## YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Varram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1908 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

- 1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.
- 2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
- 3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
- 4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
- 5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the first day of July, 1908.
- 6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

### Health Act 1890. SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

BY-LAW NO. 5.

• In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Gisborne, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

- All former by-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and block of property to south of borough bounded by Melbourne-road on east, Suburban-road and a line extending west from Aitken-street in a line with Suburban-road to the boundary of Brady Brothers' property on the south, and a line running north to the borough boundary on the west, and all premises within five chains on either side of road from Gisborne to New Gisborne up to and including the Railway Station.
- 4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

- 5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
- 6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
- 7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the daytime, and the other pan to be left in its place.
- Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.
- The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
- 10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
- 11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which breach shall be committed or continued.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Williamstown order as fol-

2. No person shall erect, construct, or build, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor, the plan and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within any of the streets mentioned in section seven (7) hereof (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction or any external or party wall) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection which is intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a shop, office, public building, or warehouse upon or within lines at a distance of thirty (30) feet from and running parallel with either side of the streets or roads mentioned in section seven (7) hereof unless the external walls thereof shall be of brick or stone, or of brick and stone together.

6. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause

9. If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection fourteen (14) days' notice in writing to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or to pull down or to remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other

10. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, or aviary or other separate outbuilding approved of by the Council, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

11. The sum of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) shall be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund for each building, erection, alteration, or addition approved of by the Council for erection. in any of the streets mentioned in section seven (7) hereof.

12. The following words or expressions whenever used in this By-law shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context; that is to say. "Council" shall mean the Council of the Town of Williamstown; "Surveyor" shall mean the Surveyor for the time being of the Town of Williamstown. The expression "Public Building" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, or as a school, college, or place of public cancert room, public hall room, public lecture room, public cancert room, public exhibition room, crass a public place of assembly, or used or constructed or adapted to be used for any public exhibition room, crass a public place of any public purpose; also a building used or constructed or adapted to be used for any public purpose; also a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a hotel, lodging-house, home, refuge, or shelter.
