IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

MEDICAL OFFICERS, STATE SCHOOLS.

DREDGING, SOUTH CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners dated 24th April, 1908, it is hereby notified that the Dredger *John Nimmo*, having been repaired, will resume dredging operations at the northern edge of the artificial cut of the South Channel about Thursday next. REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tolimeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vid. voc.*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination* of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1909.

WHEREAS by section 32 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907* (7 Edw. VII. No. 2106), it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations for prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Indeterminate Sentences Board constituted under the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907*.
2. Nominations of persons to be probation officers shall be made by the Indeterminate Sentences Board to the Chief Secretary.
3. There shall be a Chief Probation Officer, who, for the purposes of the Indeterminate Sentences Act, shall be a probation officer for the whole of the State of Victoria. The Chief Probation Officer shall perform the duties of a probation officer as prescribed by the Indeterminate Sentences Act and these Regulations. He shall visit a person released on recognisance and placed under his supervision in accordance with the requirements of the Court's direction.
4. Subject to the direction of the Board the Chief Probation Officer shall have authority—
 - to exercise a general supervision over the work of other probation officers;
 - to inquire into and report on the work of any probation officer;
 - to require returns and reports from each probation officer;
 - to make recommendations and submit reports concerning probation work;
 - to collect statistics in relation to probation work under the Act.
5. Every probation officer other than the Chief Probation Officer shall be assigned to a city, town, district, or place as the Governor in Council may direct.
6. It shall be the duty of a probation officer immediately a case is committed to his supervision to furnish full particulars of the case to the Board in the form No. 1 of Schedule A.
7. Every probation officer shall make a return for each quarter of the year ending on the last days of the months of March, June, September, and December to the Board on or before the 15th day of the month following each quarter in the form No. 2 of Schedule A of all persons placed under his supervision stating particularly the steps he has taken to satisfy himself that the conditions imposed by the Court are being observed and the general conduct and surroundings of each probationer.
8. Every probation officer shall keep a register in which he shall record full particulars in the form No. 3 of Schedule A of each person placed under his supervision. He shall also record periodically particulars of all matters ascertained by him in regard to the conduct, associations, and environment of each probationer.

9. Whenever a person is released on recognisance and placed under the supervision of a probation officer it shall be the duty of the probation officer in the absence of any direction from the Court to visit such person at least once a month, or, should this be impracticable, to require a report from such person as to his surroundings, mode of spending his leisure, occupation, and his doings generally, at least once a fortnight; to take all necessary steps to satisfy himself that such person is obeying the conditions of his recognisance, to advise, assist, and befriend such person, and, when necessary, to endeavour to find him suitable employment; and to perform any special duties that the conditions of recognisance imposed by the Court may involve.

10. When the conduct of a person released on recognisance under the supervision of a probation officer is unsatisfactory and he fails to observe one or more of the conditions of his recognisance it shall be the duty of the probation officer to swear an information before a justice in accordance with section 29 of the Indeterminate Sentences Act, and to report to the proper officer of the Court which released such person on recognisance respecting the matter, and to furnish a special report of the case to the Board.

11. Whenever a person released on recognisance under the supervision of a probation officer is again convicted during the currency of such recognisance, or whenever a person so released removes to some other city, town, district, or place, it shall be the duty of the probation officer to report the case to the proper officer of the Court which released such person on recognisance and to furnish a special report to the Board.

12. When the period for which a person was released on recognisance under supervision has expired the probation officer shall make a report to the Board as to whether such person has satisfactorily fulfilled all the conditions of his recognisance.

13. All returns and reports required to be made to the Board under these Regulations shall be sent through the Chief Probation Officer.

14. The recognisance to be entered into under sections 23 to 25 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907* shall be in the form of Schedule B to these Regulations or to the like effect.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SITE RESERVED FOR RECREATIVE PURPOSES AT DARLINGTON.

WE, Thomas Dowling, T. F. Cumming, and John Laird, the duly-appointed trustees of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 7th of April, 1870, as a site for Recreative purposes at Darlington, having passed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for

the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entrance therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

No. 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for tennis, cricket, or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

No. 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

No. 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees or shrubs or flowers in the reserve.

No. 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

No. 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

No. 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles without the consent in writing of the trustees first obtained.

No. 7. No person except labourers employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

No. 8. Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Departments.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed: all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 7s. a day, unless other wages and conditions may be determined by any special Board under the Factories and Shops Acts which may be appointed for this trade during the currency of this contract, when every such person shall be employed at such wages and subject to such conditions as may be thus determined; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW NO. 25.

A By-law of the Town of Camberwell, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 25, for suppressing nuisances, providing for the health of the residents in the Town of Camberwell, and against the spreading of contagious and infectious diseases, prohibiting spitting or expectorating on foot-paths, regulating traffic and processions; regulating the use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged projections. Prohibiting the throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway of orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter. Prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, or device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council thereof, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, and for repealing By-law No. 18.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. *Repeal.*—By-law 18 of the Shire of Boroondara, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, for regulating traffic and processions, and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, and passed by the Council on the 27th day of August, 1900, is hereby repealed.

2. *Definition of Street.*—The word "Street" shall mean and include any highway, public bridge, road, lane, path-way, footway, square, place, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

3. *Noisy and Musical Instruments, &c.*—No person shall without the consent of the Council sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, ring any bell, cry any goods, bawl, or sing in any street within fifty yards of any dwelling-house or place of business after being required by any inmate or occupier of such house or by any member of the police force to desist.

4. *Placing Refuse in Street.*—(a) No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle into any street any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or being a hawker of rabbits, fish, fruit, or vegetables, or a news-vendor or other street trader, or any other person not being a street trader, throw down and leave in any street any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

(b) No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other substance intended, or apparently intended, for the purpose of advertising.

(c) No person shall throw down or leave in any street any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any bill-posting station.

5. *Bottles, Broken Glass, &c.*—No person shall fully throw down, place, or leave any bottle or broken glass, nail, or other sharp substance on or in any street in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to passengers or animals, or damage to property.

6. *Spitting.*—No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpath of any street in the Town of Camberwell.

7. *Orange Peel, &c.*—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public highway any orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter.

8. *Foul Water to be put into Sewers.*—No person on premises connected with the sewerage system of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall deposit or throw any household slops, soap suds, or other foul or offensive fluid or matter upon any street, or upon any part of such premises other than directly into drains or sinks by which such fluid or matter will pass directly into the sewers of the said Board.

9. *Vehicles to be Lighted at Night.*—No person shall, between one half-hour after sunset of any day and one-half hour before sunrise of the next day, drive or permit or allow to be driven or impelled any wheeled vehicle of any description whatever, whether drawn or impelled by himself or drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, whether licensed or not, upon or along any street without carrying in front thereon a good serviceable and effectual lamp, with a light burning therein sufficiently bright to be seen at a distance of fifty yards therefrom, securely fixed to the off-side of such vehicle.

10. *Processions.*—No procession of persons, animals, or vehicles of any description shall march, parade, or pass along any street for other than funeral purposes unless the persons, or some one or more on their behalf, organizing or intending to take part in such processions or conducting the same, shall have previously obtained the written consent of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, and then only by the route and during the hours specified in such written consent, nor unless the recipient thereof shall have given 24 hours' written notice of the time, place, and route intended, with other particulars of such consent, to the officer for the time being in charge of the police of that portion of the Town.

11. *Rule of the Road.*—(a) Every person driving any animal or vehicle whatever, or riding any animal, shall keep to the left or rear side of the carriage-way of the street, and when passing any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction shall go or pass on the right or off-side of such other vehicle or animal, and shall allow any person desirous so to do to pass on the right or off-side.

(b) No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal on the right-hand or wrong side of the road without justifiable cause, and every person driving any vehicle, or riding any animal, shall keep as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side, so as to permit other persons going in the same direction to pass freely on the right-hand or off-side.

12. *Vehicles Obstructing a Street.*—No person shall leave any cart or other vehicle in or on any street without any horse or other animal being harnessed thereto, unless in consequence of some accident having occurred for which he is not responsible.

13. *Vehicles not to be Left Unattended.*—No driver of any vehicle shall be away from his horse, or cattle, so as to be unable to have full control of it, or them, unless one of the wheels of such vehicle be securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof.

14. *Barbed Wire.*—No person shall erect, affix, use, or maintain or permit to be erected, affixed, used, or maintained, or to continue on any building, fence, or land occupied by him any wire with spikes or jagged projections within six inches of any street. Provided, nevertheless, that this clause shall not prohibit the affixing or continuing of any number of strands of such wire at a height of not less than seven feet from the level of any street, at any point whereat the land abuts on such street.

15. *Advertising on Paths, &c.*—No person shall, without the previous consent of the Council, write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any street or upon any building, fence, garden seat, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council.

16. *Operation.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Town of Camberwell.

17. *Penalty.*—Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of any clause of this By-law shall upon conviction thereof for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Five shillings.

TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Town of Camberwell, made under subsections 6 and 7 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 26, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the Municipality and under the control or management of the Council, or preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. *Preserving Good Order and Decency.*—No person shall at any meeting held in any building belonging to the Municipality of the Town of Camberwell, or under the control and management of the Council thereof, behave in a disorderly or riotous manner, or take part in any disturbance, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct, or disturb or interrupt any meeting or gathering, or curse or swear, or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or cause any obstruction by standing or loitering in the approaches to the external doors of such building, or in the corridors, aistles, or passages within the same, after having been required by any member of the Police Force or any officer of the Council generally or specially authorized in that behalf to discontinue such loitering or standing, or enter or remain in such building while in a state of intoxication.

2. No person shall stand upon any chair or seat, or upon any window sill, cornice, or railing; or deface the walls by writing thereon, or otherwise injure or damage the said building or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

3. No person shall interrupt any chairman or other speaker who is addressing any public or other meeting or gathering, provided that nothing in this clause shall be deemed to prohibit any interruption by the chairman of any such meeting for any purpose, or by any person for the purpose of, and whilst raising what, in the opinion of the chairman of such meeting, is a genuine point of order.

4. No person other than a member of the Council, the Town Clerk, and the Hallkeeper shall enter or remain in any meeting or gathering held in any such building as is hereinbefore mentioned when admission thereto is conditional on some consent or some payment without obtaining such consent or paying the sum fixed for admission thereto as the case may be.

5. Every person offending against any of the foregoing provisions of this By-law, in addition to being liable for the penalty, may be forthwith removed from such building by any person at the request of the chairman of such meeting, or if there be no chairman, then at the request of the person conducting, or who convened such meeting or gathering.

6. In addition to any penalty provided in this By-law, the Council may recover the cost of repairing or making good any damage done to the building, furniture, or fittings from the person doing such damage.

7. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings for each such offence.

1. By-law No. 22 of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara, prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander on land not enclosed by a substantial fence, passed by the said Council on the 11th July, 1904, is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the Municipal District, that is to say:—All that portion of the Town of Camberwell bounded on the north by Whitehorse-road, on the west by Burke-road, on the south by Toorak-road and Norwood-road, and on the east by Boundary-road.

3. No person being the owner or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

4. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty for each head of cattle of not more than One pound, and not less than Five shillings for the first offence, of not more than Two pounds nor less than Ten shillings for the second offence, and not more than £5 nor less than One pound for the third and any subsequent offence.

A By-law of the Shire of Stawell, made under section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 6, for prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon certain streets in the Township of Glenorchy.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Stawell order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following streets, being portion of the Township of Glenorchy, that is to say:—Bunbury-street from Arapiles to Marl-street, Forest-street from the Wimmera River northerly to the south-west angle of allotment 16, section 14, of the said township and the street (unnamed) from the south-west angle of allotment 16, section 14, Township of Glenorchy, to the Railway Station.

2. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them in any of the streets hereinbefore described the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle, and impound them or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.

3. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any Justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the Justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty, and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the Justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

4. If such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.
