REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of One thouproving public parks and gardens under the control of borough
councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the
treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden
having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such
body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of
roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may
approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1906, and
31st December, 1906, out of funds locally contributed, provided
such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or
before the 1st March, 1907. Every statement of particulars of
claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all
moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden
from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or

garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1906, and 31st December, 1906; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1906.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1906 (cite Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced provata.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park or Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

No. 3. The word "Officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer of the Trust duly taken to mean an officer of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Rochester Waterworks Trust.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or ærated-water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen

5. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum

of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of

a rood.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where water is laid on.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice in writing to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless

the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer, after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a one-inch service pipe may be allowed.

13. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply.

14. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12 and 13 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Threepence for each One hundred (100) gallons.

16. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is, or are, hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

18. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1907, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.
