Meat Supervision Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF CARCASSES OR MEAT IN THE WARRNAMBOOL MEAT AREA.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts and of all other powers it enabling in that behalf, the Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

Carcasses or meat, whether fresh, frozen, dried, preserved, or chilled, shall be branded with a brand which, in the case of the whole of the animal having been examined prior to the branding, shall be in the form of a circle, and, in the case of only a part of the animal having been examined prior to the branding, shall be in the form of a triangle, the circle having a diameter of one inch and a half, and the triangle having sides each one inch and a quarter long, the outline of the circle and that of the triangle being broken at fifteen places evenly distributed and enclosing Roman capital letters not less than three-sixteenths of an inch in height, and arranged in two parallel lines, the first or the first two letters forming the upper line, and the rest forming the lower line,

the letters being as follows, and in each case in the order hereunder given, viz. :—

In the case of the carcass or meat being branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector of the Council, of—

- The Town of Warrnambool—W.L.T.C.
- The Shire of Warrnambool—W.S.C.

In the case of the carcass or meat being branded under direction of the Board, the letters on the brand shall be BPH similarly arranged.

The branding shall leave a distinctly seared and legible mark on the carcass or meat, showing the circle or the triangle, as the case may be, and the letters.

The brand shall be applied to the following parts, viz. :—

- A. In the case of beef, on the upper surface of the tongue and on each side of the carcass—
 - (1) On the outside of the buttock;
 - (2) On the flank;
 - (3) On the outside of the ribs; and
 - (4) On the inside of the ribs near the backbone.
- B. In the case of veal if the carcass has been flayed then on each side of the carcass—
 - (1) On the outside of the buttock;
 - (2) On the flank; and
 - (3) On the outside of the ribs or on the inside of the ribs near the backbone.
- C. In the case of mutton and lamb—on the shoulders and legs.
- D. In the case of pork—on each side of the carcass, on the cheek, the hand, the loin, and the leg.
- E. In the case of a non-flayed carcass—on the breast and either on the leg or on the inner aspect of the flank.

THREE KINGS ISLANDS.—NON-EXISTENCE OF CHARTED ISLETS, ETC.

CAPTAIN BOLLONS, of the Government steamer *Hinemoa*, reports that the undermentioned islands shown on the Admiralty Chart No. 1512 do not exist:—

1. The island north of Princes Islets: The *Hinemoa* steamed over the charted position of this island, and there is nothing north of the line of S. 60 deg. W. between the West King (600-foot island) and the continuous line of small (Princes) islets.

2. The island shown next north-east of West Island (350 feet): There is a passage a quarter of a mile wide between West Island and the first Princes Islet.

3. The islet and rocks on north side of Tasman Bay: The north point of this bay is a high bluff, with nothing off it, nor is there any outlier between Tasman and S.E. bays. The bottom between the different islands, and for a distance of a mile outside of them, is composed of rock, small coral, and small patches of coral sand. There is a smooth-water anchorage in strong N.E. weather on the S.W. side of the Great Island in from 25 to 28 fathoms. It is necessary to have a stout buoy-rope, as the bottom is very foul.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the Water Act 1905 it is among other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alteration or addition he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or with or without any conditions, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly; And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks;

- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed;
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the Waterworks District of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality, the council whereof, or the councillors of any riding whereof, were applicants for the construction of such waterworks;
- (d) Subject to the provisions of this Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the Waterworks District, as the case may be;
- (e) Assign a corporate name to the Waterwork Trust;
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case the Governor in Council may think fit.

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such council to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with one or more persons not being members of such council, to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the shire of Traralgon, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Traralgon with water; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) That the councillors for the municipal district of the shire of Traralgon for the time being, and one other person shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

No person shall land on any dock, pier, wharf, or any place whatsoever in Victoria any diseased stalks or portions of stalks, diseased bananas, or bananas suspected to contain disease, or insects, and such diseased stalks or portions of stalks, diseased bananas, or bananas suspected to contain disease or insects shall be destroyed by fire or removed from the State of Victoria.

3. No person shall remove any bananas which have been permitted landing from the importing vessel until such have been further examined in an area, enclosure, or building approved by the inspector.

4. No person shall remove any bananas or any portion of such bananas from any dock, pier, wharf, or any place whatsoever whereon bananas are awaiting certification unless and until written permission so to do shall have been obtained from the inspector.

5. No person shall discharge bananas from any vessel during the hours of darkness except under special permit from the Minister of Agriculture.

6. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of or who shall fail to comply with these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of for the first offence not exceeding One pound and for any subsequent offence not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET GROUND AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST, KNOWN AS THE "EASTERN OVAL."

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballarat East, in respect of the reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of public recreation in the Town of Ballarat East, known as the "Eastern Oval," it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Cricket Ground and for other purposes of public recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Town of Ballarat East.

And whereas by Section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, it is enacted that where, under the provision of any Act relating to Crown Lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown Lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in Section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in Trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in Sub-section 1 of Section 200, *Land Act 1901*.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, and the Council of the Town of Ballarat East, do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of public recreation in the Town of Ballarat East, known as the "Eastern Oval" :-

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows :-
 - 1st Division—The cricket and football playing ground.
 - 2nd Division—The grand stands and enclosure connected therewith.
 - 3rd Division—The bowling green and enclosure connected therewith.
 - 4th Division—The lawn tennis court and enclosure connected therewith.
 - 5th Division—The cottages of the caretakers.
 - 6th Division—The remainder of the reserve.
2. No person shall enter the first, second, third, fourth or fifth division of the reserve, except on production of a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.
3. The sixth division of the reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences or trees in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees or seats in the reserve, or roll or throw sticks, stones or other missiles therein, nor remove therefrom any soil or gravel.
6. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect therein any tent, booth or other structure without the permission in writing, of the Council, first obtained.
7. No person shall bring into the reserve any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such cart or other vehicle.
8. Every person paying for admission to the second and sixth divisions of the reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of tickets, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
9. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings, or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof :-
 - (a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

- (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the reserve, and not producing upon demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission has been lost.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Council.

11. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures in the reserve for the occasion of any cricket or football match, musical performances, sports or shows, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £10, which the Council may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and may, if any loss or damage have occurred, deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations, and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

13. All dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

14. No person, club, or association shall enter or use the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th divisions of the reserve for any physical recreation, shows, or musical performances, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Second and Sixth Divisions of the reserve on such occasions as the reserve may be set apart for fetes, cricket or football matches, sports, shows, musical performances, or other amusements, shall be as follows :-

- (a) For admission of each person to the Second Division, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Three shillings.
- (b) For admission of each person to the Sixth Division, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement which stipulates that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

21. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

22. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 21 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

24. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indented on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

- Part 1, Subdivision 10—Undermining streets.
- Part 1, Subdivision 11—Miscellaneous.
- Part 2—Waterworks, drains, &c.
- Part 4, Subdivision 1—Public Libraries and Museums.
- Part 4, Subdivision 2—Public Gardens.
- Part 5—Regulation, &c., of buildings.
- Part 5, Subdivision 2—Ruinous or dangerous buildings, &c.
- Part 6—Buildings, &c., for public meetings, &c.
- Part 7—Fire prevention. Subdivision 1—Foul chimneys.
- Part 7, Subdivision 2—Deposit, &c., of inflammable materials, &c.
- Part 8—Nuisances, &c. Subdivision 1—Nuisances of various kinds (a) goats; (b) swine; (c) night-soil. Subdivision 2—Private slaughter houses.
- Part 9—Miscellaneous matters.
- Part 10—Carriage of persons and goods.
- Part 10, Subdivision 1—Passenger vehicles.
- Part 10, Subdivision 2—Carts and carter.
- Part 10, Subdivision 3—Boats and boatmen.
- Part 11—Regulation of proceedings of council, officers, &c.

BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

BY-LAW NO. 25.

BY-LAW of the Borough of Eaglehawk, made under sub-sections 7, 10, 17, 18, 22, 24, 25, 26, 27 of section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 25.

- 7. For preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the municipality, or under the control and management of the Council, preventing damage to such building, or to the furniture or fittings thereof; and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.
- 10. For suppressing nuisances.
- 17. Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases.
- 18. Prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths.
- 22. Regulating traffic and processions.
- 24. Regulating or prohibiting the use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged edges.

25. Prohibiting the throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway of any orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter.

26. Regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under control or management of the Council thereof.

27. Prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk order as follows:—

7. *Preserving Order in Municipal Buildings.*—No person shall, in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council, and whether at any meeting or gathering held therein or not—

- (a) Behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner; or
- (b) Deface the walls by writing thereon, or otherwise injure or damage the said building or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

Preserving Order at Meetings.—No person shall, at any meeting or gathering held in any such building—

- (a) Stand upon any chair or seat, or sit upon any window sill, dado, cornice, balcony, railings, or staircase railing; or
- (b) Disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering;
- (c) Curse or swear or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language; or
- (d) Conduct himself in an insulting or riotous manner; or
- (e) Be drunk; or
- (f) Take part in any disturbance or disorder; or
- (g) Cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such building, or in the corridors, aisles, or passages within the same, or spit or expectorate.

10. *Placing Refuse in Street.*—No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle into any street or channel any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or, being a hawker of rabbits, fish, or vegetables, or a news-vendor or other street vendor, or any other person not being a street trader, throw down and leave in any street any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other substance intended, or apparently intended, for the purpose of advertising.

No person shall throw down or leave in any street any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any bill-posting station.

Bottles, Broken Glass, &c.—No person shall wilfully throw down, place, or leave any bottle or broken glass or other sharp substance on or in any street or channel in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to passengers or animals or damage to property.

18. *Spitting.*—No person shall spit or expectorate upon the footpath of any street.

22. *Definition of Street.*—The word "street," wherever herein used, shall mean and include any highway, public bridge, road, lane, footway, square, place, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Definition of "Motor Car" and "Motor Cycle."—The words "motor car" and "motor cycle" shall, whenever occurring in this By-law, mean and include locomotive wheeled vehicles, propelled or driven, or the motive power for which shall be by means of petrol, steam, or other vapour, or by electricity; and the word "motor cycle" shall mean any bicycle or tricycle driven or impelled by the like means.

Vehicles to be Lighted at Night.—No person shall, after sunset and before sunrise, drive or permit or allow to be driven or impelled any wheeled vehicle of any description whatever (not being a motor car), whether drawn or impelled by himself or drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, whether licensed or not, upon or along any street being a thoroughfare, without carrying in front thereon a good serviceable and effectual lamp, with a light burning therein sufficiently bright to be seen at a distance of fifty yards therefrom, securely fixed to the off side of such vehicle.

Processions.—No procession of persons, animals, or vehicles of any description shall march, parade, or pass along any of the streets of the Borough of Eaglehawk for other than funeral purposes, unless the persons or some one or more on their behalf organizing or intending to take part in such procession or conducting the same shall have previously obtained the written consent of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, of the said Borough, and then only by the route and during the hours specified in such written consent, nor unless the recipient thereof shall have given 24 hours' written notice

of the time, place, and route intended, with other particulars of such consent, to the officer for the time being in charge of the police of the said Borough.

Rule of the Road.—Every person driving any animal or vehicle whatever, or riding any animal, shall keep to the left or near side of the carriage way of the street, and when passing any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction shall go or pass on the right or off side of such other vehicle or animal, and shall allow any person desirous so to do to pass on the right or off side; save and except that in passing tram-cars travelling in the same direction, drivers, riders, and propellers of such vehicles and foot passengers shall pass such tram-cars on the left side.

No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal on the right-hand or wrong side of the road without justifiable cause, and every person driving any vehicle or riding any animal shall keep as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side, so as to permit other persons going in the same direction to pass freely on the right-hand or off side.

Vehicles Obstructing a Street.—No person shall leave any cart or other vehicle between the hours of sunset and sunrise in or on any street being a thoroughfare without any horse or other animal being harnessed thereto, unless in consequence of some unavoidable accident having occurred.

Vehicles not to be left Unattended.—No driver of any vehicle shall be away from his horse or cattle, so as to be unable to have full control of it or them, unless the horse or other animal be securely tied or one of the wheels of such vehicle be securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof; and no such vehicle or horse or cattle shall be tied to any tree guard or tree planted for ornamental purposes.

Rule of the Footpath.—Persons walking along the footpath or any street shall, unless for reasonable cause or with reasonable excuse, keep on their respective right-hand sides of the path, so as to pass other persons meeting on the left-hand side.

Loitering Prohibited.—No person or persons shall wilfully obstruct the carriage-way or footway of any street by standing or loitering thereon after having been required by any member of the police force, or by any officer of the Council, specially authorized in that behalf, to discontinue such standing or loitering.

MOTOR CARS, CYCLES, ETC.

No person shall drive or impel any motor car or motor cycle upon, along, or across any footpath, save across any such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon, for the purpose of entering or leaving such premises.

Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car or motor cycle or velocipede shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way of the street, and whenever overtaking any other vehicle (save only a tram-car going in the same direction), or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the carriage-way, such person shall keep to the off or right side thereof (except in the case of tram-cars travelling in the same direction, which he shall keep on the left side thereof); and such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach.

Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car or motor cycle during the times between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted, so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

In every case where a person driving or riding or impelling any motor car or motor cycle or velocipede meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by any horse or other beast of burden, and such horse or other beast of burden may on such meeting, or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding, driving, or impelling such motor car or motor cycle shall dismount or stop as speedily as possible, and shall assist to prevent an accident, and shall continue dismounted or stopped so long as may be reasonably necessary. And in the event of any accident shall, upon request by police officer or officer of the Council, give his true name and address, and also the true name and address of the owner of the motor car or motor cycle, as the case may be.

24. Barbed Wire.—No person shall place or use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street any wire with spikes or jagged projections unless the same be placed not less than four inches from the outside of the posts of such fence or erection, and no such wire shall be placed or used so that the clothing of any person passing along such street is liable to be torn thereby.

25. Orange Peel, &c.—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public highway within the Borough of Eaglehawk any orange or banana peel or vegetable matter.

PAINTING, STENCILING, ETC.

26. No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, or street, or road vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council thereof.

27. No Wandering Cattle Allowed.—No person, being the owner, hirer, drover, shepherd, or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle, shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

Penalty: Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, and of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

- (a) Coal in any quantity; or
(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers from any vehicle, and every person who conveys in any vehicle for delivery to a purchaser, coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle, shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles, or parcelled up, covered or enclosed, and kept separate and apart in such vehicle. And every such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover or enclosure shall be labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure contains.

3. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by Clause 7 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

4. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

5. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than three-quarters of a mile.

6. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—

COAL AND FIREWOOD ACT 1904.

Delivery Ticket for Firewood sold by measure and not by weight.

Note.—Firewood must be sold by weight except when sold in a quantity exceeding ten cubic feet, in which event it may be sold either by weight or by measure at the option of the purchaser.

For weighing or re-weighing coal or firewood in any quantity or quantities on any weighing instrument other than a weighbridge— For every 5 cwt. or for a less quantity ... 3d.

9. If any person be guilty of any offence or misfeasance, or wilful act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
