5. The present methods for the reception and disposal of nightsoil are hereby abelished.

6. Instead of the present methods every closet or privy shall be furnished with a double pan service.

7. The pans for such service shall be supplied by and remain the property of the Council.

8. Every occupier or other person having the control or management of any house, tenement or premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging the eto a sufficient for deolorizing or disinfecting nightsoil, and shall cause all injusticil to be covered immediately on deposit thereof in the pan with sufficient of such have a charge upon e

advance.

12. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall, for every such breach, he liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five penalts have been pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five penalts for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be receivered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five chilings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, not which tanding that the Council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

## BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1909.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, make the following By-law:—

#### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1909.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1909:—

- 1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
- 2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
- 3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds  $(\chi_{15})$  annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings  $(\chi_{1})$  ros.) per annum.
- 4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 158.) per annum.
- 5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.
- 6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.
- 7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
- 8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 105.) per annum.
- 9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.
- 10. For water supplied to Government Departments, police stations, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
- II. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (18. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.
- 12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (ts.) per annum shall be paid.
- 13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
- 14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.
- 15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
- 16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
- 17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
- 18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any office of the Trust so to do the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe

or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

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  20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.
- with water so long as the frust may think it.

  21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.
- 22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.
- 23. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of, the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.
- 24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.
- 25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.
- 26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the hest quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.
- 27. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.
- 28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.
- 20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\mathcal{L}_5$ ) shall be imposed.
- 31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1909, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1909, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1909, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1909. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

- 4. For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 5. For every steam boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
- 6. For every trough in a paddock supplied by water, except by special agreement, a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.
- 7. For water supplied to siphon pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- 8. In all cases of water supply, the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure, and in all cases where water is supplied to dinking on other troughs, or reservoirs, the Trust may compel the use of a floating-ball tap, or other improved device, to regulate the supply of such drinking or other troughs or reservoirs, to prevent the same overflowing.
- 9. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agree-
- 10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, 10. For water supplied by the trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1.000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.

For every additional acre, and proportionately ac-cording to the foregoing scale, for every fraction of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1909, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1909, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January,

Where water meters are affixed, payment shall be made at the end of each quarter in the year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and six-pence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity. over that quantity.
- 6. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water, shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any), if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.
- 8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1909. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Printed forms of tender, giving full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne, from the Receivers and Paymasters at the respective places, and for Queenseliff from the Officer Commanding Victorian Artillery, Queenseliff, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required in cash, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank deposit receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or Government debentures.

Each tender must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit for the exact amount, according to places tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tendarers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Trader for Coal or Coke at " (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- As the exact quantity of soal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to elecunstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smith's coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the coal so rejected or returned.
- 3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the
- 4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. If the bags supplied are not returned to the contractor or his agent within six weeks' time they will be charged for at the rate stipulated in the tender. Such bags to be removed at the contractor's expense.
- 5. Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.
- 6. At the time of delivering the coal the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 7. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned at the contractor's expense, and coal of a satisfactory quality must be supplied in lieu thereof.
- 8. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.
- 9. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.
- 10. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.
- II. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to tare the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.
- 12. Coal must be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.
- 13. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the vessel's bunkers, as required by condition No. 10, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.
- 14. Should an order not be complied with within 48 hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over

- and above the contract price may be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money, but coal for steam vessels must be supplied on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse. In the event of the coal having to be delivered to outlying places by ketch or steamer, seven days' notice of such requirement must be given to the contractors.
- 15. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.
- 16. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the coal as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
- 17. If the board shall decide that the coal or coke is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 14.
- 18. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a heard of survey the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such coal or coke as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected coal or coke and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition No. 14.
- 19. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the coal, &c., or delay in delivering or replacing the coal when required, will subject the contractor to such mulet, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 14. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.
- 20. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- 21. In the event of a general strike occurring at the colliery or collieries, any contract entered into under these conditions after the expiry of fourteen drys' notice being given may be suspended, such contract to come into full force and effect again fourteen days after such cause of suspension shall be discontinued. During the fourteen days everally hereinbefore mentined, the contractors shall not be bound to supply coul to a greater quantity than the average daily consumption under the contract.
- 22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of coal by the Commonwealth Government.
- 23. Under no circumstances will a contractor be normitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Covernment may sustain in consequence of such failure.
- 21. Should the selling price at Newcastle, on which the prices under this contract are based, he increased or reduced, or should any duty, rate, or charge upon coal be imposed by the Palliament of the Commonwealth or of any of the States, or by any authority emp wered to make or levy duties, rates, or charges on coal, or should any alteration take place in the wharfage rates on coal, either by way of imposition of new rates or abolition of present rates, or by increase or decrease of present rates, then the rise or fall respectively, as the case may be, occasioned by any of these causes shall be added to or subtracted from the contract price per ton hereinbefore set out.
- 25. Notwithstanding anything in these conditions, it is distinctly agreed that the contractors will be deemed to have carried out their contract if they supply the best coal of any kind which from time to time is obtainable by the contractors with ordinary steamers despatch at the loading ports.
- 26. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person-engaged therein are not to exceed 48 per week, and at a minimum wage of 78. bd. (clear of all deductions) per shift of eight hours for miners, and fis, per day for labourers; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the colliery.
