RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING IN CORNER INLET AND PORT, ALBERT.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the expiration of one month from the date hereof it is intended to make a Proclamation restricting netting in the Ports of Corner Inlet and Port Albert as follows, viz.:—
