HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Orders made on the 13th day of May, 1908, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petitions of the Councils of the Municipalities of the Shires of Portland and Stawell, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipalities of the said shires respectively, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the officials to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerks respectively of the said Shires.

And His Excellency, by the Orders hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, compiled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

25. IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

2. The gardens under the control or management of the Council shall be open from 6 o'clock in the morning till 9.30 o'clock in the evening every day, from the 1st day of October to the 30th day of April, both inclusive, and between the hours of 7.30 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening every day, from the first day of May to the following 30th day of September, both inclusive, and no person shall enter or remain in the gardens except between the hours aforesaid.

3. No person shall pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates of the gardens, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates, or any of the seats in the gardens, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any of such fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or commit any nuisance in the gardens, or leave therein any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

4. No person shall carry firearms in or through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein.

5. No cart or other vehicle shall without the authority of the proper officer of the Council be driven in or through the gardens.

6. No person shall ride a bicycle or tricycle in or through the gardens without the authority of the proper officer of the Council.

7. No horse or cattle shall be allowed in the gardens without the authority of the proper officer of the Council.

8. All dogs, goats, and poultry within the gardens, except a dog led by a chain or cord, shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

9. No person shall hawk or sell in the gardens anything of any description, or offer the same for sale therein, without previous written permission of the Council.

10. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person, unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

11. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers or employes of the Council, engaged in the gardens, by conversation, or otherwise.

12. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, may be removed from the gardens.

13. No person shall be allowed to sell or offer for sale intoxicating liquors of any description within the gardens.

14. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the gardens.

15. No person in the gardens shall behave in a disorderly or noisy manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.

16. No betting or gambling shall be allowed within the gardens.

17. No person shall engage in training, or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like game in the gardens without the authority in writing of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

18. The gardens shall not be used on a Sunday for the purpose of holding meetings or gatherings of any description without the authority in writing of the Council.

19. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the Council of the said City from closing the gardens or any portion thereof and excluding the public therefrom whenever they think fit, or prevent such Council from holding or permitting entertainments in the gardens or any portion thereof, or excluding therefrom, for such time as they think fit, all persons but those who pay the sum fixed for admission thereto. No person shall enter or remain in the gardens or any portion thereof when the public is excluded, or when admission is conditional on payment, without, in the latter case, paying the sum of admission thereto. Notices shall be posted on each of the entrance gates when the gardens or any portion thereof are closed to free access.

20. Any person offending against this By-law, or any Regulation made in pursuance with this By-law, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.
