THE QUARANTINE ORDINANCE OF NETHERLANDS INDIA.

Government Gazette 1892, No. 44, as Amended and Enlarged.

IN THE NAME OF THE QUEEN!

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL OF NETHERLANDS INDIA, with the advice and consent of the Council of Netherlands India, sends greeting, to all who shall see this or hear read, and makes known:—

WHEREAS He has found it expedient that the Regulations for the Prevention of the Introduction and Spread of Contagious Diseases in Netherlands India be repealed and substituted;

Having considered Articles 20, 29, 31 and 33 of the Regulations for the Administration of the Government of Netherlands India;

By virtue of a Royal Decree has approved and enacted the following regulations for the Prevention of the Introduction and Spread of Contagious Diseases in Netherlands India:—

CHAPTER I.

Definition of Contagious Diseases.

Article 1.

(1) The stipulations of this Ordinance are only applicable to cases of Yellow Fever, Asiatic Cholera, Small-pox (variola and varioloid) and—as far as not dealt with by the special stipulations of a later Ordinance to be enacted—to cases of Plague.

(2) The Governor-General may, if deemed expedient, and subject to later Royal approval, declare this Ordinance to be applicable to other contagious diseases, by public decree.

CHAPTER 2.

Declaration of Inspection.

Article 2.

(1) Whenever a contagious disease breaks out at a seaport in Netherlands India in such manner that a large number of persons are suddenly attacked and speedily succumb thereto, especially when several centres of the epidemic are formed, then such port must be declared infected.

(2) The Chief Local Authority in consultation with the health officer if present, decides regarding the declaration of infection and immediately gives notice thereof, if possible, telegraphically, to the Director of Education, Religion and Industry and the Chief of the Residency.

(3) The Director aforesaid, publishes in the *Government Gazette* with the utmost possible despatch that the port is declared infected in accordance with the stipulations of this Ordinance, and at the same time, advises the Chief of the Medical Service. The Chief of the Residency gives notice of the declaration of infection to the senior medical officer of the residency.

(4) If the Chief Local Authority—after consultation with the Health Officer, if present—is of opinion that there is no longer any danger of infection, he withdraws the declaration of infection, after which this decision is made public in the same manner as prescribed by the two preceding paragraphs.

(5) The Chief of the Residency gives notice of the declaration of infection and the withdrawal of same, if possible, telegraphically, to the chief Government officials at all ports which are likely to be soon visited by a ship from the infected, or lately infected, port.

(6) The Governor-General decides which portions of territory or seaports outside of Netherlands India are declared infected, and withdraws such declaration as soon as the disease which was the cause of the declaration has subsided. This declaration and the withdrawal thereof must be published on behalf of the Governor-General in the *Government Gazette*.

CHAPTER 3.

Bills of Health.

Article 3.

(1) The harbor master must hand to masters of ships leaving one port in Netherlands India for another port in Netherlands India a bill of health if the port of clearance has been declared infected, or if a case of contagious disease has broken out on board, or, if the ship, in consequence of such disease, is still in a state of infection when ready to leave.

(2) No claim may be made on the ground of non-possession of a bill of health if the master has intentionally broken the stipulations of Article 9.

(3) The bill of health will be issued by the harbor master corresponding to Model A or B, in the Dutch or Malay language, according to whether the masters are European or native. Mention is made on the clearance as to the issue thereof.

(4) The bills of health must be issued to native masters in the presence of two witnesses who, together with the harbor master, make an indorsement thereon that the masters have also been verbally informed that at the port of clearance a contagious disease exists or has broken out on board.

(5) Masters of ships leaving a Netherlands Indian seaport, whether direct or indirect for a foreign country can, on application, always obtain a bill of health from the harbour master. The bills are drawn up in accordance with Model C.

(6) He who receives a bill of health as referred to in the previous paragraph, and touches at other ports in Netherlands India before leaving for a foreign country, is bound to have the state of health at those ports recorded on his bill of health.

(7) An indorsement must immediately be made on the clearance of the ship, of the issue of a bill of health, and of the visa thereof at the succeeding ports.

Article 4.

Bills of health are exempted from stamp duty and are issued gratis.

Article 5.

(1) Masters of ships entering from ports outside of Netherlands India are bound to produce to the harbor master, on arrival at a port in Netherlands India, a bill of health issued by a competent authority.

(2) If there is a Dutch Consul present at the port of departure, the bill of health must be issued by that authority, or at least be visé by him.

(3) A vessel may only possess one bill of health.

(4) If the vessel touches at a port on the way, the Consul there must sign the bill of health as exhibited with notice as to the state of health at said port, and whether the vessel has had free pratique or not. The authorities are forbidden to retain the bill of health or to issue another in its place.

(5) In the absence of a Dutch Consul the masters must have the bill of health visé by the local competent authority.

(6) The masters may in no case destroy or do away with the bills of health before they have arrived at their ultimate port of destination.

(7) The bill of health is only considered valid if issued within 48 hours before the vessel's departure.

(8) The foregoing regulations are applicable to vessels plying between Singapore, Penang, and several ports in Netherlands India only in so far that those vessels must be in possession of a bill of health, whenever one of the two said ports of departure, or at which they have touched, have been declared infected on account of a contagious disease.

CHAPTER 4.

Cases in which the stipulations of the Ordinance are, or are not applicable.

Article 6.

The stipulations of this Ordinance are not applicable:—

(1) To fishing boats, Customs vessels, pilot boats, and other vessels of less measurement than one "last" (100 c. ft.) capacity.

(2) To guardships of stations.

Article 7.

(1) To ships lying at anchor or ships coming in which must be considered as infected—owing to their falling under the category referred to by Article 3, or owing to a case having shown itself on board while the ships were on the way, or after arrival—the authority concerned, immediately allows the flag hoisted in accordance with Article 9 to be hauled down, whenever the same sickness for which the ship is declared infected has also broken out at the port of arrival or at a place which is in communication therewith by land, and at a distance of not more than 60 pails (of 1506.94 metres) if the communication is kept up by ordinary roads, or 200 kilometres, if there is communication by railroads or tramways.

(2) The order to haul down the yellow flag is given immediately after receipt of the advice, referred to in Article 10, para. 2, of the reason of the hoisting of that flag, and without a previous visit on board of the medical officer charged with that duty.

(3) The Chief Local Authority immediately advises the harbor masters at the seaports situated within the distance referred to by para. 1, of the breaking out of a contagious disease, as also when the disease may be considered as having subsided.

(4) For the application of this article, the disease may be considered as having broken out whenever three cases are reported simultaneously among the population at any of the places referred to in the first para. It may be considered as having subsided whenever no cases have been reported among the population there during three days.

Article 8.

(1) Notwithstanding the stipulations of the foregoing articles, the regulations of this Ordinance are applicable to ships entering Netherlands Indian roads or a Netherlands Indian port, or anchoring there after arrival:—

1st. If they have touched at ports on the voyage, or come from places which at the time of departure were declared infected in consequence of one of the diseases referred to in Article 1, and the ships have not yet undergone the prescribed medical inspection in a Netherlands Indian port, and are granted free pratique.

2nd. Whenever such disease has occurred during the last voyage, or breaks out on board while the ship is lying in the roads.

(2) The word "roads" in this Ordinance also includes the usual anchorages for ships coming from the high seas, inside the bays, and on the rivers and streams.

(3) The masters take measures with all means at their disposal for a rigorous compliance with the regulations of this Ordinance.

(4) For as far as these regulations wholly or partly do not apply to their vessels, they still have, in accordance with orders to be given on behalf of the Government, to comply with the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette* 1892, No. 45).

(5) With the exception of the stipulations of paragraph 2 of Article 16, everything which is prescribed regarding masters in this Ordinance also refers to the commanding officers of war ships, irrespective which flag they fly and for the commanders of the ships belonging to the Government Marine.

CHAPTER 5.

The Hoisting of the Yellow Flag.

Article 9.

(1) The master of a vessel, falling under one of the categories referred to by paragraph 1 of Article 8, hoists a yellow flag in the daytime from the fore topmast, white, after sunset, two burning lanterns are placed on the foretop one under the other.

(2) He takes care that from the moment he falls under the category mentioned by para. 1 of this article, no communication takes place from the ship to the shore, or with other vessels until sanction has been given to his hauling down the yellow flag.

(3) He is bound to take the berth appointed by the competent authority, and to remain there, save as stipulated by Article 18, till free pratique is granted.

(4) Whenever ships with the yellow flag flying, arrive at the old roads of Batavia, they may not anchor there, but must proceed to the roads belonging to the harbor of Batavia, Tandjong Priok, being only admitted to the firstnamed roads, whenever the authority referred to in Article 11 has granted permission to haul down the yellow flag.

(5) Ships destined for Pontianak, and falling under one of the categories referred to in Article 8, para. 1, must first proceed to Padang-Tikar Bay, and remain there till the authority referred to in Article 11 has granted permission to haul down the yellow flag.

Article 10.

(1) The hoisting of the yellow flag takes place as soon as the ship sights land, before entering the roads or harbor, and for ships already lying in the roads or harbor as soon as the disease has been discovered.

(2) The masters are bound to report immediately the reason of the hoisting of the yellow flag either by signalling or by the despatch of a sloop flying the yellow flag in the forepeak, which must hold no communication with other vessels on the way, or with the shore, and remain in sight of the harbor master's office, awaiting further orders.

Article 11.

(1) The harbor master is authorized to grant permission for the hauling down of the yellow flag.

(2) He is at the same time charged with the maintenance of the prohibition concerning communication with the shore, and reports to the Chief Local Authority the measures taken or considered necessary, as also the name of the disease giving rise thereto.

(3) The granting of the permission referred to in paragraph 1 may also, at the request of the harbor master, be issued by the medical authority referred to in Article 15.

Article 12.

(1) The person in charge of a pilot boat is bound to see that his crew have no communication with ships flying the yellow flag, or with ships regarding which he may learn that there is reason for their doing so. He, however, may not withhold his assistance or that of the pilot from the ship. The pilot taken on board is bound to take precautions that the condition mentioned in Article 9 is carried out, and to instruct the master as much as possible of his obligations under this Ordinance. If necessary, written instructions may be issued to the pilot for delivery to the master.

(2) The master is bound to answer the questions put him by the pilot as truthfully and carefully as possible.

Article 13.

(1) By prohibition of communication with the shore it is understood:—

- 1st. That none of the passengers or crew may leave the ship, unless with the permission or order of the person charged with the medical inspection.
- 2nd. That nobody may go on board the ship excepting—

- (a) The pilot.
- (b) The persons charged with medical inspection.
- (c) The persons to whom the disinfection is intrusted.
- (d) Doctors or clergymen ordered to give medical or spiritual assistance to patients.
- (e) The Customs authorities in the performance of their duties.
- (f) The officers of justice and police service whenever their duties compel to do so.

3rd. That, before the medical inspection is finished, and the authority charged with this inspection has given permission thereto, no goods may be discharged, and thereafter only with due observance of the stipulations of paras. 5 and 6 of Article 20, while the persons intrusted with the discharge, may not go on board.

4th. That no other goods may be taken on board besides those which are necessary for the subsistence of passengers and crew on board, or for the treatment of the sick, on condition that the persons intrusted with the conveyance thereof may not go on board.

(2) The clothing of the persons, who, in accordance with the preceding para., are allowed on board, must, as far as possible, be disinfected immediately after they leave the ship, in accordance with the terms of the disinfection regulations of Article 33 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette* 1892, No. 45).

(3) Those persons who, in spite of the prohibition of communication, have gone on board, are looked upon as belonging to passengers and crew, and are subject to the same regulations as they are, without in any way lessening the punishment to be imposed for violating the Ordinance.

CHAPTER 6.

The Medical Inspection.

Article 14.

(1) The ships referred to in Article 8, paragraph 1, with the exceptions referred to in Articles 6 and 7, are subject to a medical inspection.

(2) It takes place in accordance with the following articles, and the instructions to be fixed by the Governor-General.

Article 15.

(1) The medical inspection is conducted:—

- (a) If a guardship is present, by a medical officer appointed to that ship.
- (b) In all other cases by the European medical officer in charge of the local civil medical service.
- (c) In the absence or prevention of attendance of the medical officer referred to in sub. b, by any other European medical officer who has been appointed for that purpose by the Chief Local Authority.

(2) Whenever no European medical officer is available, the harbor master is charged with the medical inspection.

(3) The Chief Local Authority may, however, appoint one of the local native doctors to help the harbor master.

(4) In case there are objections to following the rotation fixed by this article, the Chief Local Authority is authorized to deviate from such rotation and appoint a European medical officer.

Article 16.

(1) The master is bound to answer the questions put to him by the authority charged with the medical inspection, truthfully and carefully, as also to deliver to him the documents referred to in Article 3, para. 1, and Article 5 in so far as he possesses same.

(2) With regard to ships of war, the inspection may be limited to a written reply to the questions put by one of the persons referred to in Article 15. Such reply must be signed by the commanding officer and the senior medical officer on board.

(3) If no written replies are handed in or the replies are insufficient, the medical inspection takes place in the manner laid down by para. 1.

Article 17.

(1) Whenever the yellow flag is shown in compliance with para. 1, sub 2, of Article 8, but it appears from the inspection that no contagious disease as referred to in Article 1 is found existing on board, the authority

charged with the medical inspection must decide in how far danger of infection for others still exists, or whether disinfection must take place or not, before granting permission to haul down the yellow flag.

(2) In case such precautions are not necessary, he can immediately grant the permission referred to; in the opposite case, the disinfection must take place according to his instructions and under his supervision, unless in his judgment the application of the general stipulations in force for infected, or suspected to be infected, ships is necessary, while the master is responsible for the carrying out of the instructions to be given hereafter, in accordance with the stipulations of para. 5 of Article 8.

Article 18.

(1) In case the master of a ship which is in an infected state will not submit to the instructions given to him by the competent authority, he is at liberty to proceed to sea.

(2) The master may, in that case, be allowed by the authority charged with the medical inspection to land his passengers, who express their desire to do so with their luggage, provided they submit themselves to the prescribed, or (in the opinion of last named authority) necessary precautions regarding disinfection.

(3) The master may also, in that case, be authorized to discharge his cargo after the prescribed or, in the judgment of the authority charged with the medical inspection, necessary precautions have been taken, such as:—Isolation of the ship with passengers and crew, discharge of the bilge water after disinfection thereof, and replacing of the drinking water on board by pure water from the shore.

Article 19.

The person who conducts the inspection referred to in Article 14 gives written notice to the Chief Local Authority through the intermediacy of the harbor master, if, in the interests of the public health, measures must be taken which the medical officer does not consider himself empowered to take, and the Chief Local Authority immediately carries out same, as far as possible in accordance with the stipulations of this Ordinance, unless he finds insurmountable objections thereto. In such case he brings same to the notice of the Chief of the Residency, who finally decides.

Article 20.

(1) Ships found infected, or suspected of being infected, at the medical inspection must, in so far as the authority charged with the medical inspection considers necessary, be immediately disinfected, after the removal of the passengers and that portion of the crew which is not required to take charge of the ship, or to lend assistance at the disinfection.

(2) As soon as the disinfection of the ship is finished, the persons remaining on board must also be disinfected.

(3) When there are patients still on board, a portion of the ship can be disinfected and later on the remainder, or once again the whole ship according to circumstances.

(4) The disinfection takes place in accordance with the stipulations of the Disinfection Regulations.

(5) The merchandise present on board is allowed to be taken on shore without hindrance, unless the state of the ship or the description of the goods makes disinfection necessary.

(6) Clothing and bedclothes, together with other objects which have been in contact with sick persons, or deceased, must be disinfected, or destroyed after expropriation, in accordance with the rules referred to in para. 4, or in accordance with Article 27 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette* 1892, No. 45).

(7) After the taking of all measures considered necessary in terms of this Article, and according to the following Chapter, against the spread of infection, permission may be granted to haul down the yellow flag, which is a signal, that the prohibition of communication with the shore and other vessels has been withdrawn.

Article 21.

(1) The expenses of the medical inspection and the measures taken in consequence thereof, are for account of the Government, excepting:—

- 1st. In the event referred to by para. 1 of Article 25;
- 2nd. Whenever, owing to the violation of Article 5 a medical inspection takes place;

3rd. Whenever the master has hoisted the yellow flag without such action having been prescribed by the regulations, and he could have known that such was unnecessary.

(2) In the cases mentioned under 2 and 3, the expenses are for account of the ship.

(3) Medical officers and harbor masters are authorized to charge whatever fees may be fixed by the Governor-General.

CHAPTER 7.

The Care of Passengers and Crew.

Article 22.

(1) The passengers and crew who are not found suffering from a contagious disease at the medical inspection may, as soon as permission is granted by the authority charged with the medical inspection, be allowed to go ashore without hindrance; disinfection must, however, take place if the medical officer considers such necessary.

(2) They may not come aboard again before free pratique has been granted.

Article 23.

(1) The passengers and crew who, at the medical inspection, are found suffering from a contagious disease, or show signs which lead to the expectation of the outbreak of such disease, must be conveyed to an establishment appointed by the Chief Local Authority, in the manner prescribed by Article 17 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette* 1892, No. 45), fitted up as suitably as possible for the treatment of patients suffering from contagious diseases, and there be isolated and treated unless the authority charged with the medical inspection declares that the state of the patient does not admit of his transportation, or, that there are other circumstances which render the transportation inadvisable.

(2) Patients residing in the place where the inspection is conducted, or in the immediate neighbourhood may, with the permission of the Chief Local Authority, granted after consultation with the authority charged with the medical inspection, be conveyed to their residences.

(3) No carriages or boats may be used for the transportation referred to in the two preceding paras. than those appointed or approved of by the Chief Local Authority. They must, if necessary, be disinfected after being used, in accordance with the stipulations of the Disinfection Regulations.

(4) Articles 18 and 19 of the Epidemic Ordinance (*Government Gazette* 1892, No. 45), are applicable to the burial of persons who have died from one of the diseases mentioned.

Article 24.

(1) If there is no local establishment for the treatment of patients, the patients mentioned in the preceding article must, if possible, be conveyed to a neighbouring establishment.

(2) The chiefs of residencies are, in accordance with Article 13 of the Epidemic Ordinance, also authorized to have temporary sheds built for the treatment of patients suffering from a contagious disease.

Article 25.

(1) The expenses of erectment and burial are, as far as the crew are concerned, for account of the ship, and as far as the passengers are concerned, paid by themselves or by their heirs.

(2) Destitute passengers are treated and buried for account of the Government.

(3) The Governor-General fixes the tariff of expenses.

CHAPTER 7a.

The Embarkation of Private Soldiers, Contract Coolies, Convicts and Prisoners.

Article 25a.

(1) At seaports, which are declared infected owing to cholera or small-pox and where a medical officer is present, private soldiers, contract coolies, convicts, and prisoners, and members of their families who accompany them, may not be embarked for conveyance by sea to a port, either within or beyond Netherlands India, unless after a medical inspection they are found free from all symptoms of aforesaid diseases.

(2) The medical inspection takes place by day on shore and as shortly as possible before the embarkation.

(3) A medical certificate will be granted in favour of those who have been found free from cholera or small-pox. This certificate may hold good for a number of persons, provided each one is mentioned therein by name.

(4) The master of the ship in which the embarkation takes place does not allow the passengers mentioned in para. 1 to embark unless on production of the medical certificate mentioned in the preceding paragraph.

(5) The inspection is conducted by the medical officer who, in accordance with Article 15, is intrusted with the medical inspection therein referred to.

(6) The consular representative of the country to which the ship belongs may be present at the inspection.

Article 25b.

(1) The medical officers charged with the medical inspection referred to by Article 25a have the right to charge whatever fee may be fixed by the Governor-General.

(2) The expenses of the inspection are for account of the Government.

Article 25c.

The master who allows passengers to embark in violation of Article 25a will be punished with a fine of from One hundred and ten to Five hundred and fifty guilders for each passenger thus embarked.

CHAPTER 8.

The Enforcement of the Regulations.

Article 26.

Any one who hinders or opposes the carrying out of the stipulations of this Ordinance, or the medical inspection, will be punished as far as Europeans are concerned, with imprisonment, and natives with imprisonment with hard labour, from one month to two years, and a money fine of from F 100—to F 2,000—together or separately, unless a heavier punishment is fixed for same by the Penal Code.

Article 27.

Violation of the stipulations of the sixth para. of Article 3 and Articles 9, 10, 12, 13, 16, para. 2 of Article 17, para. 2 of Article 22, and para. 3 of Article 23, will be punished, as far as Europeans are concerned, with imprisonment, and natives, with imprisonment with hard labour, unmanacled, from fourteen days to one year, or a money fine of from F 25—to F 500.—

Article 28.

The penalty for the non-hoisting of the flag and for non-burning of lanterns, as prescribed by the first para. of Article 9, is, in cases referred to by para. 1, section 1 of Article 8, not applicable to those who, while in default, could not have known that the port of departure was infected.

Article 29.

(1) Ship and cargo are distrainable and executable for the money fines imposed on the master in accordance with Articles 26 and 27, and for expenses which are to be paid by him.

(2) The sentence of judgment must always contain a declaration of the authority of the officer charged with the execution, to continue the embargo on the vessel and to prevent the departure thereof till the money fine has been paid, if the sale under execution is, in the interests of the public health, considered inadvisable by the Chief Local Authority.

Article 30.

The Chief Local Authority, and the staff approved by and accompanying him, are authorized, for the carrying out of this Ordinance, to board, at all times, ships entering from the high sea or on arrival even without the permission of the master.

Article 31.

For the due observance of all orders issued in accordance with this Ordinance, the Chief of the Residency may, if necessary, call in the help of the naval or military forces.

Article 32.

The Inspector of the Civil Medical Service for Java and Madura, and the Senior Medical Officers of the Residencies, supervise the working and application of the stipulations, if necessary give information to the local authorities, of everything which must be taken into consideration for the carrying out thereof, and report at the end of each year, and, if necessary, at shorter intervals, to the Chief of the Medical Service, of everything that has been done and observed by them.

CHAPTER 9.

The Coming into Force of the Ordinance.

Article 33.

The Ordinance of 21st February, 1879 (*Government Gazette* No. 99), 5th June, 1882 (*Government Gazette* No. 157), and of 6th March, 1887 (*Government Gazette* No. 53), as also the decrees of 21st February, 1879, No. 5 (*Government Gazette* No. 100), and 23rd February, 1883, No. 11 (*Government Gazette* No. 74), are repealed.

Article 33a.

This Ordinance may be cited as the "Quarantine Ordinance."

Article 34.

This Ordinance takes effect on the 20th of August, 1892.

PORT OF GEELONG (HOPETOUN CHANNEL).

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 2 of 1907, mariners and others are hereby informed that the Dredger *Thomas Bent* has resumed dredging at the eastern end (near No. 4 Beacon) of the Hopetoun Channel, and is working to the westward, and in order to indicate the side on which vessels navigating the Channel are to pass the Dredger, there will be exhibited (by day) a basket ball from the port or starboard side of the Dredger, and by night two (2) red lights in a vertical position not less than six (6) feet apart. Two anchor lights will also be exhibited by night, one at the stem and one at the stern of the Dredger.

During the night, and when not working or when a vessel is about to pass the Dredger, she will be hove to as close to either side of the Channel as practicable, but will not be entirely clear of the Channel.

Caution.—Mariners and others navigating the Channel must pass the Dredger at the lowest possible speed, and must stop the engines whilst passing over the Dredger chains.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law for the year 1908 in respect of such Urban District:—

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid, to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land, but in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

(b) For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

(c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings.

(d) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1908, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1908.

(e) Such person as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 53 of the *Water Act* 1905 (Act No. 2016), the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth by this present Order exercise the powers and authorities following:—

1st. Under the power conferred to extend any irrigation and water supply district by the addition thereto of any land that has not theretofore formed part of an irrigation and water supply district, it is hereby ordered that the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply District be extended by adding to the same (and as on and from the 1st day of July last past such district shall be deemed to be so extended) the land following, such land not having heretofore formed part of an irrigation and water supply district, that is to say:—

That land comprising the whole of allotment 24 in the parish of Rochester West.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING CONFERENCES OF DELEGATES, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of February, 1908.

WHEREAS by section 30 of the *Mines Act 1904* (No. 1961), as amended by section 57 of the *Mines Act 1907* (No. 2127), it is provided that delegates of the Mining Boards of all the mining districts assembled in Conference may make By-laws for any of the purposes for which a Mining Board is, by section one hundred and six of the *Mines Act 1890*, empowered to make By-laws, and that the Governor in Council may make regulations for convening Conferences of Delegates of Mining Boards, for prescribing the number of delegates to be elected by each Mining Board, and the times and manner of election, and what number of delegates shall constitute a quorum for the purposes of a Conference, and generally for regulating the proceedings at such Conferences: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said Acts, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following Regulations:—

ELECTION OF DELEGATES, ETC.

1. (a) On notice being sent by the Secretary for Mines to the Clerk of a Mining Board, the Board shall, at its first practicable sitting, elect one of its members a delegate to represent such Board on a Conference of Delegates of Mining Boards.
- (b) Within seven days of the election of a delegate as aforesaid, his name and address shall be sent to the Secretary for Mines by the Clerk to the Board.
- (c) The time and place of any meeting of any Conference shall be fixed by the Minister of Mines, and shall be communicated to the Clerks of the several Mining Boards by the Secretary for Mines.
- (d) At the first meeting the delegates at such Conference shall proceed to the election of a Chairman. The delegate who shall receive the greatest number of votes shall be the Chairman of such Conference, but no delegate shall be entitled to vote for himself. In case any two or more delegates shall receive an equal number of votes, the Chairman shall be selected from such two or more delegates by lot.
- (e) Any five of the delegates elected as aforesaid for any Conference shall form a quorum.
- (f) In case of the absence of the Chairman, it shall be lawful for the delegates present, being a quorum, to appoint an acting Chairman, who, during such absence, may exercise the powers vested in the Chairman.

ORDER OF MEETINGS.

2. The first business at each sitting of the Conference shall be to confirm and, if necessary, amend the minutes of the preceding sitting.
3. The reading of correspondence shall take precedence of all other business in the order herein stated.
4. All motions shall be considered in the order in which they are proposed.
5. No notice of motion shall be proceeded with until seconded, nor shall any motion be withdrawn, unless by the sanction of the Conference. Any delegate about to propose a motion shall, if considered necessary by the Chairman, read the same before speaking to it.
6. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Conference, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof, together with the names of the delegates voting upon any question, shall be recorded in the minutes. The Conference shall vote by show of hands.
7. The Secretary to the Conference, who shall be appointed by the Minister of Mines, shall have charge of all books, records, &c., and shall keep the minutes of the proceedings.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

8. Any delegate upon proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the Chairman. No delegate shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall resume his seat. The delegate calling to order shall then be heard, and the question of order decided by the Chairman before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.

9. If more than one delegate rise at the same time, the Chairman shall decide respecting which delegate shall speak first.

10. No delegate shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as a mover of an original motion; after such reply the question shall be immediately put to the vote, unless an amendment be moved. When, however, any amendment has been proposed and seconded, it may be discussed, and the question upon it put by the Chairman before he shall put the original motion.

If no amendment shall be proposed, nor any amendment proposed shall be carried, then the original motion shall be put to the vote.

11. No delegate shall digress from the subject under discussion. Any delegate who may impute motives or make use of an expression calculated, in the opinion of the Chairman, to offend any other delegate to the Conference, shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw such expression and apologize to the Conference.

12. The decision of the Chairman shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

13. Any delegate may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Conference bearing upon the question under consideration.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, and if the question shall be decided in the negative, the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment be again entertained.

15. The ordinary rules of debate shall apply to any question arising which may not be provided for in the foregoing.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the *Land Act 1890*, certain Crown lands were proclaimed as townships: And whereas it is expedient to partly rescind the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in Part I. of the *Land Act 1901*, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

LAWLOIT.—The Proclamation bearing date the 10th November, 1891, by which certain Crown lands were proclaimed as townships, is hereby rescinded so far only as it relates to the portions of the township at Lawloit, in the parish of Lawloit, hereinafter described, viz.:—

Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 6; bounded thence by that allotment, allotments 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, and a line bearing west twenty-four chains thirty-nine links; thence by a road bearing south three chains ninety-five links; thence by the road to Kaniva bearing N. 50 deg. 0 min. W. forty-five chains five links; and thence by the boundary of the township bearing east and south to the point of commencement.

And: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 7; bounded thence by that allotment and allotments 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 bearing west twenty-two chains eighty-nine links; thence by a road bearing south thirty-six chains twenty-six links; and thence by the boundary of the township bearing east and north to the point of commencement.—(L.1374(2) (07.B.122455.)

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE WARRINGAL (HEIDELBERG) PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees for the Warringal (Heidelberg) Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the Cemetery to be made to the Trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in the scale of fees.

4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the Trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person duly appointed by them.

6. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

8. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the Trustees for their approval.

9. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

10. Wooden fencings allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the Trustees.

11. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule C given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

12. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than three feet below that level; and a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

13. No re-interment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there is submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

14. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or other person appointed by the Trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of 10 a.m. and sunset the previous day.

15. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

16. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

17. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

18. The usual hours for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st of September to 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months of the year.

19. A plan of the Cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in the scale of fees.

20. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tomb-stone, building, erection, railing, fence; shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the Cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the 39th section of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

21. The Trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
RACING, RECREATION, AND PUBLIC PARK
PURPOSES KNOWN AS THE CAULFIELD RACE-
COURSE.

PREAMBLE.

WE, James Grice, George Woodforde, Norman Wilson, William Pitt, Francis Sidney Stephen, Adrian Charles Akhurst, Charles Frederick Kirkham, and Frederick George Wood, being a majority of the duly appointed Trustees of the land and premises being allotments A and B in the parish of Prahran, county of Bourke, the subject-matter of a Crown grant dated the 31st day of August, 1888, and known as the Caulfield Race-course Reserve, have, in the exercise of the powers conferred on us by the said Crown grant and by the *Land Act 1901*, and of any and every other power enabling us so to do, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, made the following Regulations:—

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

REGULATION I.

Repeal of Former Regulations.

The Regulations and By-laws heretofore made with reference to the said land, or any part thereof, are hereby repealed and rescinded.

REGULATION II.

Divisions of Land.

The divisions into which the said land, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out are as follow:—

- (1) The Lawn, the Public Grand Stands thereon, and Inner Carriage Paddock and Approaches.
- (2) The Reserve and Stand set apart for Members of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club on race days, and known as the Members' Reserve and Members' Stand.
- (3) The Weighing Yard, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Rooms and Offices, the Committee Stand, the Stewards' Stand, the Judge's Box, and Approaches.
- (4) The Inner Flat Enclosure and Outer Flat Enclosure and Stand thereon.
- (5) The Training Ground and Approaches.
- (6) The enclosure called "The Birdcage," including the adjoining training sheds enclosure.
- (7) The Course Proper and Approaches.
- (8) The enclosure called the Outer Carriage Paddock.

REGULATION III.

Bringing Racehorses, &c., on Land.

Except when a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racehorse or racing pony on any part of the said land without the consent in writing of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized in writing by such Trustees. When a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racehorse or racing pony on any part of the said land without the consent in writing of the Committee or Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or of some person duly authorized in writing by such Committee or Stewards.

REGULATION IV.

Training Horses.

The fee for permission to train or exercise horses or ponies on the said land shall be for each horse or pony for each half-year, 40s. Horses and ponies shall be trained and exercised on such part or parts of the said land as the Trustees or some person duly authorized in writing by the Trustees may from time to time direct. No person shall train or exercise a horse or pony upon any other part of the said land.

REGULATION V.

Application of Training Fees.

The moneys received as fees for permission to train horses and ponies shall be applied in maintaining the training grounds and course proper in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing purposes.

REGULATION VI.

Damaging Buildings, &c.

No person shall in any way damage or deface any fence, building, or erection on the said land.

REGULATION VII.

Distributing and Posting Bills, &c.

Except when a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized in writing by the Trustees, distribute or assist in distributing any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick or assist in posting or sticking any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

When a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or of some person duly authorized in writing by the said Committee, distribute or assist in distributing any bill, placard, or notice within the limits of the said land, or post or stick or assist in posting or sticking any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises on the said land.

REGULATION VIII.

Entering upon Certain Parts of the Land.

Except when a race meeting is being held on the said land, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized in writing by the Trustees, enter upon any part of the divisions of the said land numbered one, two, three, six, and eight.

REGULATION IX.

Lighting Fires.

Except when a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized in writing by the Trustees, light any fire on any part of the said land or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

When a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or of some person duly authorized in writing by the said Committee, light any fire on any part of the said land or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

REGULATION X.

Remaining in Buildings at Night.

No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees or of some person duly authorized in writing by the Trustees, enter or remain within any building, shed, or other premises on the said land after seven o'clock in the evening.

REGULATION XI.

Misconduct, &c., on the Land.

No person shall on the said land—

- (1) Assault any other person;
- (2) Use any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words;
- (3) Be drunk and disorderly;
- (4) Behave riotously or indecently, or otherwise misbehave or misconduct himself.

REGULATION XII.

Dogs.

No person shall take any dog on any part of the said land when a race meeting is being held thereon, and no person shall at any time take or keep any dog on any part of the said land unless such dog is led by a chain or string or other similar means.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO RACE DAYS ONLY.

REGULATION XIII.

Restriction to Race Days.

The following Regulations, XIV. to XXIII., both inclusive, shall apply only to days on which race meetings are held on the said land.

REGULATION XIV.

Entering on Land without a Ticket.

Unless otherwise authorized under these Regulations, no person shall enter upon any part of the said land unless he shall have a ticket duly authorizing him so to do.

REGULATION XV.

Tolls and Charges.

The following tolls, entrance-fees, and charges for admission shall be levied upon, taken from, and made to persons other than members of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club and ladies holding ladies' tickets of the said Club:—

Every person paying the prescribed sum for admission shall be supplied with a ticket of admission.

Provided that the Committee or Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or any person duly authorized in writing by the said Committee or Stewards may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such tolls, entrance-fees, or charges.

REGULATION XVI.

Production and Surrender of Tickets.

Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing him to enter upon any part of the said land shall, upon demand, produce such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee or Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club to demand production of the same. Every person who has received a ticket under the last preceding Regulation shall, in addition, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from such Committee or Stewards to demand the surrender of the same.

REGULATION XVII.

Judge's Box, Stewards' Stand, &c.

No person except the Judge and Timekeeper, and any person the Judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the Judge's box. No person shall enter the Stewards' Stand or the Stewards' Room except the Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, and such persons as they may invite to do so.

REGULATION XVIII.

Weighing Stand and Yard.

No person shall enter or remain in the Weighing Stand or the Weighing Yard or the approaches thereto except the Stewards and Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club and those authorized by such Stewards or Committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or are about to be weighed.

REGULATION XIX.

Committee Stand and Rooms, &c.

No person shall enter the Committee Stand or the Committee Rooms and Offices or the approaches thereto respectively except the Committee and Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club and those authorized by such Committee or Stewards.

REGULATION XX.

Thieves, Pickpockets, &c.

No person who has been convicted in a Court of Law of larceny or of an attempt to commit larceny, or of obtaining money by false pretences or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretences, or who is a reputed thief, pickpocket, balancer, welsher, or prostitute shall enter or remain on any part of the said land.

REGULATION XXI.

Remaining on Land after Race Meeting.

No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee or Stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or of some person duly authorized by such Committee or Stewards, remain on any part of the said land, except the fourth, fifth, and seventh divisions, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day has been run.

REGULATION XXII.

Warning Off.

Any person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club to be a defaulter, or to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by the said Committee either directly or by the adoption of the said Committee of a disqualification of any other racing club, may be warned off the said land, or any part or division thereof, by the said Committee or by any person duly authorized by the said Committee in that behalf.

REGULATION XXIII.

Remaining on Land after Warning-Off.

No person shall remain on the said land or on any part or division thereof after having been warned off such land, part, or division under the last preceding Regulation.

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

REGULATION XXIV.

Removal of Offenders.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations may be removed from the said land, and such removal shall not exempt him from any penalty to which he would otherwise be liable for such offence.

Penalties.

Every person offending against any of the above Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Part V. Regulations, &c., of buildings. Section 1,

2, 3, and 4.

- (2) Ruinous or dangerous buildings, &c. Sections 5, 6, 7, and 8.

Part VII. Fire Prevention—

- (1) Foul chimneys. Sections 1 and 2.
- (2) Deposit, &c., of inflammable materials, &c. Sections 3 to 7 inclusive.

Part VIII. Nuisances, &c.—

- (1) Nuisances of various kinds—
- (a) Goats. Sections 1 to 8 inclusive.

Part IX. Miscellaneous matters. Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5.

Part X. Carriage of Persons and Goods—

- (1) Passenger vehicles. Sections 1 to 35 inclusive, and sections 37 to 49 inclusive.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BY-LAW NO. 21.

A By-law of the Borough of Wangaratta, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 21, to prohibit the driving of carts, carriages, bicycles, and other vehicles at night without a light in the Borough of Wangaratta.

Every person who during the hours between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in or upon or along any of the roads, streets, thoroughfares, or places used as such, or any public place within the borough of Wangaratta, drive, ride, or impel or allow to remain stationary, any vehicle, shall carry a lamp or lantern which shall be properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the front or right side of such vehicle in such manner as to exhibit a light which shall be plainly visible to any person, and the driver of any vehicle proceeding along or through the same street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first mentioned vehicle is directed or proceeding, and every driver or person in charge or control of such vehicle shall keep such lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and exhibited as aforesaid.

3. Every person who does not comply with any of the provisions of the by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Wangaratta.

Lotteries Gaming and Betting Act 1906.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE
COMMITTEE OF THE BENDIGO JOCKEY CLUB.

CONDUCTING race meetings on the race-course known as the Epsom Race-course, and licensed under the *Lotteries Gaming and Betting Act 1906*, in pursuance of the powers and authority conferred by the said Act:—

BOOKMAKERS AND BOOKMAKERS' CLERKS.

1. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk on any part of the said race-course except the following parts, which are hereby specially set apart for that purpose:—

1. That part of the Grand Stand enclosure delineated on the plan annexed and marked "Grand Stand Ring."

2. That part of the course delineated on the said plan and marked "Flat Ring."

2. Every person desiring to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk on the said race-course shall make application, in writing, to the committee for permission so to do, stating on which of the parts above set out he desires permission to carry on the said business or vocation.

3. If the applicant be approved by the committee, and pay in advance a fee or charge according to the scale hereinafter set out, the committee may permit him to so carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk.

4. To every person so approved and permitted, the committee shall issue a permit, in writing, stating the period during which, and the part or parts whereon he is to carry on the said business or vocation, and that such permit is issued subject to these regulations.

5. Such permit, until determined by revocation or effluxion of time, shall be evidence that the person named therein is approved and permitted by the committee, and shall entitle him to carry on the said business or vocation on the part or parts therein named subject to these regulations.

6. The scale of fees or charges above referred to is as follows:—

For permission to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker—

Grand Stand Ring—Not exceeding 21s. per day.

Flat Ring—Not exceeding 10s. 6d. per day.

The fees or charges hereinbefore set out shall in each instance permit the bookmaker to employ upon the part of the race-course to which his permit relates one clerk, approved and permitted as aforesaid.

7. The fee or charge for any clerk approved and permitted as aforesaid; but not coming within the last preceding rule, shall be—

Grand Stand Ring—Not exceeding 5s. per day.

Flat Ring—Not exceeding 2s. 6d. per day.

8. Any person who carries on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk on any part of the said race-course without a permit authorizing him so to do may be prevented from so doing by the committee and may be removed by them from the said race-course.

9. Every person shall during each race meeting at which he is carrying on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, wear in such a manner as to be clearly visible to the public, a badge or ticket supplied by the committee, which badge or ticket shall have his name clearly written or printed thereon.

10. Any person having a permit who on the said race-course—

1. Offends against Regulation 9,
2. Makes a bet for or with any jockey or apprentice, or with any female, or youth apparently under the age of 21 years,
3. Is drunk and disorderly,
4. Assaults any person, or makes use of any profane, indecent, obscene, or blasphemous language, or any threatening or abusive words, or otherwise misconducts or misbehaves himself,
5. Is guilty of any dishonorable or improper conduct in connexion with any race or race meeting held thereon,

may be prevented by the committee from carrying on the said business or vocation, and may be removed by them from the said race-course.

11. If any person having a permit be convicted in a Court of Law of any offence punishable by imprisonment, or be shown to the satisfaction of the committee to have—

- (a) Obtained his permit by misrepresentation or concealment of any material fact, or
- (b) Made a bet with a jockey or apprentice under such circumstances as to indicate bribery or corruption, or
- (c) Made default in payment of any bet made by him, or
- (d) Misconducted or misbehaved himself on the said race-course, or
- (e) Been guilty of any malpractice, or dishonorable or improper conduct in connexion with horse racing, or betting on the said race-course or elsewhere, or
- (f) Been disqualified by the committee or stewards or governing body of any racing club,

the committee may (whether they have exercised any powers under Regulation 10 or not) revoke his permit and withdraw their approval and permission, and shall not be under any obligation to repay to such person any portion of the fee or charge which he has paid for such permit.

JOCKEYS AND TRAINERS.

12. The regulations governing jockeys and trainers shall be such as are from time to time adopted by the Victoria Racing Club.

CATERERS.

13. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a caterer on the said race-course unless he be approved by the committee and permitted so to do.

14. Any person not so approved and permitted who carries on the said business or vocation may be prevented by the committee from so doing, and removed by them from the said race-course.

GENERAL.

15. No person shall on the said race-course carry on any business or vocation other than those hereinbefore provided for without the approval and permission of the committee.

16. Any person offending against the last preceding regulation may be prevented by the committee from carrying on the said business or vocation, and may be removed by them from the said race-course.
