Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905.

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION BOARD.—REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16, sub-section (1), of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905 upon the Teachers and Schools Registration Board enabling the Board to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) for "determining the courses of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers, and generally for carrying this Act into effect," the Board doth hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION V. (A) .- PRIMARY TEACHERS.

r. Any person may be registered as a primary teacher who-

- (i.) Has passed through the full course of study at a
 State Continuation School for the Training of
 Junior Teachers or some similar Continuation
 School approved from time to time by the
 Board, established and conducted under the
 same conditions as those prescribed in the regulations for the time being of the Victorian
 Education Department relating to Continuation
 Schools for the Training of Junior Teachers
 (provided that no school shall be approved as a
 Continuation School, except in accordance with
 the conditions set out in section 2 hereunder);
 and

 (iii.) After having passed through the full course of
- the conditions set out in section 2 hereunder); and

 (ii.) After having passed through the full course of study at a State or other approved Continuation School, has received the permission of the Board to be employed as a junior teacher in a school and under the supervision of a teacher or teachers approved by the Board in accordance with the conditions set out in section 3 hereunder, and has served as a junior teacher in such school under the same conditions: as to length of period, training, and examination as are prescribed in the regulations for the time being of the Victorian Education Department relating to junior teachers; and

 (iii.) Has passed the annual examinations prescribed in the regulations for the time being of the Victorian Education Department for second class and first class junior teachers respectively, or some other similar examinations deemed equivalent thereto by the Board, and has fulfilled all the conditions as to such examinations as are laid down in the said regulations. Provided (a) that wherever the word "Director" or "Classifier" occurs in the said regulations the words "Teachers and Schools Registration Board" shall be substituted, and (b) that the Board may prescribe other examination or examinations deemed to be of equivalent standard in lieu of any examination held by the Education Department for junior teachers; and (iv.) Has fulfilled all the conditions prescribed in the regulations for the time being of the Victorian Education Department as to the granting of a Second Class Certificate to junior teachers, or conditions adjudged by the Board to be in all respects equivalent to those prescribed by such regulations.

2. No school will be approved by the Board as a Continuation School for the training of junior teachers except under the following conditions:—

(i.) That the course of study at such school is deemed by the Board to be of equivalent standard to that prescribed for the time being in the regulations of the Victorian Education Department

lations of the Victorian Education Department relating to Continuation Schools for the training of junior teachers, and that the staff of teachers of such school is deemed by the Board to be competent to conduct the course of study and training of such school;

(ii.) That such school shows to the satisfaction of the Board, by means of its time-table, equipment, and general arrangements that the training of students is a part of its regular work;

(iii.) That if at any time after having approved of any school as a Continuation School the Board is of opinion that the course of study provided, or the standard of instruction given in such school, or the standard of education, it may withdraw its approval of such school as a Continuation School; and

(iv.) That, before such approval, such school be in-

tinuation School; and
(iv.) That, before such approval, such school be inspected by the Board or any member thereof or any officer or person authorized by the Board for that purpose, and that after approval, the Board may inspect such school or authorize an inspection to be made by any member thereof or any officer or person authorized from time to time.

3. No school will be approved by the Board as a school in which a junior teacher may be trained and no junior teacher will be permitted to be employed in a school except under the following conditions:—

- (i.) That such school has on its staff one or more teachers deemed by the Board to be qualified to train junior teachers.
- (ii.) That any other teacher in such school who under-takes any part of the duties of training the junior teachers must be approved by the Board.
- (iii.) That not more than one junior teacher may be employed in a school for every fifty pupils in average attendance at such school.
- That to enable junior teachers to pass their annual examinations the teachers of such school will be required to give to the junior teachers instruction as follows:—
 - In a school having but one junior teacher, five hours per week; in a school having more than one junior teacher, having more than one junior teacher, at least six hours per week; the time for such instruction and the names of the teachers giving the instruction must in all cases appear on the timetable. The time actually given to the instruction shall be entered in the teachers' rolls by the teacher giving such instruction. The exercise books kept by the junior teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the teachers of the school, shall be dated from day to day and shall be produced when required by the Board or any officer authorized by the Board. the Board.
- (v:) That the Board may, if it think fit, withdraw its permission for the employment of any junior teacher in a school who has been guilty of misconduct or has failed at two or more annual
- (vi.) That if at any time after having approved of any school for the training of junior teachers the Board is of opinion that the standard of instruction given in such school is not being maintained it may withdraw its approval of such school for the training of junior teachers.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE VEGETATION DISEASES ACTS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Vegetation Diseases Acts to make regulations among others for the purpose of regulating the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any particular kind of tree, plant, or vegetable likely in the opinion of the Governor in Council to spread any disease or insect, and for prescribing penalties for the breach of any regulation so made, the Governor of the State' of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order as follows:—

GENERAL.

1. The Regulations of the 10th day of September, 1907, and published in the Government Gazette of the 18th day of September, 1907, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

INTERPRETATION.

For the purpose of these regulations, "Registered mark or brand" means any mark or brand registered with and approved by the Department of Agriculture of the State of exportation.

IMPORTATION OF NURSERY STOCK, TREES, PLANTS, AND VEGETABLES GENERALLY.

- 2. All importers from outside the State of Victoria of nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables, the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of which is for the time being prohibited, except subject to regulations, not being of a kind in respect to which any other specific regulation or regulations is or are for the time being in force, must give notice to the inspector under the Vegetation Diseases Act upon arrival of any nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables before the removal of such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables from any dock, pier, wharf, station, or warehouse where such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables have been landed.
- 3. No person shall remove any nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables from any dock, pier, wharf, station, or warehouse unless and until such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables shall have been examined and checked in an area, enclosure, or building approved by the inspector, and a certificate or written permission for removal shall have been obtained from the inspector.

IMPORTATION OF BANANAS.

- 4. No person shall land, or attempt to land, any bananas from any steam-ship or other vessel until each and every bunch shall have been examined by an inspector, and all diseased stalks or portions of stalks, diseased bananas or bananas suspected to contain disease or insects shall have been removed from such bunches.
- 5. No person shall land on any dock, pier, wharf, or any place whatsoever in Victoria any diseased stalks or portions of stalks, diseased bananas, or bananas suspected to contain disease or insects, and such diseased stalks or portion of stalks, diseased bananas, or bananas suspected to contain disease or insects shall be destroyed by fire or removed from the State of Victoria.
- 6. No person shall remove any bananas which have been permitted landing from the importing vessel until such have been further examined in an area, enclosure, or building approved by the inspector.
- 7. No person shall remove any bananas or portions of such bananas from any dock, pier, wharf, or any place whatsoever whereon bananas are awaiting certification unless and until written permission so to do shall have been obtained from the inspector.
- 8. No person shall discharge bananas from any vessel during the hours of darkness except under special permit from the Minister of Agriculture.

IMPORTATION OF CITRUS FRUITS.

· 9. All importers from outside the State of Victoria of the fruit or any part of any tree of the citrus family must give notice to the inspector under the Vegetation Diseases: Act upon the arrival of the fruit or any part of any tree of the citrus family before the removal of

such fruit or any part of any tree of the citrus family from any dock, pier, wharf, station, or warehouse where such fruit or any part of any tree of the citrus family shall have been landed.

ro. No person shall remove the fruit or any part of any tree of the citrus family from any dock, pier, wharf, station, or warehouse unless and until such fruit or part of any tree of the citrus family shall have been examined and checked in an area, enclosure, or building approved by the inspector and a certificate or written permission for removal shall have been obtained from the inspector.

IMPORTATION OF NURSERY STOCK, TREES, PLANTS, AND VEGETABLES FROM OTHER STATES.

- 11. No nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables shall be imported, introduced, or brought into the State of Victoria from any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia unless—
 - (a) they be accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, stating that such goods have been examined by him, found to be reasonably free from disease and fit for export, and that the packages containing the said nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables are new or have been baked, steamed, dipped in boiling water, or otherwise treated to the satisfaction of the said officer;
 - (b) the arrival of such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables has been duly notified to the inspector at the port of entry, and such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables have been submitted to him for inspection, and a certificate or written authority of removal obtained from him;
 - (c) each case, crate, bag, bundle, or other package containing nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables, and each bunch of bananas has indelibly and legibly printed, marked, stencilled, or impressed upon it or upon a label, ticket, or tag attached thereto the grower's or exporter's name and address or his registered mark or brand in letters or figures of not less than one-half inch in length.
- one-half inch in length.

 12. All nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables imported into Victoria from any other State, if complying with the conditions set out in Regulation 11 (a) shall be accepted as far as possible as being in the state or condition described in the certificate therein required, but if an inspector thinks fit he may inspect such nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables on arrival, and may reject the same if found to be diseased. All such diseased nursery stock, trees, plants, or vegetables shall be dealt with in accordance with the Act and these regulations.

IMPORTATION OF SLIGHTLY DISEASED FRUIT.

- 13. Fruit which is found on inspection to be slightly diseased may be imported into Victoria from any other State, for manufacturing purposes only, by bond fide fruit preservers upon the following conditions, viz.:—
 - (a) Such fruit shall be inspected by an inspector, and may be rejected.
 - (b) If passed by the inspector such fruit shall be taken forthwith to any fruit-preserving factory approved by the inspector in charge and there manufactured; the refuse of all such fruit shall be absolutely destroyed by burning forthwith; all receptacles in which such fruit has been carried shall forthwith be either destroyed by fire or otherwise treated at the factory to destroy all fruit diseases to the satisfaction of an officer of the Department of Agriculture.
 - (c) No such fruit shall be sold or distributed unless in a manufactured state.
 - (d) The manufacturer shall enter into a bond with two approved sureties in the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500) to observe the foregoing conditions.
- 14. If it is found by the inspector that any cases of imported fruit which have been condemned contain a fair proportion of fruit which is sound and free from disease, and also some fruit which is but slightly diseased, the contents of such cases may be sorted at any approved place under the supervision of an inspector, upon the following conditions, viz.:—
 - (a) Such cases with their contents shall be taken forthwith from the place of inspection to the approved place aforesaid.
 - (b) When sorted, fruit which is free from disease may be re-packed in clean cases and disposed of in the ordinary way, while slightly diseased fruit may be disposed of to the fruit preservers, when it shall be subject to all the conditions contained in Regulation 13 above mentioned.

- (c) All fruit which after sorting shall be deemed by the inspector to be unfit by reason of disease for either of the foregoing purposes shall be destroyed at the importer's or consignee's ex-
- (d) A charge not exceeding Threepence per case shall be made to cover the cost of sorting.
- (e) Before any fruit may be sorted as aforesaid the consignee or importer shall enter into a bond with two approved sureties in the sum of Fifty pounds (£50) to observe the foregoing condi-

IMPORTATION OF BANANAS FROM QUEENSLAND.

15. No bananas shall be imported, introduced, or brought into the State of Victoria from that part of the State of Queensland north of the Tropic of Capricorn unless they be accompanied by a certificate signed by the grower of such bananas, and countersigned by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of Queensland, that such bananas have been, prior to examination by the said officer, covered with a netting impervious to the fruit fly for three weeks preceding the time of examination.

PENALTIES.

16. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of or who shall fail to comply with these Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty of, for the first offence, not exceeding One pound, and for any subsequent offence, not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the Vegetation Diseases Act 1896 (59) Vict. No. 1432) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation—in the Government Gazette, may, either absolutely or, subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of—any tree,—plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the trees, plants, and vegetables, of the kind hereinafter specified, and any part of the fruit or other product of the same, are likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation prohibit, except subject to the regulations for the time being in force under the said recited Act, the importation, introduction, "for bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable, including—any part or the fruit or other product of the same, of the following kinds, that is to say:—

Apple trees, Apricot trees, Almond trees, Cherry trees, Currant trees, Trees of the Citrus Family, Fig trees, Gooseberry trees, Jack trees, Loquat trees, Mango trees, Nectarine trees, Paw Paw trees, Peach trees, Pear trees, Persimmon trees, Plum trees, Quince trees, Banana plants, Blackberry plants, Cucumber plants, Granadilla plants, Raspberry plants, Strawberry plants, Fineapple plants, Raspberry plants, Strawberry plants, Sugar canes, Tomato plants, all Culinary Vegetables and the plants thereof, all Nursery stock, trees, and plants, and all bulbs, corms, tubers, and rhizomes of any kind.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION. AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF KINGLAKE, KNOWN AS THE KINGLAKE WEST RECREATION RESERVE.

RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Peter Lawrey, John Junor, and Alexander Campbell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Kinglake, known as the Kinglake West Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:— REGULATIONS.

t. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for files, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regard dress, language, or

nay one against account.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Manage-

A. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

frees, or seats, or foil or union stories in the castle, goats, or pigs.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any beiliff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more creless, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.
