## PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN, SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 20th June next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

## CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

## QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

## COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

## PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils; and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

## TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors' Board as to his qualifications.

## REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

## SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

## BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not exceeding £160 per annum.

## Health Act 1890.

## SHIRE OF KOWREE.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of any other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Kowree, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of Former By-laws.*—All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. *Date of Operation.*—This By-law shall come into operation and full force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. *Area Affected.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the parish of Goroke contained within a circle having a radius of sixty-five chains, and its centre at the present site of the Goroke Post Office.

4. *Erection of Closets.*—Every occupier of any house in connexion with which there is no properly-constructed closet must have one such erected with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pans, and the space under the seat suitably prepared, and shall permit such closet to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the same to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. *Abolition of Present Methods.*—The present methods for the reception and disposal of night-soil are hereby abolished.

6. *Initiation of Double-pan System.*—Instead of the said present methods every closet shall be furnished forthwith with a double-pan service.

7. *Provision of Pans.*—The pans for such service shall be supplied by the Council.

8. *Deodorization of Night-soil.*—Every occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of any house shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a sufficient supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil to be covered immediately on deposit thereof in the pan with sufficient of such material to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. *Removal of Pans.*—The Council shall, at such times or intervals as it shall from time to time determine, cause the pan with the contents thereof to be removed in the day-time.

10. *Cleaning Pans.*—Before leaving such pan the Council shall cause the same to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

11. *Person Authorized to Remove Night-soil.*—No person, unless duly authorized by the Council, shall be allowed to remove any night-soil, nor shall the occupier of any house contract with any person whatsoever for the removal of night-soil.

12. *Charge for the Supply and Removal of Pans, &c.*—The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions. Such charge shall be paid in advance.

13. *Penalties.*—If any person or the Council commits a breach of this By-law, he or it shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within that portion of the North and West Ridings of the shire as is bounded on the north by the Donald-road, Brim-road, Bowman-street, and the Creek-road to its junction with the Yarriambiack Creek and a line at right angles to such Creek-road to a point 5 chains west of the Yarriambiack Creek; on the south by Gardiner-street and a line 2 chains south of Wood-street, continued to a point 5 chains west of Yarriambiack Creek; on the east by the eastern boundary of the township of Warracknabeal; and on the west by a line running parallel with the Yarriambiack Creek at a distance of 3 chains to the west of same.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan of such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time and the other pan left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

## BY-LAW NO. 117.

A By-law for requiring the occupiers of houses or premises within the City of Melbourne to provide boxes or other specified receptacles for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1866* (and of every other power enabling it in that behalf), the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. The occupier of any house or premises within the said city shall, when so required by notice in writing, signed by an Inspector of such Council, provide and keep in such house or on such premises a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified, or so many such receptacles as may be necessary for the deposit of all the house and yard refuse from such premises, and shall cause all such refuse to be placed in such receptacles with the least possible delay and kept therein under cover as hereinafter provided until such refuse is removed from such house or premises.

2. Every such receptacle must be of a size not exceeding four cubic feet in content, and must be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and be fitted with a properly constructed metal cover or lid, and with handles for convenience of moving and emptying same.

3. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and not less than 5s.

*Sunken Wrecks of "Norma" and "Jessie Darling."*

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 1 of 1907, masters of vessels, pilots, and others are hereby informed that the sunken wrecks above mentioned are lying in a position with the Lighthouse on Wonga Shoal bearing east, distant one and a half miles, and the structure of the Old Lighthouse with fixed light bearing N.E., distant three miles approximately.

Until the obstructions are removed, or further notice is given, the s.s. *Argyle* will be moored to mark the danger S.S.W. 600ft. from the wreck, and will show the following signals:—

*By Day.*—Three Balls on a yard 20ft. above the sea, two placed vertically at one end, and one at the other, the Single Ball being on the side nearest the wreck.

*By Night.*—Three White Lights similarly arranged, but not the ordinary riding light.

In addition to the wreck-marking vessel mentioned above, a large conical-shaped Buoy painted green, with the word "Wreck" in white letters, from which is exhibited a green occulting light, will be moored close to the south side of the above-mentioned wrecks.

Both the marks mentioned should be given a wide berth by vessels navigating the vicinity.

KRAYANG ESTATE.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown includes supplies for s.s. Lady Loch and Albert and vessels in the Naval Service which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office, and the Inebriates Retreat at Lara.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogshheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's



credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

21. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

22. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 21 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

24. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

 At a Special General Meeting of Contributors held at the Council Chambers, Sale, on 23rd April, 1907, the following By-law was carried and confirmed at a Special General Meeting held for that purpose on 8th May, 1907: By-laws made under the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, for conducting elections.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, the corporation known as the Gippsland Hospital orders as follows:—  
 1st. The undermentioned portions of By-laws of the Gippsland Hospital, published in the *Government Gazette* of 8th of June, 1894, and 3rd of May, 1895, are hereby repealed:—In section 6 all words after annually; the whole of sections 11, 22, 23, 24.

2. An election of Members of Committee and of Honorary Medical Officers in terms of *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890* shall be held on the last Thursday in July of each year, at such time and place as the Committee for the time being shall appoint, shall be conducted by a Returning Officer appointed by said Committee, and may be adjourned should necessity arise to a date to be fixed by the Returning Officer, not exceeding seven days from the day appointed in the first instance.

3. Candidates for the office of Member of Committee shall be qualified as "contributors" in terms of *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

4. Such candidate shall be nominated by delivering to the Secretary of the Hospital, not less than seven days before date of election, a nomination paper signed by not less than five contributors qualified to vote at such election, and also by the candidate in token of his acceptance of such nomination.

5. A list of all nominations shall be published locally, not less than three days prior to the day of election, and shall be kept posted in the Secretary's office for inspection.

6. If the number of candidates nominated does not exceed the number of members to be returned such candidates shall be declared elected by the Chairman at the annual meeting.

7. If the number of candidates nominated exceeds the number of members to be returned the Returning Officer shall take a poll of contributors, as before provided.

8. Contributors of One pound shall be entitled to one vote; of Three pounds, to two votes; of Five pounds or over, to three votes at all meetings of contributors, and elections held within twelve months of the dates on which such contributions were paid. Payment must be made before the day on which any such meeting or any election is held to qualify the contributor to vote thereat.

9. The word "nominated" shall henceforth be substituted for the words "Honorary Life" wherever such occur in the By-laws referred to herein.

10. Life Governors and Nominated Governors shall be entitled to one vote at meetings of contributors, and at elections.

11. At all contested elections the Secretary of the Hospital shall lay before the Returning Officer an alphabetical list, hereinafter called the Voters' List, of the names of all contributors qualified to vote at such election, showing the number of votes to which each such contributor is entitled.

12. Printed ballot-papers showing the names of all candidates nominated shall be provided, and be initiated by the Returning Officer before issue to the voter.

13. The Returning Officer shall, on demand, issue to each voter one or more ballot-papers according to the number of votes opposite such voter's name on the voters' list, and shall check off on such list the name of each voter who has voted; and shall also enter thereon the number of ballot-papers issued to each voter.

14. Each voter is to record his vote or votes by striking out the names on the ballot-paper of the candidates for whom he does not desire to vote; he shall vote for the number of candidates to be elected. Any ballot-paper which is found not to comply with this provision will be treated as informal and void. The ballot-paper is to be dropped by the voter into the ballot-box.

15. In making up the poll the Returning Officer shall take special care to prevent the vote recorded by any voter from becoming known improperly.

*Regulations for the Control of Motor Vehicle Traffic along St. Kilda-road.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Offences Act 1890*, and by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the Regulation following:—

Every driver of a motor vehicle whilst driving such vehicle along the St. Kilda-road shall observe the following route, that is to say, he shall keep such vehicle to that portion of the carriage-way which lies within thirty feet of the kerb alignment of the footpath on the near or left-hand side of the said road.

This Regulation shall not apply to vehicles which are being driven from the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way aforesaid by the most direct route to some premises on the off or right-hand side of the said road.

The expression "Motor Vehicle" in these Regulations shall mean and include any vehicle propelled by mechanical power.
