PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. A. BOWLEY AND CO.,
CLOTHING MANUFACTURERS, 156-8 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 17th July, 1908, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty-six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty-six females shall not be employed for more than sixty hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. REGULATION NO. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY
FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE
TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twenty-second day of July, 1908.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

- “(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- “(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- “(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act.”

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the *Railway Lands Acquisition Acts*, and known as the *Alexandra Township Railway Construction Trust*, make the Regulation following, viz:—

1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least four members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of three members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling him to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the

- enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.
27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.
28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.
29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.
30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.
31. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.
32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.
33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.
34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.
40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in, its terms disrespectful to the Trust.
41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.
44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by, order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.
45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.
46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.
47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.
48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.
49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.
50. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.
51. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.
52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Sir Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 29th day of April, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th day of May, 1908, and in the *Alexandra and Yea Standard*, a newspaper circulating in the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra through which municipality the Alexandra Township line of railway is to be constructed, His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., upon the petition of the Council of the Shire of Alexandra, announced his intention to constitute the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra the Railway Construction Trust for the Alexandra Township Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by the Governor in Council praying that such Trust be not so constituted: Now therefore I, the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this present Order constitute the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra (the Council which has petitioned to be constituted such Railway Construction Trust) to be the Railway Construction Trust under the name of the Alexandra Township Railway Construction Trust to act under the provisions of Part I. of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act of 1898*, and the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act of 1899* for the said Railway Construction District with respect to the said Alexandra Township line of railway authorized to be constructed by the *Alexandra Railway Construction Act 1907*, and to do all things necessary to fulfil and carry out such provisions.

THE ALEXANDRA TOWNSHIP RAILWAY
CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., by an Order in Council dated the 10th day of June, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of June, 1908, announced his intention to constitute under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* the land hereinafter described a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Alexandra Township Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by the Governor in Council praying that such Railway District be not constituted, and that the line of railway from

Alexandra-road to Alexandra township, authorized by the *Alexandra Railway Construction Act 1907*, be not constructed: Now therefore I, the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby by this my Order constitute the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the Alexandra Township Railway Construction District.

The lands above referred to:—

Part of the parish of Alexandra: Commencing at a point on the east boundary of the said parish, being the most northerly corner of allotment 113; thence by a two-chain road in a south-westerly direction by the north-western boundaries of allotments 113, 113B, 62A, 63, 65A; and part of the western boundary of allotment 66 to the intersection of the said two-chain road with a three-chain road; thence across the said three-chain road to a point on the north boundary of allotment 66A; thence in a westerly direction by the said north boundary to the north-west corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence in a southerly direction by the west boundary of said allotment 66A to the south-west corner thereof; thence across another three-chain road to a point on the north-east boundary of allotment 46C; thence in a north-westerly direction by the said north-east boundary to the most northerly corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence in a southerly direction by the west boundary of said allotment 46C to the south-west corner thereof; thence in a westerly direction by the south boundaries of allotments 46B, 46A, and 45A to the south-west corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence again in a westerly direction across allotment 45B in a straight line, being the production of the south boundary of said allotment 45A to a point on the east boundary of allotment 42B; thence in a southerly direction by part of the east boundary of said allotment 42B and the east boundary of allotment 42A to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence in a westerly direction by part of the north boundary of allotments 38A, 39, 39A, and 40A to the north-west corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence in a southerly direction by part of the west boundary of said allotment 40A to the south-east corner of allotment 40B; thence in a westerly direction by the south boundary of said allotment 40B to the west boundary of the parish; and thence southerly by part of the said west boundary of the said parish to the south-west corner thereof; and thence by the south and east boundaries of the said parish to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Molesworth: Commencing at the south-east corner of the said parish; thence in a northerly direction by the east boundary of the said parish to the north-east corner of allotment 24; thence in a westerly direction by the north boundary of the said allotment 24 to the north-west corner thereof; thence in a southerly direction by the west boundary of said allotment 24 to the south boundary of the said parish; and thence in a south-easterly direction by part of the said south boundary of the said parish to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Enoch's Point: Commencing at the north-west corner of the said parish; thence in an easterly direction by part of the north boundary of the said parish to its intersection with the east boundary of the Shire of Alexandra; thence in a southerly direction by part of the said east boundary of the said Shire of Alexandra to its intersection with the production easterly of the south boundary of the parish of Taggerty; thence in a westerly direction by the said production of the south boundary of the parish of Taggerty to its intersection with the boundary between the parishes of Torbreck and Enoch's Point; and thence in a northerly direction by part of the boundary between the said parishes of Torbreck and Enoch's Point to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Torbreck: Commencing at the north-west corner of the said parish; thence in an easterly direction by the north boundary of the said parish to the north-east corner thereof; thence in a southerly direction by the east boundary of the said parish to its intersection with the production easterly of the south boundary of the parish of Taggerty; thence in a westerly direction by the said production of the south boundary of the parish of Taggerty to the south-east corner thereof; and thence northerly by the boundary between the said parishes of Torbreck and Taggerty to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Kevington: Commencing at the south-west corner of the said parish; thence in a northerly direction by part of the west boundary of the said parish to its intersection with the east boundary of the Shire of Alexandra; thence in a south-easterly direction by part of that boundary to its intersection with the south boundary of the said parish; and thence in a westerly direction by part of the said south boundary of the said parish to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Maintongoo: Commencing at the south-west corner of the said parish; thence in a northerly direction by part of the west boundary of the said parish to the north-west corner of allotment 19A; thence in a north-easterly direction by a two-chain road running along the north boundary of said allotment 19A and through allotments 19, 35, 36, and 34B to the intersection of the said two-chain road with the north boundary of said allotment 34B; thence in an easterly direction by part of the north boundary of said allotment 34B and the north boundary of allotment 34A to the north-east corner thereof; thence northerly by part of the west boundary of allotment 29 to its intersection with a one-chain road; thence in a south-easterly direction by that road through said allotment 29, allotment 33, and allotment 33A to its intersection with the south boundary of said allotment 33A; thence in an easterly direction by part of the south boundary of said allotment 33A to the north-east corner of allotment 24; thence in a southerly direction by part of the east boundary of said allotment 24, to its intersection with a one-chain road; thence in a south-easterly direction by that road through allotment 25 to its intersection with the south boundary of said allotment 25; thence in an easterly direction by part of the south boundary of said allotment 25 to the south-east corner thereof; thence in a southerly direction by part of the east boundary of the said parish to the south-east corner thereof; and thence in a westerly direction by the south boundary of the said parish to the point of commencement.

Part of the parish of Wappan: Commencing at the south-west corner of the said parish; thence northerly by part of the west boundary of the said parish to the north-west corner of allotment 71; thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction by the north and north-easterly boundaries respectively of said allotment 71 to a point opposite the north-west corner of allotment 66; thence in an easterly direction across a one-chain road by the northern boundaries of said allotment 66 and allotment 103 to the north-east corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence again in an easterly direction across a road one and a half chains wide to the west boundary of allotment 65; thence in a southerly direction by part of the west boundary of said allotment 65 to the south-west corner thereof; thence in an easterly direction by the south boundary of said allotment 65 to the Delatite River; thence in a southerly direction by that river to a point opposite the south-east corner of allotment 68; and thence in a westerly direction by the boundary between the said parish of Wappan and the parish of Eildon to the point of commencement.

*Marine Act 1890.*PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITION TO THE
GENERAL RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the General Rules for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

REGULATION of traffic to provide for the safe navigation of the United States Fleet through the waters of the Port of Port Phillip on their arrival thereat.

The inwards and outwards traffic through the Entrance to Port Phillip and the South Channel within such Port shall be suspended from about Eleven a.m. to half-past One p.m. on the 29th of August, 1908, while the Fleet is being navigated through such waters.

During the progress of the naval procession of the ships of the Fleet from the South Channel to an anchorage ground at the head of Port Phillip Bay no person shall cause or permit any vessel to obtrude on the course or break into the line of the procession. Persons in charge of vessels desiring to join the procession shall cause their ships to fall into line astern of the rear warship or other vessel that may have already formed into line in such procession.

Persons in charge of vessels are required to keep at least a quarter of a mile from the above-mentioned anchorage ground.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY
COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 51.—COLIBAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-law following for the district supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said district:—

(I.) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d., Twenty shillings per annum.

(II.) Of any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d., Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £300 and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation exceeding £700.

(III.) Of lands on which there is no building, Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1908, and ending

with the 30th day of June, 1909, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st day of August, 1908, and the 1st day of January, 1909.

3. Such persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK
IN THE TOWN OF PORTARLINGTON, KNOWN
AS THE "EASTERN PARK."

THE Council of the Shire of Bellarine, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the Town of Portarlington, known as the "Eastern Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public free of charge except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only in the place set apart for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or figures on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings in the Park, or roll or throw stones therein, or remove any sand or soil from the Park.

5. No person shall bring into the Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of

Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall camp in the Park or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure, or bring into the Park any basket or box or other receptacle for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except workmen and labourers employed in the Park shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the Park on any evening set apart for entertainments, or bring any horse, carriage, or other vehicle into the Park except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket shall be of any avail except on the date specified thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder to enter any building, erection, or enclosure, or cultivated plot within the Park, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to collect tickets.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the Park notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The net proceeds of all entertainments other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park.

12. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Park after half-past Six p.m. on such days (not exceeding eight in any one year) as the Park may be set apart for entertainments shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	1s.
For the admission of every saddle horse (exclusive of rider), such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	1s.
For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	2s.
For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by two or more horses, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	5s.

Provided always that no fee shall be charged or taken for admission to the Park on any day embraced by the Christmas, New Year, or Easter holidays in any year.

Provided always that the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person, horse, carriage, cart, or vehicle during any evening on which the reserve is set apart for entertainments.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

A By-law of the City of Prahran, made under sections 10, 17, 18, 23, 26, and 34 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered one hundred and eighteen, for suppressing nuisances; providing for the health of the residents in the City of Prahran and against the spreading of contagious and infectious diseases; prohibiting spitting or expectoration on footpaths; and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran do hereby order as follows:—

1. *Placing Refuse in Streets*.—No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop or vehicle, into any street within the City or vacant land within the City, any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or throw down and leave in any street within the City any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse. No person shall throw down and leave in any street within the City any bill, placard, or other paper, which shall be torn off or removed from any premises.
2. *Bottles, Broken Glass, &c.*—No person shall throw down, or place, or leave any bottle or broken glass, nail or other sharp substance, on or in any street within the City, in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to passengers or animals, or damage to property.
3. *Spitting*.—No person shall spit or expectorate upon any footpath of any street of the City.
4. *Orange Peel, &c.*—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public footway within the City any fruit, skins, vegetable matter, or other substance.
5. *Advertising on Paths, &c.*—No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road within the City, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council.
6. *Noisy and Musical Instruments, &c.*—No person shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, ring any bell, cry any goods, bawl or sing in any street, within fifty yards of any dwelling house or place of business after being required by any inmate or occupier of such house or by any member of the police force to desist.

7. *Foul Water to be put in Sewers*.—No person on premises within the City, connected with the sewerage system of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, shall deposit or throw any household slops, soap-suds, or other foul or offensive fluid or matter upon any street within the City or upon any part of such premises, other than directly into drains or sinks by which such fluid or matter will pass directly into the sewers of the said Board.

Operation of By-law.—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Prahran.

Penalty.—Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.
