## PRÖCLAMATION

<sup>a</sup> By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson-Carmichael, Baronet, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia; do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize and validate certain Expenditure by Councils of Municipalities, in connexion with the Visit of the Fleet of the United States of America."

"An Act to provide for the Leasing of Certain Land granted as a Site for Municipal Purposes at Castlemaine."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.

#### AVOCA WATER TRUST.—BY-LAW FOR CONTROL, SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER.

THE Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the property of the Avoca Water Trust, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him in that behalf, make the following By-law providing for the control, sale, and distribution of water within the district of the said Trust:—

1. That Regulation No. 3, made by the Avoca Water Trust on the 13th day of June, 1887, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of July, 1887, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. No diversion within the Trust District of water the property of the Trust shall be made from the Avoca River, or from any creek, stream, watercourse, or lake, or works supplied with such water, unless application therefor shall have been made, as hereinafter provided, and such application has been approved.

3. No obstruction shall, without the authority, in writing, of the Auditor-General of Victoria or the receiver appointed by him, be placed or maintained in the Avoca River within the Trust District, or any creek, stream, watercourse, lake, or works therein supplied with water from the said Avoca River, so as to interfere with the free flow of water.

4. Any person desiring to obtain a supply of water from the Avoca River, or from any creek, stream, watercourse, or lake, or works supplied with water from the said river within the Trust District, must make application, in writing, to the Trust Engineer or the Water Bailiff.

5. Applicants desiring to obtain supplies of water must give at least seven days' notice, in writing, to the Trust Engineer or the Water Bailiff, and must state clearly:—

- The day and hour when it is desired to take the supply.
- The part of the river, watercourse, lake, or works from which it is intended to take the supply.
- Whether such supply is to be taken by gravitation or pumping.
- If the supply is for irrigation, the area to be irrigated, its situation, and whether it is grass land, ordinary cultivated land, or garden.
- If for filling tanks or dams, the dimensions of same must be given.

6. Payment for water must be made, in advance, to the Water Bailiff, who will give a receipt therefor in prescribed form.

7. Measurement of the quantity of water supplied shall, wherever practicable, be made by the Water Bailiff, and no water shall be diverted from the river, or any water-course, lake, or works except under the direction of the Water Bailiff or an authorized officer of the Trust.

8. The charges for water for irrigation shall be:—  
By gravitation, One shilling for each fourth of an acre foot—i.e., 3 inches in depth on one acre.  
By pumping, Sixpence for each fourth of an acre foot.

9. The charges for water for filling tanks for domestic and stock use shall be:—

By gravitation, One pound (£1) for each tank of capacity not exceeding 1,000 cubic yards. For tanks exceeding 1,000 cubic yards, One shilling (1s.) extra will be charged for each 100 cubic yards or fraction thereof.

By pumping, Ten shilling (10s.) for each tank of a capacity not exceeding 1,000 cubic yards. For tanks exceeding 1,000 cubic yards, Sixpence (6d.) extra will be charged for each 100 cubic yards or fraction thereof.

10. No charges shall be made in respect of land irrigated by the natural overflow of water from the Avoca River or its branches, but if any land be irrigated with water which has been caused to spread by banking or by cutting or breaking away of banks, or by any artificial means, the charges for irrigation, as fixed by this By-law, shall apply to the whole area irrigated.

11. Persons requiring water for irrigation or tank filling must construct any off-take deemed necessary at their own expense, but, nevertheless, under the direction and supervision of the Trust Engineer or Water Bailiff.

12. In no case shall the diversion of water by gravitation be commenced, and no pump shall be started until the Bailiff shall have given authority so to do. No tank or dam shall be supplied unless a proper drain or channel shall have been made to convey the water thereto.

13. The water shall be the property of the purchaser immediately it leaves the pump or off-take, and the purchaser shall thereupon be responsible for any damage to property that may arise through the water overflowing upon adjacent lands or otherwise howsoever.

14. Any person who shall pump or divert water in excess of the quantity to which he would be entitled in respect of payment made shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during the whole or any part of which such diversion shall have been made.

15. The Trust shall incur no liability through failure or refusal to supply water for any purpose to any persons whomsoever.

16. In the event of the Trust being unable through failure of works or from any other cause to deliver or supply the whole or part of the water paid for, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the whole or portion of the amount paid, as the case may be.

17. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall interfere with the works of the Trust shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such interference.

18. The minimum charge for any water supplied, either for filling tanks or dams, or for irrigation, shall be Ten shillings (10s.).

19. Any person or persons committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Water Act* 1905 it is among other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendation as to the granting of the application, or as to any alteration or addition he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or with or without any conditions, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks;
- (b) state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed;
- (c) specify the boundaries of the district to be called the Waterwork District of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any

municipality, the council whereof, or the councillors of any riding whereof, were applicants for the construction of such waterworks;

- (d) subject to the provisions of the said Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the Waterworks District, as the case may be;
- (e) assign a corporate name to the Waterworks Trust;
- (f) contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the said Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case the Governor in Council may think fit:—

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a Waterworks District is either wholly, or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such council to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with one or more persons not being members of such council, to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the Central Riding of the Shire of Warragul for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Warragul with water; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) That the Councillors for the Central Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Warragul for the time being, and three other persons, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Sixteen thousand five hundred and eighteen pounds (£16,518).
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 12, section 11, township of Warragul; thence northerly by Bowen-street to Alford-street; thence easterly by Alford-street to Hope-street; thence northerly by Hope-street to Sutton-street; thence easterly by Sutton-street to the north-east corner of allotment 25, section 6; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 25, 24, and 23 of the said section to the north-west corner of allotment 21 of the said section; thence easterly by the north boundary of the said allotment 21 to Normanby-street; thence southerly by Normanby-street to the north-east corner of allotment 5, section 8, in the said township of Warragul; thence westerly by the northern boundary of allotments 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 of the said section to Howitt-street; thence northerly by Howitt-street to Bourke-street; thence north-westerly by Bourke-street to a point where it is intersected by the southern prolongation of the western boundary of allotments 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16, section 11, township of Warragul; thence northerly by such prolongation and the western boundary of the said allotments to the north-west corner of the said allotment 12; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said allotment 12 to the point of commencement.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at" as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged, as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
