Health Act 1890.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.—BY-LAW No 116.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Prahran, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being By-Law No. 116, that is to say:—

1. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a fowl-yard any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling-house be possible and be necessary for the health of any of the residents in the vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of it or of the premises of which such fowl-yard forms part, to remove or alter it so that no part thereof shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling-house.

2. No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling-house establish or construct a fowl-yard, or cause one to be established or constructed, or within such distance permit

any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard, without the written permission of the Council, and any such permission may, if deemed necessary, be revoked by the Council.

3. Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Prahran.

REFUSE RECEPTACLES.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Prahran, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution, within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 117, that is to say:—

1. Clause No. 2 of By-law No. 100, made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises within the City of Prahran shall cause to be provided and kept therein a covered galvanized-iron receptacle not exceeding two and one-half cubic feet in contents, and of a uniform size and pattern, corresponding with the following:—

(a) *Material and Shape.*—The refuse receptacle to be cylindrical in shape, of galvanized iron of 24 gauge, coated on the inside with distilled tar, strengthened at the top with a wrought-iron band 1 in. wide by 3-16 in. thick, and at bottom with wrought-iron band 1½ in. wide by ¼ in. thick to keep bottom off ground, stiffened with two hoop-iron bands crossing beneath the bottom and carried up sides to rim.

Construction.—To be 18 in. in the longest and 15 in. in shortest diameter and 14 in. deep, receptacle to be 2 in. wider at top than at bottom to facilitate emptying of contents. To contain 1½ cubic feet.

To be provided with good, stout, rigid side handles and a flat conical cover, fitting easily over receptacle and constructed in such manner that when the lid is placed on receptacle the contents will be efficiently ventilated. Lid to be also provided with handle, and to be lettered, "Keep Contents Dry"; or

(b) *Material, Shape, and Construction.*—To be the same in every respect as (a), but to be 21 in. in longest and 17 in. in shortest diameter and 15 in. deep. Capacity not to exceed 2½ cubic feet; or

(c) Such material, shape, and construction as the Council may from time to time authorize or permit.

3. The occupier shall cause all house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be constantly kept covered except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of house refuse as aforesaid.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises situate in any of the parts of the said City set out in the Schedule hereto shall cause the receptacle hereinbefore mentioned to be placed and kept close to the yard or side entrance thereof between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m. on the day of the week stated in such Schedule in relation to the part of the City in which such house, building, or other tenement or premises are situated in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged by the scavengers or other person authorized or appointed by the Council of the said City to remove the same.

5. No person shall place or deposit any house refuse or garden refuse in any street, road, or right-of-way.

6. No person shall pick over or assort any household or street refuse except at the Council's depot, and then only with the written permission of the City Surveyor or of some other person authorized on that behalf by the Council.

7. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL.—BY-LAW No. 21, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Municipal Council in and for the Borough of Stawell, in the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 21 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in every part of the Borough of Stawell;

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling (1s.).

I desire to be registered, in accordance with the particulars in the Schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Council or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Council; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are, or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Council may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of

any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this By-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting Justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 27th day of March, 1908, and confirmed the 22nd day of May, 1908.

REGULATION OF GOOD ORDER AND DECENCY IN THE SOMERVILLE PARK.—SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.—BY-LAW NO. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, under section 197, sub-section 7, of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, and numbered 18, for preserving good order and decency in the municipal grounds known as the Somerville Park, purchased by the said Shire for the purposes of a Public Park and Recreation Ground, including any buildings or other improvements already there or that may be placed in or upon said grounds, and for fixing the amounts to be charged either by the Council themselves or by any club or association empowered to hold sports or shows by the Council of the above Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers of the *Local Government Act of 1903*, and of the *Municipal Grounds Act of 1905*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings order as follows:—

Except when the Council of the said Shire shall otherwise decide, the said Park shall be open from Eight o'clock in the morning to sunset in the evening for 365 days in the year, provided that no game or sport shall be played or engaged in on a Sunday.

The Council of the said Shire hereby authorize the Somerville Tennis Club to occupy and control the tennis Court built by them, and the members of such club to have free use of same during the existence of such club for playing the game of tennis, provided that same is conducted in a proper manner and in accordance with the wishes of said Council, and no person shall engage in a game of tennis on the enclosed court without the consent of the said club or of the Council of the said Shire of Frankston and Hastings.

Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the Council from giving authority to the Somerville A. and H. Association to hold a show and conduct riding and jumping competitions and other sports on from one to three days in the year, and to erect buildings and make such other improvements as may be authorized by the Council. The maximum entrance charge to the said show and sports to be 1s.

No person shall enter or remain in the Park or Recreation Grounds who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

No person, without permission of the Council, shall light any fire in the Park or Recreation Grounds, and no person shall interfere with or damage any of the trees, shrubs, flowers, or any other property or effects therein, or walk on the beds or borders.

No person shall go or be allowed upon any of the playing areas of the tennis courts unless such person wears boots or shoes having rubber soles or other suitable shoes.

No person shall play or engage in any game of cricket, football, lacrosse, bowling, tennis, or other game whatever in the Park or Recreation Grounds without the authority, in writing, of the Council, unless such person at the time of playing is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play therein, or such person shall have previously paid the prescribed charge or fee for playing or engaging in such game, or member of visiting team engaged in competition.

No person shall hawk or vend or in any other way offer for sale in the Park or Recreation Grounds any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the Council: nor shall any person sell or offer for sale any fermented or spirituous liquor without such consent.

No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council, shall bring into the Park or Recreation Grounds any horse or vehicle, nor any dog, nor any cattle, sheep, goats, or any other animal.

No person shall climb, jump, or get upon, under, or over any of the trees, fences, or gates of the Park or Recreation Grounds, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such trees, fences, gates, or seats, or any building thereof, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Park or Recreation Grounds, or leave therein any bottle, glass, orange or banana peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish whatever.

Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the Council of the said Shire from closing the Park or Recreation Grounds and excluding the public therefrom whenever they shall think fit, or prevent the Council from holding or permitting games or entertainments in the Park or Recreation Grounds, and excluding therefrom all or any person or persons but those who pay the sum fixed for admission thereto.

No person shall enter or remain in the Park or Recreation Grounds when the public is excluded, or when admission thereto is conditional on some payment or some consent being first obtained, without paying the sum fixed for admission thereto or obtaining the said consent.

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.—BY-LAW NO. 6.

REGULATION OF TRACTION ENGINE TRAFFIC.

A By-law of the Shire of Eltham, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to

- (a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,
- (b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—
- (i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
- (ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
- (iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- (iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF RODNEY.

By-law No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Rodney, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 21, for regulating traffic on the roads between Mooroopna and Shepparton.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rodney order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district, that is to say, within that part of the municipal district the boundaries whereof are as follows:—Commencing at a point on the south-east corner of allotment one, in the parish of Mooroopna; thence by a line south 42 deg. 58 min. east to the Goulburn River; thence north-easterly, south-easterly, easterly, and northerly by the river to the southern side of the Benalla and Echuca road; thence westerly by the southern side of the said road 28 chains 9 links; thence by a straight line bearing approximately south 30 deg. 30 min. west to the point of commencement.

2. In this By-law the term "high level road" shall mean and include that part of the main road in the Shire of Rodney between the point of commencement referred to in paragraph one hereof and the boundary between the Shepparton and Rodney shires, which has been raised to a height of eight feet or thereabouts above flood level, and which is indicated by a double fenced line of metalled road, and includes all bridges and culverts thereon; and the term "the side tracks" shall mean and include all roads or tracks between the point of commencement as aforesaid and the point where the high level road leaves the Rodney Shire and enters the Shepparton Shire other than the high level road.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle or bicycle, or driving any vehicle upon or along the high level road or the side tracks during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. No person shall ride or drive or impel any motor car, motor cycle or bicycle, or ride or drive any horse or vehicle over or along the high level road or the side tracks at a greater rate of speed than eight miles an hour without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle or bicycle, or riding or driving any horse or vehicle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and when in such motor car or on such motor cycle or bicycle, and when overtaking waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, any person overtaking such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road shall, within reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

6. In every case where a person driving or riding a motor car, motor cycle or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle or bicycle shall immediately stop and dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as reasonably necessary.

7. All cattle intended for sale or slaughter or shipment or travelling from one part of Victoria or any other State to any other part shall, when practicable, be driven along the side tracks, and shall not, except during flood times, travel upon or along the high level road, and nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or prevent cattle from being driven upon such parts of the high level road where there are no side tracks.

Cattle shall have the meaning as defined in section 3 of the *Local Government Act* 1903.

8. No person shall drive or travel any traction engine or any cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing a load the total width whereof exceeds twelve feet along the high level road except between the hours of One a.m. and Six a.m. in summer, and between One a.m. and Seven a.m. in winter without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

9. Sub-section 2 of By-law number 13 of the Shire of Rodney is hereby repealed as regards that part of the municipal district to which this By-law applies and has operation.

10. Every person driving any traction engine or any cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing a load the total width whereof exceeds twelve feet upon or along the high level road shall; when any person driving any motor car, carriage, cart, or other vehicle is approaching from the front or from behind and cannot conveniently pass, draw as close to the left-hand side of the road as he is able, and there pull his traction engine, cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing the load aforesaid to a stand-still, and remain so standing until the person driving the motor car, carriage, cart, or other vehicle approaching as aforesaid shall have passed.

11. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Rodney the twenty-fifth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and eight, and confirmed the twenty-ninth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eight.
