By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—.

- "An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation and Crown Grant of certain Land at Elsternwick in the Municipal District of Brighton."
- "An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Ultima to Chillingollah."
- "An Act to further amend the Mining Development
- "An Act Constituting the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne the Trustees of the Mechanics' Institute in the said City."

# ADDITIONAL REGULATION RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1890 to make Regulations for the conduct of the examination of persons desiring to obtain Certificates of Competency as Masters and Mates, and as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, doth hereby, with the consent of the Covernor in Council, make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

#### ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

Every candidate for a Certificate of Competency for the grade of Master or Mate of a foreign going ship, or of a home-trade ship, exceeding 100 tons gross registered tonnage, will be required to show that he possesses a knowledge of First Aid to the Injured, and proof thereof must be given by means of a certificate to such effect granted by either the St. John Ambulance Association or the St. Andrew's Ambulance Association of the Examination of Masters and Mates' made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1903, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1909.

# AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPER-ANNUATION FUND.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 96 of the Marine Act 1890, the Pilot Superannuation Board doth make the Regulations following amending the Regulations heretofore made for the maintenance of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund, and for the distribution of the annual income thereof (that is to say) :-

1. These Regulations shall form portion of the Regulations relating to the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund made by the Board on the 3rd day of July, 1895, and shall be read in connexion with the same, and shall come into operation on the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette, on which date certain amended Regulations made on the 28th day of May, 1902, whall be received. shall be repealed.

2. Superannuation.—Pilots who have served ten years and upwards, and who have been permitted to retire from the Pilot Service in accordance with the Regulations of the Marine Board, shall be entitled to an annual pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund, according to the scale of pensions set forth in Schedule (1) hereto, provided that no pension shall be granted for more than thirty-five years' service.

thirty-five years' service.

3. Lump sum in lieu of Pension or on Resignation after Ten Years' Service.—Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension, as provided in the foregoing Regulation, and he is desirous of accepting a lump sum in lieu thereof, or where any pilot who has served as, such for not less than ten years is permitted to resign, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £35 for the first year of completed service, £36 for the second year of such service, £37 for the third year of such service, and so on increasing One pound for each additional year of completed service up to thirty-five years, provided that such pilot grants a release to the Board from all future claims against the Fund on behalf of himself and of his wife and of his children (if any), and provided further that no payment shall be made for a greater length of service than thirty-five years.

4. Prevision for Widows of Pilots.—On the decease of a pilot in the exercise of his calling after having served ten years and upwards, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to receive a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund, in accordance with the seale prescribed in Schedule (2) hereto, subject to the proviso that the pension to the widow of any pilot shall in no case exceed £45 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him ten years or upwards

at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed £55 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him at least fifteen years at the time of such decease or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed the amount specified as pen-sion for the widow of a pilot who has served thirty-five

sion for the widow of a pilot who has served thirty-five years.

5. Increase or Reduction of Pensions.—If at any time after the granting of any pension the particular scale on which the same was originally computed or is, for the time being, paid (hereinafter referred to as the "old scale") be superseded or altered, with the result that the pension of a person whose claim to a grant arises subsequently to such supersession or alteration (with, for computation purposes, identical or like services to that of the pilot incidental to whose services the pension was granted at the date when the right to a pension accrued), will, under the new scale, be computed and allowed at a different amount, either higher or lower, than is or would be payable in like case under the old scale; then, and in every such case (to take effect from the date when the new scale came into force) every pension theretofore granted to which this clause has application shall thereupon be and be deemed to be increased or reduced, as the case may be, by an amount representing the difference between the rate the pensioner was in law entitled to be paid immediately prior to the new scale coming into force and the rate which the pensioner would receive under the new scale had the same been in force at the date when his claim to the grant of a pension originally arose, and shall so continue raised or reduced until the new scale is in its turn superseded or altered (if at all), and so on from time to time.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board held this tenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than one hundred females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said one hundred females shall not be employed for more than fitty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

  2. That every female, so anyward shall received.
- any one cay, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

  2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid. Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

  3. That every founds shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

  4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty eight hours in any one week without their consent.

  5. That a copy of this Order be kent sometimes.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CARAMUT TOWN COMMON.

N pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Managers of the Caramut Town Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Lands and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

### REGULATIONS.

- REGILATIONS.

  1. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 2. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 3. The fees for depasturing on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year:—For every horse, gelding, mare, tolt, or filly, Ten (to) shillings per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Eight (8) shillings per annum; for every head of small cattle, Three and fourpence per annum.

Progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free.

- 4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine months shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without permission, in writing, of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any animal which, in their opinion, is likely to prove a nuisance.
- 5. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing on the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand.
- 6. All stock depastured on the Common and registered the previous half-year, on which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of six days after the commencement of each half-year, shall be liable to be treated as trespassers, and all other stock found on the Common and not registered the previous half-year shall forthwith be treated as trespassers.
- 7. Neither the managers nor the herdsman shall be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, any stock depasturing on the Common.
- 8. No person shall remove registered stock from the Common without the consent, in writing, of the managers or the herdsman, and the herdsman shall assist the owners to separate any stock they may require to remove.
- 9. No stock affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Common.
- 10. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcass be not removed after six (6) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried or destroyed (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expense so incurred has been paid.

· Every person offending any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
