By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson-Carmichael, Baronet, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson-Carmichael, Baronet, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and forty-seven thousand three hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and seven and One thousand nine hundred and eight."

BOROUGH OF KEW.

BY-LAW No. 45.

A By-law of the Borough of Kew, made under sections 197 and 650 of the Local Government Act 1903 and the Municipal Grounds Act 1905, and numbered 45, for regulating the conduct of persons whilst at or within the Gardens, known as "Alexandra Gardens," Cotham-road, within the Borough of Kew, and for fixing the amount to be charged to persons using or entering in or upon the said Gardens.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, and the Municipal Grounds Act 1905, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kew order as follows:—

1. The said Gardens shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days and at such hours as a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council of the said Borough.

2. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the said Council closing the said Gardens and excluding the public therefrom whenever such Council shall think fit.

3. No person shall enter any portion of such Gardens when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

4. No person shall spit or expectorate within such Gardens or commit a nuisance or do any indecent act within such Gardens.

5. No person shall use indecent or abusive language within such Gardens or by unseemly behaviour interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of other persons within such Gardens, or enter them when intoxicated.

6. No person shall climb upon or get through, over, or under any fence at or within such Gardens.

7. No person shall play or engage in any game within such Gardens without the authority of the Council.

8. No person shall disturb, write upon, cut, or in any way deface or injure any wall, fence, seat, fountain, label, or other erection, structure, or path at or within such Gardens.

9. No person shall walk upon any bed, injure any lawn, or remove or injure trees, shrubs, plants, or labels, or pluck any flowers or disturb or interfere with any fish or other thing within such Gardens.

10. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder any caretaker, gardener, or any other officer of the Council in the prosecution of his duties.

11. No person shall remain within such Gardens at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employé of the Council to leave such Gardens.

12. No person shall within such Gardens light any fire or sell or offer for sale any article of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement without first obtaining from the Council permission so to do.

13. No public meeting shall be held within such Gardens unless authorized by the Council.

14. The Council shall have power to hold or permit performances in such Gardens and to make a charge for admission thereto.

15. No charge or fee for admission or entrance to such Gardens shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for children under twelve years of age.

16. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, may be removed from such Gardens.

17. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the municipal district known as "Alexandra Gardens," situate in Cotham-road and Gellibrand-street.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC ON ARRIVAL OF UNITED STATES FLEET.

THE following Port Rule is published for general information:—

Port of Port Phillip.

Regulation of traffic to provide for the safe navigation of the United States Fleet through the waters of the Port of Port Phillip on their arrival thereat:—

The inwards and outwards traffic through the Entrance to Port Phillip and the South Channel within such Port shall be suspended from about Eleven a.m. to half-past One p.m. on the 29th of August, 1908, while the Fleet is being navigated through such waters.

During the progress of the naval procession of the ships of the Fleet from the South Channel to an anchorage ground at the head of Port Phillip Bay no person shall cause or permit any vessel to obtrude on the course or break into the line of the procession. Persons in charge of vessels desiring to join the procession shall cause their ships to fall into line astern of the rear war-ship or other vessel that may have already formed into line in such procession.

Persons in charge of vessels are required to keep at least a quarter of a mile from the above-mentioned anchorage ground.

The sea breaks heavily over the rock in westerly gales. From the peaked southern islet the rock lies S. 80 deg. W. correct magnetic, distant one mile six and a half cables from that islet.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SEYMOUR  
PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Seymour Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other information required, must be stated to the Secretary of the Trustees at the time of making the application for any burial in the Cemetery.

3. Orders for or notices of interment must be given to the sexton of the Cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

4. Any person desiring to hold ground in the Cemetery for a private grave or graves must apply to the Trustees or their Secretary for the same.

5. That every adult's grave shall be at least six feet deep, and every child's grave five feet deep; and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet from the top of coffin to the original surface of the ground.

6. That no burial shall be permitted to take place without a certificate from a Registrar of Births and Deaths, Coroner, or a Justice of the Peace; such certificate shall be delivered or shown to the sexton before the funeral enters the Cemetery.

7. That any person having died from any infectious or contagious disease, the grave of such person shall not be re-opened within two years.

8. The usual hours for interment will be from Nine a.m. to Five p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April; and from Nine a.m. to half-past Four p.m. during the other months of the year; in the event of any burial for sanitary reasons on Sunday the hours shall be from Two to Five p.m.

9. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday, except where it is certified, in writing, by the Officer of Health of the District or by a Police Magistrate that, for sanitary reasons, it is necessary that the burial shall take place on that date.

10. That no interment shall be allowed between the hours of Five p.m. and Nine a.m. except by special permission of the Trustees.

11. In case an interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the owner must be left with the order.

12. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a headstone or monument in the Cemetery must be made to the Trustees, in writing, and, if approved of, permission will be granted on payment of the proper charges.

13. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, railing, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner. In the event of an owner refusing to do or have the work done the Trustees may have the work done, and recover cost of same by legal proceeding, as provided in section 21 of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

14. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

15. Licensed exhumations for removal and re-interment in any other grave or Cemetery shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., but the consent of the Trustees shall be first obtained.

16. That no dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.

17. That no smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the Cemetery.

18. That no person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any shrub, plant, or tree from the Cemetery, unless by permission of the Trustees.

19. Any workman employed in the Cemetery, though not employed by the Trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their Secretary, as may be necessary for the control and good order of the Cemetery.

20. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery; all refuse remaining after the work is completed must be removed at once from the Cemetery by the person employed on the work.

21. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily. All persons misconducting themselves, or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection, tree, shrub, or flower, or otherwise infringing the Act No. 1072, shall be dealt with as the said Act provides.

22. No child under the age of ten years shall be allowed to be in the Cemetery except in the charge of a responsible person.

23. The Trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these Regulations.

DEVIATIONS OF ROADS IN THE PARISH OF HAWKESTONE.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890* or any Act amending the same, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved

to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate certain roads in the parish of Hawkestone: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act No. 1893 aforesaid, doth hereby declare the roads defined in the following description to be public highways (that is to say):—

County of Talbot, parish of Hawkestone: Commencing at a point bearing N. 76 deg. 0 min. E. seven chains sixty-three links from the north-west angle of allotment 43 of section 6; bounded thence by a line bearing S. 21 deg. 33 min. W. twenty chains fifteen links; thence by a road bearing south twenty-five links and a half and S. 15 deg. 31 min. W. eight chains sixty-three links; thence by a line bearing N. 21 deg. 33 min. E. twenty-nine chains sixty-nine links; and thence by a road bearing S. 76 deg. 0 min. W. one chain twenty-three links to the point of commencement,

in lieu of a road in the same parish, defined in the following description (that is to say):—

#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PORT FAIRY HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

##### OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical aid to persons in destitute circumstances, and for a limited number of paying patients and casualties; and also to give temporary relief in cases of emergency as required.
2. The object of the Benevolent Asylum shall be the reception of the sick, aged, infirm, and destitute, with a view to affording them consolation and assistance.

##### LIFE MEMBERSHIP.

3. Every contributor of £10 and upwards, every person nominated by a society giving a donation of £20, and the first named executor in any will paying a bequest of £50 or upwards to the institution, or any benefactor whose services are valued at £10 or upwards shall be a life member.

##### CONTRIBUTOR.

4. Every donor of £1 and upwards shall be, and be alone, regarded as a contributor entitled to vote at all general meetings of the contributors held in the year for which his or her donation is paid.
5. Every annual contributor of £1 and upwards, and every life member, shall be eligible to be a member of committee.

##### CURRENT YEAR.

6. The current year shall, with respect to each contribution, be reckoned from the 1st of July, and shall terminate on the 30th day of the June following.

##### ANNUAL MEETING AND BUSINESS.

7. The annual meeting of life members and contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year, and shall be convened by public advertisement in one or more local newspapers.
8. At the annual meeting the report of the committee and audited balance-sheet shall be submitted for the approval of contributors.
9. Two auditors and one-third of the members of the committee for the ensuing year shall be elected at the annual meeting.
10. No person shall vote at any meeting while he or she is a salaried officer of the institution, or who may be financially interested in the subject before the meeting.

##### COMMITTEE.

11. The Committee of Management shall consist of twenty-four members, twelve of whom shall reside within the municipal district of Port Fairy, and twelve in the outlying districts (the latter shall not be required to attend meetings of committee).
12. The Presidents of the Shire of Belfast and Minhamite, and the Mayors of the Boroughs of Port Fairy and Koroi, shall be members of committee by virtue of their respective offices.
13. Immediately after the annual meeting the committee shall elect from their number a president, vice-president, and treasurer for the ensuing year.
14. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.
15. One-third of the members of committee shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.
16. Those members of committee who have been longest in office shall retire; but if any doubt exists as to who shall retire the same shall be decided by lot.
17. No person shall be nominated as a member of committee unless his consent has been obtained, and his subscription for the current year paid.
18. All elections when contested shall be by ballot.

## MEETINGS.

19. At all general or special meetings of the Committee of Management five shall form a quorum, and, as soon after the time fixed for holding such meeting as a quorum is present, the chair shall be taken by the president, or, in his absence, by the vice-president, or, in his absence, by a chairman appointed by the members present; but if there be no quorum within twenty minutes of the time named the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day and hour of the following week, or to such time as may be agreed upon by the members present.

20. No person shall be a member of the committee whilst a salaried officer of the institution.

## POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

21. The committee shall direct the general business of the institution; shall frame by-laws for its internal regulation; shall enter into all necessary contracts on behalf of the institution, and direct payment to be made therefor; shall fix the salaries of all paid officers and have power to discharge them. They shall have power to fill any vacancy that may occur during the year at a regular monthly meeting. They shall meet at the institution or other appointed place once at least in every month, and on such days and at such hours as they may fix. They shall have power to admit patients and make regulations concerning them. The chairman of the committee shall have a deliberative and a casting vote.

## SPECIAL MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

22. The committee by resolution, or three members thereof by writing under their hands, shall be at liberty at any time to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of the committee to be held within ten days from the date of notice. Three days' notice at least of such meeting shall be given to each member, by circular, by the secretary, and the occasion for calling the meeting shall be stated both in the requisition and summons, and no business other than that stated or indicated shall be transacted at such meeting.

## ATTENDANCE AND NON-ATTENDANCE.

23. The secretary shall keep a correct list for each year of the attendances and non-attendance at ordinary meetings of the committee, and a similar but distinct list in relation to special meetings, and in the event of any seat becoming vacant through insufficient attendance it shall be necessary, before the remaining members of committee proceed to fill the vacancy, that one month's notice be given by some member of the committee.

24. Any member of the committee absenting himself from four consecutive monthly meetings, except in case of sickness or by leave of the committee, shall cease to be a member for the rest of the current year.

25. Non-attendance at special meetings shall not in itself, or in conjunction with any other, occasion a vacancy of office.

## SPECIAL MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

26. It shall be competent at any time for the committee, by resolution, or for five or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the president to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days, a special meeting of the contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting to be stated in the requisition and summons, and no business shall be transacted at such meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting shall be called by the secretary, by advertisement, in one or more local newspapers at least one week before the day of meeting. Nine contributors shall form a quorum at all meetings of contributors.

## ALTERATION OF RULES.

27. No new general rules, nor any repeal of or alteration in the existing rules, shall be valid unless the same shall have been passed at a special meeting of the contributors.

## VISITING COMMITTEE.

28. The committee shall appoint from their own number two members for each month during the year who shall act as a visiting committee. The visiting committee shall meet on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and shall report to the committee as to the wants of the institution.

## ADMISSIONS.

29. All applicants for admission must be furnished with a recommendation from a contributor of not less than Ten shillings, and produce a medical certificate as to the nature of the disease or complaint from which they are suffering, and it shall be competent for the medical officer to admit only such cases as are authenticated, except in cases of accident and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency.

## PAYING PATIENTS.

30. No person who shall meet with accident, and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance, but paying patients

may be admitted on the certificates of the visiting committee and of the medical officer. The amount chargeable to each patient shall be determined by the committee, and shall be paid in such manner as the committee may direct.

## OUT-PATIENTS.

31. Persons unable to pay for medicine or medical attendance, but not requiring admission to the house, may be treated as out-patients of the Hospital on producing the recommendation of a contributor, countersigned by one of the visiting committee, and contributing the sum of Sixpence.

## PERSONS NOT ADMITTED.

32. No female for the purpose of confinement, no child under two years of age (unless suffering from serious injury or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident); no person insane or having any contagious infectious or other disease which, in the opinion of the medical officer, ought not to come within the operation of the charity, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

33. The committee may, if necessary, make provision for the reception and treatment of patients labouring under contagious infectious or other diseases on the Hospital ground, but at a suitable and safe distance from the main building.

## MINISTERS OF RELIGION.

34. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as may be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his or her wish shall immediately be complied with; and in the event of the death of any patient, notice shall be forwarded to the minister of the denomination to which the deceased person is supposed to have belonged, stating the hour of burial.

## WARRAGUL DISTRICT HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED 1908) BY-LAWS.

## OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the Hospital are to provide medical and surgical aid to sick persons in destitute circumstances in cases of accident or disease under such conditions as the committee shall from time to time determine.

## QUALIFICATIONS OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

2. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of the governors and contributors:—

£20 personal contribution in one year shall constitute a life governor.

£10 collected in one year by one person shall constitute collector an annual governor.

£10 to society or company or entertainment committee in one year to entitle to nominate annual governor.

£1 yearly subscription, contributor.

Any municipality contributing a percentage of its revenue shall have the privilege of nominating one annual governor for each Ten pounds given.

£20 or over paid to Hospital under will shall entitle first-named executor to the privileges for one year from payment of annual governor.

Persons who shall have conferred any special benefit to the Hospital may, irrespective of subscription, be elected honorary life governors at any special meeting on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and five out-patients every year.

## PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

3. Life governors, annual governors, and contributors shall be eligible to sit on the committee and be entitled to vote at all general, special, and adjourned meetings of governors and contributors (all such persons being herein referred to as "Contributors"), with power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:—

Life governors—three in-patients and five out-patients annually.

Annual governors—three in-patients and five out-patients annually.

Contributor—one in-patient and two out-patients annually.

4. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through some one member of such firm.

5. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid; and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privileges until his or her subscription be paid.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

6. At all meetings of contributors the president or one of the vice-presidents or treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, and, in their absence, the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

7. The president or chairman for the time being shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote as a contributor.

8. At all the meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum shall be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within one hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

9. The annual meeting of contributors to the Hospital shall be held on the third Friday of the month of July in every year, at Three o'clock in the afternoon, for the following purposes, viz. :—

1. To receive the annual report and balance-sheet of the institution.
2. The election of members of the Committee of Management.
3. The election of Honorary Medical Officers for the ensuing year.
4. The election of two Auditors, and fix their remuneration (if any).
5. To transact any other business of which notice shall have been given, or that may arise at such meeting in connexion with the institution.

10. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management or for twelve or more governors or contributors, by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special general meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being specified in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special general meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every meeting shall be called by the secretary or three members of the committee.

11. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

12. The Hospital shall be managed by a committee, to consist of fifteen members, who shall be elected from the governors and contributors for the time being at the annual meeting as aforesaid, and, in addition to the said number, the said meeting may elect the honorary medical officers of the institution (but not exceeding four of them) to be members of the committee for the ensuing year whilst holding such office.

13. All life governors, annual governors, and contributors shall be eligible for election as members of the committee, upon being nominated as hereinafter provided, seven days prior to the time fixed for the election.

14. The committee, at its first meeting after the annual meeting in each year, shall elect from amongst its members a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer for the ensuing twelve months.

15. The president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall preside at all meetings of the committee. In the absence of the president or vice-presidents the members present shall elect a chairman amongst themselves. The president or chairman for the time being shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

16. The committee shall direct the business of the Hospital and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution and other officials thereof, and shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on its behalf. All paid officers and servants shall find such security as may be required.

17. The committee shall be empowered to frame such rules and regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper internal government of the institution in its different departments and in connexion with the officers of the institution, and to alter, repeal, or amend same, provided that such rules and regulations are not repugnant to the By-laws of the institution or an Act of Parliament.

18. The committee shall meet on the third Friday in every month at a quarter to Four o'clock in the afternoon, and at such other times as may be necessary—five members to constitute a quorum. In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of such meeting it shall be in the power of the members present, or if there be no members present, of the secretary, to adjourn such meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from date of such adjournment.

19. The president shall be empowered to convene a special meeting of the committee at any time he may consider necessary, and the secretary shall, on receiving a requisition from three members of the committee, convene a special meeting thereof, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that for which it shall have been so convened.

20. On the third Friday in the month of July in every year one-third out of the fifteen members (elected) of the committee shall go out of office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office

shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or when two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot (Act 54 Vict. No. 1099, Sec. 14).

21. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent or assign his estate for the benefit of his creditors, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent without the permission of the committee for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to the institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the aforesaid provisions or by the said Act, are required to go out of office.

22. If a vacancy shall occur amongst the officers elected by the contributors such vacancy shall be filled by the committee. Every person so elected shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the contributors only.

23. The committee shall present at the annual meeting of contributors an annual report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a detailed statement of accounts duly audited, and a schedule of the attendance of each member of the committee at the meetings of the general and visiting committees respectively.

24. The president shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

25. No member of the committee shall enter into any discussion or vote on any question in which he shall have any pecuniary interest.

26. The Committee of Management may suspend any honorary medical officer or other officer of the institution on any well-founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by the majority of the members present at the special meeting of the committee to be convened for the consideration of such charge, and be confirmed at a special meeting of contributors, to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee, and such meeting shall have power to remove the name of such practitioner from the list of honorary medical officers.

27. The Committee of Management may appoint visiting, house, and finance committees as they may from time to time determine.

28. The common seal of the institution shall be kept in a box with two keys, one to be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

29. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Committee of Management, at a meeting at which at least a quorum of members is present.

## ELECTIONS.

30. At all annual elections held under these By-laws the committee shall appoint one of their number to be the returning officer, and such returning officer shall have full power to give a casting vote if necessary.

31. Not less than fourteen clear days before any election by the annual meeting under these By-laws the returning officer or his deputy shall give notice, by circular, to each contributor of the date of such election; and requiring every candidate for the committee at such election to nominate, in writing, at least eight clear days prior to the date fixed for the election, such nomination to be signed by two contributors nominating him, and by himself or his agent assenting to such nomination, and such notice shall have attached thereto a form of nomination.

32. When at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving nominations of candidates there are not more candidates than there are vacancies in each office respectively, the returning officer shall declare such candidate duly elected. If more than five vacancies in committee have occurred the annual meeting shall, by ballot, determine which of them shall hold office for the full term of three years, and which for one or two years, according as the extra vacancies may have occurred.

33. If at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving nominations of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of officers and members of the committee to be elected, the returning officer or his deputy shall cause ballot-papers to be printed with the names of all the candidates thereon, with their postal addresses, and shall notify such nomination in some newspaper circulating in the district.

34. For all contested elections for members of the Committee of Management a ballot-paper shall be forwarded as soon as practicable after the closing of nominations by post to each governor, subscriber, or contributor whose subscription shall be in force at the date of such annual meeting, such ballot-paper to bear the seal of the Hospital and to be initialed by the returning officer, and to be returned duly marked to the secretary, to reach him not later than Three o'clock on the date fixed for such annual meeting.

35. In the event of there being more than five vacancies for members of the committee at such annual meeting, then the five candidates who shall be highest on the poll shall hold office for the full term of three years; the other successful candidates shall hold office only for one year or two years, according as the extra vacancies may have occurred, the committee to determine as to these extra vacancies prior to such annual meeting.

36. All disputes regarding elections shall be decided by the Committee of Management, but at such meeting no member whose election is in dispute shall vote or take any part in the proceedings.

37. The returning officer at the expiration of the time fixed by him for the closing of the poll shall, in the presence of two scrutineers then and there appointed by the contributors, open the ballot-box, count the votes given to each candidate, and declare the result of such poll, and shall also notify such result in the next issue of some newspaper circulating in the district.

38. The secretary shall before each annual meeting of contributors make out a list in proper alphabetical order of all persons entitled to vote under these By-laws, such list to be certified under the hands of the president and treasurer.

39. In the event of the number of candidates nominated for the committee not being equal to the number to be elected, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above conditions, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of.

40. Nominations may be received for honorary medical officers and auditors at the annual meeting.

41. No election to any paid office at the disposal of the committee shall take place until seven clear days' notice at least shall have been given in one or more local newspapers inviting applications for same, and the salary of such officer shall in all cases be fixed for the current year before proceeding to the election.

42. No member of the committee or officer belonging to the institution shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the committee or for any work to be done for the committee.

43. Contributors whose contributions shall have been paid after the posting of the ballot-papers as aforesaid, but before the annual meeting, shall be entitled to vote and to receive ballot-papers for the said election of members of committee, provided that such ballot-papers be returned duly marked, to reach the secretary not later than Three o'clock on the date fixed for such annual meeting.

#### MEDICAL OFFICERS.

44. The honorary medical officers shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors.

45. There shall be three or more honorary medical officers, as the annual meeting may from time to time determine, and the committee may appoint to any vacancy during the year until the next annual meeting.

46. The honorary medical officers shall have access to the Hospital at all times. They shall perform all surgical operations in such order as may be agreed upon amongst themselves, but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of as many of the medical officers as can be obtained, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in cases of importance or protracted continuance in the Hospital.

#### PATIENTS.

47. Any applicant for relief producing a recommendation ticket then current from a contributor, and a certificate for fitness for admission from one of the honorary medical officers, shall, upon his or her signing the required declaration of inability to pay on the recommendation form, shall be received into the Hospital pending the advent of the visiting committee, and the visiting committee shall, on their next day of attendance, deal with all such applicants upon such conditions as they may deem proper, and they shall indorse their decision on each such patient's ticket; provided that if any applicant seeking relief be under the age of ten years the declaration on the ticket may be made by his or her parent or guardian.

48. Cases of accident or other cases of emergency may be received by the matron at any time without any recommendation ticket.

49. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expense of their in-maintenance as far as their circumstances may enable them, and all property found on deceased patients shall be handed to the legal representatives or the Curator of Estates, and an account rendered for the amount due for the patient's maintenance and burial.

#### TREASURER.

50. All moneys received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the treasurer and deposited by him within forty-eight hours of the receipt of same in such bank as the Committee of Management may from time to time appoint, to the credit of the Warragul District Hospital, and he shall also check the collector's receipt

book. He shall also give to the secretary at least once a week a written statement of all moneys received by him for entry in the proper books of the institution.

51. Payments shall be made by the treasurer only upon the orders of the Committee of Management, under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which such orders shall have been made, such payments to be made by cheque upon the banking account, signed by the treasurer and president, and countersigned by the secretary.

52. The treasurer shall also keep an account of all moneys received by him, and report the same at least once a month to the meeting of the committee, together with a statement of the banking account up to the date of such meeting.

#### VISITING COMMITTEE.

53. The Committee of Management shall, at each monthly meeting, appoint from time to time such of its members as may be arranged, not less than three, as a visiting committee, two to form a quorum, who shall visit the Hospital not less than once a fortnight, for the purpose of dealing with the admission and discharge of the patients. The visiting committee last appointed shall hold office until their successors are appointed.

54. The visiting committee shall have power to examine and check the Hospital books and records, to engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the Hospital under the direction of the Committee of Management. They shall keep a minute-book of their proceedings, and enter therein all complaints and directions or suggestions by them, such book to be open for inspection by the matron and medical officers, and be laid before each monthly meeting of the committee. They shall report to each monthly meeting of the Committee of Management as to their proceedings and the general control of the Hospital, and as to the number of patients being treated, and as to such other matters as they think of importance.

55. The visiting committee shall have power to make such purchases for the use of the Hospital or for such repairs to the building to the extent of Five pounds for each month, as may be urgently required.

56. Subject to confirmation by the visiting committee, the matron shall have control of the household servants of the Hospital, and shall have power to engage or discharge them. The matron shall conduct the household affairs of the institution in accordance with such regulations as shall be issued or given by the Committee of Management or the visiting committee, and in the event of any sudden vacancy amongst the servants between the monthly meetings she shall temporarily provide for the performance of the duties thus unprovided for.

#### AUDITORS.

57. The auditors shall, in the month of July in each year, or as soon as conveniently may be prior to the annual meeting of the contributors, examine the secretary's, treasurer's, and collector's books, together with the cash and other books of account of the institution, and the balance-sheet, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto. They shall certify as to the accuracy of the accounts for the preceding year, and the balance-sheet, and shall report thereon to the Committee of Management at the meeting appointed by them, and as to any matters connected with the bookkeeping of the institution.

58. The auditors shall retire at each annual meeting of contributors, but be eligible for re-election. Any vacancy occurring during the year may be filled by the committee until the next annual meeting.

#### SECRETARY.

59. The secretary shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the Hospital, and duly send out all notices, circulars, and ballot-papers as may be required, and compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before same, carry out all resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the Committee of Management, as prescribed by the By-laws or rules of the institution. The secretary may be required to procure a guarantee for such amount as the committee may decide.

#### COLLECTOR.

60. The collector shall canvass for and collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or receivable by the institution, and shall, within seven days of the time of receipt of such moneys, pay over the same to the treasurer, who shall give him a receipt therefor. He shall give printed receipts for all subscriptions or moneys paid to him, and shall keep counterparts or butts for the inspection of the treasurer and auditors. He shall furnish a guarantee or bond to the committee in such sum as the committee may determine, and shall keep all necessary books as directed by the committee.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE.

61. There shall be a finance committee appointed by the Committee of Management, to consist of three members and the treasurer, who shall examine all accounts prior to

the monthly meeting, and certify as to their correctness—two members to form a quorum. In the event of the finance committee not having passed the accounts prior to the meeting the committee shall have the power to appoint two of the members present to examine the accounts, and upon their reports the said accounts shall be dealt with by the committee. The visiting committee may from time to time be appointed to act as a finance committee if the committee shall so think fit.

## CONTRACTS.

62. All goods, when practicable, shall be supplied by contract, and the committee may, if they think fit, require all tenders to be accompanied by a cash deposit for the due fulfilment of the contract, and no contracts shall be entered into for the supply of goods or agreements entered into with the paid officers or servants for a period extending over the date of the annual meeting, or the first committee meeting held thereafter.

## ALTERATIONS OF BY-LAWS.

63. It shall be competent for the committee to alter the By-laws of the institution or to add to same at any time, subject to confirmation by a general meeting of the contributors specially convened for the purpose.

The above By-laws, made by the Committee of the Warragul District Hospital, were confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, held on the 29th day of May, 1908.

## SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

## BY-LAW No. 3.

## SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Gisborne, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act, for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Gisborne order as follows:—

*Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(A) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width, and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(B) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(ii.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to Move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic-way is narrow by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engines between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

(A) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(B) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(C) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## SHIRE OF ORBOST.

## BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the Shire of Orbost, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and numbered 20, for prohibiting the keeping of swine within the township of Lakes Entrance.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost order as follows:—

1. No person shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any swine in or upon any shed, house, building, ground, paddock, yard, or enclosure, within any portion of the township of Lakes Entrance.

## PENALTY.

If any person commit a breach of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every such breach on conviction before a Court of Petty Sessions be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that such court may order that the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.
