DEFINITION OF THE TERM "NATIVE."

THE following despatch from His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO DEFINE THE MEANING OF THE TERM "NATIVE."

(U.S.) EVERARD IM THURN.

Necessity for Definition.

1. Whereas it is expedient to define the meaning of the term "native" as employed in the Regulations Proclamations and Notifications that have been and may be issued by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific in virtue of the powers vested in him by the Pacific Order in Council 1893.

Definition of Term.

2. The term "native" shall unless otherwise defined mean and include in its reference—

Aborigines.

(1) Any aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific Ocean.

Half-castes.

(2) Any person of mixed European and aboriginal native descent who shall not have been registered by a Deputy Commissioner or whose registration shall have been cancelled in the manner provided in section three hereof.

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Registration.

3. On personal application being made in that behalf to a Deputy Commissioner for the Western Pacific by any person of mixed European and native descent or on the application of the European parent or guardian of the person concerned, such Deputy Commissioner shall unless he is satisfied that the applicant or the person on whose behalf application is made has contracted or has not abandoned native habits of life and provided always that such applicant speaks one European language, register such person as being of status equivalent to Europeans; and such registration shall be liable to cancellation by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific on the representation of a Deputy Commissioner that the person so registered has abandoned European for native habits of life.

Half-castes in Tonga.

4. Provided that in the Kingdom of Tonga registration of persons of mixed European and native descent by the Consul of a European Power shall be regarded as equivalent to registration by a Deputy Commissioner under section three above.

New Hebrides Exempt.

5. This Regulation shall not apply to the New Hebrides.

Short Title.

6. This Regulation may be cited as "The Definition (Native) Regulation 1907."

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN, SURVEY BRANCH.

APPPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 20th June next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors' Board as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupillage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupillage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary not exceeding £160 per annum.

GEOLOGICAL SURVEY EXAMINATION.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1125) it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria from time to time make any regulations as to the colouring of any poisons or as to the sale or custody of the same or otherwise as to carrying into effect the objects of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to powers conferred by the *Poisons Acts*, doth by this Order make the following additional Regulations, which have been duly recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, and which are to be read in conjunction with the Regulations approved on the 15th October, 1877, viz.:

9. All liniments embrocations lotions and liquid disinfectants consisting of or containing poison dispensed solid or delivered by any person shall be delivered in bottles rendered distinguishable by touch from ordinary medicine bottles and there shall also be affixed to each bottle (in addition to the particulars required by the *Poisons Acts*) a label giving notice that the contents of the bottle are not to be taken internally.
10. The following poisons namely:—Arsenic strychnine tartar emetic and corrosive sublimate (except when sold by wholesale dealers in the ordinary course of wholesale dealing when an order in writing signed by the purchaser has been given for the supply of the same) shall be delivered (whether in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) in bottles rendered distinguishable by touch and labelled as required by Regulation 9.
11. When any drug consisting of or containing any poison is delivered (whether in the pursuance of a sale or otherwise) in a quantity exceeding a single dose the bottle or other vessel wrapper or cover box or case immediately containing such drug shall be labelled distinctly with the name of such drug and on such label there shall be legibly written or printed the word "CAUTION" and the amount of the dose to be taken.
12. Every person who is required by the *Poisons Acts* to keep a book relating to or make an entry in a book showing the sale of poison or of any material or article consisting of or containing any poison shall on demand at any time by a member of the police force produce to such member of the police force and permit him to inspect all books and entries required by the *Poisons Acts* 1890 and 1905 and in default thereof shall be liable on conviction by a Court of Petty Sessions to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1125) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the said Act; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time declare that any other article specified

in such proclamation shall be deemed a poison within the meaning of the aforesaid Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare that the undermentioned articles shall be deemed to be poisons within the meaning of the *Poisons Act 1890* aforesaid, viz.:—

1. Heroin and its salts.
2. Cocaine and its salts and all solutions and preparations.
3. Mercuric Iodide.
4. Mercuric Sulphocyanide.
5. Mercurous Iodide.
6. Strophanthus and its preparations.
7. Croton Oil.
8. Lysol.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN AND GENERAL RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST, KNOWN AS "DUNN'S RESERVE."

THE Council of the Town of Ballarat East, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 23rd June, 1890, and 2nd March, 1891, respectively, as sites for a Public Garden and for General Recreation in the town of Ballarat East, known as "Dunn's Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the power conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:-

REGULATIONS.

The Reserve shall be divided as follows:-

- 1st Division—The bowling green and pavilion connected therewith.
- 2nd Division—The croquet lawn and pavilion connected therewith.
- 3rd Division—the cottage of the caretaker.
- 4th Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter the first, second, or third division of the Reserve except on production of a ticket duly authorizing him on that behalf.
3. The fourth division of the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats in the Reserve, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles therein, or remove therefrom any soil or gravel.
6. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any tent, booth, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle except on production of a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such cart or other vehicle.
8. Every person paying for admission to the first, second, or fourth divisions of the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of tickets, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
9. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may

have purchased or shall be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing grounds during a bowling or croquet match, or during practice at bowling or croquet, or when crossing or trespassing upon the grounds would be injurious to them as bowling and croquet grounds.
- (d) Being found in any part of the Reserve and not producing upon demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any one deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission has been lost.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.
10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Council.
11. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.
12. All persons renting or hiring any stands, buildings, erections, or enclosures in the Reserve for the occasion of any physical recreation shows or musical performances shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.
13. All dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
14. No person, club, or association shall enter or use the first, second, or fourth division of the Reserve for any physical recreation, shows, or musical performances without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the first, second, and fourth divisions of the Reserve on such occasions as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, bowling or croquet matches, sports, shows, musical performances, or other amusements shall be as follows:—
 - (a) For admission of each person to the first and second divisions, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Three shillings.
 - (b) For admission of each person to the fourth division, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit or pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Burials of deceased persons from sub-districts north of the Yarra will take place at the Fawkner Cemetery, and those from sub-districts south of the Yarra at the Springvale Necropolis respectively.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either funerals or removals, but if both services be included in one tender it may, if advisable, be accepted for one service only.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, and all charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £5 for burials and £5 for removals (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Security will be required, in the sum of £25 for burials, and £25 for removals, either in cash, Victorian Government debentures, Bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the necropolis, or to the cemetery as the case may be, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time.

4. Coffins for funerals must be sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. In the event of a body being decomposed, or whenever it may be considered necessary by the member of the Police Force issuing the order for the burial, a coffin must be supplied sufficiently large to leave at least 2 inches between the body and the sides and top and bottom of the coffin, and this space must be filled up round the body with pine or phenyle sawdust by the contractor at his own expense; and in the event of any neglect in so providing or filling up the coffin the contractor will be dealt with as provided in Condition 13. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

5. Bodies of deceased persons must be conveyed to the Fawkner Cemetery for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra.

6. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

7. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

8. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the contractor.

9. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be

allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

10. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed before removal in shell coffins securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles.

11. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the *post-mortem* examination.

12. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

13. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.
