Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890, and of any other powers thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act in execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed in and throughout the township of Lang Lang, and within the boundaries thereof as hereinafter described.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Lang Lang within the boundaries herein described, that is to say:—Starting at the railway crossing at the west end of Lang Lang Railway Station; thence by the centre line of the Great Southern Railway in a north-westerly direction to a point opposite the centre line of Nellie-street; thence in a south-westerly direction by the centre line of that street to the centre of McDonald's Track; then along the centre of that road in a south-easterly direction to the centre of Dorcas-street and by the centre of the latter street in a north-easterly line to the centre line of the Great Southern Railway; and thence by the centre line of that railway to the starting point, all on the south side of the Great Southern Railway; also on the north side of the railway along the Westernport-road as far as and including the State School for a depth of five chains on each side. The premises occupied by William Neat and owned by the executors of the late Jas. Baker on the north side of the railway and the premises formerly owned and occupied by the late James Baker on the south side of the railway and adjoining Dorcas-street shall be included in the area to which the provisions of this By-law apply.

(4) The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.

(5) The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or a privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinbefore provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

(6) The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing matter sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

(7) At least once a week the person employed by the Council so to do shall close the pan in use with a tight-fitting lid and remove the same with its contents from the premises in the day-time in a suitable cart.

(8) The person so employed by the Council shall also at the time of removal of the pan in use leave in the place thereof a pan cleansed by superheated steam, boiling water, and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means approved by the Council.

(9) No occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

(10) The Council shall have the power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, and the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

(11) Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than 5s., or if such breach be a continuing act, or default, to a penalty not exceeding £5 and not less than 5s. for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; gauging; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

Explosives Act 1890.

CERTAIN EXPLOSIVES DEFINED, CLASSIFIED, AND ADDED TO LIST OF EXPLOSIVES PROHIBITED FROM IMPORTATION INTO VICTORIA EXCEPT UPON CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of July, 1907.

WHEREAS by the *Explosives Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define, for the purposes of Part I. of that Act, the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, may classify explosives, and may prohibit either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture keeping importation from any place out of Victoria conveyance and sale or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 13th day of December, 1897, the Governor in Council did prohibit the importation from any place out of Victoria, keeping, conveyance, and sale of certain explosives except upon the conditions and restrictions mentioned in the said Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby define and classify certain explosives as shown hereunder, and doth add to the list of explosives so prohibited in the said Order of the 13th December, 1897, except upon certain conditions or restrictions mentioned therein, the explosives so defined and classified hereunder as aforesaid, namely:—

CLASS 2.—NITRATE MIXTURE.

Bobbinite, consisting of a mixture of nitrate of potassium, charcoal, and sulphur, with one or more of the following ingredients:—Sulphate of copper, sulphate of ammonium, paraffin wax, and rice or maize starch.

CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

Division 1.

Abbate, consisting of neutral nitrate of ammonium, thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, and wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 11 per cent. of the finished explosive. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Arkte, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton (thoroughly purified), and mixed with one or more of the following ingredients:—Nitrate of potassium, nitrate of barium, nitrate of sodium, wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), and carbonate of calcium not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive. To the above ingredients, oxalate of ammonium is added. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in inner packages containing not more than 5 lbs., made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin, or other suitable waterproofing material.

Blasting Gelatine No. 1, Dragon Brand, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-cotton, combined with nitro-glycerine thoroughly purified, and with or without carbonate of calcium or carbonate of magnesium not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, and with or without the addition of castor oil. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation.

Cambrite, consisting of not more than 27 per cent. of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, with or without the addition of not more than half a part of sulphuretted benzol, uniformly mixed with not less than 73 per cent. of a pulverized preparation consisting of wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), not less than 52½ per cent., nitrates of potassium, barium, and sodium, or any of them, not more than 47½ per cent., and carbonates of sodium and calcium, or either of them, not more than ½ per cent., mixed with oxalate of ammonium. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality when mixed in the above proportions to prevent

exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in inner packages containing not more than 5 lbs., made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin or other suitable waterproofing material.

Cornish powder, consisting of gelignite, as already defined, in which part of the nitrate of potassium has been replaced by sulphate of magnesium.

Excellite, consisting of a mixture of nitrate of ammonium, nitro-glycerine, di-nitro-toluol, nitro-cotton, such nitro-glycerine, di-nitro-toluol, and nitro-cotton being thoroughly purified, wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), and castor oil, provided that the nitro-glycerine and di-nitro-toluol together do not amount to more than 11 per cent. of the finished explosive. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided also that the explosive is packed in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Fracturite, consisting of nitro-glycerine, thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton, both thoroughly purified, and mixed with nitrate of potassium, and wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), carbonates of calcium and magnesium, or either of them, not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, mixed with oxalate of ammonium, not exceeding 20 per cent. of the finished explosive. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in inner packages, containing not more than 5 lbs., made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin or other suitable waterproofing material.

Gelatine Dynamite No. 1, Dragon Brand, consisting of nitro-glycerine, thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton, both thoroughly purified, and mixed with one or more of the following non-explosive ingredients:—Cotton, charcoal, wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), carbonate of calcium not exceeding 2 per cent., and carbonate of magnesium not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, with or without the addition of castor oil. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation.

Gelatine Dynamite No. 2, or Gelignite, Dragon Brand, consisting of nitro-glycerine, thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton, both thoroughly purified, and mixed with one or more of the following non-explosive ingredients:—Cotton, charcoal, wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), carbonate of calcium not exceeding 2 per cent., and carbonate of magnesium not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, mixed with nitrate of potassium, and with or without the addition of castor oil. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation.

Infalible smokeless powder, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-cotton, not more than 59½ per cent., and thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, not more than 40 per cent., with the addition of urea, not exceeding ½ per cent. of the finished explosive, the whole being thoroughly gelatinized and incorporated by means of acetone.

Kolax, consisting of a mixture of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, nitrates of potassium and barium, wood-meal (for the bleaching and purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), and starch. Provided that the nitro-glycerine does not exceed 26 per cent., and the wood-meal and starch together (estimated after drying at 100 deg. C) do not amount to less than 37 per cent. of the finished explosive. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine.

Kynite, consisting of not more than 27 per cent. of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, with or without the addition of not more than ½ per cent. of sulphuretted benzol, uniformly mixed with not less than 73 per cent. by weight of a pulverized preparation consisting of wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), not less than 52½ per cent., nitrates of potassium, barium, and sodium, or any of them, not more than 47½ per cent., and carbonates of sodium and calcium, or either of them, not more than ½ per cent. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality when mixed in the above proportions to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive shall be contained in cartridge cases or wrappers made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin, or other suitable waterproofing material.

Monobel, consisting of neutral nitrate of ammonium, thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, and wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed),

provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 11 per cent. of the finished explosive. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Rippite, consisting of gelignite as already defined, with the addition of oxalate of ammonium and castor oil. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in inner packages containing not more than 5 lbs., made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin.

Saxinite, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine, thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton, thoroughly purified, and mixed with one or more of the following ingredients:—Nitrate of potassium, nitrate of barium, nitrate of sodium, wood-meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), carbonate of calcium, not exceeding 2 per cent., and carbonate of magnesium, not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, mixed with oxalate of ammonium. The whole to be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in inner packages containing not more than 5 lbs., made thoroughly waterproof with melted paraffin.

CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

Division 2.

Empire powder, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-cellulose incorporated by means of a suitable solvent, or otherwise, with barium and potassium nitrates, graphite, and maize starch, or any of them, and mineral jelly (free from acid); the whole being dyed with nigrosine, provided that the maize starch does not exceed 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, and with or without not more than 3 per cent. of camphor.

Imperial Schultze gunpowder, consisting of Schultze gunpowder, as already defined, with or without the addition of gum tragacanth, provided that the amount of gum tragacanth shall not exceed 2 per cent. by weight of the finished explosive, and with or without the addition of eosin soluble in water, and aurin, or either of them, provided that the amount of eosin or aurin shall not exceed 0.2 per cent. of the finished explosive.

King's semi-smokeless powder, consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-cellulose, mixed with nitrate of potassium, charcoal, and sulphur (free from acid). Provided that the amount of sulphur does not exceed 8 per cent. by weight of the finished explosive.

SHIRE OF MEREDITH.

BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Meredith, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Meredith order as follows:—

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections:—

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to

(a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars not exceeding five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last mentioned case—

(i) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(ii) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council, duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters, not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours, during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

(a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The foregoing By-law, No. 7, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Meredith on the twelfth day of June, 1907, and was confirmed by the said Council on the tenth day of July, 1907.

MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

34. On and after the 25th day of July, 1907, the building known as the Maternity Hospital (erected within the grounds and forming part of the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum) shall be used for the reception of females during their confinement.

35. The management and control of the said Maternity Hospital shall be included in the powers of the Committee of Management of the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum, and the rules relating to the management of such hospital and asylum shall apply to the government and management of the said Maternity Hospital.

36. All expenses necessary for the maintenance, management, and upkeep of the said Maternity Hospital shall be paid by the said Committee of Management out of the funds of the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

37. All officers and servants employed in the management of the said Maternity Hospital shall be under the same control and directions as those employed in the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

38. It shall be the duty of the President, Chairman of the House Committee, the Superintendent, and the Head Nurse for the time being of the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum to inquire into all applications for admission to the Maternity Hospital for treatment, and to decide, or any two of them to decide, on such information as may be available to them, whether the applicant is a fit subject according to the rules and by-laws of the Hamilton Hospital and Benevolent Asylum for admission to the said Maternity Hospital.

39. When the said President, Chairman of the House Committee, Superintendent, and Head Nurse, or any two of them, have decided that the application for admission be granted, a card to that effect shall be issued and signed by any two of such four mentioned persons, which card shall be submitted to the Medical Officer for his approval or disapproval of the case from a medical point of view, and, if he approve, he shall indorse such card accordingly, and on presentation at the Maternity Hospital of such card so indorsed the applicant shall be admitted to the said hospital for treatment, and no patient shall be admitted to the said hospital unless such card has been issued as aforesaid.

40. The period during which such patient shall remain in such Maternity Hospital shall be a matter to be decided by the Medical Officer.

QUORUM FOR COMMITTEE.

41. In section 12 of the above-mentioned By-law, the word "seven" where last occurring is hereby repealed, and the word "five" is substituted therefor.

The above amendments were confirmed at a meeting of contributors, held on Thursday, 25th July, 1907, and for which due notice had been given.
