal.

25. When any vacancy caused by the retirement by effluxion of time of any elected or temporarily appointed member of committee or both is about to occur in accordance with the requirements of Act No. 1099, the secretary shall give public notice by advertisement thereof and fix therein a time not less than seven days from the date of such notice within which candidates for any such vacancy shall send to the secretary their notice of candidature and a day on which in the event of a contest the election shall be held.

26. When at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving notice of candidature the number of candidates does not exceed the number of vacancies, the returning officer shall declare the candidates duly elected.

27. All questions other than elections at meetings of contributors and all questions at meetings of the committee shall be decided by a show of hands.

28. When at the expiration of the time fixed by clause 25 there are more candidates than vacancies, the secretary shall give public notice by advertisement of the names of such candidates at least seven (7) days before the date of such election, and the contributors and life governors shall upon the day appointed for the election elect such number of candidates as are required to fill the vacancies in respect of which the election is held.

29. It shall be competent for the committee to make arrangements (not inconsistent with these by-laws) for the conduct of elections, and to determine the validity of all disputed elections.

30. The committee in their discretion may, and shall upon the written application of ten or more duly qualified contributors specifying the object of such meeting, direct special meetings of contributors to be convened by the secretary, and no business shall be transacted at any such special meeting except that for which it shall have been convened.

31. Every meeting of contributors shall be called by advertisement in a local newspaper at least one week before the day of meeting.

32. If at any annual or special meeting of the contributors to the said institution at least ten of the contributors qualified to vote shall not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting no business shall be done at that time, but in such case there shall be another meeting at the same place and at the same hour of the same day in the following week, and at this last-mentioned meeting any number of contributors (qualified to vote as aforesaid) exceeding three shall constitute a meeting.

33. The committee shall have power to appoint probationer nurses. Such appointments to be subject to such conditions as the committee may in its discretion from time to time approve.

CONTRACTORS.

34. A deposit of 5 per cent., based on the average cost of the provisions or goods consumed for the previous three years, shall accompany each tender, and the amount of such deposit shall be fixed by the secretary and treasurer, and such deposit shall be forfeited if the contractor fails to carry out his contract. No deposit to be a less sum than £2.

HONORARY TREASURER.

35. He shall receive all money on behalf of the hospital, and invest same in such bank or banks, as the committee of management shall direct, to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting and the secretary as having been approved by the committee by cheque on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by any two members of the Finance Committee, and by the secretary. He shall also keep an account of all moneys received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

ACCOUNTS.

36. The finance committee shall consist of not less than four members of committee, who shall meet to pass accounts on the first Monday in every month, such accounts to be submitted at the following general meeting of the whole committee for confirmation. Such accounts must be initiated by one of the finance committee, and the said finance committee shall at each monthly meeting of the general committee present a report of the financial position of the hospital.

AUDITORS.

37. The auditors shall at the end of each year examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

38. All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial; the residue, if any, to be handed over to the legal representatives.

39. The committee of management shall appoint a sub-committee to judge as to the ability of patients to pay, which sub-committee (with the concurrence of the surgeon) shall have power to discharge any patient in case of his refusal to pay, and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a justice as to their means.

40. Patients are expected to pay according to their means.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

41. That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance be received at any time; that patients arriving from over a distance of ten miles from the hospital be treated in accordance with Rule No. 76, but in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily between the hours of 11 and 12 a.m., on the recommendation of a contributor for the then current year.

42. That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one affected with syphilis or any infectious diseases (except at the discretion of the medical officer), or any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance, is unfit to be an indoor patient, shall be received under any circumstances, and the reason of refusing any patient shall be stated to the house committee by the surgeon.

43. The house committee shall at least once a week visit the hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and of inquiring of the patients if they are properly attended to, and to report to the next meeting of the board any alteration or suggestion they may think necessary; such house committee to be elected by agreement amongst the members during the sitting of the committee.

HOSPITAL SURGEON.

44. He shall examine the nature of each applicant's case, and decide the fitness of each complaint for admission, and shall discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged.

45. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and their treatment; shall attend at the hospital and visit each patient once a day, and in cases of difficulty or danger shall request the attendance of any of the consulting medical officers available; but in the event of the

services of such honorary medical officers not being obtainable he shall report the fact to the house committee, and shall in all other respects comply with such regulations as the committee of management may frame for his guidance.

46. He shall superintend and control the dispenser and all nurses and wardsmen or those performing such duties in the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them, and forthwith report the matter to the superintendent, who in turn shall report to the house committee, who may discharge or reinstate the same at their discretion.

47. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them both as to the quantity and quality, and report any defects in any respect to the committee of management; and he must in the absence of the dispenser perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer.

48. He shall enter regularly in books to be kept for the purpose (such books to be provided by and remain the property of the committee) the names of patients as they are admitted and discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment, manner of treatment, time of attending each case, medicine prescribed, and instructions for the guidance of the dispenser.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

49. Legally qualified medical practitioners must lodge written applications for the office with the secretary ten days previous to a meeting of the committee.

50. The consulting medical officers shall attend at the hospital for consultation or operation whenever requested by the hospital surgeon.

SUPERINTENDENT.

51. The superintendent, or in his absence the responsible person in charge, shall receive the tickets from applicants for admission, and shall hand same to the hospital surgeon.

52. He shall forward all admission tickets to the secretary for monthly committee meetings, and specially report the cause of any ticket not being produced or not bearing the patient's signature to necessary declaration.

53. He shall superintend and control all servants (other than nursing staff) in the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them and forthwith report to the house committee, who may discharge or reinstate the same at their discretion. He shall have supervision over the nurses and servants generally.

54. He shall keep an inventory of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals in a book to be kept for that purpose (such book to be provided by and remain the property of the committee), and keep an account of the receipts and expenditure, or loss and breakage of all such instruments, drugs, and chemicals.

55. He shall have charge of all stores and provisions, and shall be responsible for receiving and issuing same.

56. He shall instruct the yardsman as to his duties from time to time.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

57. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the hospital; compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same; carry out the resolutions, and perform all clerical and other duties that may be ordered by the committee.

58. He shall convene the annual general meeting of each year, in accordance with clause 21 of these By-laws.

59. He shall convene all special meetings of duly qualified contributors when directed by the committee so to do, the object of such special meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and he shall also give special notice in writing to each member of the committee of such meeting.

60. He shall give the notice required by clauses 25 and 28 of these By-laws and in accordance therewith.

61. He shall visit the hospital once in each week, and shall record quantity of stores and provisions, &c., received and issued.

62. He shall collect contributions and all moneys due to the hospital, in all cases give receipts for same, and render an account for the same to the committee.

HOSPITAL SERVANTS.

63. The superintendent or dispenser, nurses and wardsmen and hospital servants such as may be employed shall live on the hospital premises. They shall be regular in their attendance, and conform generally to such rules as may be made by the committee.

64. All employes of the hospital on being engaged shall sign an agreement undertaking to give one month's notice of intention to resign their position, and in default of giving such notice shall forfeit any salary or wages due at time of leaving.

65. The superintendent shall remain on the hospital premises for at least two evenings a week; the head nurse for at least three evenings a week. In the absence of the superintendent and head nurse the night nurse must be in charge.

66. The absence from duty of any of the hospital employes will not be sanctioned without the express permission of the surgeon, superintendent, or responsible person in charge should the two former be absent.

67. The superintendent must during his absence at any time leave in charge of the hospital either the head nurse or night nurse.

68. Should the superintendent or the head nurse require to be absent from duty for a longer period than half a day he or she must make arrangements for the efficient carrying out of their respective duties as shall be satisfactory to the medical officer or the committee.

69. Applications for leave of absence must be made in writing to the committee through the secretary.

70. Should any of the other employes be absent from duty during any month the superintendent must report the same, also cause of absence, to the committee at the monthly meeting.

71. All employes living at the hospital other than surgeons, superintendent and head nurse, must be in the hospital by Ten p.m., except special permission be granted by superintendent or head nurse.

72. All gates must be closed at Eight p.m. in the summer and Six p.m. in the winter, excepting the night gates.

PATIENTS.

73. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and strictly observe all the directions of the hospital surgeon and nurses, and such regulations as may be made by the hospital surgeon or house committee.

74. Any patient having cause of complaint shall make the same known to the hospital surgeon, the superintendent, or the committee.

75. Patients deemed able by the hospital surgeon to assist in the work of the hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

76. Out-door patients shall attend at the hospital between Eleven and Twelve o'clock a.m. on Tuesday and Friday in each week, unless coming from over a distance of 10 miles from the hospital, when the dispenser or superintendent, in the absence of the surgeon, may provide such patients with accommodation for the night of arrival. All out-door patients must observe the rules so far as they are practicable.

77. All patients received by the dispenser or superintendent, in the absence of the surgeon, under rules Nos. 51 and 76, shall, until the surgeon has decided upon the fitness of the case for admission, be placed in a ward apart from the rest of the patients.

VISITORS AND PATIENTS.

78. Patients and visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or any other person connected with the hospital.

79. Visitors will be admitted on Tuesdays, Fridays, and Sundays, between the hours of Two and Five o'clock in the afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the hospital surgeon or superintendent, or any member of committee, but no visitor will be allowed to remain more than an hour, except ministers of religion, who may visit the patients at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested by the nurses.

80. Visitors shall not give to or leave with any patients medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquid of any kind, nor any other thing, without permission of the hospital surgeon; nor interfere with the nurse, nor disturb the patients with loud talking or unnecessary noise.

81. Any visitor or patient violating any of the rules of the hospital or behaving with impropriety will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the hospital surgeon or committee of management.

82. Any officer, nurse, servant, or other person in any way connected with the hospital who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, unless by the permission of the committee of management, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted in future to hold any office or appointment belonging to the hospital.

83. No person shall be permitted to remain on the hospital premises longer than specified in rule 76, except by special permission.

84. All persons, including patients, are expressly prohibited from entering the kitchen and servants' quarters, unless members of committee or others duly authorized.

85. On no account will any person be permitted to undertake the duties of nursing or attending to patients without the permission of the medical officer. Should such permission be granted at any time during a month the superintendent must report the same and circumstances to the committee at their regular monthly meeting.

NIGHT NURSE.

86. She shall be on duty for such hours as may be arranged by the hospital surgeon.

87. She must attend to all patients in the hospital.

88. She must have all chamber utensils and beds in a cleanly condition, to the satisfaction of the head nurse, before ceasing duty each morning.

89. Should the night nurse be applied to to admit any person desiring admission as a patient she shall at once communicate with the superintendent, and should he not be present, with the head nurse.

90. The observance of these By-laws will be strictly enforced.

The foregoing amended By-laws, numbered consecutively 1 to 90 both inclusive, were duly made by the committee at its monthly meeting on the 25th day of February, 1907, and confirmed by a general meeting of the contributors, specially convened for that purpose, and held on the 7th day of March, 1907.
