### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to further amend the Law relating to Married Women's Property.”

“An Act relating to the Name Style or Title of Companies.”

“An Act to amend the *Fences Act 1890*.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.

## SHIRE OF BRIGHT.—BY-LAW No. 14.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bright, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, as far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the area of the township of Myrtleford.

4. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the area aforesaid from the operation of this By-law.

5. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

7. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents in the day time and the other pan to be left in its place.

9. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted or by some equally efficient means.

10. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

11. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

12. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any such person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty, notwithstanding that the said Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

## SHIRE OF DANDENONG.—BY-LAW No. 16.

IN pursuance of all or any of the powers conferred by the *Public Health Act 1890* and by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the Shire of Dandenong, that is to say:—Commencing at the corner of Eel-Race-road and Church-street; thence along Church-street to Bridge-road; thence along Bridge-road to south-west corner of allotment 26 on L.P. 4168; thence along road to Patterson River; thence by the Patterson River to Beach-road; thence along Beach-road to Mordialloc Creek; thence along Mordialloc Creek to Port Phillip Bay; thence along the shores of Port Phillip Bay to Eel-Race-road; thence along Eel-Race-road to commencing point. The Council of the said Shire may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer or the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this By-law or any part or parts of such By-law.

2. Every owner, lessee, or tenant, and every person having the management or control of any land within the aforesaid area who shall permit any person or persons to camp thereon shall at all times whilst any person or persons are camping on such land provide thereon for the use of campers proper earth closet or earth closets in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained, and the provisions of clauses numbered 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, and 9 of this By-law shall apply to every such owner, lessee, or tenant, and to his or her land as aforesaid as if he or she were an occupier, and as if such land was premises within the meaning of such clauses or any of them.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any house or premises within the foregoing area shall register or cause to be registered all or any night-soil pan or pans in use on such premises, and shall pay to the Council such annual charge as may be made from year to year under the provisions of section 259 of the *Public Health Act 1890*, and at such times as the Council may from time to time direct. Failure to pay this charge shall constitute a breach of this By-law.

4. Every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service, and every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and shall be provided by the occupier.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than three inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public-house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Council.

8. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

9. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for



effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

10. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty, at the discretion of the justices, either of Five pounds for every such breach, or Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES  
BOROUGH COUNCIL.—BY-LAW No. 8.

THE Corporation intituled "The Clunes Water Commissioners" doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the *Water Act* 1905, No. 2016, make the following By-law:—

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the period ending the 30th September, 1909, in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Commissioners, and such rates shall be payable in two moieties, one on the first day of December, 1908, and the other on the first day of April, 1909:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of One pound sterling, except for unoccupied lands where no water is laid on, and on these the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of valuation.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of valuation.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds and not exceeding Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of valuation.
4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Two hundred pounds and not exceeding Three hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds per centum on the amount of valuation.
5. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Three hundred pounds, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of valuation.
6. Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of valuation.
7. Such person as shall be appointed by the Commissioners for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of, the rates hereby made.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.**

WHEREAS by the 190th section of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations, to be observed and enforced in respect of—

2,880 acres reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park.

23,100 acres reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person shall enter or remain in the National Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall, without the permission of the Minister of Lands, or duly authorized officer, remove, cut, damage, or deface any rocks, trees, shrubs, ferns, plants, seats, tables, gates, posts, or fences in the National Park, or write or paint, or otherwise mark, any rock, tree, bridge, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, table, pillar, railing, or any building or other erection within the National Park.

3. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy, or interfere with, or take away any game, wild fowl, or any animal, bird, or fish of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the National Park, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands, or duly authorized officer first obtained.

4. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park without the permission of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer, and then only in such place as may be directed.

5. No person shall camp in the National Park, or erect therein any dwelling, hut, or other structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands, or duly authorized officer.

6. No person shall bring into the National Park, or allow to wander therein, any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands or duly authorized officer.

7. No person shall bathe in the National Park, except in the places set apart for the purpose, and every person bathing therein shall be decently clad from the neck to the knees.

8. No dog shall be allowed in the National Park, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof to prosecution.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the National Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall cut in the National Park, or remove therefrom, any live or dead timber, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands, or duly authorized officer.

11. No motor nor any timber traffic shall be in the National Park, nor any delivery cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or other vehicle carrying a load exceeding one ton, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.—BY-LAW No. 14.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Winchelsea, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 14, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

1. No person shall ride or drive any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads within the Shire of Winchelsea at a greater speed than (20) miles an hour, and within the boundaries of the townships of Winchelsea, Birregurra, Lorne, and Deans Marsh at a greater speed than eight miles an hour without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire, or of the President thereof first had and obtained.

2. No person shall ride or drive any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the Shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person riding or driving any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off-side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.—BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Winchelsea, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea order as follows:—

*Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, grips, or other projections:—

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least three inches in width and not more than three-fourths of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed three inches; or

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon, other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the

space intervening between such cross-bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

- (I.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways as specified.
- (II.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
- (III.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- (IV.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
- (V.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed 3 hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by horses.

*Engines not to Halt in certain Parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side in the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the

driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (A) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (B) For a second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (C) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Winchelsea.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea on the sixth day of December, 1907, and confirmed on the 10th day of January, 1908.

**B**Y-LAWS OF THE COLAC DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

"[All By-laws previously made for the management of this institution, and not herein contained, are hereby repealed.]

Rules 2-11, 13-15, 23, 25, 30, 32-35, 37, 53, 55-57, 50-60, 68-79, were published in *Government Gazette*, 24th September, 1886."

OBJECTS.

1. The hospital shall be for the purpose of affording medical aid and surgical relief in accident or disease, under such conditions as the committee shall from time to time determine.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

12. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday of the month of July in every year, for the following purposes, viz:—

- To receive the annual reports and balance-sheet.
- To fill vacancies in the committee of management.
- To fill vacancies in the medical staff.
- To elect two honorary dentists.
- To elect two auditors.
- To transact any other business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting in connexion with the institution.

16. At all meetings of the contributors or of the committee, the president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall take the chair, but in the absence of these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

17. At all meetings of the contributors or of the committee, the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the voting is equal.

18. It shall be competent for a majority of the committee of management, or for ten or more contributors, by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting to be specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that specified; and every such meeting shall be convened by the secretary by advertisement in one or more local papers at least one week before the day of meeting, with intelligible reference to its object.

MANAGEMENT.

19. The institution shall be governed by a committee of management consisting of eighteen members, twelve representing the town of Colac, and six the country district, all of whom shall be contributors of not less than £1. or benefactors.

20. A special meeting of contributors shall be held as soon as possible after these by-laws shall come into force, and the present members of committee shall hold office until such meeting be held, when they shall retire from office, but be eligible for re-election. At such special meeting of contributors, the committee, as fixed by by-law number 19, shall be elected. At the annual meeting to be held in the year 1909 and 1910, one-third of the committee so elected shall retire from office, those to retire being determined by ballot, and thereafter the committee shall retire and be elected in accordance with the provisions of the Hospital and Charities Act, 54 Vict., No. 1099.

21. The committee shall at the first meeting after such special meeting, and each annual election, elect from amongst themselves the president, vice-president, and treasurer.

22. Any extraordinary vacancies occurring in the committee shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of Act 54 Vict., No. 1099.

24. They shall meet on the second Friday in every month, at Three o'clock p.m., and at such other times as may be necessary. Five members to constitute a quorum.

26. No member of the committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have any pecuniary interest.

27. The committee of management shall, at the first committee meeting subsequent to the annual meeting of subscribers in each year, elect from among themselves a house committee of two, who shall retire from office quarterly, but shall be eligible for re-election. The duties of the house committee shall be to visit the hospital at least once a week, to examine buildings, inspect the wards, make inquiries respecting the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce rules, investigate accounts, and report upon the same and all matters connected with the management of the institution at the next monthly meeting of the general committee. The office of any member of the house committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee.

28. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be members of the house committee, and shall hold office for one year. Should, however, any of these officers be absent without the consent and approval from three consecutive meetings of the house committee, such officer shall cease to be a member of the house committee, and shall also forfeit his office as such president, vice-president, and treasurer.

29. The house committee, as above constituted, shall also be a finance committee (two to form a quorum), for the purpose of examining all accounts for disbursement, and certifying to their correctness.

31. The committee shall be empowered to frame such regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper internal government of the institution on its different departments, provided such regulations are not *ultra vires* to the laws of the institution or the Legislature.

36. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the bank of the institution. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the general committee, at a meeting at which four members at least shall be present.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

38. There shall be three honorary medical officers resident in the Town of Colac, who shall be appointed for the first time at a special general meeting of the subscribers, and thereafter annually in the manner hereinafter determined.

39. The three shall be elected by ballot at the special general meeting referred to above. Nominations must be in writing, signed by a subscriber to the hospital, and also signed by the candidate, and must be lodged with the secretary fourteen days at least prior to such meeting. The medical gentleman who is highest on the poll shall be appointed until the annual general meeting in 1911. He who is second on the poll shall be appointed until the annual meeting in 1910. He who is third on the poll shall be appointed until the annual meeting in 1909.

40. After the first appointment of the honorary medical staff under these regulations, one honorary medical officer shall retire at each annual meeting, and his successor shall be appointed at the annual meeting by the subscribers by ballot for a term of three years. Nominations to fill each annual vacancy shall be received fourteen days at least prior to such annual meeting.

41. Casual vacancies on the medical staff shall be filled by the committee until the next annual meeting, when the subscribers shall fill the position for the unexpired portion of the term of the medical officer whose retirement shall first have caused such vacancy.

42. The medical staff shall be under the control of the committee of the hospital, which may, however, delegate from time to time such of its powers as it thinks fit to the house committee.

43. The general internal superintendence of the hospital shall be given to each honorary medical officer in turn for a week at a time.

- (a) During the week in which he is the superintending officer he shall have the full responsibility for the admission of patients, and such patients as are admitted during his week of office shall continue to be treated by him until discharged. During the week if he shall have occasion to leave the town boundaries of Colac he shall arrange for one of the other honorary medical officers to be within the said boundaries and attend to his hospital duties.

- (b) During the week succeeding that for which any honorary medical officer is the superintending officer he shall administer anaesthetics for the honorary medical officer who succeeds him as the superintending officer in all cases which have to be so treated that week.
- (c) Out-patients are to be attended to twice a week by the medical officer having charge of them, hours of attendance to be decided by the committee.
- (d) All out-patients who become in-patients shall be under the charge of the medical officer who has had charge of them as out-patients.
- (e) Permission to transfer duties will be allowed to any or either of the medical officers amongst themselves, but the committee reserve the right of veto.
- (f) It shall be within the power of the committee to suspend any medical officer, but such suspension shall only remain in force until a special general meeting of subscribers shall be called to deal with the cause of suspension.
- (g) Each of the honorary medical officers shall give lectures to the nurses, under such conditions as to time and curriculum as the committee shall require, in keeping with the rules of the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association.

44. In no case shall any patient in charge of any member of the medical staff have any major surgical operation performed without a consultation of the honorary medical officers.

45. In all serious cases of illness or accident a consultation shall be immediately held of the whole medical staff, or as many of them as may be available.

46. In all medical cases when the illness is protracted for a period of one month, the medical officer in charge of the case shall request an immediate consultation of the honorary medical officers.

47. No major operation shall be performed without due notice being given to all the honorary medical officers.

48. No patient having been admitted for medical treatment shall be discharged as incurable without a consultation by the honorary medical officer in charge of the case with one or more of the honorary medical officers.

49. The results of all consultations and operations shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose. The record of such to be signed by the medical officers.

49. Should a majority of the medical men of Colac not become candidates for the positions of honorary medical officers, or should the number of candidates for such positions not equal the number of vacancies, it shall be within the power of the committee to suspend either wholly or in part the by-laws relating to honorary medical officers; and it shall further be in their power to make such arrangements as are necessary to the effectual conduct of the work of the hospital, including the power to appoint a paid medical officer or officers until the next annual meeting of subscribers.

50. The honorary medical officers shall sign their acceptance of these rules.

#### MATRON.

51. The matron shall reside on the premises, and have the charge, control, and management of the institution and the inmates thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the general and house committee. The matron shall not be absent between the hours of Ten p.m. and Eight a.m., nor more than two hours at a time without permission from the house committee (except on Sundays for three hours). The matron is never to be absent from the institution at any time without leaving some responsible and qualified substitute in charge, who shall be approved of by the superintending officer for the time being.

52. The matron shall have the immediate superintendence of the wardsmen, nurses, and servants, and shall see that they do their duty; and she shall enforce order, sobriety, personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty by them, she shall have power to suspend the offender and report to the house committee.

54. She shall have charge of, and be accountable for, the surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicines and stores, and all other property of the institution; and she shall make an exact inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which she shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, or breakage of any article; and she shall, on the last days of June and December in each year, and at such other times as the General Committee may require, prepare and submit such inventory to the committee.

#### PATIENTS.

58. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket, except in cases of accident and decided emergency. The medical fitness of the applicant shall be determined by the medical officer superintending for the week.

67. Patients shall not sit up after Eight o'clock p.m. in the winter, nor after Nine p.m. in the summer,

and shall rise as directed by the medical officer in charge of the case or by the matron.

#### ALTERATION OR AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

80. No new by-law shall be made, nor any of the existing by-laws rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of a majority of the subscribers present at the annual general meeting; or a majority of subscribers present at a special meeting convened for the purpose; one month's notice of intention to move such rescission, alteration, or amendment shall be given to the committee, except such rescission, alteration, or amendment shall be proposed by the committee, and the committee shall give fourteen days' notice by advertisement to the subscribers.
