REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Constitution.
 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his
- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been pro-fessionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australissian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of height, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks.
(Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sex-tant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachecmeter, and steel band.

Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those napers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Kaniva and Lillimur Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby required.
- 2. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Secretary when applications are made and orders are given.
- 3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate of right of burial, which shall give the holder or his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein. other erection therein.
- 4. No interment shall be permitted until an application hus been made, the required particulars given, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tomb-stone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription, or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees of the Trustees.
- 6. Application for an order for interment shall be made least eight working hours before the time fixed for burial.
- 7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed:
- 8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in other months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year.
- $_{\rm 9}.\ {\rm No}$ catacombs or wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan to the Trustees.
- 10. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- 11. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless with previous authority from the Trustees.
- 12. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.
- 13. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner.
- 14. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office.
- 15. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than three feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least one, foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 16. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister authorized in that behalf.
- 17. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next Rule.
- 18. That in case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given.

rg. That every person dressing, attending, digging graves, or doing other work within the Cemetery, shall comply with the following Rules, viz.:—

First.—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing, attending, digging, or re-opening graves shall be placed on any grave, and when placed temporarily on any adjoining ground, or path, shall be placed after interment or completion of work, to such spots as the Trustees may from time to time appoint.

Second.-That all refuse and other materials remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once by, or at the expense of, the person causing same, and if the ground is in any way cut up the same shall be neatly levelled off and left in the same order as before.

Third.—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for dressing graves, or other purposes, without permission from the Trustees.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HEATHCOTE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD-FIELDS COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council, on the 8th of January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of McIvor, as managers of the Heathcote Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Lands and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:

Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five miles from the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall all cases be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration or branding, and shall be as follow:—For every horse, Eight shillings per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum; for

every goat, Two shillings per annum; for every head of other small cattle, Two shillings and sixpence per annum; for every horse depastured on the Common for not more than two days in each week, Five shillings per annum.

4. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owners of

such stock.

5. The Pounds to which the foregoing Regulation shall apply are the Heathcote Pound and the Tooborac Pound. 6. No person shall remove registered stock from the Common without the consent, in writing, of the managers

or the herdsman.

7. No bull or entire horse, shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without the permission of the mana-

8. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed for the purposes of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered and branded with the Common brand.

o. Whenever the managers have reason to believe that

Whenever the managers have reason to believe that any animal on the Common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall within six (6) hours after receiving notice, in writing, to that effect from the managers or herdsman remove such animal from the Common, and in case of neglect or refusal to so remove such animal, the managers shall be at liberty to order its immediate destruction and burial (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof; and the managers shall be at liberty to refuse registration of any other stock of such owner until he shall have paid the expenses. No compensation shall be allowed for the destruction of any diseased animal. any diseased animal.

No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcass be not removed after six (6) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expenses so incurred has been poid. been paid.

- 1. Any former Regulation made under the provisions of the Local Government Act so far as it relates to the matters and things provided for in this Regulation is repealed.

2. No person shall erect, construct, or build, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection contrary to the provision of this Regulation.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its secretary or surveyor, the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

4. No. person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within the area mentioned in section six (6) hereof (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction, or any external or part walls) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only, within the area mentioned in section six (6) hereof, unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever material constructed shall cover an area of one thousand (1,000) square

feet at the least, and if such building or erection be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and the ceilings of the main rooms shall be eleven (11) feet at least.

6. The portions of the Shire to which the foregoing sections numbered four (4) and five (5) shall apply are as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Merri Creek where the south boundary of section 139, parish of Jika Jika, abuts thereon; thence east by the south boundary of sections 139 and 138 of the aforesaid parish to the east side of Victoria-street; thence north by the east side of Victoria-street to the north side of Bell-street; thence west by the north side of Bell-street to the east side of O'Keefe-street to the south side of Wood-street; thence east by the south side of Plenty-road; thence horth by the west boundary of 20189 survey to the north-west side of Tyler-street to a point six hundred and eighty-nine (689) links east of Plenty-road; thence north by the west boundary of 20189 survey to the north-west side of Plenty-road; thence by a line joining this point and the north-west corner of the said survey; thence west by the north side of High-street; thence north by the east side of High-street; thence north by the east side of forty (40) chains; thence south by a line to the north side of Regent-street to the west side of Gilbert-road; thence south by the west side of Gilbert-road to the north side of Regent-street to the west side of Gilbert-road; thence south by

No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, any building or erection either in whole or in part into any part of the area to which this Regulation extends, or from any part of such area to another part of the same unless such building or erection, when completed, shall comply with all the provisions of this Regulation, and unless six (6) days' notice, in writing, of the intention to remove same be first given to the Council, its secretary or surveyor.

8. If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly

If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this Regulation, the Council, its secretary, or surveyor may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, fourteen (14) days' notice, in writing, to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or to pull down or to remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, its secretary, or surveyor, to enter upon such building or erection, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its secretary, or surveyor, in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale; and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto.

9. This Regulation shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, or aviary or other separate outbuilding approved

9. This Regulation shall not apply to any fence, green-house, or aviary or other separate outbuilding approved of by the Council, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

ro. No building may have an external wall of wood (a) within four (4) feet, measured horizontally, of land not in the same possession or occupation, unless the latter be a public way or public drain at least four (4) feet wide, or (b) within eight (8) feet of another building or erection with an external wall of wood built on land in the same possession or occupation.

11. No two or more houses may be built together unless they have not less than an eight and a half inch (8½ in.) brick or stone party wall, projecting in case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork (front and back), and in all cases projecting one foot at least throughevery part of the roof, whether belonging to the sameowner or not.

12. The external wall of any building or erection within four (4) feet, measured horizontally, of land not in the same possession or occupation, or within eight (8) feet, measured horizontally, of another building or erection with an external wall of wood built on land in the same possession or occupation, must be built of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches thick, and be carried up and remain at least one foot higher than the nearest part of the adjoining sutter or voof of the adjoining gutter or roof.

13. Every wall (other than wood) shall have a damp-proof course above the surface of the ground throughout its whole thickness of asphalt or other material impervious to moisture, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the ends by a vertical course of the same material.

14. The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

15. No porticoes shall be erected which shall be less than seven feet six inches (7 ft. 6 in.) in height in the rlear over the kerbing and footpath, and shall be of the full width of the footpath, unless special permission be first obtained from the Council authorizing any deviation from this Regulation. The posts of such porticoes shall, in the case of wood, be of such timber as approved of by the Council, and be not less than five (5) inches square, and in the case of iron, not less than four (4) inches in diameter.
