Every person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.
- 5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.
