## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

## CARLTON ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming Election of the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

*Caution.*—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

## NOTICE.

The following persons have been appointed officers within the meaning of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* to witness the signature of any elector who desires to vote by means of the Post Office:—Justices of the Peace, Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire, Municipal Clerks, Clerks of Courts, Officers in Charge of Police Stations, and Head Masters of State Schools throughout Victoria.

## TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 2nd December, 1907, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1909.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st November, 1907, must, not later than 2nd November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1909.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

FOG SIGNAL, GODLEY HEAD.—ENTRANCE TO LYTTELTON  
HARBOR.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after Monday, 5th October, 1908, the following fog signals will be sounded from a position on a ledge of rocks about 60 feet above sea-level, half-a-cable south of Godley Head Light-house.

The signals consist of explosions of cotton powder charges at intervals of five minutes, and will be made when the land is likely to be obscured at a distance of about 3 miles from seaward by either fog, mist, falling snow, or continuous rain.

It is anticipated that these sound signals will be heard at any distance under 10 miles, varying according to the state of the atmosphere and the force and direction of the wind.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK, IN THE PARISH OF SNAKE ISLAND, AND KNOWN AS SNAKE ISLAND.

WHEREAS by the 199th section of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, or to rescind any Rules and Regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 22nd September, 1908, as a site for a Public Park in the parish of Snake Island, and known as, and hereinafter designated Snake Island:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, net, hook, catch, or otherwise injure, destroy, or interfere with, or take away any game, or native game, as defined by the *Game Act 1890*, or native fauna of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or nets within Snake Island; or lay, make, or set therein any poison, trap, snare, or net, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.

2. No person shall camp in Snake Island, or erect thereon any dwelling, hut, or other structure.

3. No person shall light or maintain any fire within Snake Island without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands.

4. No person shall bring into Snake Island, or allow to wander therein, any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands.

5. No dog shall be allowed in Snake Island, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof to prosecution.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with sect. 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, WILSON'S PROMONTORY.

WHEREAS by the 199th section of the *Land Act 1901*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, or to rescind any Rules and Regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of the Reserve for a National Park in the parishes of Beck Beck, Warreen, Kulk, and Tallang, and of the Reserve in the township of Seaforth and parishes of Beck Beck, Warreen, Kulk, Tullang, and Yanakie South, for a National Park, and on which to establish, when required, Pilot Stations, Light-houses, and other aids to navigation, both of which Reserves are hereinafter referred to as the National Park:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The National Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the National Park, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the National Park, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut or paint names, letters, or marks on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon, or destroy, break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way, or take away any trees, shrubs, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, or any other vegetation, or soil, in the National Park.

4. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy, or interfere with, or take away any animal, eggs, skins, or feathers of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or guns within the National Park, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park without the permission of the Committee of Management, or the Caretaker, or person in charge of the National Park, and then only in such places as may be directed.

6. No person shall camp in the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall erect in the National Park any dwelling, booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall bring into the National Park any animal of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance, stocking, and improvement of the National Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall bring into the National Park any seed, plant, or portion of any plant, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. Every person bathing in the waters of the National Park shall be decently clad from the neck to the knees.

11. No person shall bring into the National Park any dog without the permission of the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the National Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Tenders should be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than One p.m. on Wednesday, 21st October, 1908.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the period from 1st November, 1908, to 30th September, 1909, and fee of Five shillings for licence, are forwarded.

TENDERS will be received up to One p.m. on Wednesday, 21st September, 1908, for the right to depasture stock for a term of three years, on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions. The licence will be renewable annually to 30th September, 1911, and in the event of any application for renewal for a further term being made, the manner in which the area has been protected from injury by fires during the term of the licence and the conditions thereof have been observed will be fully considered.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land, for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.
5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.
6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.
7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.
8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.
9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act 1901* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.
10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.
11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.
12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

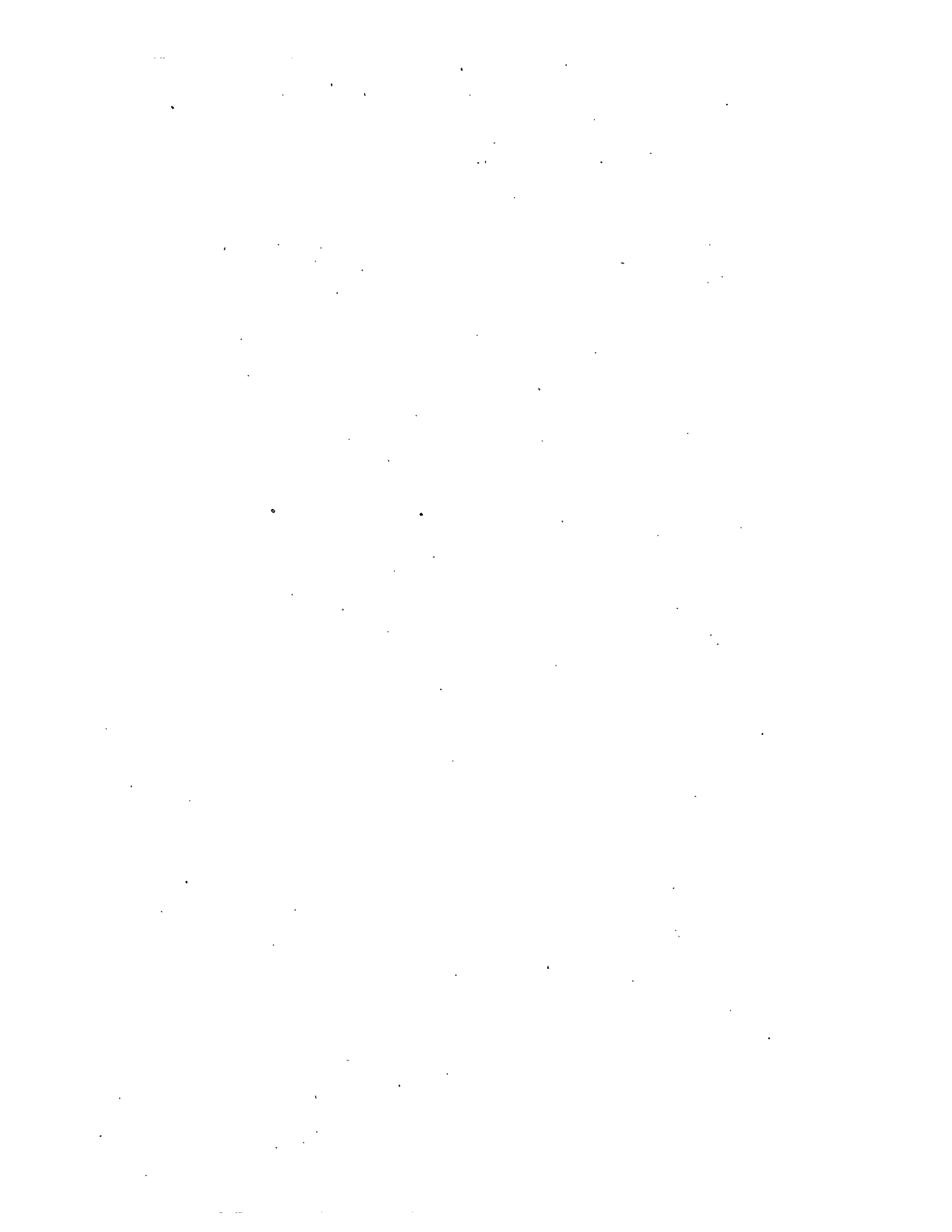

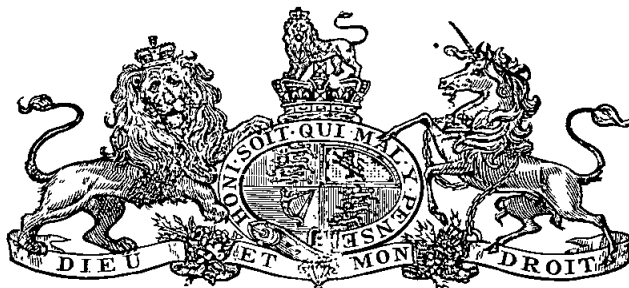
