EASBY WRECK.—GABO ISLAND.

ANCHORAGE FOR VESSELS WITH EXPLOSIVES, PORT PHILLIP.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 180, dated 15th May, 1907, and previous notice regarding the anchorage for vessels with explosives within Port Phillip, it is hereby notified that the Gas Buoy to be substituted for the present black can buoy on or about the 22nd August next will show a green occulting light, instead of a fixed white light, as previously notified.

Such Gas Buoy showing an all round green occulting light will be in 28 feet low water, with the Altona Black Beacon in line with the Railway Water Tower at Newport, bearing N. 17 deg. E., and the shed at the outer end of Truganina Jetty bearing N. 84 deg. W., marking the most suitable anchorage to facilitate the discharge and shipment of explosives for vessels within the area defined by the regulations for vessels with explosives on board.

Health Act 1890. Local Government Act 1903.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW No. 78.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and in the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the City of Fitzroy, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 78, that is to say :—

1. Every occupier of a house or premises and every owner of an unoccupied house or premises shall cause all house refuse, organic waste matter or edible substances to be kept, while on the premises, in rat-proof receptacles, and shall

unless there is a dog or a cat, efficient in both cases for rat-killing, kept in such house or premises and given constant access to the places therein where rats are likely to go from cover, set in suitable places a trap or traps for catching rats, and shall cause all rats caught to be killed;

and shall also, if required to do so by the Council, the Officer of Health, or an Inspector of the Council, take either or both of the following measures, namely :—

- (1) cause sulphur fumes or other lethal gas to be pumped into the places in the premises likely to harbor rats;
- (2) lay effective poison baits in such places as the rats are known to frequent.

2. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Fitzroy.

The foregoing By-law was adopted at a meeting of the Council, held 18th March, 1907, and confirmed on 15th April, 1907.

UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Council of the United Shire of Beechworth, held at the Council Chambers, Beechworth, on the 12th day of April, 1907, the said Council did agree to the following resolution, that is to say :—

"That the Council do agree to By-law No. 24 submitted."

BY-LAW No. 24.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the United Shire of Beechworth, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say :—

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the portion of the Shire Riding situate within the town boundary.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of nightsoil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of nightsoil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 12th day of April, 1907, and confirmed the 7th day of June, 1907.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 48.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection and examinations of candidates for employment as Apprentices, Engine Cleaners, Labourers, Lad Labourers, Lad Porters, Porters, Repairers, or Shunters in the Victorian Railways Service, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto:—

1. In every case in which a vacancy exists in connexion with any position in the Victorian Railways Service which the Commissioners desire to fill by the appointment of an Apprentice, Engine Cleaner, Labourer, Lad Labourer, Lad Porter, Porter, Repairer or Shunter, and a public notice is issued to that effect, every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any of the positions referred to therein shall prepare, in his own handwriting, an application in the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for the position of Labourer or Porter (or as the case may be).

2. The age of every candidate shall be not less than the minimum and not more than the maximum age shown hereunder opposite the particular grade in which he desires employment, viz. :—

Apprentice	14	18
Engine Cleaner	19	30
Labourer	21	35
Lad Labourer	14	18
Lad Porter	14	18

with the exception that every youth at present in the temporary employment of the Commissioners who will not have reached the age of twenty years at the date of the opening of such applications, shall be eligible to become a candidate for the position of Apprentice, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter, provided that he has had continuous employment in the service of the Commissioners at least from the date on which he attained his eighteenth birthday.

3. The height of every candidate for the position of Labourer, Porter, Repairer, or Shunter shall be not less than 5 feet 4 inches; and the height of every candidate for the position of Engine Cleaner shall be not less than 5 feet 5 inches.

4. The rate of pay of every adult Engine-cleaner, Labourer, Porter, and Repairer shall on appointment be 6s. per day, and after twelve months' service 6s. 6d. per day, with the exception that any such employe who immediately prior to appointment may have been engaged in the temporary service of the Commissioners at a wage in excess of 6s. per day shall on appointment be paid at the rate of 6s. 6d. per day; and the rate of pay of every Shunter shall on appointment be 6s. 6d. per day or 7s. per day, according to the location in

which his services are utilized; and in all cases the subsequent rate of pay shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Regulation in operation for the time being, subject, however, to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the performance of the allotted duties.

5. The rate of pay of every Lad Labourer, Lad Porter, and Engine-cleaner less than twenty-one years of age shall on appointment be in accordance with his age, based on the following scale:—

7. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the Public Notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the Trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that

it will reach the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

8. Any candidate for the position of Lad Labourer may specify the particular Branch in which he desires employment, but in the event of the number of successful applicants for any particular Branch being in excess of the number of Lad Labourers required for such Branch, the Commissioners reserve the right to allot the whole or any number of the successful candidates among the different Branches according to the order of precedence for appointment as determined by the ballot hereinafter referred to.

9. Every candidate shall forward with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth, which may be obtained from the office of the Government Statist, Melbourne, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted in lieu of such certified extract.

10. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employé, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment and the cause of his leaving such service; and any candidate who has been dismissed therefrom at any time, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the Service of the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

11. The Secretary for Railways, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, shall, on the day and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

12. If the number of candidates for employment in any grade be not more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade, the candidates for employment in such capacity shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 18 to 25 inclusive of this Regulation.

13. If the number of candidates for employment in any grade be more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade, the number of candidates for employment in such capacity shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number to be employed in the particular grade.

14. The Members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them, and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the Victorian Railways Service.

15. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

17. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled, and such list shall be certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

18. Every such candidate and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed in the particular grade shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

19. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

20. Every such candidate for the position of Apprentice, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter shall be required by the Educational Examiners to pass an examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Standard Certificate, and every such candidate for the position of Engine Cleaner, Labourer, Porter, Repairer, or Shunter shall pass a simple examination in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

21. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firm or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years.

22. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the selected candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

23. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

24. After examination by the Educational Examiners, the successful candidates for each grade, provided that the number of such candidates be not in excess of the number required in the respective capacities by the Commissioners, shall be employed in order of merit according to the number of marks respectively allotted them by such Examiners, but if the successful candidates for employment in any grade be in excess of the number required by the Commissioners in such grade, the successful candidates in each such capacity shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in

the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz. :—

- Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates for the particular grade.
- Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.
25. Every successful candidate in excess of the number required by the Commissioners in the particular grade for which he is a candidate shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade that may occur during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of such determination without further or other examination.
26. Every appointment shall be made on probation for a period of six months and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity and industry of the employé whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.
27. Every Apprentice shall immediately enrol himself as a student at the Working Men's College, and shall attend the classes of instruction at such College appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over a period of three years.
28. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College, at his own expense, but the Commissioners shall pay the College fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College.
29. Every Apprentice shall present himself for the examinations of the aforesaid College, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations prescribed for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

30. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the two Apprentices among those apprenticed to the trades of Boilermaker, Car and Waggon Builder, Fitter and Turner, and Moulder, who each year may be adjudged to have passed the best examination at the College up to the standard prescribed by the Commissioners for such Apprentices, shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively, according to their order of merit, with the exception that at the end of the third year the first in order of merit amongst such Apprentices shall be nominated as a student in either the Electrical or Mechanical Engineering course, and the second in order of merit among such Apprentices shall be awarded a prize of £5.

31. The Apprentice among those apprenticed to the trades of Boilermaker, Car and Waggon Builder, Fitter and Turner, and Moulder who may be adjudged to have passed the best examination in the third year, and to possess the highest qualifications, shall be accorded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at the Working Men's College in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering, as may be determined by the Commissioners, and provided that such Apprentice passes the prescribed examination, and gains a diploma of the College in respect thereof, he shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College fees shall be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £7 per month.

32. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the two Apprentices among those apprenticed to the trades of Carriage Trimmer, Nickel Plater, Painter, and Sailmaker, who may be adjudged to have passed the best examination at the College up to the standard prescribed by the Commissioners for such Apprentices, shall at the end of each of the first three years be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively, according to their order of merit.

33. The term of apprenticeship shall be six years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the six years exceed three months in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the six years exceeding three months in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the six years for a period equivalent to the period of leave of absence granted in excess of the three months.

34. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employé shall, without previous notice, be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners, if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

FUNERALS OF DESTITUTE PERSONS AND REMOVAL OF DEAD BODIES IN THE MELBOURNE DISTRICT.

FRESH Tenders will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, the 23rd July, 1907, from persons willing to undertake Funerals of Destitute Persons at the Necropolis (Springvale) and Fawkner Cemetery, and Removals of Dead Bodies to the Melbourne Morgue, as required by the several Departments of the Government, from 1st August, 1907, to 30th June, 1910, in the Melbourne district, which includes the following police sub-districts:—Melbourne City, Bourke-street west, Little Bourke-street, East Melbourne, West Melbourne, Albert Park, Alphington, Armadale, Ascot Vale, Auburn, Balaclava, Brunswick, Brunswick East, Brunswick West, Burnley, Camberwell, Carlton, Carlton North, Clifton Hill, Coburg, Coltingwood, Essendon, Essendon North, Fitzroy, Malvern, North Fitzroy, Flemington, Hawthorn, Hawthorn West, Hottham Hill, Kensington, Kew, Middle Park, Montague, Northcote, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Port Melbourne North, Prahran, Prince's Hill, Richmond, South Richmond, Royal Park, St. Kilda, East St. Kilda, St. Kilda West, St. Kilda-road, South Yarra, South Melbourne, South Wharf, Toorak, and Windsor.

Burials of deceased persons from sub-districts north of the Yarra, with the exception of those buried from the Morgue, will take place at the Fawkner Cemetery, and those from sub-districts south of the Yarra, including burials from the Morgue, at the Springvale Necropolis respectively.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either funerals or removals, but if both services be included in one tender it may, if advisable, be accepted for one service only.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, Railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £5 for burials and £5 for removals (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, in the sum of £25 for burials, and £25 for removals, either in cash, Victorian Government debentures, Bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders, indorsed "Tender for Funerals or Removals" (as the case may be), are to be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, or addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the necropolis, or to the cemetery as the case may be, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time.

4. Coffins for funerals must be sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. In the event of a body being decomposed, or whenever it may be considered necessary by the member of the Police Force issuing the order for the burial, a coffin must be supplied sufficiently large to leave at least 2 inches between the body and the sides and top and bottom of the coffin, and this space must be filled up round the body with pine or phenyle sawdust by the contractor at his own expense; and in the event of any neglect in so providing or filling up the coffin the contractor will be dealt with as provided in Condition 13. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

5. Bodies of deceased persons must be conveyed to the Fawkner Cemetery for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, with the exception of bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

6. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

7. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the contractor. Should any circumstances, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

8. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the contractor.

9. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

10. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed before removal in shell coffins securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles.

11. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the *post-mortem* examination.

12. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

13. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount

may be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, the hours of employment of any person engaged in the burials or removals provided for in this schedule are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage of not less than 6s. per day; and a copy of these labour conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which funerals are prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.
