# PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN, SURVEY BRANCH.

A PPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, up to 31st December next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connexion with this Department.

### CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

### QUALIFICATIONS.

He must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Mel-bourne or other recognised University, or—

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department, or other authority, as will satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the three subjects named, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also with such certificates submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

### COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the Department as to probation.

### PROBATION.

Accepted candidates (not exceeding two) approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the l'ublic Service as far as they are applicable.

### TERM OF SERVICE.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing or subsequent examination for land surveyors for the purpose of obtaining the certificate of the Surveyors' Board as to his qualifications.

### REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—ist year, £40; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £65; 4th year, £80.

Pure Food Act 1905.—Health Acts.

FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO BEVERAGES AND EXEMPTIONS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 13 of the Regulations made on the 12th October, гооб-
  - (a) It shall not be necessary for Ginger Cordial, Peppermint Cordial, Clove Cordial, or cordials of a like nature to
  - dial, or cordials of a like nature to contain sugar;

    (b) Fruit juice beverages (such as Lime Juice, Lemon Juice, Lemon Squash, Orange Juice) made without sugar or with less than 35 per cent. of sugar may contain salicylic acid or sulphurous acid (the latter calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>)) in a proportion not exceeding 16 grains to the gallon.
- (2) Exemption under section 15, Pure Food Act.—
  Packages of Cod-bricks shall be exempt from such of the provisions of section 15 of the Pure Food Act 1905 as require information, by an accompanying or attached label, tag, or statement as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the Pure Food Act 1905 is liable, on conviction, to the penalty prescribed therein.

These Regulations shall take effect from the 31st day of December, 1908.

- 2. For every house and tenement over Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
- 3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

  4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

  5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter

during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision, or wastes, or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent, shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made. But on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

- 6. No person shall run in any foot race, or ride on any bicycle or train in the reserve on Sunday.
- 7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first ob-
- 8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 9. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unvested by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 10. No person shall bring into the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, poultry, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- annually to the Board of Land and Works.

  11. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, or bring therein any horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person or horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated plot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to any gatekeeper or other person authorized by the Committee of Management to collect tickets.
- 12. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person or committing any nuisance shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission.
- a ticket of admission.

  13. The Committee of Management shall be at liberty at all times, in its discretion, to decline to admit any person or horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle to the reserve, and to remove any person, horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle therefrom, or from any part thereof, or from any building thereon, whether the fee for admission of such person or horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall have been paid or not.

- 14. All net proceeds of cricket or football matches, sports or fêtes or holiday amusements shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
- 15. No child under the age of five years shall be at any time allowed in the reserve unless in charge of and under the control of some responsible person.
- 16. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket and football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be as
  - For the admission of every person over the age of twelve years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five
  - For the admission of every person over the age of six years and not over the age of twelve years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and six-
  - For the admission of every horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
  - For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle, exclusive of passengers, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
  - For the admission of every other unspecified animal, vehicle, or property, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
  - For the admission of every person to any stand, platform, or building, such further sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Pence, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay any penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Nelbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bunk notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within tendays to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to compute the necessary hord within a reasonable time after the accessful to the profiled. complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

- 1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or caten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; cats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild cats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from caten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- 2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of permanent horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
- 3. - 7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
- 8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. - 9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- 10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
- 11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
