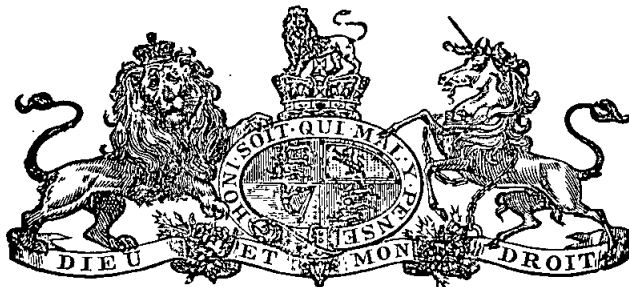

SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1907.

IT is hereby notified that Wednesday, the 1st day of May next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

"Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 30th April instant will be in time for enrolment on the Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Electors' Rights for the Assembly can be obtained free of charge.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900. WELLINGTON PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Council, and I declare that (here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper).

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

THE VICTORIAN POLICE FORCE.

AN Examination of persons who are desirous of being employed in the Victorian Police Force will be held at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, at Nine o'clock a.m., on Tuesday, 14th May, 1907.

Application forms are now available, and can be obtained from "The Officer in Charge of Police Depot, St. Kilda-road," personally or by writing.

The forms must be filled up in the candidates' own handwriting, and must be returned to the Depot on or before Tuesday, 7th May, 1907.

Candidates must be over 20 and under 25 years of age, and must be at least 5ft. 9in. in height. They must be smart and active, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. Weight, chest measurement, &c., must be in accordance with the following scale:—

They will be subject to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character.

Applicants who fail to comply with any one or more of the conditions herein stated will not be eligible for examination.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

The light will appear white all round except from northward of the beacon within the arc between S. 86 deg. E. and S. 4 deg. E., which will appear red for the purpose of marking No. 1 Beacon and the Nyerimilang Black Buoy near its western cutting, and Maringa Spit near its eastern cutting.

Caution.

Mariners are advised that the western cutting of the red sector of light is intended to enable the Nyerimilang Buoy to be picked up in approaching the light, but it will be necessary to haul into the white sector of light after rounding such buoy.

SHIRE OF BARRARBOOL.

A By-law of the Shire of Barrarbool, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 3, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Barrarbool order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride or drive any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads within the Shire of Barrarbool at a greater speed than sixteen (16) miles an hour without the permission in writing of the Council of the said shire, or of the President thereof first had and obtained.

2. No person shall ride or drive any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
