PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1906, and 31st December, 1906, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st March, 1907. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or

garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1906, and 31st December, 1906; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1906.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1906 (*vide* Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park or Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY
COMMISSION.

By-law No. 5, made under section 306 of the *Water Act* 1905, for the appointment of a time and place for the meetings of the Commission and the management and conduct of business thereat.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "The Commission"), in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Commission.

2. The Commission shall hold ordinary meetings for the transaction of general business at the office of the Commission on each Monday at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, and in case of Monday being a public holiday then at the same hour on the next following day which is not a public holiday, and until the time of meeting is changed and notice of such change is given to the Commissioners by the secretary the Commissioners shall attend such ordinary meetings without notice.

3. The Commission may hold special meetings, and the Chairman or any two of the Commissioners may call a special meeting. No such meeting shall be held unless 24 hours' notice at least be given; such notice shall be in writing, and shall specify the time of meeting and the object thereof, and shall be delivered or sent by the post by the Secretary to each Commissioner. No business shall be transacted at such meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

4. The Commissioners present at any meeting may from time to time adjourn such meeting. If at any meeting there is not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for such meeting the number of Commissioners authorized by the said *Water Act* 1905, to exercise the powers vested in the Commission, the Commissioner present, or the Secretary if no Commissioner be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than 7 days from the date of such adjournment; except when any meeting is adjourned to a subsequent hour on the same day the Secretary shall forthwith deliver or send by the post to each Commissioner notice in writing of such adjourned meeting, and of the time to which such meeting has been adjourned.

5. The Commission shall cause minutes of all the proceedings at each meeting of the Commission, together with the names of the Commissioners present, to be duly entered from time to time in a book to be provided for the purpose, which shall be kept by the Secretary under the superintendence of the Commission. Such minutes shall record the business definitely transacted and decisions arrived at, but not the discussions leading thereto. Each resolution shall be considered to have been unanimously adopted unless the dissent of a Commissioner be recorded at such Commissioner's request.

6. At every ordinary meeting of the Commission the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding ordinary or special meeting or meetings, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes shall, after confirmation by the Commission, be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which such minutes are read.

7. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as set out in the agenda paper prepared by the Secretary, and if no agenda paper is prepared in such order as the Commission may at each meeting decide.

8. All the plans and specifications for any work shall be laid before the Commission at least 7 days before being considered and ordered upon.

9. The common seal of the Commission shall be kept in a box having three locks, of two of which locks each Commissioner shall have keys, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless two Commissioners be present and attest the same by their signatures.

10. Whenever the word Secretary is used it shall include any person appointed by the Commission to act as secretary.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905 the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust:—

- I. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- II. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.
- III. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate be less than Ten shillings.
- IV. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year or a quantity which at the price mentioned would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the occupier or owner would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1907. And such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW for the use of water for irrigation and garden purposes made by the Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905.

The following hours are set apart for the use of water for irrigation and garden purposes by the occupiers of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust:—

- No. 1. In that portion of Rochester Township lying west of the course of the Campaspe River, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Eight a.m. and between the hours of Seven p.m. and Eight p.m. In that portion of the said township lying east of the course of the Campaspe River, between the hours of Six a.m. and Eight a.m. and between the hours of Six p.m. and Eight p.m. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

No. 2. The officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose shall have power, between Ten a.m. and Four p.m., to enter any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of water, and if such officer at any time be refused admission into such house, dwelling, or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house of dwelling.

No. 3. The word "Officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Rochester Waterworks Trust.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law, viz.:—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1907. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable, in advance, in four equal instalments on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated-water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where water is laid on.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice in writing to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless

the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer, after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a one-inch service pipe may be allowed.

13. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply.

14. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12 and 13 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Threepence for each One hundred (100) gallons.

16. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is, or are, hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

18. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1907, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or with or without any conditions, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions he may by Order in Council constitute a waterworks trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks, and the constitution of a waterworks trust for the purpose, shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks:
- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed:
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the waterworks district of the waterworks trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality, the council whereof or the councillors of any riding whereof were applicants for the construction of such waterworks:
- (d) Subject to the provisions of this Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several Councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the waterworks district, as the case may be:
- (e) Assign or corporate name to the waterworks trust:
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case the Governor in Council may think fit.

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such riding or ridings to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be commissioners of the waterworks trust of such waterworks district.
