**YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1908.**

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1908 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the first day of July, 1908.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

BY-LAW NO. 5.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Gisborne, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and block of property to south of borough bounded by Melbourne-road on east, Suburban-road and a line extending west from Aitken-street in a line with Suburban-road to the boundary of Brady Brothers' property on the south, and a line running north to the borough boundary on the west, and all premises within five chains on either side of road from Gisborne to New Gisborne up to and including the Railway Station.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the daytime, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 2nd day of September, 1907.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. McCARRON, BIRD, AND CO., PRINTERS, COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 17th June, 1908, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. PROVISIONS OF VOTING BY POST ACT APPLIED TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS—SHIRE OF DONALD.

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 10th day of June, 1908, under the provisions of section 148 of the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Donald, directed that the provisions of the Voting by Post Act 1900, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said shire, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said shire.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

2. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz. :—

- All Justices of the Peace,
 - All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire,
 - All Municipal Clerks,
 - All Clerks of Courts,
 - All Head-masters of State Schools,
 - And every member of the Police Force,
- } throughout
the State of
Victoria.

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the Voting by Post Act as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONS OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900 APPLICABLE TO THE ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS FOR THE SHIRE OF DONALD, AND ALTERATIONS TO BE READ AS MADE THEREIN FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUCH APPLICATION.

The following provisions, with the necessary alterations thereof, as shown or indicated, of the Voting by Post Act shall apply to the election of Municipal Councillors for the Shire of Donald:—

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 9 shall apply, omitting the words "electors electoral province or district" in the second and third lines, and "province or district" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality" in both places; omitting the words "electoral provinces or districts" in the twentieth and twenty-first lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality," and omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur, and in line three omitting "Postmaster" and inserting "Officer" in lieu thereof.

Section 10 shall apply, omitting the words "Postmaster or" wherever they occur.

Section 11 shall apply unaltered.

Section 12 shall apply, omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where

it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Shire of Donald."

Section 14 shall apply, omitting the words "pursuant to the Constitution Acts Amendment Acts" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "together" in the twenty-sixth line down to the word "such" in the twenty-ninth line; omitting the words "said sections" in the thirtieth line, substituting therefor the words "*Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the thirty-ninth line down to the end of the section, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 16 shall apply, omitting the word "posted" in the first line, and substituting therefor the words "sent through the post"; omitting all the words after the word "shall" in the second line down to the word "every" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the words "have the necessary postage thereon prepaid."

Section 17 shall apply, omitting the words "within the provisions of section two hundred and seventy-five of the *Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890*."

Section 18 shall apply unaltered.

Section 19 shall apply unaltered.

Section 20 shall apply unaltered.

Section 21 shall apply, omitting the words "each electoral province or district" where they appear in the second and third lines, and the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 22 shall apply unaltered.

Section 23 shall apply unaltered.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The best quality only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. The cost of all postage, however, shall be defrayed; and printed forms required under the contract shall be supplied by the Education Department.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order; or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment when receipts, showing the due delivery of the goods, have been received from the teacher, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim. 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any school he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original; the duplicate to be retained by himself. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 15 of these conditions.

12. An invoice of each parcel shall be, by the contractor, forwarded by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, together with a form of receipt for him to sign and return. TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BY-LAW No. 72.

A By-law of the Town of Williamstown, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and numbered 72 for the purpose of regulating the construction and erection of buildings and erections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Williamstown order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall erect, construct, or build, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor, the plan and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within any of the streets mentioned in section seven (7) hereof (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction or any external or party wall) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection which is intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a shop, office, public building, or warehouse upon or within lines at a distance of thirty (30) feet from and running parallel with either side of the streets or roads mentioned in section seven (7) hereof unless the external walls thereof shall be of brick or stone, or of brick and stone together.

6. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only in any of the streets mentioned in the seventh (7) section hereof, unless the whole of the said building or erection, of whatever material constructed, shall cover an area of twelve hundred (1,200) square feet at the least, and if such building or erection be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and the ceilings of the main rooms shall be eleven feet six inches (11 feet 6 inches) at least.

7. The streets to which the foregoing sections four (4), five (5), and six (6) shall apply are the following:—

- (a) Esplanade.
- (b) Morris Street from Railway Terrace to Esplanade.
- (c) Victoria Street.
- (d) Verdon Street.
- (e) Ferguson Street.
- (f) Pasco Street.
- (g) Melbourne Road.
- (h) Parker Street.
- (i) Nelson Place.

- (j) Lyons Street.
- (k) Cole Street.
- (l) Hammer Street.
- (m) Electra Street.
- (n) Strand.
- (o) Douglas Parade from Ferguson Street to John Street.
- (p) Osborne Street.

8. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be moved or transported, any building or erection either in whole or in part into any part of the area to which this By-law extends, or from any part of such area to another part of the same unless such building or erection when completed shall comply with all the provisions of this By-law, and unless six (6) days' notice in writing of the intention to remove the same be first given to the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor.

9. If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection fourteen (14) days' notice in writing to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or to pull down or to remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Town Clerk, or Surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto.

10. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, or aviary or other separate outbuilding approved of by the Council, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

11. The sum of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) shall be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund for each building, erection, alteration, or addition approved of by the Council for erection, in any of the streets mentioned in section seven (7) hereof.

12. The following words or expressions whenever used in this By-law shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context; that is to say: "Council" shall mean the Council of the Town of Williamstown; "Surveyor" shall mean the Surveyor for the time being of the Town of Williamstown; "Town Clerk" shall mean the Town Clerk for the time being of the Town of Williamstown. The expression "Public Building" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, or as a school, college, or place of public instruction (not merely a dwelling house so used), or as a hospital, public theatre, public hotel, public concert room, public hall room, public lecture room, public library, or public exhibition room, or as a public place of assembly, or used or constructed or adapted to be used for any public purpose; also a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a hotel, lodging-house, home, refuge, or shelter. The expression "Warehouse" means a warehouse, factory, manufactory, workshop, public stable, brewery or distillery, or any other building exceeding in cubical extent 150,000 cubic feet which is neither a public building nor a domestic building. The expression "Dwelling House" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5).

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 72 of the Town of Williamstown, was passed by the Council of the Town of Williamstown on the 21st day of May, 1907, and confirmed by special order on the 18th day of June, 1907.

"(3) And for the better carrying out of the work of the Returning Officer and Scrutineers as detailed above—

"(a) A Register shall be kept in which to record for each person entitled to vote a specimen of his signature and his address, to be supplied in writing for that purpose, and unless such specimen signature shall have been supplied, the Returning Officer, if he have any reason to believe any vote received to have not been made by the person that it purports to have been made by, may declare such vote invalid, and the envelope containing the voting paper shall be initialed by the Returning Officer and Scrutineers and retained unopened.

"(b) Each Annual Report and Statement of Accounts shall contain a separate list showing the names of all Contributors entitled to vote, which list shall be compiled immediately after the 30th June in each year, and be made available at the Hospital not later than 3rd July in each year for inspection by Contributors."
