Every person who shall commit any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Kew.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of April, 1907.

WHEREAS by section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make (and when made, may at any time alter or repeal) Rules for regulating the practice and proceedings of the Licensing Courts, and for prescribing the forms to be used in proceedings in the said Courts, and for fixing the scale of fees and costs to be allowed to persons practising as

counsel or attorneys therein, and for regulating the keeping of all registers, books, entries, and accounts by officers of the said Courts, and for regulating the expenses to be paid to witnesses in the said Courts, and any such Rules may apply to all Licensing Courts, or to such of the said Courts as may be specified in that behalf by the Governor in Council: And whereas by the said section it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may also from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations to enforce the carrying out of the said Act and for giving effect to the same: And whereas by section 62 of the Licensing Act 1906, it is, amongst other things, enacted that in addition to the purposes for which Rules may be made under the provisions of section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890 the Governor in Council may also, in manner provided in such section, at any time make Rules in relation to the fees, costs, and charges for summonses, subpoenas, warrants, and searches, and all other process issued or made under the Licensing Acts by the Licensing Courts: and that every clerk of a Licensing Court shall demand and receive and take for the use of His Majesty the several fees mentioned in the tenth schedule to the Licensing Act 1906, or in any rule made by the Governor in Council in substitution for any of the said several fees or in addition thereto: And whereas by section 106 of the Licensing Act 1906, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may, pursuant to the provisions of section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890, make regulations prescribing the forms of certificates, licences, permits, applications, orders, and forms required under the Licensing Acts, and altering the forms of any of the schedules to the Licensing Acts, and such forms so prescribed or altered may be used for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be sufficient in law: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the said recited powers, doth make the following additional Rules and Regulations, and the said Rules and Regulations shall come into operation immediately.

SEARCHES AND COPIES OF DOCUMENTS AND PROCEEDINGS.

1. Nothing in Rule 22 of the Rules and Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 21st day of February, 1907, shall be deemed to give any right of search to any person other than the licensed victualler or club secretary who lodged the same, or the duly authorized representative of such licensed victualler or club secretary or the Licensing Inspector, in respect of any declaration lodged with the Clerk of the Licensing Court pursuant to the requirements of section 103 of the Licensing Act 1906, and no person other than the licensed victualler, club secretary, duly authorized representative, or Licensing Inspector as aforesaid, shall be entitled to make or cause to be made any copy or extract from such declaration.

2. Nothing in Rule 22 above mentioned shall be deemed to give the right to any person, other than the Licensing Inspector, to search any register-book kept by any clerk of a Licensing Court, or make or cause to be made any extract therefrom for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of any compensation fee fixed by any Licensing Court pursuant to the provisions of section 110 of the Licensing Act 1906, or the amount of any percentage payable under section 14 of the said Act. Provided always that any licensed victualler, club secretary, or duly authorized representative of such licensed victualler or club secretary shall be entitled, on payment of the prescribed fee, to search and make any copies of or extracts from any entry relating to his victualler's licence or club registration, as the case may be.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW NUMBER FIVE.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and Numbered Five, for regulating and controlling bathing in Lake Wallace, Parish of Edenhope.

WHEREAS the Board of Land and Works, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of May, 1906, page 2033, has appointed the Council of the Shire of Kowree to be a Committee of Management of certain land, being the bed of Lake Wallace in the parish of Edenhope, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree order as follows:—

(1) That no male person over the age of six years shall, between the hours of Six o'clock in the evening and Twelve o'clock at night, enter upon or remain on that portion of the shore of Lake Wallace extending from a point on the lake frontage near the south-west corner of the Lake Wallace pre-emptive right, indicated on the ground by a post there erected, to another point along the lake frontage eastward about fifteen chains from the last-mentioned point, and similarly marked. Nor shall any male person, during the hours hereinbefore mentioned, enter or remain in the water lying northward from the said portion of the shore, and within a distance of ten chains from the water's edge, in a boat or otherwise.

(2) No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Lake Reserve.

Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
