NETTING AT GIPPSLAND LAKES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by the *Upper Yarra Traffic Act 1909*, hereby make the Regulations following, viz. :—

PRELIMINARY.

(1) For the purpose of these Regulations the words following shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction :—

“River” shall mean the portion of the River Yarra Yarra from Queen’s-bridge, at Melbourne, to Dight’s Falls, or to such place further up the stream as may be at any time proclaimed by the Governor in Council.

“Department” shall mean the Department of Public Works.

“Boat” shall include any boat, canoe, house-boat, barge, raft, punt, craft, or vessel whether propelled by wind or oars or by steam, electricity, or other mechanical power, or towed.

“Boatman” shall mean any person who may be engaged in the navigation of any class or description of licensed boat.

“Licence” shall mean a licence for the time being in force issued by the Port Officer, or a licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria or the Melbourne Harbor Trust and approved in writing by the Port Officer.

(2) The owner or other person in charge of any boat on the river shall conform to these Regulations, and promptly obey and conform to the directions of any officer of the Department or any member of the Police Force on duty.

PASSENGER BOATS PLYING OR LET FOR HIRE.

(3) No boatman shall carry in his boat more than the number of passengers which such boat is licensed to carry.

(4) Every boatman and motor-boat driver shall on demand produce his licence to any officer of the Department, or to any member of the Police Force.

(5) Every boatman shall have a printed copy of these Regulations, and shall produce the same on demand to any person hiring his boat.

(6) Whenever any boat shall be let for hire on any occasion the owner of such boat shall notify the person hiring the same of the number of persons which such boat is licensed to carry or which such boat if not licensed can carry with safety.

(7) No person shall let any boat for hire unless he has taken all reasonable precaution to ascertain that a person competent to manage such boat is to be in charge thereof, nor shall he let any boat to a party any member of which is under the influence of liquor.

(8) No boatman shall use any insulting or offensive language, or be guilty of insulting behaviour to any passenger or any other person, while in or upon the river or at any wharf or passenger stair on, or abutting on, the river.

(9) All goods or property left in any boat shall be delivered by the boatman or owner of the boat to the officer in charge of the Ports and Harbors Office, Custom House, Melbourne, or the nearest Police Station, as soon as practicable after the same shall have been found.

RULE OF THE RIVER.

(10) Every boatman or person in charge of a boat shall at all times strictly observe the rule of the river, that is to say :

(a) Every boat shall be kept to the right or starboard side of the river, and in meeting boats shall be navigated so as to pass any other boat with the left side of one next to the left side of the other, or port side to port side.

(b) Every boat overtaking another boat shall be navigated so as to pass on the left or port side of such other boat, which shall be kept to the right or starboard sufficiently to allow any overtaking boat to keep clear.

(11) Boats turning round or crossing from one side of the river towards the other shall be kept out of the way of boats proceeding up or down the river, and shall not be turned round or crossed from one side of the river to the other immediately in front of any approaching boat.

STEAM BOATS AND MOTOR BOATS.

(12) Every boat propelled by mechanical power, when approaching a rowing or sailing boat shall, as far as possible, be kept out of the way of such latter boat, and shall also, if necessary for the safety of either boat, be caused to slacken speed or stop or reverse.

(13) Boats propelled by mechanical power proceeding against the stream shall be caused to slacken speed, and, if necessary, stop to allow boats coming down with the stream to pass clear, particularly when rounding points or sharp bends in the river.

(14) On the portion of the river between Prince's-bridge and the Engineer's Depot no boat propelled by mechanical power shall be driven at a rate of speed exceeding 4 miles per hour, and on every other part of the river the speed at any time shall not exceed the rate of 8 miles per hour.

(15) Notwithstanding anything contained in the next preceding clause, no boat shall at any time be propelled at such a speed as to endanger by its wash or otherwise the safety of any other boat or person.

LIGHTS AFTER SUNSET.

(16) Every person in charge of any boat in the river shall, between sunset and sunrise, have lights exhibited according to the description of boat, as follows :—

(a) Boats propelled by any mechanical power shall carry a red light exhibited in such a position that it can be clearly seen by boats approaching or passing.

(b) Boats propelled by oars or sails shall have ready at hand a lantern showing a white light, which shall be temporarily exhibited to approaching boats in sufficient time to prevent collision.

MOORING, ETC., OF BOATS.

(17) Boats shall be moored or berthed only in such part or parts of the river, and in such a manner as may from time to time be appointed by the Port Officer ; and all moorings laid down in the river shall be subject to the approval of the Port Officer.

(18) No person shall cause any boat to lie or loiter in any part of the river so as to obstruct the free navigation, or interfere with the ordinary traffic thereof, provided always that nothing in this clause shall prevent any boat from remaining during any regatta, boat race, procession, or other special occasion at such place and for such length of time as may be sanctioned by the Port Officer or any officer of the Department acting for him for the time being.

(19) With the exception of the Port Officer or other officer of the Department acting for him for the time being, no person shall remove, unmoor, interfere with, cast off, or take away any boat from any wharf or place appointed by the Port Officer for the mooring or berthing of boats, without the permission of the owner or other authorized person.

(20) No person shall cause to remain on the river any boat which is considered by the Port Officer, or any officer of the Department acting for him for the time being, to be too large for or unsuitable for the river, or likely to become offensive or annoying by reason of noise, smoke, or smell, or the machinery of which is defective, or is or likely to be or become dangerous to life or traffic.

BOAT RACES, REGATTAS, ETC.

(21) No boat race, regatta, or other assemblage of boats shall take place on the river without the permission of the Port Officer, and upon such special conditions as the Port Officer may from time to time impose. This prohibition does not apply to races promoted by a rowing club for its own members only.

(22) The following Regulations shall apply to boat races, regattas, and other occasional assemblages of boats for which permission shall have been given by the Port Officer under Regulation 21 :—

- (a) No person shall cause any boat to be navigated on the river in such a manner as to obstruct, impede, or interfere with the boat race, regatta, or assemblage of boats, or endanger the safety of persons on the river or prevent the maintenance of order thereon.
- (b) During racing hours, that is to say, between noon and the conclusion of the day's racing, no boats other than rowing boats, punts, canoes, umpires' launches, or boats engaged in keeping order, and having a permit therefor from the Port Officer, will be permitted to navigate any portion of the course, except during such intervals between the racing as may be specially fixed and set out in the official programme of the boat race, regatta, or other assemblage of boats.
- (c) When the pre-arranged bells for clearing the course ring, or when otherwise ordered by the officer in charge of the course, all non-competing boats must pass off the course as quickly as possible. Between the starting point and Brander's Ferry, such boats, punts, or canoes shall lie close to the south bank of the river; and between Brander's Ferry and Prince's-bridge, except on the portion of the course which may be specially buoyed for racing, they shall lie close to the north bank of the river.
- (d) No boats other than those engaged in the authorized race or races shall land passengers on the boat stagings in front of the boat-houses on the south bank of the river near Prince's-bridge.
- (e) No person in charge of or on board any boat shall in any way obstruct, impede, or interfere with any boat engaged in the authorized race or races.
- (f) Except as may be laid down in the special conditions referred to in Regulation 21, no house-boat, sailing-boat, barge, or any vessel driven by mechanical power or towed will be permitted to be on the course during racing hours, without the express permission of the Port Officer or officer of the Department acting for him for the time being in charge of the course.
- (g) No house-boat, sailing-boat, barge, raft, punt, or vessel driven by mechanical power, except those to which positions shall have been allotted with the approval of the Port Officer, shall be moored or berthed anywhere in the river between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road-bridge.
- (h) No house-boat, sailing-boat, barge, raft, punt, or vessel driven by mechanical power shall leave its allotted position during racing hours, except as may be laid down in the special conditions, without the express permission of the Port Officer or other officer of the Department acting for him in charge of the course.
- (i) No boat not engaged in a regatta shall be raced or be driven or propelled at any time during the day or night to the danger of the public, and if in the opinion of the officer in charge of the course any boat is overcrowded or is being incompetently navigated or managed in a manner dangerous to its occupants or the public, the officer in charge of the course may order such boat to the bank of the river or to its moorings, and may compel the whole or any number of the passengers on board to disembark.
- (j) No person shall discharge any description of fireworks or firearms on or from any boat in or upon the river, except with the permission of the Port Officer or other officer acting for him.
- (k) Every motor-boat or launch driven by the agency of any inflammable spirit, oil, or gas shall have on board such boat or launch a quantity of dry sand for soaking up any spirit or oil which may escape into the vessel by reason of leakage or overflow, and for use in extinguishing fire. Whilst the vessel is on the regatta course no readily inflammable oil or spirit may be transferred from one receptacle to another.

The penalty provided by section 3 of the Act for contravening any Regulation is for a first offence not exceeding Ten pounds, and for a second offence not less than Two pounds or exceeding Twenty pounds.

SCHEDULE OF ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated on the Ouyen-Kow Plains railway line now in course of construction, and is from 14 to 20 miles south-west from Ouyen.

- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings;
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers, under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence the erection of any building in the city until he shall lodge with the City Surveyor a plan and specification of the same, showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such building, and the manner in and the materials of which it is proposed to erect the same, and until the City Surveyor shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, and no person shall erect any such building except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

2. No person shall commence to erect any hoarding for advertising or other similar purposes until he shall have lodged with the City Surveyor a complete plan and specification showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such hoarding, and the manner in and the materials of which it is proposed to construct the same, and until the City Surveyor shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification with such modifications or additions thereto as in his opinion are necessary in the interests of public safety, and no person shall erect any such hoarding except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

3. No person in the construction of the internal or external walls, roofs, floors, ceilings, or any part of any building to be erected, shall use any material which in the opinion of the City Surveyor shall be unsound.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Building Regulation of the City, sheds covered as to their external walls with galvanized iron may be erected on the side boundaries of properties, provided that such sheds shall

not have their external walls within four (4) feet of any existing wooden building, and that the City Surveyor shall certify in writing that the erection thereof in such position is not detrimental to any property abutting on such side boundary.

5. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council of the said city, place or erect on any land within the said city any building, or portion of a building, which has been removed either from without the city or from another part of the same. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundary of the land in the same possession on which it stands, provided that such alteration is carried out in strict conformity with the general provisions of the Building Regulation of the said city.

6. If the City surveyor shall certify in writing that any building is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or insanitary state as to be dangerous to public health or safety, or that any hoarding is in such a state as to be dangerous to public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or hoarding, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove the said building, erection, or hoarding, shall pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

7. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any building, erection, or hoarding, the Council may, immediately on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, hoarding, or materials, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

2. No person shall, in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control or management of the Council of the Borough of Coburg, and whether at any meeting or gathering held therein or not—

(a) behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner, or

(b) deface the walls by writing thereon, or otherwise injure or damage the said buildings or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

3. No person shall ride or drive any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle upon, along, or across any footpath in the borough, nor impel any motor car or motor cycle along or across any such footpath, except directly to or from any premises abutting on the footpath, for the purpose of entering or leaving such premises.

Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings.
