REGULATION RELATING TO THE CLEANSING OF DRINKING VESSELS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulation for securing the cleanliness of receptacles used for the serving of liquid food and liquid refreshments and ice cream, that is to say:—

No person shall serve liquid food or liquid refreshments or ice cream or cause the same to be served in any glass tumbler or other vessel to any person at or in any licensed premises or bar or counter or refreshment stall or booth or other place where drinking vessels are used in common unless such tumbler or vessel has been thoroughly cleansed since the last occasion of its use.

In any licensed premises where clean water under pressure is available or where it can be readily made available the cleansing shall be carried out by means of clean running water.

"Licensed Premises" as used in this Regulation shall mean all premises licensed under the Licensing Acts of Victoria.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the Health Acts is liable, on conviction, to the penalty prescribed therein.

This Regulation shall take effect from the first day of October, 1908.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 3rd July, 1882, a Waterworks Trust, known as the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the lands comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by the said Order in Council and subsequent Orders in Council duly proclaimed and defined.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Water Act 1905* it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations and additions in the general plan and description thereof, or with or without any conditions, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act. And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks;
- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed;
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the waterworks district of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality the council whereof or the councillors of any riding whereof were applicants for the construction of such waterworks;
- (d) Subject to the provisions of this Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the waterworks district, as the case may be;
- (e) Assign a corporate name to the Waterworks Trust;
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case the Governor in Council may think fit.

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such riding or ridings to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with any other person or persons, not

exceeding three in number, to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the councillors for the west riding of the shire of Charlton for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, and for a loan wherewith to pay for certain water supply works constructed by the Shire of St. Arnaud Waterworks Trust, and to be taken over from that body.

- (1) The taking over of the waterworks constructed by the Shire of St. Arnaud Waterworks Trust within the area hereinafter defined, such works consisting of tanks, drains, and wells.
- (2) That the councillors for the west riding of the shire of Charlton for the time being, and three other persons, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust for such waterworks district.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Two thousand eight hundred and twenty-two pounds five shillings (£2,822 5s.).
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF FAT CATTLE FROM QUEENSLAND INTO VICTORIA BY LAND, VIA SOUTH AUSTRALIA AND VIA NEW SOUTH WALES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of June, 1908.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, No. 1141, it is among other things provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such Regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be expedient for all or any of the purposes in section 4 of the said Act mentioned, and rescind the same: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to make the following regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations made on the 21st day of December, 1897, or in the Order in Council of the 20th day of September, 1898, cattle from Queensland may be introduced into Victoria *via* New South Wales and *via* South Australia under the following conditions, viz.:—

1. CONCERNING THE INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE *via* NEW SOUTH WALES—

Cattle which have been introduced into New South Wales from the area in Queensland west of the 146th Meridian of Longitude at any of the following crossing places, viz.:—Barrington, Parragundy, Hungerford, Adelaide Gate, and Wompah under the conditions specified in the New South Wales Proclamation of 6th February, 1907, and which cattle have been in New South Wales territory for the full period of thirty days next preceding as shown by the date of the hereinafter-mentioned permit, may be admitted into Victoria at the following crossing places, viz.:—Echuca and Wodonga, on production to the Inspector of Stock at such crossing places of the permit, duly made and completed, described in the said New South Wales Proclamation as Schedule "C," and

2. CONCERNING THE INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE *via* SOUTH AUSTRALIA—

Cattle which have been introduced from Queensland into South Australia under the conditions of the South Australian Proclamation of 2nd May, 1907, and which cattle have been in South Australia for the full period of thirty days next preceding the date of introduction,

may be admitted into Victoria at the gazetted crossing place, Serviceton, on production to the Inspector of Stock stationed at such crossing place of a certificate from the Stock Inspector at the crossing place from Queensland into South Australia at which such cattle entered, setting out the class, numbers, sexes, description, and brands of such cattle, the date of their entry, and that such cattle had been admitted into South Australia under the conditions of the aforesaid Proclamation.

Provided that—

(a) *Notice of Intention to Introduce*—

Forty-eight hours' notice in writing of intention to introduce cattle under these Regulations shall be given by the owner or person in charge to the Inspector of Stock at the port of entry.

(b) *Hours of Introduction*—

Introduction of cattle under these Regulations shall be allowed only during the hours between sunrise and sunset.

(c) *Inspection on Entry*—

No cattle will be permitted introduction under these Regulations until the Inspector of Stock at the port of entry has satisfied himself by inspection during daylight that they are free from contagious or infectious diseases.

(d) *Slaughter within twenty-one days*—

All cattle introduced into Victoria under the terms of these Regulations shall be slaughtered within twenty-one days of their introduction, and the owner or person in charge shall state in writing to the Inspector of Stock at the port of entry the intended location of such cattle during the interval between introduction and slaughter.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Health Act 1890.*AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS TO PERMIT
THE INTRODUCTION OF HORSES FROM
WESTERN AUSTRALIA INTO VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas the Regulations made by Order in Council the 15th day of August, 1898, in respect to the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs were amended by Regulations made the 25th of February, 1904, in respect to the introduction of horses: And whereas the Regulations made the 23rd day of December, 1907, absolutely prohibited the introduction of horses from Western Australia: Now therefore the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Regulations of the 23rd day of December, 1907, in so far as they relate to the prohibition of horses and dogs are hereby repealed.

2. Horses and dogs from Western Australia may be permitted introduction into Victoria at the port of Melbourne provided they are accompanied by—

(a) a declaration by the owner (or authorized agent) indorsed by the Chief Inspector of Stock of the Government of Western Australia in the form or to the effect of Schedule "A" hereto setting forth that such horses or dogs have not been north of the 27th parallel of latitude in Western Australia and have been regularly stabled or kennelled and groomed for the period of six calendar months next preceding the date of shipment at Fremantle from which port only dogs or horses may be admitted into Victoria.

(b) a certificate from a duly qualified and approved Veterinary Surgeon in Western Australia indorsed by the Chief Inspector of Stock of the Government of Western Australia in the form or to the effect of Schedule "B" hereto setting forth that such horses or dogs are in good general health and exhibit no signs of any contagious or infectious disease or parasitic infestation, including Surra, Trypanosomiasis, and Cattle Tick infestation, and provided further that on arrival at the port of Melbourne and before landing a certificate in the form of Schedule "C" from an approved Veterinary Surgeon setting forth that such horses or dogs exhibit no signs of any contagious or infectious diseases, including Surra, Trypanosomiasis, and Cattle Tick infestation is obtained and produced to an Inspector of Stock.

OWNER'S DECLARATION CONCERNING HORSES (OR DOGS)
FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING, ETC., IN CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 38 of the Fisheries Act 1890, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation impose and prescribe the following conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing in the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert, viz. —

- (1) Flounder mesh or drag nets with less than 4 1/2 inch mesh between knots while stretched by a 1/2 lb. weight and being wet at least five minutes are prohibited, provided that for a period of twelve months from the date hereof, old nets with not less than 4 1/2 inch mesh in the possession of fishermen may be used.
- (2) The use of nets or lines of nets exceeding 500 fathoms in length is prohibited for any boat with attendant boat or flatty.
- (3) Leaving mesh nets in the water for more than 16 hours, at a time after being set is prohibited.
- (4) The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines whether fixed or unfixed to be employed in fishing is prohibited for 36 hours of each week, namely, from noon of each Saturday till midnight of each Sunday following throughout the year; and the removal of any boat having trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines or netting gear on board from any wharf or jetty or anchorage during such period is also prohibited.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. The cost of all postage, however, shall be defrayed, and printed forms required under the contract shall be supplied, by the Education Department.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the

contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment when receipts, showing the due delivery of the goods, have been received from the teacher, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim. Receipt and invoice forms may be obtained free of charge from the Education Department, and must be forwarded to the officer authorized to take delivery when the goods are supplied.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any school he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 15 of these conditions.

12. An invoice of each parcel shall be, by the contractor, forwarded by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, together with a form of receipt for him to sign and return. The production of the receipt given by the teacher shall be considered sufficient proof of the delivery of the goods, but should the teacher fail to return the receipt within a reasonable time the payment to the contractor shall not be delayed on that account, provided he can produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Education Department for the time being of the delivery of such parcel.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. 14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. 15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7.
