FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE FIRST SESSION OF THE TWENTY-SECOND
PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the seventh day of January, 1909, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Three o'clock in the afternoon, in the State Parliament Houses, situate in the Carlton Gardens, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.
