WHEREAS by section 202 of the Land Act 1901 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works to appoint and remove any number of persons, not less than three, or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified Crown land reserved, either temporarily or permanently, for any of the purposes et out in section 10 of the Land Act 1901, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby appoint the Council of the Shire of Korong to be a Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Parkrand Recreation purposes and for Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the township of Wedderburne.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MOLYULLAH.

W E, Edward Cain, William Ryan, and Cornelius Murphy, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Molyullah, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetcs, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, os, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be shrubs, or flow lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
