PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,  
SURVEY BRANCH.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 31st December next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

## CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

## QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

## COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient

number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the Department as to probation.

## PROBATION.

Accepted candidates (not exceeding two) approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

## TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors' Board as to his qualifications.

## REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

## SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria as far as they are applicable.

## BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties, and to provide for his remaining in the service of the Department for a further term of two years, if required, at a salary of not less than £160 per annum.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1909.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

**BY-LAW NUMBERED 28.**

Fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1909.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum.

Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1909, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. For every public and private water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.
5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1909, and the rates shall be payable in advance, in two moieties, on the first day of January, 1909, and the first day of July, 1909.

7. All rates remaining unpaid for six months after they have become due and payable shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum until they are paid.

**W**HEREAS by section 8 of the *Melbourne Sailors' Home Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII., No. 1772), it is amongst other things provided that all matters relating to the office of the members of committee and their relation to the trustees may be provided for by Regulations which may be made by the Governor in Council, and shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AT MEETINGS OF  
THE COMMITTEE.

1. The Committee may appoint one of their number to be Chairman, with such powers and duties, and (if he so long remain a member) for such term as they may see fit, and they may at any time revoke such appointment. The Chairman at any meeting shall in addition to his own vote, have a casting vote where the voting is equal, and shall be *ex officio* a member of all Sub-Committees.
2. Any member of the Committee may resign his office by letter addressed to the Chairman, and given to the Superintendent, who shall forthwith notify the resignation to the Committee and to the authority which appointed him.
3. At every ordinary meeting of the Committee the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the Minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting.
4. After signing of the Minutes, the order of business of a periodical meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—
  - (a) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Committee or by the Superintendent if called for;
  - (b) reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon;
  - (c) reading and considering the monthly audited financial statement;
  - (d) considering and passing accounts for payments;
  - (e) presentation of reports of Chairman and Committees and considering and ordering thereon. The postponed items of former reports of Committees shall take precedence of new business brought up by Committees;
  - (f) orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of the former meetings and any business the Chairman may think desirable, with the consent of the Committee;
  - (g) motions of which previous notice has been given;
  - (h) notices of motion for consideration at following meeting;
 And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
5. All notices of motion shall be dated, signed and given by the intending mover to the Superintendent either at a meeting of the Committee, or three clear days at the least prior to the holding of any ordinary meeting.

6. No motion for altering or revoking any resolution of the Committee which shall have been negatived shall be again entertained during the same financial year, unless by the consent of at least two-thirds of all the Committee.

7. No member other than the Chairman shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in clause 5.

8. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Committee.

9. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Committee unless it be seconded.

10. It shall be competent for any Committeeman, without previous notice, to move for a call of all the Committee for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and if such motion be carried, notice thereof shall accordingly in due course be given by the Superintendent.

11. Any Committeeman may of right demand the production of any documents, and have access to all the records and documents of the Committee at any meeting thereof.

12. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the members present, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and the results thereof shall be recorded in the Minutes Book.

13. The Committee shall, when a decision is called for, vote by show of hands.

14. At every meeting of the Committee, all motions whether original motions or amendments shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced into writing signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

15. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

16. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

17. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first mentioned was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Committee for discussion at a time. If an amendment be carried it shall become the original motion, and only one amendment shall be made thereon at a time.

18. A motion for adjournment of the Committee or of a debate may be moved at any time, but no discussion shall be allowed thereon. If on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

19. Any member may protest against any resolution of the Committee, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Committee by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Superintendent, and signed by such member, and which shall be entered in the Minutes of the meeting at which the protest was made.

20. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by an insufficient quorum, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was interrupted, at the next meeting.

21. Minutes of all proceedings of the Committee and of Sub-Committees shall be entered in the Minute Book.

22. The Superintendent or any two of the Committee shall convene the first Committee in each financial year for the second Monday in March, or at any other time thereafter, on the order of any two members of Committee.

23. Any one or more of the Rules and Regulations relative to the management and conduct of business at the meetings of the Committee may be suspended for a special purpose by the consent of two-thirds of all the Committee present thereat.

#### CONTROL AND GUIDANCE OF OFFICERS APPOINTED BY THE COMMITTEE, AND THE TIME AND MODE OF ACCOUNTING BY OFFICERS FOR MONEYS COMING TO THEIR HANDS.

24. The Committee shall require that every officer, clerk, or servant of the Committee who shall collect or receive any moneys for or on behalf of the Committee shall daily pay over the same to the Superintendent of the Home, and the receipt of such Superintendent for the moneys so paid shall be a sufficient discharge to said collector, officer, clerk, or servant.

25. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall make true entries in the books provided by the Committee for that purpose, of all moneys or cheques paid to or received by him for and on behalf of the Committee; and when such moneys or cheques shall amount to or represent a sum of Twenty pounds and upwards, he shall within Twenty-four hours or such shorter period as the Committee shall direct after the same shall have come to his hands, pay the same moneys and cheques to the credit of the Melbourne Sailors' Home Account in such Bank as the Committee from time to time shall appoint. No money shall be drawn out of such accounts save by cheque signed by two members of the Finance Committee.

26. It shall be lawful for the Finance Committee, from time to time, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Committee for the purpose of the Act, and also such moneys not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two periodical meetings of the Committee, the sum of One hundred pounds, as may be required for necessary occasions.

27. Except in cases of emergency, no contract for the execution of any work, or for furnishing materials or labour to the amount of One hundred pounds or upwards, shall be entered into, unless five days previous to the date thereof tenders for the same shall have been invited by advertisement published in some newspaper circulating in Melbourne.

28. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall provide security to the amount of Five hundred pounds to be approved of by the Committee for the due payment by him of all such moneys as he shall receive as such Superintendent and as Treasurer, or otherwise, on behalf of the Committee, and for faithful execution of his office.

29. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, to make, alter, or amend rules or regulations for all or any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Fixing a scale of charges for board and lodging and residence in the Melbourne Sailors' Home;
- (b) taking charge of money, luggage, or other property of inmates during their sojourn in the Home;
- (c) regulating the hours of opening and closing the Home, and the good conduct of the inmates of the Home;
- (d) assisting seamen to engage with ship-masters;
- (e) the purchase, at wholesale prices, of goods for seamen's outfits and necessaries, and the sale of same at prices to be regulated by the Committee;
- (f) the hire and dismissal of a Superintendent, and any officers or other persons required in the service of the Home, and to regulate their respective duties;
- (g) generally for regulating the conduct of inmates.

#### POSITION AND DUTIES OF SUPERINTENDENT.

30. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent of the Melbourne Sailors' Home shall be appointed by and shall hold office at the pleasure of the Committee, subject to the approval of and confirmation by the Trustees.

31. The Committee shall require that the office of Superintendent shall carry with it the position of Secretary to the Trustees.

32. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall be Treasurer, and responsible for all accounts, moneys, and effects connected with the Melbourne Sailors' Home or its management.

33. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall himself conform to all rules and regulations of the Melbourne Sailors' Home, or passed by the Committee, and shall be responsible for their observance by all employés under him, and by all persons using the Home.

34. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall have entire control of the domestic servants of the Home, including their appointment, dismissal, and allocation of duties subject to confirmation of the Committee.

35. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall be responsible to the Committee and Trustees for the due performance of their duties by the employés.

36. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall make out and furnish to the Committee a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Home for each and every calendar month: such statement shall, on the expiration of each month, be audited by a professional auditor who shall report thereon, and such audited account and report shall be submitted to the Committee at its then next meeting.

37. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall keep a log book to be provided by the Committee, and shall enter therein, as the occasion may require, a true statement or record of all irregularities and other matters, and things concerning the intaking or rejection or expelling of seamen or persons applying for admission to or frequenting the Home otherwise than in the regular course of business of the Home.

38. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall also, half-yearly, make out and furnish to the Committee a statement or balance-sheet of all moneys received and disbursed by the Committee, and showing the financial position of the Home made up to the 30th day of June and 31st day of December in each year, to be audited by a professional auditor and reported thereon; and submitted to the Committee within one month after each half-yearly period. The Committee shall, within one month after the receipt of each such half-yearly audited balance-sheet forward the same or a copy thereof to the Trustees of the Home, to be by the Trustees submitted to the Auditor-General to be dealt with pursuant to the provisions of section Eleven of the *Melbourne Sailors' Home Act 1901*.

#### GENERAL.

39. The Committee shall require that all moneys received on behalf of the Home shall be by the Superintendent paid into the bankers of the Home to the credit of an account entitled "The Melbourne Sailors' Home," and such account shall be operated upon by cheque to be signed by any two of such four members of the Committee as the Committee may, from time to time, appoint to sign cheques on behalf of the Home; such four members to constitute the Finance Committee of the Home to supervise generally the receipts and expenditure.

40. The Committee shall require that the Superintendent shall prepare and furnish to the Committee half-yearly progress reports of the work of the Home and the condition of its affairs, and the Committee shall forward the same or a copy thereof to the Trustees.

41. The Committee shall meet for the consideration and ordering of all matters relating to the general business of the Home on the second Monday of each calendar month at the hour of half-past Two o'clock p.m., or on such other day and hour as the Committee may by regulation from time to time order or direct.

42. The Committee may appoint from among their number a House Committee, and a Finance Committee, whose members shall meet as often in each month as may be requisite to supervise and set out in detail the general affairs of the Home and the ordering of the expenditure and the banking of moneys received on behalf of the Home, and the general conduct and management or hire and dismissal of any of the servants, and shall submit a report of their respective proceedings and recommendations to the Committee at each of its monthly meetings for confirmation or otherwise.

43. The Committee, with the approval of the Trustees and the Minister, may lease for such term as may be approved at such rent and generally on and subject to such conditions as the Committee may arrange for any part or parts of the building or land known as the Melbourne Sailors' Home to the Federal Government, the Government of Victoria, the Melbourne Harbor Trust, or to any corporation or person in connexion with the shipping interest, or which may be deemed advisable for the welfare of sailors sojourning in the port of Melbourne.

These Regulations are auxiliary to the Regulations made and passed by the Governor in Council on the 5th day of February, 1902, and published in the *Government Gazette*.

And the Honorable John Emanuel Mackey, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET GROUND AND OTHER RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEPPARTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Shepparton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket Ground and other Recreation purposes in the township of Shepparton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall play any game, or run or ride in any race, or train for any game or race or athletic contest, or perform any work in the reserve on Sunday.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or write names, letters, or words on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, nor remove any soil or sand therefrom.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and

improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

10. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, *fêtes*, or holiday amusements, nor bring therein any horse nor any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date indicated thereon, or, if no date be thereon, such ticket shall be of avail on the day of issue only; nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered, on demand, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to collect tickets.

11. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.

12. The net proceeds of all sports or *fêtes*, other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions, and all other moneys received and retained in connexion with the reserve, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement thereof.

13. No person shall ride in the reserve on horseback.

14. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve, on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, *fêtes*, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

*Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of permanent horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depôt for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

A BY-LAW OF THE SHIRE OF DANDENONG, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1903, FOR REGULATING TRAFFIC AND SUPPRESSING NUISANCES.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. No cattle shall be allowed on any road or street in the Shire of Dandenong, except for the purpose of travelling thereon (unless by the permission of the Council).

#### *Travelling Cattle.*

If any cattle are found upon any road or street in such shire (unless by the permission of the Council) in charge or appearing to be in charge of any person or persons, such person or persons and each of them shall, upon demand by any person having the authority of the Council of the Shire of Dandenong to obtain such information forthwith, so far as possible give to such person such information as in the opinion of any Court before whom the matter may come shall be reasonably sufficient to show—

- (1) The place from which such cattle have come, and when they left such place.
- (2) The fixed destination to which they are going.
- (3) The names and addresses of the person or persons in charge, and of the owner of the cattle.

And if such person or persons in charge, or appearing to be in charge as aforesaid, shall fail without reasonable excuse to be shown by him or them to give such information, or shall wilfully give untrue information in respect of any of the matters aforesaid, or if in the opinion of the Court before whom the matter may come the cattle are not *bona fide* travelling to some fixed destination, then in any of such cases such person or persons shall be deemed guilty of an offence against or infraction of this By-law, and upon conviction before any justice of the peace or Court of Petty Sessions shall be liable to forfeit and pay for every such offence or infraction a sum not exceeding One pound per head for every such head of cattle so found.

All such cattle shall be driven in a direct course, so far as practicable, towards their fixed destination given as aforesaid at the minimum distance per day allowed by law, and if such cattle or any of them are found on any road or street within the said Shire of Dandenong (without there being a reasonable excuse therefor) after the expiration of such a period of time as would be sufficient for the cattle travelling as aforesaid to have reached such destination (if within the said shire) or to have passed the boundaries of the said shire (if such destination be outside such boundaries) then the person or persons in charge or appearing to be in charge shall, on conviction before a justice of the peace or Court of Petty Sessions, be liable to forfeit and pay a sum of not exceeding One pound for every head of cattle so found on any road or street within the said shire.

#### *Wandering Cattle.*

If any cattle be at any time found within the Shire of Dandenong (except within such areas and at such times as the Council may permit) without any person having charge of them—

- (a) In any street or road, or
- (b) Upon any unfenced land (not being a common),

the owner of such cattle shall, on conviction before a justice of the peace or a court of petty sessions of any wilful act or default contrary to or tending to the contravention of this provision, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and such justice or Court may, if the cattle are impounded, and

if it is thought necessary or proper so to do, order such cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale shall be applied in payment of the said penalty and the costs awarded, and all pound fees and charges and expenses of sale, and the balance (if any) shall be paid to the owner of the cattle, if demanded.

In addition to the remedies and provisions of the last clause, and either with or without resorting to the same, the proper officer of the Council may seize any such cattle so found without any person having charge of them, and impound them in some convenient pound, and the owner shall be liable to pay all proper pound fees and charges in respect of such impounding, and of seizing and keeping such cattle, in addition to the amount of any penalty and costs under the last clause.

*Lonsdale-street Traffic.*

That from and after the first of July, One thousand nine hundred and eight no cattle travelling the road or being taken to or from the Dandenong market (except with the permission of the Council, and except such cattle as are actually being kept for dairy purposes or being horses are being ridden or driven in harness) shall be driven or conducted through or along Lonsdale-street, in Dandenong, between the points where such street is intersected by Foster-street and Clow-street respectively, so long as they can be driven or conducted through or along the parallel streets on the easterly and westerly sides of Lonsdale-street, and any person who shall wilfully drive or conduct any cattle contrary to the provisions hereof shall, upon conviction before any Justice of the peace or Court of Petty Sessions, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every such head of cattle so driven or conducted.

In the whole of this By-law the word "cattle" shall bear the same interpretation as it bears under the *Local Government Act 1903*.
