MURDER OF MAN AT MODERN CHAMBERS, COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE.

REWARD INCREASED TO ONE THOUSAND POUNDS.

WHEREAS at about Five p.m. on Friday, 7th June, 1907, a man named Bernard Bauer was found lying on the floor of his office at the Modern Chambers, Collins-street, Melbourne, suffering from the effects of wounds caused by violent blows on the head which had been inflicted some minutes previously, and from which the said Bernard Bauer died about three hours later: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One thousand pounds will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who caused the above-mentioned fatal injuries. No portion of the above-mentioned reward will be paid to any member of the Police Force.

DEFINITION OF MOUTH OF MOYNE RIVER; ALSO PROHIBITION OF NETTING, ETC.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is intended, on the expiration of one month from the date hereof, to move His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to make a Proclamation defining the mouth of the Moyne River to be an imaginary line running N. 83 deg. W. from the lamp-post near the outer extremity of the eastern training wall to the opposite or western training wall; and also prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, within the waters outside the Moyne River enclosed by the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the lamp-post at the outer end of the eastern training wall; and thence along a line N. 83 deg. W. to the outer end of the western training wall; thence N. 37 deg. E. to the black nun buoy moored about 500 yards outside the mouth of the Moyne River; thence S. 12 deg. E. to the lighthouse on Griffith Island; thence along high-water mark in a generally westerly direction along the northern shore of Griffith Island to the eastern training wall of the Moyne River; thence along the south-eastern side of such training wall to the starting point.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulation, viz.:—Clauses 1, 2, and 3 of the Consequential Alterations in Regulation C VIII. made by the Dental Board on the 22nd day of July, 1904, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th day of August, 1904, are hereby repealed, and the following Clauses are substituted in lieu thereof, viz.:—

Students who have, prior to the 1st day of March, 1904, completed their second year need not, on proceeding to their third year, attend lectures and pass in *Materia Medica and Therapeutics*, but will be required, in addition to the course otherwise prescribed for the third year, to attend lectures and pass the examination in *Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative*, as now prescribed for the second year. Such students may, during their third year, attend lectures and pass in the course of *Practical Metallurgy* as now prescribed for the second year, or, on proceeding to their fourth year, will be required to attend lectures and pass that subject in addition to the course prescribed for the fourth year.

Students who have, prior to the first day of March, 1904, completed their third year, will not be required to attend lectures and pass in *Medicine*, but will be required, in addition to the course otherwise prescribed for the fourth year, to attend lectures and pass both in *Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative*, and in *Practical Metallurgy*, as now prescribed for the second year.

This Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW
No. 11.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authority conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, and whose waterworks district has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an urban district, make the by-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound five shillings.
- (b) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this by-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied from standpipes shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) On buildings in course of erection when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1907.

- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing By-law, No. 11, was made and adopted on the 22nd day of June, 1907, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in our presence—

WHEREAS by section 95 of the *Water Act 1905* it is enacted that where in any Order in Council, whether made before or after the passing of the said Act, it has not been provided that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust are to be elected by the ratepayers, the Governor in Council, upon the petition of a majority of the ratepayers, may, if he thinks fit, declare that the Commissioners shall, from a date to be named in such Order, cease to be such Commissioners, and shall, from such day, be succeeded by Commissioners elected by the ratepayers.

And whereas it is further provided by the aforesaid section 95 that the Governor in Council may, by the same or any subsequent Order, direct that any number of Commissioners stated in such Order, shall within a time specified in such Order, and thereafter from time to time be elected in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations made by the Governor in Council.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 15th March, 1892, a certain Waterworks Trust, known as the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and it was ordered and provided that the Councillors for the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Romsey and three other persons should be the Commissioners of the said Trust.

And whereas a petition has been signed by a majority of the ratepayers within the waterworks district of the said Trust praying that the Municipal Councillors for the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Romsey and the three other persons, appointed Commissioners of the said Trust, shall cease to hold office as such Commissioners, and that they be succeeded by Commissioners to be elected by the ratepayers within the waterworks district of the said Trust.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the said *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust, by virtue of their office as Municipal Councillors for the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Romsey and the three persons appointed Commissioners of such Trust, shall, after the 27th day of August, 1907, cease to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall, after such day, be succeeded by six Commissioners, to be elected for such Trust on the 28th day of August, 1907, in the manner prescribed by regulations made for that purpose, and also for the purpose of conducting subsequent elections.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**RIDDELL'S CREEK WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COM-
MISSIONERS.**

WHEREAS by Division 3 of Part III. of the *Water Act 1905* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust," or "the said Trust" shall mean the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations, within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 28th day of August, 1907, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 28th day of August in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 96 of the *Water Act 1905* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 30th day of July, 1907, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force, and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 96 of the *Water Act 1905*, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Romsey included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the township of Riddell, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the *Water Act 1905* in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule.—Notice of Poll.—Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the township of Riddell, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the township of Riddell a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

NIGHT SCHOOLS.

1. Night schools will be established by the Minister as necessity may arise.
2. All night schools must be held in State school buildings, but they will not necessarily be conducted by the teacher of the day school held in the same building.
3. In every night school, three meetings, of not less than two hours each, must be held weekly, and the instruction must comprise at least the following subjects, as set forth in Regulation I., viz. :—Reading, spelling and explanation, dictation, composition, writing, and arithmetic.
4. No teacher shall be recorded for employment as a teacher of a night school unless he is certified by the Director to be qualified for such employment. In determining the suitability of any teacher for employment as teacher of a night school special consideration shall be given to the applicant's disciplinary power and his ability to interest and rightly influence night school pupils.
5. In determining the order in which the names of applicants for employment as teachers in night schools shall be recorded, the names of teachers employed in the day school may, if the Classifiers so recommend, take precedence over the names of teachers in the same class employed in other schools.
6. Subject to the foregoing conditions, the senior applicant shall be nominated for appointment to any vacancy for a teacher of a night school, unless the Classifiers report in writing to the Minister that there are good reasons for departing from this rule and for appointing some other applicant, in which case the applicant named shall, subject to the approval of the Minister, be nominated to fill such vacancy, and such reasons shall be stated in the report submitted by the Classifiers.
7. In every night school in which the average attendance exceeds 50, the teacher will be required to maintain a staff of approved assistants at least equivalent to that allotted to a day school of a similar size. The head teacher shall report, on the monthly return, the names and qualifications of all assistants employed.
8. An allowance, determined upon the basis of the average attendance, will be made to teachers of night schools for cleaning, providing fuel, light, and such other articles as may be required, according to the following scale :—

- In schools where the average attendance is not less than 30, but under 40, £8 per annum;
In schools where the average attendance is not less than 40, but under 50, £9 15s. per annum;
In schools where the average attendance is not less than 50, but under 60, £11 5s. per annum;
And an increase of £1 10s. for every additional 10 in average attendance.

9. In estimating the average attendance, only such scholars shall be reckoned as are above fourteen years of age, and are not in attendance at, or employed as teachers, junior teachers, or monitors in, a State School.

Scholars between the ages of twelve and fourteen years may be reckoned, provided they have been granted by the Minister a special exemption from compulsory attendance at a day school, or have gained a certificate of having been educated up to the standard.

10. All other regulations and rules relative to examination and inspection of schools will, so far as they are applicable, affect night schools.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts a Special Board has been appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory or work-room all articles of women's and girls' underclothing (except stays and corsets), also nightgowns, blouses, pinafores, aprons, and infants' gowns and underclothing: And whereas under the said Factories and Shops Acts it is amongst other things enacted that where any person or persons or classes of persons is or are employed by any employer in preparing or manufacturing articles the lowest prices or rates of payment for preparing or manufacturing which have been determined by a Special Board, then, if so directed by the Governor in Council, any Special Board shall also determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be made by any employer to such person or persons or classes of persons for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory or work-room any particular articles whatsoever: And whereas the Underclothing Board has fixed the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing all articles of women's and girls' underclothing (except stays and corsets), also nightgowns, blouses, pinafores, aprons, and infants' gowns and underclothing: And whereas such persons are in one or more factories or work-rooms also employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing Pillow Slips: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby direct that

the Underclothing Board shall also, in the manner prescribed in section 75 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid by any employer to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory or work-room all classes of Pillow Slips.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Health Act 1890.

INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF SWINE FROM SOUTH AUSTRALIA PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered to, from time to time, make, alter, or vary such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same, or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same, or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct: and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. That the prohibition contained in the Regulations of 25th September, 1903, as regards the introduction into Victoria of Swine from South Australia, shall not apply to stud pigs from that State, provided such pigs are accompanied by a statutory declaration by the owner to the effect that there has been no swine fever on the property from which they came, and that they have not been in contact with any pigs affected with swine fever during the last preceding twelve months; and also by a certificate from a South Australian Stock Inspector to the effect that he has examined the pigs to be imported and found them to be free from disease.

2. And provided further that notice of intention to export stud pigs be furnished by intending exporters to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, together with the declaration and certificate as aforesaid, not later than fourteen days prior to their proposed introduction into Victoria.

3. And also that before the introduction of any stud pigs, the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that every requirement specified herein has been carried out, and that the pigs to be introduced are healthy.

The introduction of stud pigs into Victoria under the above stated conditions shall be permitted only at the port of Melbourne, or at Serviceton.

Any person introducing stud pigs in accordance with aforesaid provisions shall keep such pigs in complete isolation on his own farm, or in some place approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, for a period of thirty days.

FURTHER RULES UNDER THE JUSTICES ACT 1890.

WHEREAS by the *Justices Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time make and, when made, rescind, alter, and add to Rules in relation to the following matters, or any of them (that is to say), the practice and procedure before Justices out of Sessions and in Courts of Petty Sessions in cases of summary jurisdiction: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, do hereby make the following Rules in addition to those previously made under the said Act, namely:—

Courts of Petty Sessions not to adjudicate in Children's Court Cases.

1. Where any person has been summoned to appear before a Court of Petty Sessions as a defendant to answer a charge or information for an offence, and it appears to such Court, either before or during the hearing of such charge or information, that the said defendant is a child within the meaning of the *Children's Court Act 1906*, the said Court of Petty Sessions shall abstain from adjudicating, or from further adjudication, in the case, and shall adjourn the hearing, or further hearing, of the case to the next or most convenient Children's Court nearest to the place where the offence in respect of which the said child has been summoned is alleged to have been committed, and in the meantime it may suffer such defendant to go at large, or admit him to bail, with or without surety or sureties, to appear at the said Children's Court at the time and place to which the said hearing or further hearing of the case has been so adjourned as aforesaid.

Court of Petty Sessions or Justices may extend the return day of summons conditionally.

2. Where a summons other than a summons to witness has been issued under the Justices Acts returnable before a Court of Petty Sessions or Justices, but for some reason service thereof has not been effected, the Court of Petty Sessions before which, or the Justices before whom, the summons is returnable, on the application of the informant or complainant, or his agent, authorized in writing, or by the barrister and solicitor of either, or a clerk solely in his employment, may amend such summons by altering the day on which such summons was made returnable to some other day following it that may be appointed for a sitting of the said Court or Justices, and such summons, when so amended, shall be as valid and effectual as if issued in the first instance for such other day, if the following conditions are observed, but not otherwise, that is to say:—

- (a) One of the Justices constituting such Court of Petty Sessions, or one of the Justices before which the said summons is returnable, when so amending the summons as aforesaid, shall write his initials in the margin of the summons in a line with that on which the alteration is so made;
- (b) Such summons shall not be so amended more than once.

And the Honorable John Mark Davies, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
