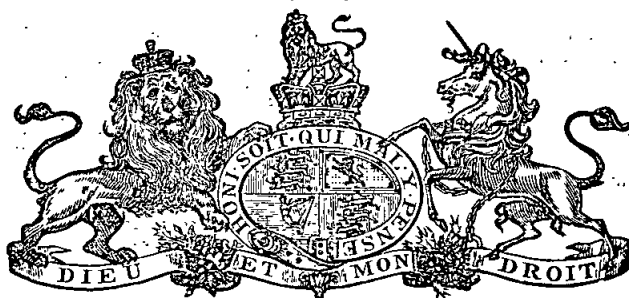

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH, 1908, in the Shire of Maffra*, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, in the Township of Mortlake*;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF APRIL, 1908, in the Shire of Huntly* and the Western* and Central* Ridings of the Shire of Waranga;

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF APRIL, 1908, in the Shire of Yea;

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF APRIL, 1908, in the Shire of Seymour*.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ENFORCE COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF MINING DEVELOPMENT ACT 1896.

WHEREAS The Rob Roy Gold Mining Company No Liability, whose registered office is at 369 Collins-street, Melbourne, in the State of Victoria (hereinafter called the mortgagor), has made default in payment of interest due and payable, under and by virtue of the following securities, namely:—

To His Excellency the Governor in Council.

MAY it please Your Excellency, the humble petition of the undersigned sheweth—

1. That an association, called The Young Men's Christian Association of Bendigo, has been established in the city of Bendigo since the year 1907.
2. That the objects of such association include, amongst other things, the promotion of health, temperance, and morality, the prevention of cruelty and vice, and other cognate objects of a philanthropic and humane nature, as set out in section 19 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.
3. That the said association is supported almost entirely by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom has paid and pays not less than One pound per annum.
4. That your petitioners are annual voluntary contributors to such association, and have each paid not less than One pound towards the support of such association.
5. That your petitioners believe that it would be to the advantage of the said association to be incorporated under the provisions of the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.
6. Your petitioners desire the name of the association to continue as at present, The Young Men's Christian Association of Bendigo, and further desire such association to have perpetual succession and a common seal.

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the contributors for the time being to such association may be incorporated in terms and under the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

GULF ST. VINCENT.—SEMAPHORE ANCHORAGE.—WRECK OF SHIP "NORMA."

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 1 of 1908, masters of vessels are informed that the vessel *Argyle* will remain in position until about the 8th March, 1908, when she will be removed, and in lieu thereof the sunken wreck of the *Norma* will be marked by Two Green Buoys moored at either end thereof.

From the south one at night a Green Occulting Light will be shown, and a fixed Green Light from the northern one.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. VANLEY BROS.,
PRINTERS, AIRMAR-Street, SOUTH MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 10th March, 1908, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

10. The ring barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

11. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

By-Law No. 57.

A By-law of the Town of Brighton, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 57, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any Fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) And for repealing all By-laws and Regulations inconsistent therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—
1. That this By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

2. By-law No. 49 heretofore in force in the municipality is hereby expressly repealed.

3. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

4. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or addition to any building without first submitting to the Council, through its Town Clerk, plans and specifications of the proposed building or addition, and without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Council to such building or addition, which permit the Council may revoke after three months from the date thereof if the building or addition be not proceeded with to the satisfaction of the Council.

5. All plans and specifications of any building, or of any addition to any building submitted to the Council must show, or state the purpose for which the building or addition is intended to be used as well as all details of construction, including sizes and qualities of all materials proposed to be used; the position of the proposed building or addition relative to contiguous buildings, erections, fences, or hoardings, if any, or to cross streets, lanes, and rights-of-way, to street alignment, and to the boundary lines of land not in the same occupation; proposed drainage arrangement, and the name and address of the owner of the land on which it is proposed to build, and, where necessary to comply with the provisions of this By-law, an estimate of the cost of the building shall accompany the plans and specifications. Plans and specifications in pencil will not be considered by the Council. The plans and specifications approved by the Council shall be kept at the building therein referred to, and shall be available for inspection by the Engineer at all reasonable times on demand during the construction of, and for fourteen days after the completion of the building.

6. No person shall commence any building or any addition to any building without having first paid to the Council such fees as are provided therefor by this By-law.

7. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall or may be used as a dwelling-house, within a distance of 15 feet from the building lines of the street or road the building is to front, and 8 feet from any street or road at the side of such building, and 8 feet from any other building not in the same occupation, and 4 feet from the land of any adjoining owner, or where the land is the property of the same owner, 4 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement, but this section of this By-law shall not prevent the erection, with the consent of the Council, of a shop or a shop and dwelling-house combined abutting on the building line in any street other than the streets mentioned in the schedule hereto.

8. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall or may be used as a dwelling-house, within a distance of 25 feet from the building lines of the streets or roads or parts of streets or roads mentioned in the schedule hereto, and 10 feet from any street or road at the side of such building, and 8 feet from any other building not in the same occupation, and 4 feet from the land of any adjoining owner, or where the land is the property of the same owner 4 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement.

9. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building in any of the streets or roads or parts of streets or roads mentioned in the schedule hereto, unless the said building shall cover an area of 1,500 superficial feet at least, exclusive of all detached outbuildings, or where two or more attached dwelling-houses are erected, unless each dwelling-house shall cover an area of 1,200 superficial feet at least, exclusive of all detached outbuildings.

10. No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall or may be used as a shop, within a distance of 30 feet from the building lines of the streets or roads or parts of streets or roads mentioned in the schedule hereto.

11. Two or more buildings or dwelling-houses may be erected in one block on land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness, and carried up to at least one foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the wood-work or spouting.

12. Every building hereafter built or re-built must have an enclosed back yard or open space of at least 450 square feet exclusive of any buildings thereon, unless all the rooms of such building can be lighted and ventilated from the street or right-of-way.

13. If any existing external wall or external enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for a space

equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner required by this By-law must be taken down and the same, if re-built, must be re-built in all respects in accordance with the requirements of this By-law.

14. Stables, coach-houses, cow-sheds of not more than two squares in area and not exceeding 9 feet in height may, with the consent of the Council, have the external walls covered with approved sound weatherboards or approved galvanized iron, and roofed with approved galvanized iron. Stables, coach-houses, cow-sheds, and outbuildings exceeding two squares in area, including roofed structures or erections for the storage of timber and other materials, shall be subject to all the conditions and limitations mentioned in section 7 of this By-law.

No privy, closet, or urinal which is not connected with the underground sewerage system and approved by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall be erected at a less distance than 6 feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house on the same allotment, or allotments adjoining, or a less distance than 2 feet from any fence unless divided by an eight and a half inch brick or stone wall.

No fowl-house shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment, or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this section of this By-law shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment in a position approved by the Council.

15. The distances mentioned in sections 7, 8, 10, and 14 of this By-law shall be respectively measured from the verandah or any other projection nearest to the point at which such building may be from such other building, street, road, land, or boundary line.

16. Every habitable room in every dwelling-house hereafter built or re-built, except rooms wholly or partly in the roof, shall be in every part at the least 10 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling; other than rooms under a skillion roof, which shall at the least be 8 feet 6 inches in height from floor to ceiling.

17. Every habitable room in every dwelling-house hereafter built or re-built wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least 8 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling throughout not less than one-half of the area of such room.

18. The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall or may be used as a dwelling-house, shall be finished in lath and plaster, wood, or approved fire-resisting materials.

19. No person shall remove or transport, or cause or permit to be removed or transported, any building either in whole or in part into the municipality, or from one part of the municipality to another part, without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and every such building shall when completed comply with all the provisions of this By-law.

20. No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials as set forth on the plan and specification adopted by the Council, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway; no opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with rough rolled plate glass protected underneath with a fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

21. The Engineer at all reasonable times during the progress and during the fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law may, and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the Engineer or Town Clerk for the time being, for inspection, the original plans and specifications approved by the Council and the contract (if any) for the building when demanded by him.

22. If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, by its Town Clerk, Engineer, or other authorized agent, may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, by its Engineer or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and for that purpose to break down any fences surrounding the land on which such building is

situate, and to demolish and pull down the said building or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Town Clerk, Engineer, or other authorized agent, in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto, on demand.

23. Fees payable under this By-law shall be as under :—

(a) For all new buildings, or additions to existing buildings, or old buildings re-erected or re-instated after being partially destroyed, taken down or demolished, or buildings removed into the municipality, or from one part of the municipality to another part. For every square of total floor area on each story, inclusive of attic rooms, sheds, stables, and out-buildings, at per square or part of a square, 2s., the minimum fee in any case to be 10s.

(b) For every permit to build, erect, or construct any verandah or hoarding, the sum of 5s.

(c) But in no case shall the fees payable in respect of any one building exceed in all the sum of £2.

24. The following words or expressions whenever used in this By-law shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, so far as such meanings are not excluded by context, that is to say :—

"Council" shall mean the council of the Town of Brighton.

"Town clerk" shall mean the town clerk or acting town clerk for the time being of the Town of Brighton.

"Engineer" shall mean the engineer, or consulting engineer, or acting engineer for the time being of the Town of Brighton.

"Dwelling house" shall mean a building used or constructed or adapted to be used for human habitation, whether the building, or a portion thereof, may be or is used for some other purpose.

"Street or road" shall mean and include "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road," as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1903*.

"Hoarding" shall mean and include any erection or structure used, or that may be used, for the purpose of writing, printing, pasting, or posting notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed or written matter thereon, provided that the height measured from ground level is not less than 6 feet, but shall not apply to the "To Let" or "For Sale" boards not exceeding 30 square feet in area.

"Area" applied to a building shall mean the superficial area of a horizontal section thereof made at the point of its greatest surface, exclusive of the external walls.

"Square" applied to the measurement of the area of any building shall mean the space of 100 superficial feet.

"Build" shall mean and include erect, build, or construct.

"Built" shall mean and include erected, built, or constructed.

"Building" shall mean and include erection, structure, hoarding, and every structure of whatever kind, and every part of such structure.

"Addition" shall mean and include any increase in the habitable enclosed or covered area, height or cubic contents of any building.

All words importing the singular shall include the plural, and the plural the singular.

25. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence, and in the case of a continuance of such offence to a further penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each and every day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the council by its town clerk.

26. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of, such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

27. Provided always that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice of the business has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building.

28. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Brighton.
