## SHIRE OF COLAC.

## BY-LAW NO. 64.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 64 of the said Shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law to amend By-law No. 62, for regulating earth closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans, in the parish of Ondit, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Section 10 of By-law No. 62 is hereby repealed.

4. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cesspans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act 1890*, shall be as follows:—Once a week for each pan, per annum, £1 10s.; twice a week for each pan, £3; thrice a week for each pan, £4 10s. Such charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this By-law.

5. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

This By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Colac this 19th day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1906*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE AUSTRALASIAN JAM CO. PROPY. LTD., CHAPEL-STREET, SOUTH YARRA,

for a period of six weeks from the 7th January, 1907, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five hundred females or more than twenty boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five hundred females and twenty boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall be allowed to use or carry any fire-arms, or shoot or otherwise destroy any game within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any enclosure or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or *fêtes*, nor bring therein any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered, on demand, to any gatekeeper or other person authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the tickets.

11. Any person being drunk and disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.

12. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for *fêtes*, races, or sports shall be as follow:—

For the admission of every adult to the Reserve, excepting the grand-stand enclosure and saddling paddock, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding	s. d. ... .. 1 0
