NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

SOUTH-EASTERN PROVINCE AND ELECTORAL DISTRICTS OF
MORNINGTON, UPPER GOULBURN, AND WANGARATTA.

AN Election is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province and Electoral Districts, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province or Districts, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

REGULATION OF NETTING, WESTERN PORT.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date hereof, to issue a Proclamation for the regulation of netting in Western Port, as under:—

- (1) Prohibiting the use of seine nets within half a mile from the eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and Queensferry.
- (2) Providing that garfish nets are not to be used unless they have the following dimensions:—
Length of bunt not more than ten fathoms;
Mesh of bunt not less than one inch;
Depth of bunt not more than twelve feet;
Total length of net not more than eighty fathoms;
Mesh of wings not less than one and a quarter inches;
Depth of wings not more than seven feet.
- (3) Providing that seine nets are not to be used unless they have the following dimensions:—
Length of bunt not more than five fathoms;
Mesh of bunt not less than one inch;
Total length of net not more than one hundred and twenty fathoms;
Mesh of wings not less than one and three-quarter inches.
- (4) Providing that the mesh of nets is to be measured between knots when tanned and while stretched by a half-pound weight, after having been wet for five minutes.
- (5) Providing that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these regulations, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for three years from the date of the proclamation of these regulations.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST. REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation, namely:—

Signals for Victoria Dock and River.

No. 346. Signals to be used by vessels navigating the Victoria Dock and River.

- (a) A vessel proceeding from the Victoria Dock to the river shall, when abreast of the east end of No. 6 Shed, give a prolonged blast on the whistle of not less than six seconds duration, to be repeated when abreast of the centre of No. 2 Shed.
- (b) If such vessel shall have another vessel or vessels in tow, she shall give three blasts in succession, viz., one prolonged blast as above, followed by two short blasts, the short blasts to be of one second duration, with an interval of one second between each blast.
- (c) Vessels moored on either side of the Dock to the westward of the east end of No. 6 Shed, shall give the signals immediately upon leaving their berths, to be repeated when abreast of No. 2 Shed.
- (d) A vessel proceeding down the river, upon hearing a warning signal given by a vessel proceeding down the dock, shall reply by a prolonged blast on the whistle of not less than six seconds duration, and if towing one or more vessels shall also give the two additional short blasts as above but not otherwise.
- (e) The above sound signals must be given in all cases, and at all times, day or night, at the points stated, but they may be repeated at any point as often as the circumstances may demand.
- (f) A vessel proceeding either up or down the river, intending to berth in the Victoria Dock, shall hoist the flag V at the fore, and keep it flying until she has passed into the dock; in the former case it must be hoisted before entering the Coode Canal, and in the latter as soon as the vessel leaves her river berth. The towing vessel shall hoist the signal when towing lighters or barges not having masts, and, in all other cases the vessel being towed shall hoist the signal.
- (g) Vessels not having a foremast may use a temporary pole or staff on which to show the flag.
- (h) This regulation shall not apply to vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage.

This regulation shall be read and construed with the regulations of the said Commissioners, made and passed on the 27th day of September, 1907.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES
OF THE PITFIELD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Pitfield Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Secretary when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate of right of burial, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the required particulars given, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary or Sexton.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before time fixed for the burial.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual hours for funerals will be from Two till Five p.m. throughout the year.

9. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan to the Trustees.

10. No servant or other person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof unless he has special authority from the Trustees.

11. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily, throughout the year.

12. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless with previous authority from the Trustees.

13. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.

15. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner.

16. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

17. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, at the charge set out in the schedule.

18. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

19. No reinterment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister authorized in that behalf.

20. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

21. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given.

22. That every person dressing, attending, digging graves, or doing other work within the Cemetery shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—

First.—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing, attending, digging, or re-opening graves shall be placed on any grave, and when placed on any adjoining ground, or path, shall be removed after interment or completion of work.

Second.—That all refuse and other material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once by, or at the expense of, the person causing same, and if the ground is in any way cut up the same shall be neatly levelled off, and left in the same order as before.

Third.—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for dressing graves, or any other purposes, without permission from the Trustees.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KILCUNDA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Kilcunda Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, without the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

Governor with the advice aforesaid and in exercise of the power given by the *Land Act 1901* Doth hereby grant unto the licensee licence and liberty to enter upon improve and occupy the surface and down to a depth of _____ feet below the surface of all that grazing allotment situate in the parish of _____ county of _____

_____ in the State of Victoria containing _____ acres more or less of class land and delineated on the plan kept in accordance with the provisions of the 5th section of the *Land Act 1901* and thereon numbered _____ in the said parish and also delineated on the plan drawn in the margin of these presents and thereon coloured _____

for the term of six years from the day of the date of this licence *Excepting and reserving unto His Majesty his heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the land hereby licensed together with liberty for His Majesty his heirs and successors and his and their agents servants lessors licensees and assigns at any time or times during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to remove therefrom any gold silver auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining And also excepting and reserving to His Majesty his heirs and successors and the holder of a miner's right or a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a gold mining or mineral lease and their agents and servants tenants and workmen liberty and right of ingress egress and regress at all times through over and across the premises hereby licensed with or without horses cattle and other animals carts waggons and carriages to or from any claim or mine and to any public road or track subject to such Regulations to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force The land comprised in this licence is and shall be also subject both during the currency of this licence and after the licensee shall have acquired the fee-simple or leasehold thereof to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a gold mining or mineral lease being allowed by the licensee his executors administrators and assigns to enter upon the area hereby licensed and search for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to mine therein and thereon and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those on which such person had at the time of the date of these presents the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands provided that compensation shall be paid to the licensee by such persons for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as by law required and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry and this licence is subject to the conditions that the licensee shall at all times during the currency hereof permit every such person to exercise the right aforesaid. Yielding and paying therefor during the said term a yearly fee for this licence of _____ per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre contained in the said allotment and such further fee (if any) fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 419 of the *Land Act 1901* as amended by the *Land Act 1903* the said yearly fee to be paid in advance by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of _____ and the first day of _____ in every year clear of all deductions the first of the said half-yearly payments having been made in advance the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ next and the last of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ next preceding the expiration of the term of this licence The licensee for himself his heirs executors and administrators hereby agrees with the Governor as follows:—*

1. To pay the said licence-fee in moieties in advance at the times and in the manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. To pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable by landlord or tenant in respect of the premises.

3. That he will not during the currency of this licence assign the licence nor transfer his right title and interest therein or in the allotment hereinbefore described and herein comprised or any part thereof nor sublet the said allotment or any part thereof.

NOTE.—The lengths of the boundaries are approximately given in this plan in links.

4. To at once and to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and within two years after the issue of this licence to have destroyed to the satisfaction of the said Board the animals and birds by the said Act included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare or have declared to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act or any Act thereby repealed upon such land and to keep the same free from such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the said Board during the currency of this licence.

5. That he will enclose within six years from the issue of this licence if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1890* the land herein comprised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* and keep the same in repair during the continuance of this licence.

6. That he will make and erect substantial and permanent improvements in respect of each acre or fractional part of an acre of the allotment to the value of three shillings and fourpence in each year of the first three years of this licence.

7. That he will at all times during the continuance of this licence *bona fide* comply with all and will not violate any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1901*.

8. That the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council or the Board of Land and Works for and on behalf of His Majesty his heirs and successors may at any time during the currency of this licence resume possession of all or any part or parts of the lands comprised in the said allotment which may be required for reserves for public purposes or for the purpose of water supply irrigation works races dams and ditches or for railways roads canals or for tramways or other internal communication or for mining purposes provided that any moneys which may have been paid by the licensee to the Crown in respect of the lands so resumed or expended by him thereupon shall be repaid to him together with such other moneys as compensation for such resumption as to the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council seems fit. The preceding provision shall be construed as independent of and concurrent with the powers conferred by the 180th section of the *Land Act 1901* and of the powers conferred by the provision last but one of this licence.

9. In case possession of any part or parts of the said lands be resumed as aforesaid or as hereinafter mentioned the agreements and conditions herein contained with reference to the whole shall continue in force and apply to such part as shall be left in the possession of the licensee.

That if and whenever any part of the said fees for this licence be in arrear whether the same have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the agreements positive or negative by the licensee herein contained or if this licence be assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise save as in the *Land Act 1901* is otherwise expressly provided or if the said allotment or any part thereof is sublet or in case substantial and permanent improvements certified in writing under the seal of the Board of Land and Works or under the hands of arbitrators as provided by the *Land Act 1901* to be of the value of three shillings and fourpence in respect of each acre or fractional part of an acre of the allotment have not been made on the said allotment by the licensee in each year of the first three years of this licence or if it at any time be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor with the advice aforesaid (and that it has been so shown the production of a copy of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice purporting to be signed by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Act 1901* so declaring or notifying or declaring or notifying that this licence has become forfeited and void shall be conclusive evidence) that the licensee became such licensee or that he held or continued to hold this licence in violation of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1901* or that the licensee has committed a breach of or not fulfilled any of the conditions of this licence then and in any of such cases this licence shall be void and of no effect.

11. That ancillary and without prejudice to the provisions of the 81st and 166th sections of the *Land Act 1901* it is hereby agreed that immediately upon this licence so becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatever to enter upon the said allotment and the licensee and all persons claiming from under or through him for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case His Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same

by any person whomsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and licence thereto and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the licensee and all persons claiming from under or through him to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceeding.

12. That the lands hereby licensed shall during the currency of this licence be deemed lands of the Crown within the meaning of section 419 of the *Land Act 1901* as amended by the *Land Act 1903* (notwithstanding subsection 5 of the said section 419) and that upon the making of any Order in Council under the provisions of the said section the enhanced licence-fee therefor fixed by such Order in Council shall be payable in respect of such lands as though such licence-fee had been so fixed prior to the making of this licence.

13. That if the licensee fence and make the improvements of the nature and value hereinbefore mentioned on the said allotment during the said respective periods and prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works (to be certified under its seal) by such evidence as the said Board may require that he has complied with the said conditions and with all other conditions hereof he shall be entitled at any time after the period of the currency of this licence or during the term of the lease hereinafter mentioned to demand and obtain from the Governor in Council a Crown grant upon payment of or such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater nor more than double the sum of _____ as may be fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 419 of the *Land Act 1901* as amended by the *Land Act 1903* for each acre or fractional part of an acre or otherwise he may obtain a lease of the said allotment and such lease shall be for a term of _____ years at a rent of _____ or of such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater nor more than double the sum of _____ as may be fixed by any Order in Council as aforesaid per annum for each acre or fractional part of an acre so demised payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance and containing the usual covenants for the payment of rent and a condition for re-entry on non-payment thereof and such other covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct.

14. That upon payment of the last sum due on account of the rent under any such lease or at any time during the term upon payment of the difference between the amount of rent actually paid and the entire sum of _____ or such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater nor more than double the sum of _____ as may be fixed by any Order in Council as aforesaid for each acre or fractional part of an acre the lessee or his representatives shall be entitled to a grant in fee of the lands leased and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct.

15. In the case of the insolvency or death of the licensee during the currency of this licence it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency or for the executors or administrators of such licence to assign within the time limited in that behalf by the *Land Act 1901* such licence to any person who is qualified for becoming a licensee under Part I. Division 3 of the *Land Act 1901* and such person shall thereupon be with respect to such licence in the same position as though he had been the original licensee.

16. Except as herein otherwise expressly provided the word "licensee" shall include his executors and administrators and any person or persons in whom this licence may under the provisions of the said Acts become vested.

17. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Acts, except under the 187th section of the Land Act 1901, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the Land Act 1901, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any

compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assignees, for surface or other damage.

4. 6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public.
