Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CYCLE TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, trieycles, and motor cycles, has made the following Determination, namely :—

1. That the Determination of the Cycle Trade Board, dated the sixth day of August, 1907, shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date on which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.

ADULT WAGES.

2. That the lowest prices or rates payable to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, trieycles, and motor cycles shall be :—

Foremen	57s. 6d. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.		
Assemblers	40s.	"	"
Filers	36s.	"	"
Frame-builders	48s.	"	"
General Repairers engaged on any class of repair work	42s.	"	"
Persons working at screw-cutting or turning lathes	50s.	"	"
Wheelbuilders	33s.	"	"

PROPORTION OF IMPROVERS.

3. That the number of improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be—

One improver to one or two adults,
Two improvers to three adults,

and thence one improver to every additional two adults employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, trieycles, and motor cycles, receiving not less than 33s. per week of 48 hours.

RATE OF WAGES OF APPRENTICES.

4. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices who may be employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, trieycles, and motor cycles shall be as follows, namely :—

For the 1st year's experience	...	5s.	for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

And thereafter the minimum wage as determined by the Board for adults for the class of work performed.

RATE OF WAGES OF IMPROVERS.

5. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to improvers who may be employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, tricycles, and motor cycles shall be as follows, namely:—

For the 1st year's experience		1st six months	5s.	for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

And thereafter the minimum wage as determined by the Board for adults for the class of work performed.

OVERTIME FOR MALES OVER SIXTEEN YEARS.

6. That the wages price or rate which shall be paid to any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, tricycles, and motor cycles for more than the maximum number of 48 hours per week shall be for such extra hours at the rate of time and a quarter; but in the case of an apprentice or an improver the minimum payment for overtime worked shall not be less than 1s. for each day in which he works beyond the ordinary hours, but such remuneration shall only be payable where the apprentice or improver works more than 48 hours per week.

7. That the above Determination shall come into force on and after the 6th day of July, 1908.
