2. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown includes supplies for s.s. Lady Loch and Albert; and vessels in the Naval Service which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; and Rutherglen, the Viticultural College. 5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded except brandy cases, porter cases, hogsheds, butter tins or boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. 8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. 16. ## BY-LAW No. 62.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under Part VII., Division 2, and Part XXVIII. of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 62, for altering By-law No. 29 of the Town of Richmond.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond and the Municipal Council of the said City, order as follows:—

- (1) After the list of market dues in By-law No. 29 of the Town of Richmond, there shall be and the following are hereby added:—For milk, per day, 6d.; for ice-cream, per day, 6d.; for selling or exposing for sale in the market-place without a stall any article or articles upon which dues have not been otherwise charged and paid, per day, 6d.
- (2) After clause 7 in By-law No. 29 there shall be, and the following clause is hereby added:—  
(8) Notwithstanding the provisions contained in clause 3 of By-law No. 29 empowering the collection of all rents, rates, tolls, and dues, as enumerated in schedule A appended to such by-law, any person who is a *bona-fide* ratepayer in the City of Richmond shall be entitled to a standing in the market for a cart, wheelbarrow, truck, or vehicle, from or in which to sell or expose or offer for sale any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said schedule A on paying to the Council, or the Council's collector, the following sums in advance, instead of the sums mentioned in the said schedule for each cart, wheelbarrow, truck, or vehicle, viz.:—Six shillings (6s.) per month; fifteen shillings (15s.) per quarter.

## SHIRE OF BROADFORD.

## BY-LAWS.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under section 213 of the *Local Government Act* 1874, and numbered 1, for regulating the due management of the business of the Shire of Broadford and the conduct of their officers and servants, and adopting the *Police Offences Statute* 1865, enumerated hereunder.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford, order as follows:—

That By-law No. 1, hereunder referred to and Part I. of the *Police Offences Statute* 1865, be adopted in and for the whole of the Shire of Broadford.

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by the said Act required.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Council.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials, and reception of deputations.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

4. All notices of motion shall be dated and given by the intended mover to the Secretary of the Shire at the close of the meeting of the Council.

5. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received.

6. No motion of which notice has been given shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

7. At every meeting of the Council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover or Secretary.

8. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice at the next meeting of the Council.

9. Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Council, and the Secretary of the Shire, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of Committees.

10. No petition shall be presented after the reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

11. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name at the end thereof.

12. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else.

13. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, if so required by any three Councillors being present, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

14. The Common Seal of the Shire shall be kept in the Secretary's office, and shall not be affixed to any document unless one Councillor and the Secretary be present, or by a minute of the Council.

15. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained herein, or contained in the sections adopted herein, may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a majority of two-thirds of the Councillors present.

16. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law, or contained in the several sections adopted by this By-law or any of them, he shall forfeit the sum of five pounds.

17. A question being once made and carried in the affirmative or negative cannot be questioned again in the same municipal year during which it has been so resolved, unless a call of the Council be made for that purpose.

18. No question or amendment which is the same in substance as any question which, during the same municipal year, has been resolved in the affirmative or negative, shall be a resolution of the Council unless carried by two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the Council.

19. It shall be competent for any Councillor, by notice, to move for a call of the whole Council for the consideration of any subject at the next meeting, or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each Councillor, by post or otherwise, of the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made, is set down for consideration, and any Councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the Council.

#### Order of Debate.

20. Every Councillor, including the President, shall stand up while addressing the Council.

21. The President's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

22. Any Councillor desirous of making a motion, or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the Chair may proceed with the subject.

23. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon.

24. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

25. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

26. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

27. The Councillors in meeting of Council assembled shall designate each other by the official titles, namely, that of President or Councillor, as the case may require.

28. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which one is entitled to priority.

29. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

30. A Councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

31. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

32. The mover of every original proposition and amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no Councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

34. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on any amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. When amendments have been made, the main question, as amended, shall be put.

36. When amendments have been proposed and negatived, the question is put as originally proposed.

37. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on the motions moved and seconded, or on any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

38. Any or each of the following acts, words, or omissions shall constitute and be an offence unless the offending member, upon being called to order, do make a satisfactory apology to the Council, viz. —

Addressing the Council in any other than a standing posture without permission of the Chairman.

Interrupting another Councillor while addressing the Council, except upon a point of order.

Presenting to the Council any application disrespectfully worded.

Refusing to cease speaking when interrupted by a call to order.

Disobeying the lawful orders of the Chairman.

Interrupting the business of the Council by asking questions as to what has been previously transacted.

Using offensive language, imputing improper motives, or making personal reflections on a member or officer.

Any member, after taking his seat, who wilfully absents himself without permission of the Council.

39. Any person not being a Councillor who having been admitted to any meeting of the Council shall—

Speak without permission of the Council,

Interrupt the Council or officers,

Verbally censure a Councillor or officer,

Use offensive language, impute improper motives, make personal reflections on any Councillor or officer, or be guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct,

Disobey the lawful orders of the Chairman, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and may be forthwith removed on the order of the Chairman.

#### Protests.

41. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given forthwith, on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Council, by the protesting Councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such Councillor, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful of the Council.

#### Appointments, &c.

42. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

43. The salary or allowance attached to the offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

44. The rate collector shall attend all Council meetings, and shall furnish written reports every month giving full particulars of rates collected and outstanding.

45. Complaints against any officer will not be entertained unless set forth in writing, and such written complaints shall be referred, if considered necessary, to a special meeting.

#### Miscellaneous.

46. No public works exceeding the value of Five pounds shall be ordered upon except in pursuance of notice duly given at a previous meeting. Except in cases of unforeseen and pressing emergency no public works shall be undertaken excepting those detailed in the estimate of expenditure prepared for the purpose of striking a rate.

47. No payment shall be made on account of any contract, nor shall any claim for payment thereon be entertained, unless on the written recommendation of the engineer.

48. No reduction shall be made in rates or valuations excepting on the recommendation of the valuer.

49. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this By-law may be suspended *pro tem* in case of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the Councillors present at any meeting.

#### PART I.—POLICE PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO SPECIAL LOCALITIES.

2. The Acts mentioned in the First Schedule hereto to the extent to which the same are therein expressed to be repealed shall be and the same are hereby repealed; but such repeal shall not effect any things done offences committed or proceedings commenced or pending under by virtue of or against any of the said repealed Acts; and all proclamations made under the authority of any of the

said Acts, or of any Act thereby repealed and not revoked before the coming into operation of this Act shall have the same force and effect as if the same had been made under this Act.

3. In the construction of this Act the following expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

In Parts I. and II. the word "cattle" shall mean and include horses mares geldings colts fillies asses mules bulls cows oxen heifers steers calves sheep rams ewes lambs goats and swine.

The word "animal" shall mean and include every species of quadruped and every species of bird whether in a natural or domestic state.

The words "public place" (so far as they relate to Part I. of this Act) shall include and apply to every road street footway court alley and thoroughfare within any city town district or place proclaimed as hereinafter mentioned, notwithstanding that such roads streets footways courts alleys and thoroughfares may be formed on private property. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to divest the owners of such property of their rights or property therein and their power to resume the sole use and occupation thereof, anything in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

The "local authority" hereinafter referred to shall be in the City of Melbourne and Town of Geelong the Corporations of the said City and Town respectively; and within any borough the council thereof; and outside the limits of such Corporation or borough, the local authority shall be represented by the nearest court of petty sessions of the peace.

In any offence against the provisions of Part III. of this Act the time at which "the night" shall be deemed to commence and conclude shall be the same as in the cases of burglary.

4. The Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in this Part to any city town district or place in Victoria; and may define the limits of any such city town district or place and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city town district or place.

5. Any person guilty of any of the following offences omissions or neglects shall on conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

- (i.) Throwing any glass filth dirt rubbish or other matter of a similar nature upon any road footway or public place;
- (ii.) Riding driving or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath;
- (iii.) Placing any timber bricks or other building materials upon any footway channel surface drain or carriage road without permission of the local authority having been first obtained;
- (iv.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway carriage road or open or public place;
- (v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority;
- (vi.) Drawing or trailing any sledge timber or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road;
- (vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority;
- (viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road street footway or public place;
- (ix.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway;
- (x.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building or any wall, fence, lamp, post or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
- (xi.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained;
- (xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused;

(xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows or arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road or by placing goods thereon or otherwise;

(xiv.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person;

(xv.) Having any awning or any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway;

(xvi.) Blasting any rock, stone or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority;

(xvii.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place;

(xviii.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show hire or sale;

(xix.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority;

(xx.) Any carter plying for hire without a licence;

(xxi.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority;

(xxii.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steam-boat at any ferry or on any river without a licence from the local authority or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority;

(xxiii.) Discharging any firearms or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any firearm, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority;

(xxiv.) Any person riding bicycles on footpaths or driving vehicles over channels or on footpaths in township of Broadford;

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice, or any person in His Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

(xxv.) Any carter or driver of waggon or cart travelling down the water tables of any road with heavy excessive load and injuring same will be prosecuted;

(xxvi.) That sections 494, 495, of Local Government Act be made law and enforced within the Shire of Broadford.

(xxvii.) If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

(xxviii.) 1. The driver of every cart, dray, waggon, van, or other carriage, which shall during the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day be in any road, street, or public place within the Shire, shall keep a light attached to or suspended from the off or right side thereof, so as to be plainly visible to the driver of any cart, dray, waggon, van, or other carriage proceeding in a contrary direction, and every driver who shall fail to comply with this subdivision of this By-law shall forfeit the sum not exceeding Forty shillings. 2. Section 36, sub-division 1, part 10, of the thirteenth schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Broadford.

Section 36, sub-division 1, part 10 of the thirteenth schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* is as follows:—

“The owner of every hackney carriage or borough stage carriage used in plying for hire or passengers and of every private vehicle and velocipede travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage shall be so used, and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.”

(xxix.) If any person shall, without the authority of the Council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land or cutting down trees on any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with reference to the licensing of carters and boatmen, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such local authority may see fit.

7. No person without a licence first had and obtained from the local authority shall erect, place, or set up or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding or place or erect any posts, bar rails boards or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar or of depositing sifting screening or slaking any brick stone lime sand or any other materials for building or repairing any house or other tenement or erection or for any other purpose; and such licence as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which any such hoarding scaffolding posts bars rails boards or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary. And if any person place set up erect or build or cause or permit to be erected placed set up or built any such hoarding or scaffolding or any enclosed posts bars or rails or any other matter or thing for the purposes aforesaid or for any other purpose without such licence or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such licence or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such licence, then in any of the said cases such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof, and the said local authority may four days after notice cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such persons together with the charges of pulling down removing and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

8. If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare, he shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and if any article so exposed be not removed within six hours after notice, any local authority or any officer of police or any constable without warrant may seize any such article; and every such article shall be forfeited and sold

and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

9. The local authority or any justice may authorize and depute any peace officer or constable from time to time to visit and inspect any butcher's shambles slaughterhouse or yard or any house outbuilding lane alley or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed; and such person so authorized shall if it appear that any accumulation of manure dung offal soil filth coal ashes or other unwholesome or noxious matter whatsoever ought to be removed shall give notice to the person to whom the same belongs or to the occupier of the premises whereon it exists to remove the same; and if at the expiration of four days after such notice the same be not complied with, the manure dung offal soil filth coal ashes or other matter referred to shall be removed by such constable or other peace officer at the expense of the person to whom such notice was given, and such expense may be recovered in the same manner as any penalty inflicted hereunder.

10. If any person after the coming into operation of this Act erect or cause to be erected in any city town district or place to which this provision may be extended any chimney or fireplace of timber or other matter liable to ignition or do not place for a sufficient distance some matter or material not liable to ignition between such chimney or fireplace and any material of an inflammable nature or liable to ignition, the occupier of such house shall, on notice from the local authority being served upon him or left at such premises requiring such fireplace or chimney to be so altered as not to come within the meaning of this provision and neglecting after the expiration of seven days to comply with the conditions of such notice, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

11. Upon the extension of any of the provisions of this part of this Act to any city town or borough in Victoria, the council of such city town or borough, or if there be no such council, the Surveyor-General, shall cause to be set out the breadth of the carriage and footways in the streets and public places of every such city town or borough, and shall cause the said footways to be marked by posts at the corners and intersections of the streets; and the carriage and footways when so set out shall be deemed to be the carriage and footways respectively of such city town or borough.

12. Before the Surveyor-General shall cause to be set out the carriage and footways of any such city town or borough as aforesaid, he shall submit to the Governor in Council a plan of same showing the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways, and thereupon the Governor may by notice in the *Government Gazette* fix and declare the breadth of such carriage and footways, and the distance from the outer edge of such footways within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building or fence.

**PART XXII.—WEIGHT TO BE CARRIED ON VEHICLES TO BE DETERMINED BY WIDTH OF TYRES.**

No person shall in or by means of a vehicle carry on any public road a greater weight than the next mentioned (that is to say):—For each wheel of any two wheeled vehicle a total weight of four hundredweight avoirdupois, and for each wheel of any four wheeled vehicle a total weight of four and one-half hundredweight avoirdupois for each half inch of width of bearing surface of the tyre or felloe. The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

In this section the words “width of bearing surface” mean the actual width of the bearing surface of the tyre or felloe that would actually come in contact with or bear upon a hard smooth level surface when the wheels are attached to the axle and ready for use; and when the tyres or felloes of any vehicles are not of uniform width, the width of the narrowest tyre or felloe shall be deemed to be the width of each of the tyre or felloes.

Nothing in this section shall be deemed to apply to the conveyance of any piece of heavy machinery which cannot be taken apart without great loss or expense.

Any person who in or by means of a vehicle carries on any public road a greater weight than that allowed by this Act or any regulation made thereunder by the Governor in Council shall for each offence be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for each hundredweight or part of a hundredweight carried in excess of the quantity allowed by this Act or such regulation.

1. The Governor in Council may make regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement.

2. Such regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall come into operation one month after the date of such publication, and shall then be of the same effect as if they were contained in this Act, and shall be judicially noticed.

Every person in charge of any vehicle carrying goods on any public road upon being so requested by any

inspector of weights and measures, member of the police force, or officer of any municipality, shall—

- (a) Allow such inspector member or officer or any person acting by or under the authority of such municipality to measure such goods with the view of ascertaining the weight thereof in accordance with any such regulation made as aforesaid; or
- (b) Take such vehicles and goods to the nearest weighbridge or weighing machine on the route towards the place to which such vehicle and goods are being taken, or to any weighbridge or weighing machine within two miles in any direction from the place at which the request is made.

If the weight of such goods is ascertained by such inspector member of the police force officer or other person by measurement only then the result of such measurement shall be taken to be the actual weight of such goods for the purposes of this Act unless the owner or driver of the vehicle at the time gives notice of his intention of having same weighed, and forthwith at his own expense proceeds to have same weighed at the nearest or most convenient weighbridge or weighing machine.

Any person who when requested as aforesaid refuses to allow a vehicle and goods to be weighed or goods so carried to be measured as aforesaid shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Any council or their surveyor or engineer, or any person acting by or under their authority, or any officer of the council of any municipal district, or any member of the police force, may measure and examine or cause to be measured or examined the wheels of every vehicle on any public road in such district.

If without the consent of the person in charge of any vehicle any person purporting to act under the authority of this Act who is not authorized by this Act so to do measures or attempts to measure any goods carried in any such vehicle, or measure and examines or attempts to measure and examine or causes to be measured and examined the wheels of any such vehicle, or makes any request that such vehicle and goods shall be taken to any weighbridge or weighing machine to be weighed, then such last-mentioned person shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction thereof be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Every vehicle carrying or constructed to carry goods of any kind whatever and every vehicle carrying passengers for hire shall have the weight of such vehicle legibly painted on some conspicuous part of the offside thereof in white letters or figures, such letters or figures not being less than one inch in length and of a breadth in proportion.

If the owner of any such vehicle neglects to have such weight painted as aforesaid, or has the same painted incorrectly, he shall for each offence be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Nothing in this section shall apply to any private passenger vehicle not plying for hire and ordinarily used for private passenger purposes only, even if on any particular occasion goods are carried in such private passenger vehicle.

For carrying this part into effect it shall be lawful for any municipality to make by-laws not inconsistent with this Act or with any regulation made by the Governor in Council as hereinbefore provided.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under section 213 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, and numbered 32, for preventing obstructions to bridges within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford order as follows:—

If any person shall fish on or from, or shall in any manner impede the driving of any horses, cattle, sheep, or swine over or across, any of the bridges within the Shire of Broadford, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## SHIRE OF MARONG.

## BY-LAW No. 8.

A By-law of the Shire of Marong, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong order as follows:—

*Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections. This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(ii.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf), to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle), does not exceed three hundredweight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself Sufficient Motive Power to move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engine not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road, if unmade.

*Engine not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
