IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. A general rate of One shilling in the pound of the rateable value of all lands within the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any urban division thereof, is hereby made under the provisions of section 62 of the *Water Act* 1905, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all such lands for the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling thereon, and for watering cattle or other stock.

3. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the half-year beginning with the first day of January, 1907, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1907, and shall be payable on the second day of May, 1907, at the office of the said Commission at Bacchus Marsh.

4. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

5. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by Thomas Cain, valuer, returned on the sixth day of February, 1907, and adopted by the said Commission on the eleventh day of February, 1907, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless such valuation be altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act* 1905, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws or Regulations prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following rates for the supply of water are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or

owners of lands and tenements within the said Urban Division:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), a rate of Ninepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings per half-year.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building, a rate of Ninepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the half-year beginning with the first day of January, 1907, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1907; and shall be payable on the second day of May, 1907, at the office of the said Commission at Bacchus Marsh.

4. Such persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

5. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

CAUSE OF FIRE ON THE S.S. *KANOWNA*.
DIRECT IGNITION OF CARGO.

THE following Report of Committee, received by the Marine Board of Victoria on the above subject, was adopted thereby, and is, with other data, published for the information of whom it may concern.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

"In the matter of a fire which occurred in the No. 1 hold of the s.s. *Kanowna* (Official No. 115743) when at her berth in the River Yarra, Melbourne, on the 2nd March, 1907, immediately prior to the time of her projected departure for Western Australia.

Mins. 22.3.7.

"THE NAUTICAL EXPERT COMMITTEE has taken into consideration the documents referred thereto relative to the above-mentioned casualty, and desires to report that it concurs with the opinion expressed by the Chief Inspector of Explosives, namely, that the fire was caused by the direct ignition of the cargo either by a person smoking in the hold shortly before the hatches were closed or by a live match or a burning cigar end being thrown down a ventilator.

"As to smoking in holds by those engaged in the loading or unloading of cargo the Committee is advised, as the result of inquiry made by the Inspector of Shipping, that local ship-owners and agents prohibit the practice under pain of dismissal of any person found so offending; but, notwithstanding, there is reason to believe that the prohibition is at times disregarded to the distinct danger of life and property, and in view thereof the Committee is of opinion that the matter should receive the further attention of ship-owners and all persons supervising the loading or unloading of cargo with a view to such measures being taken as safety demands.

"With regard to the theory that the fire was possibly occasioned by a live match or a burning cigar end being thrown down a ventilator, the Committee desires to draw attention to a previous recommendation which was made (17th March, 1905) in a report relative to a fire which occurred on the s.s. *Warrimoo*, namely—

"That the cowls of all hold ventilators should be at least seven (7) feet above the deck, with a view to minimising the possibility of fires being occasioned in holds by a lighted match or the contents of a lighted pipe being thoughtlessly thrown into the openings of cowl heads."

"The Committee recommends that every publicity be given to the report of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, and that the attention of ship-owners and agents be drawn to the matter.

REPORT BY CHIEF INSPECTOR OF EXPLOSIVES.

"From the results of Mr. Hughes' investigations of No. 1 hold of the *Kanowna* (details attached) it is clear that the fire originated on the starboard side of the lower between-decks, well forward, and that it was confined to a very limited area.

"Within this area the cargo consisted of blankets in bales (woollen), and in rolls (flannelette), butter, confectionery, and tea. The blankets were stowed on bags of grain, and were surrounded by confectionery and tea. The cargo above the blankets consisted of boxes of butter.

"The blankets were almost entirely consumed; many of the butter boxes were burnt or charred.

"The butter melted and flowed on to the blankets.

"Cause of Fire.

"Spontaneous combustion is a fruitful source of fire in ships, but in this case it appears that there was no cargo stowed within the area of the fire which was specially liable to spontaneous combustion; moreover, only one hour and a half elapsed between the closing of the hatches and the issue of smoke from the ventilators.

"I think, therefore, that this cause can be dismissed as utterly improbable.

"The remaining most probable cause is direct ignition. Direct ignition may have been brought about—

"(1) By a person smoking in the hold shortly before the hatches were closed; or

"(2) By a live match or a burning cigar end being thrown down a ventilator.

"As regards (1), I have no experience as to what precautions are taken to prevent fire from this cause when stowing cargo in the hold of a vessel.

"As regards (2), Mr. Gough, the Board's shipwright-surveyor, informed me that the Chief Officer of the

Kanowna stated to him that the blankets were stowed under one of the ventilators.

"Experiments made in my laboratory show that the blankets made of wool do not readily burst into flame when ignited in a current of air, but smoulder.

"On the other hand, the flannelette material ignites easily under the same conditions, and bursts into flame.

"After careful consideration of the whole of the circumstances, I am of opinion that the fire was caused by the direct ignition of cargo (probably the blankets), as suggested under paragraphs 1 and 2 above.

"The cargo in the vicinity of the fire consisted of a large stack of oats and barley, on which was stowed fifteen to twenty bales of blankets, and above these, right up against the iron bulkhead, boxes of butter, jam, confectionery, and tea.

"Wharfinger Stanbridge stated to me that the bales of blankets were shipped between half-past One and Two o'clock on the afternoon of the 2nd instant, and that a quantity of case goods was afterwards stowed in the centre of the hold. At a quarter to Five p.m. the hatches were closed.

"At Six o'clock (an hour and a quarter later) smoke was observed issuing from the ventilators.

"The area in which the fire occurred was very small, and the inflammable cargo stowed therein consisted of blankets, butter, &c., as above stated.

2. Such rate is made for the year 1907, commencing on the first day of January, 1907, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1907.

3. Such rate is made payable on the first day of June, 1907.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rate.

5. Such rate as aforesaid is hereby made this nineteenth day of March, 1907, by the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Waterworks Trust, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed, by the authority of the said Trust, in the presence of—

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890*, it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the Municipal Districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra has made an application under the common seal of the said Municipality in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Shire of Upper Yarra.

And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Shire of Upper Yarra shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:— Commencing in the Little Yarra-road at a point opposite the north boundary of allotment 62b(1), parish of Beenak (as shown on plan lodged in the Public Works Department), thence north-westerly along the said road to the Yarra Junction Railway Station.

'GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be three feet, and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the specification now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which specification is indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said specification so deposited as the specification referred to in this Order, and which specification is to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of same as if it were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used shall be horses.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be three miles in the hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the approximate time required to construct the tramway is three months from the date of the approval of the Order authorizing the construction of the tramway.

NATURE OF TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of timber and produce only.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of passengers passing along the roads upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the rates to be charged upon the said tramway for the carriage of timber and produce are as follows:—
 3d. per hundred super feet for sawn timber.
 6d. per hundred for palings.
 5s. per ton for produce.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order, and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in Clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule.

If, upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said Clause 25 of the Regulations in the second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as the sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and, in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra shall forthwith proceed to restore the road along which the said route is laid out to its condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Minister of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 13 of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for all or any of the purposes therein specified, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. The occupier or owner of any land whereon there are growing trees, plants, or vegetables upon which fruit affected with fruit flies (*Tephritis tryoni* and *Halterophora capitata*) has been found shall at once pick and gather up all infested fruit and shall forthwith treat all such fruit for the effectual destruction of the maggot or chrysalis by immersion in boiling water, or in such other way as the inspector may direct in writing; and no person shall make use of any such infested fruit before the same shall have been treated in accordance with this regulation.

2. The occupier or owner of such land shall treat the soil under each tree upon which infested fruit has been found in such manner as the inspector shall direct in writing.

3. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of, or who shall fail to comply with these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound (£1) for a first offence, and not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for any subsequent offence.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 45 of the *Boilers Inspection Act 1906* (6 Edw. VII. No. 2071) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations not inconsistent with the said Act for prescribing the mode in which the pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained, and the method of reckoning the horse power of boilers, and generally for carrying the said Act into execution: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS (SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE ACT) FOR THE INSPECTION AND TEST OF BOILERS.

1. The pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained by applying the British Board of Trade Rules relating to Steam Boilers.

2. On the first inspection, sec. 14, boilers to be subjected to an hydraulic test. In the case of new boilers the test pressure to be double the working pressure allowed, and in the case of boilers in work and second-hand the test pressure to be one and a half times the working pressure allowed.

3. Under the conditions referred to in sec. 15, sub-sec. (2), and in sec. 29, or otherwise, the Chief Inspector may deem it necessary to have the hydraulic test pressure applied before issuing a renewed certificate.

4. Water gauges to be provided with strong metal guards around the glasses.

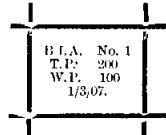
5. Steam gauges to be tested and adjusted once in twelve months, and no gauge to be passed which varies more than five pounds from the standard gauge.

6. The design of safety valves to be submitted to the Chief Inspector, and to be subject to his approval. In lever safety valves, the weight to be at end of lever to give working pressure.

7. No boiler to be placed in position, or built in, before an inspector has inspected it internally and externally, and a certificate has been granted.

8. The method of reckoning the horse power of boilers is:—Allow 10 square feet of heating surface per horse power.

9. The registered number, test and working pressures, and date of test, to be stamped by an inspector in a conspicuous place on front of boiler, or alongside manhole, as in the following illustration:—
