AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPER-ANNUATION FUND.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Acts, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

- r. Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1909."
- 2. Commencement and Refeal.—These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 27th day of August, 1908, from which date all previous regulations relating to the maintenance of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superanuation Fund, and for the distribution of the annual income thereof, shall stand repealed, and it is hereby directed that from such date the regulations so repealed shall no longer continue or remain in force with respect to pilots licensed before the commencement of The Marine Board Act 1887. And it is further directed with respect to widows or children of such pilots that no allowance, gratuity, or pension granted by the Pilot Board before the commencement of the said Act under any of such regulations shall be or continue to be payable to the recipients thereof in the same way as it would have been had The Marine Board Act 1887 or the Marine Act 1890 not been passed; but that as from such date such allowance, gratuity, or pension shall be and continue to be paid under these regulations or other regulations for the time being in force under the Marine Act 1890 or under any Act amending the same or in substitution therefor.
- 3. Applications for Pensions, Allowances, &c..-Every application for any allowance, gratuity, or pension shall be made in such form as the Pilot Superannuation Board may require, and shall be accompanied by satisfactory evidence of the validity of the grounds upon which any such application is based.
- 4. Service of Sea Pilots under Ten Years.—No sea pilot shall be entitled to a pension under these Regulations unless he shall have completed ten (10) years' service as a duly licensed pilot, and in the event of his death before the completion of such term his widow and children shall not be entitled to participate in the benefit of the fund; provided, however, that should any such pilot die or be disabled by sickness or accident from the performance of duty as a pilot, thereby necessitating his retirement from the pilot service before he has served the specified term of ten years, then in such case there shall be paid to him or to his executors for the benefit of his widow and children from the Sick and Superannuation Fund a gratuity, the amount of which shall be determined as provided in the following Regulation.
- 5. Determination of Gratuity to Sea Pilots.—The Secretary to the Board shall record at the end of every month the amount which, has been contributed to the Sick and Superannuation Fund for such month from the earnings of the sea pilots; such amount shall then be divided by the number for the time being forming the full complement of licensed sea pilots, and the sum so arrived at shall be recorded and shall represent the amount which for that month is to be deemed to be the proportion contributed to the fund by each individual pilot; the total amount of gratuity to be paid to any sea pilot under the provisions of the Regulation immediately preceding shall be the sum total of the recorded individual contributions for every completed calendar month forming the period of his service as a pilot.
- 6. Scrvice of Harbor Pilots under Ten Years.—No harbor pilot shall be entitled to a pension under these Regulations unless he shall have completed ten (10) years' service as a duly licensed pilot, and in the event of his death before the completion of such term his widow and children shall not be entitled to participate in the benefit of the fund; provided, however, that should any such pilot die or be disabled by sickness or accident from the pilot die or be disabled by sickness or accident from the performance of duty as a pilot, thereby necessitating his retirement from the pilot service before he has served the specified term of ten years, then in such case there shall be refunded to him or his executors for the benefit of his widow and children the amount he has directly contributed from his earnings to the Sick and Superannuation Fund.
- 7. Superannuation.—Any pilot who has served ten (10) years and upwards, and who has attained the retiring age applicable to his case for the time being fixed by the Marine Board Regulations, or who in consequence of infirmity, sickness, or accident has become incapacitated for the performance of duty as a pilot, shall be entitled

from the date of his retirement from the pilot service to an annual pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund, according to the scale of pensions set forth in Schedule (1.) hereto, provided that no pension shall be granted for more than thirty-five years' service.

- 8. Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.—Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension, and he is desirous of accepting a lump sum in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £35 for the first year of completed service, £36 for the second year of such service, £37 for the third year of such service, and so on increasing One pound for each additional year of completed service up to thirty-five years, provided that such pilot grants a release to the Board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself and of his wife and of his children (if any), and provided further that no payment shall be made for a greater length of service than thirty-five years.
- o. Provision for Widows of Pilots.—On the decease of a pilot in the exercise of his calling after having served ten years and upwards, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to receive a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund, in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule (II.) hereto, subject to the proviso that the pension to the widow of any pilot shall in no case exceed £45 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him ten years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed £55 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him at least fifteen years at the time of such decease or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed the amount specified as pension for the widow of a pilot who has served thirty-five years.
- five years.

 10. Provision for Children of Pilots.—If a pilot shall die leaving a widow and child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance shall be made in favour of each child at the rate of £6 5s. per annum until such child shall have attained the age of fifteen years. On the death of any widow, she leaving any child or children under the age of fifteen years her surviving, the capitation allowance, if there be but one child, shall be increased to a sum of Fifteen pounds (£15) per annum. In the case of more than one child, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal portions as there are children, and each such portion shall be continued as a yearly allowance in addition to the capitation allowance payable as aforesaid to each such child, to be continued until the age of fifteen is attained, but without benefit of survivorship between the children, and subject to the further proviso that no child shall, in any case, receive a larger allowance (capitation money included) than £15 per annum.

In the event of a pilot dying leaving a child or children under fifteen years of age, but no widow him surviving, the allowance to each child is to be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow surviving him for a period of 24 hours.

- 11. Suspension of Widow's Allowance on Her Remarriage.—In all cases of a widow of a pilot remarrying, her pension shall be suspended from the date of her re-marrying, but in the event of her again becoming a widow her pension may be restored to her on proof being adduced to the satisfaction of the Board that she is in circumstances needing assistance and is otherwise deserving of bounty, but it will be again liable to suspension during future re-marriages.
- 12. Provisions Inalienable.—The provisions hereby made for pilots, their widows, and children are intended to be personal and inalienable by charge, mortgage, executions under judgment, insolvency, or other voluntary or involuntary disposition; and, notwithstanding any assignment which may purport to have been made thereof, the Board shall pay the person entitled irrespective of any such assignment; or, if necessary for the protection of such persons under this clause, the Board may apply the same, at their discretion, for the benefit of such persons or of other members of their families.
- 13. Sick Allowance.—Any pilot who by reason of accident or of physical, mental, or visual unfitness for duty shall have been granted leave of absence by the Marine Board shall, during the term of such leave, be entitled to receive a sick allowance at the rate of Twenty-five shillings per week, provided that no pilot shall be entitled to sick allowance for any period of absence through sickness under 24 hours.
- 14. Increase or Reduction of Pensions.—If at any time after the granting of any pension the particular scale on which the same was originally computed or is, for the time being, paid (hereinafter referred to as the "old scale") be superseded or altered, with the result that the

pension of a person whose claim to a grant arises subpension of a person whose claim to a grant arises sub-sequently to such supersession or alteration (with, for com-putation purposes, identical or like services to that of the pilot incidental to whose services the pension was granted at the date when the right to a pension accrued), will, under the new scale, be computed and allowed at a dif-ferent amount, either higher or lower, than is or would be payable in like case under the old scale, then, and in every such case (to take effect from the date when the new scale came into force) every pension theretofore granted to which this clause has application shall there-upon be and be deemed to be increased or reduced, as the case may be, by an amount representing the difference upon be and be deemed to be increased or reduced, as the case may be, by an amount representing the difference between the rate the pensioner was in law entitled to be paid immediately prior to the new scale coming into force and the rate which the pensioner would receive under the new scale had the same been in force at the date when his claim to the grant of a pension originally arose, and shall so continue raised or reduced until the new scale is in its turn superseded or altered (if at all), and so on from time to time! from time to time!

The provisions of this clause shall extend and apply to the case of all pensions and periodic allowances granted under any rules or regulations hereinbefore repealed, including more particularly pensions of and periodic allowances to persons entitled under Rules or Regulations made by the late Pilot Board declared no longer in force under the authority conferred by the Marine Act 1990 (Act No. 2172). The intention being that the amount of such latter pensions and periodic allowances shall be adjusted in accordance with the scale in force on the 27th day of August, 1908, which thereupon shall be deemed the particular scale on which the pension or allowance is for the ricular scale on which the pension or allowance is for the purposes of this clause to be regarded as "originally computed."

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board, held this 25th day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine.

WIEREAS by the Tramways Act 1890 it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Councils of the Municipalities of the Town of Geelong, Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Borough of Geelong West have made an application under the common seals of the said municipalities in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal districts of the municipalities of the said Town of Geelong, Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Borough of Geelong West: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Councils of the said municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said Councils to make the said application in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided by the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said applications should be granted, has determined to grant

ROUTES.

MANIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be fifteen (15) miles in the hour, excepting on curves, where the speed must be reduced sufficiently to ensure the safety of the public.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

Time of Completion.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic as regards routes (a), (b), and (e) within the period of two and a half years from the date of delegation by the Councils of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of this tramway. As regards route (d), within the period of four years from the date of delegation by the Councils of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of this tramway; and as regards route (c), within the period of six years from the date of delegation by the Councils of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of this tramway. Provided, however, that in the event of the Victorian Railways Commissioners not having given their consent to the construction of the said route (c), the non-construction of the tramway over such route shall not affect or invalidate the Order as regards the construction of routes (a), (b), (d), and (c) aforesaid mentioned.

TRAFFIC.

TRAFFIC

That such tramway shall be used for passengers, passengers' luggage, light goods, and parcels.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets upon the routes of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Councils of the said municipalities: Provided, also, that before negotiating the curves at either end of Pleasant-street either running into or out of that street, a stop shall be made at the entry of each curve, and the conductor shall proceed to the street crossing, so as to obtain a full view of that thoroughfare into which the car is about to pass, and shall signal to the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that this can be done without endangering the fraffic. That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of endangering the traffic.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SEITING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop, for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, at such points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES,

Tolls and Charges.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said trainway may be, but shall not exceed, the sum of Threepence (3d.) in cash (save as hereinafter appears) for the whole or any part of the journey between any of the three surburban termini and the town, railway, or wharf terminus and vice versa on each route; children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare; and children in arms, free of charge. GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations. in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the reference made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of, or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall

in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said Municipalities of the Town of Geelong, the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Borough of Geelong West shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said routes are laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramways, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order. Education Act 1800. ADDITIONS TO REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of October, 1909.

W HEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governorin Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, that is to say:—

REGULATION XI. (B).

FIRST CLASS CERTIFICATE: MANUAL ARTS.

r. First Class Certificates, Manual Arts, will be granted to candidates upon examination in the subjects set out in section 2 below.

- (a) A knowledge of standard works, and of the lives of the authors and the periods in which they lived; to write out any passage from about 150 lines of the same; analysis and parsing; the rules of syntax and their application; the prefixes, affixes, and roots given in the list issued by the Department; the derivation of words contained in the standard works prescribed, only words derived from important roots, or whose etymological history is instructive, being required; prosody; one or more books for culture reading.
- (b) Reading and Recitation.—To read with distinct articulation, fluency, and expression, prose and verse, from a book or newspaper, and to recite any passage from the 150 lines prescribed in the preceding sub-section (a).
- (c) Writing.—To write half-text (or text) and running hands.
- (d) Composition.—Leading rules of composition; to compose an essay on a given subject; para-
- (e) Spelling.—Exercises in word-building, spelling, and the rules of spelling.

N.B.—In judging the writing, composition, and spelling, the whole of the candidate's work in regard to these subjects will be taken into account.

Arithmetic—

Arithmetic generally: vulgar and decimal fractions; more advanced application of ratio and percentage, e.g., compound proportion, interest (simple and compound), bank discount, and proportional parts; square root; examples in stocks, profit and loss, and approximations: exercises in the metric system and in decimal money; mental arithmetic. The calculation of the area and sides of right-angled triangles, of the diameter, circumference, and area of circles, and of the contents and dimensions of rectangular and of cylindrical solids, and of the area of oblique-angled triangles, with the addition (in the case of male candidates) of the calculation of the contents of dams and tanks.

Elementary Science-

(a) Hydrostatics and Pneumatics: Saxton and Shar-man's Practical Physics, Book I., sections 32-58; Book II., sections 22-59; Book III., sec-tions 18-27; or an equivalent amount in other approved text-book.

Gregory and Simmons's Exercises in Practical Physics (edited by M. P. Hansen), Chapters III., IV., V., VI.; or an equivalent amount in other approved text-book.

(b) Heat.—Saxton and Sharman's Practical Physics, Book I., sections 59-67; Book II., sections 60-70; Book III., sections 28-42; or an equivalent amount in other approved text-book.

Gregory and Simmons's Exercises in Practical Physics (edited by M. P. Hansen), Chapters XII., XIII., XIV., XV., XVI., omitting sections 115-118 inclusive; or an equivalent amount in other approved text-book.

- (c) Mechanics.—Saxton and Sharman's Practical Physics, Book III. (alternative course), and Gregory and Simmons's Exercises in Practical Physics (edited by M. P. Hansen), Chapters I., II., VII., VIII., IX., X., XI.
- (d) Physiology.—The organs of digestion, circulation, and respiration.

NOTE.—The Department's certificate in any science subject, as specified in section 28 below, will be regarded as an equivalent of the course in elementary science above.

N.B.—Candidates who have passed the Junior Public or any higher examination of the Melbourne University, in any of the following subjects, viz., English, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, or any science subject, may, on complying with such conditions as may from time to time be prescribed, be credited with a pass in the corresponding subject as specified above.

In addition to passing in the subjects named in the preceding section, candidates, after due notice, must give a satisfactory class lesson in any one of them selected by the Department,

ELEMENTARY MODELLING.

OM2, LNM2, or LNM3.

This examination is intended as the complement of elementary drawing.

The candidate must be prepared to model in clay from such subjects as those given under 11., 111., and 1V. below. He must also be prepared to cast his model if required to do so.

The course of instruction should embrace the modelling of-

- I. The simpler geometric shapes, as, spheres, cylinders, cubes, cones, prisms, ellipsoids, ovoids, and the like, from actual models and from orthographic or isometric projections of these solids.
- II. Simple natural objects, fruit and the like, the forms of which are based upon any of the above geometric shapes, as the apple, and the orange, upon the sphere; the lemon and the plum, upon the ellipsoid; and so on.
- III. Simple casts of ornament, as E7, I4 and I5; and of natural forms, such as E4, E10 and I2.
- IV. Leaves such as the arum, the poplar, the laurel and the ivy; flowers such as the sun-flower and the convolvulus.

WOMEN STUDENTS ONLY.

Needlework-

To be able to cut out and do any kind of plain needle-work, including patching and mending: to darn and knit; to give a class lesson in such work. (The specimens presented must include a full-sized shirt.)

The above syllabus presupposes a knowledge of Needlework, Part I. and Part II., as follows:—

Needlework, Part I.—A specimen on fine soft calico to show workmanship, containing all the stitches used in making calico garments (top-sewing, felling, hemming, stitching, button-holes, gathering); a garment, such as a boy's flannel shirt, showing all the stitches except gathering, but including herring-boning, used in making flannel garments; patching on calico; darning on stocking-web of medium fineness; to knit a knicker-bocker sock; to cut out, by paper-folding, the flannel garment to be made.

Needlework, Part II.—The work prescribed for Class VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction," viz. :—

Cutting out and making the following garments:—A cotton skirt and blouse bodice; or boy's flannel-suiting knicker-bockers; or other suitable garment, such as an under bodice, or an infant's night-dress, or a frock for a child of about two years of age. Patching (flannel patch, print patch). Darning (hedgetear darn on muslin or cashmere, cross-cut darn on linen). Knitting (a pair of child's socks, or a pair of stockings).

Students should also have additional practice in the development of more difficult and complicated forms such as oblique sections of the cylinder and cone; oblique prisms; pyramids, cylinders and cones; elbows of rectangular and cylindrical sections; roof surfaces.

II. SLOVD WOODWORK.

Syllabus for Preliminary Examination.

Benchwork.—Candidates must have completed the first, 25 models, and submit any or all of them, with drawings, as may be required, to the examiner for inspection.

Candidates will be provided with suitable pieces of wood, and will be required to construct some simple model, or other exercise, from dimensioned sketches, involving any of the more simple manipulations of all the ordinary tools in the Sloyd room.

They should also be familiar with the proportions and methods of constructing some of the commoner joints, such as housing, lap and dovetail halving, angle bridle, mortise and tenon, &c.

Drawing.—(t) Candidates should have an elementary knowledge of plane geometry, including the construction of plain scales, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, and ellipses from given data, elementary problems relating to lines and circles. (2) Orthographic projection in which the projectors are at right angles to the plane of projection; drawing to scale, plans, elevations, and sections of geometrical solids, and of any of the first 25 models, or parts of them. (3) Oblique projection, in which the projectors are parallel to each other, but oblique to the plane of projection. (4) Principles and application of isometric projection.

Timber and Tools.—Candidates should have a clear knowledge of the structure and growth of cone-bearing and leafy timber trees. Occurrence, description of tree, characteristic properties, and uses of the timber of the following trees:—Kauri pine, Queensland cedar, blackwood, basswood, clear pine, red deal.

Candidates should understand the principles of the construction of the tools used in the construction of the first 25 models, and he able to sharpen and keep them in proper order.

Syllabus for Final Examination.

Candidates for the final examination must have previously passed the preliminary examination; they must have completed not less than 40 models, and submit any or all of them, with drawings, as may be required, to the examiner for inspection.

Benchwork.—Exercises similar to those for the preliminary examination, but of a more difficult character. Correct methods and accuracy of measurement will be considered of first importance, both in the preliminary and final tests.

Drawing.—More advanced problems on the syllabus for the preliminary examination, with the addition of diagonal scales.

Candidates should cultivate facility in making free-hand sketches of all the tools, models, and joints involved

Timber and Tools.—As for first year, with the addition of the object and principal methods of seasoning timber; the cause and effect of warping and shrinking; felling; preservation of timber; common defects and diseases of timber.

Occurrence and description of tree: characteristic properties, uses, and identification of the timber of the following trees:—Oak, ash, walnut, beech (English, Tasmanian, and New South Wales), mahogany, teak, stringvark (E. obliqua), bluegum (E. globulus), redgum (E. rostrata), ironbark (E. leucoxylon).

Tools as for preliminary examination, but to include all the tools, fittings, and appliances usually found in a Sloyd room.

Theory.—Candidates should have a thorough knowledge of the theory of education as applied to manual training, and be familiar with the characteristics, aims, and methods of the Sloyd and other systems of woodwork.

Chief facts in life of Otto Salomon, and an outline of the history and development of the Sloyd system.

Candidates adjudged by the Director to have equal or superior qualifications to such students will also be eligible for enrolment. Candidates on selection will be required to enter into an agreement by themselves and an approved security not to relinquish their course of training without the permission of the Minister, and, for four years after the termination of their course, to teach in any school to which they may be appointed. In the selection of candidates preference will be given to those who can furnish satisfactory evidence of interest and success in manual work.
- 4. Women students may, in the event of their marriage, be permitted to resign at the expiration of three years' service after the termination of their course of study.
- 5. The course of study shall extend over three years, and shall be free to selected students. During their course of training, students will receive an allowance at the rate of £40 per annum for the first year, £50 for the second year, and £60 for the third year. The continuance of such allowance to any student and the yearly increment after the first year shall be conditional upon satisfactory progress being shown by such students.
- 6. On completing their course and passing the necessary examination, students will be eligible for employment as teachers of Drawing, Manual Arts, Sloyd; and as teachers in State Schools, Continuation Schools, or Trade Schools.
- 7. A First-class Certificate, Manual Arts, shall, for the purposes of Part II. of the Second Schedule of the Teachers Act 1905, be held to be equivalent to a First-class Certificate.

- (c) A drawing from nature of any freely growing plant, such as the elematis or the vine. The work to be executed in outline with a pen or brush on a half imperial sheet.
- (d) A study of a flowering plant from nature, in water colour, with two designs from it to fill, decoratively, such simple shapes as a square, a lozenge, a circle, or a lunette. One design to be in monochrone and one to be in two or more colours, the three studies to be on an imperial sheet.
- (c) A drawing to scale of some architectural feature or features, such as one of the classic orders, or a Gothic window or doorway; or of some simple article of furniture, such as a table or a chair. The drawing is to be inked in, but is not to be coloured or shaded.
- (f) An example of elementary craft work, designed and wrought by the candidate. This may take the form of any applied art process in wood, metal, leather, needlework, &c. Preference will be given to complete works, however elementary in construction, but when the complete structure cannot be submitted, sketches must accompany the work sent in to illustrate the position it is designed to occupy.

A candidate for a Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate must also have passed the examination for a Drawing. Teacher's Primary Certificate, and must present a class which has been taught by the candidate for twelve months, and which can pass a satisfactory examination, or, in the case of candidates for the Trained Teacher's Manual Arts Certificate, give such other evidence of ability to teach Drawing as may be considered by the Director to be an equivalent.

The works submitted for this certificate must be certified to as the unaided production of the candidate, and will be retained by the Department so long as may be deemed necessary.

NOTE.—With the exception of those subjects marked with an asterisk, the examinations are those prescribed under the Technical Schools' Art Syllabus.

MODELLING PLANT FORMS FROM NATURE,

The candidate will be required to model in clay, on a slab about 15 inches by 11 inches, a spray of a shrub, or

other suitable plant. The slab will be considered as a panel, and the plant must be so arranged as to fill the space agreeably.

The candidate must be prepared to cast his-model.

- 3. Studentships will be awarded at the Training College to persons who have completed the course of study for First-class Certificate, Manual Arts. In awarding such studentships, conduct and progress during the preceding three years, as well as aptitude for the work, will be taken into consideration.

4. The course of instruction in the Training College will be free, and will be for two years.

- 5. Selected students may be allowed to reside at the Training College upon payment of £12 per annum towords the expense of their board and residence. In the event of any candidate not being in a position to pay the amount above stipulated, the Minister may allow him, on entering into a bond by himself and an approved security, to pay such amount at such time and in such instalments as the Minister may determine. Students who reside at home will be entitled to an allowance of £18 per annum towards board and residence. Students will be granted an allowance of £12 per annum towards defraying their personal expenses during the currency of their course.
- 6. A Trained Teacher's Certificate, Manual Arts, shall, for the purposes of Part II. of the Second Schedule of the Teacher's Act 1965, be held to be equivalent to a Trained Teacher's Certificate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF WHITTLESEA, KNOWN AS THE "WHITTLESEA RECREATION RESERVE."

r. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sinset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) of the Reserve may be set apart for fetes, sports, or buildiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

- 2. No person shall remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the ferces or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, roats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the meneys received for agistment shall be expended in the mairtenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve and dog unless led by a chain or a cord without the permission, in witing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, if the Committee of Management first obtained: of offering writing, of

8. No person, except labourers employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any hailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy made under section 604 of the Local Government Act 1903 and numbered eighty, for Regulating the Management and Use of the Municipal Baths, Alexandra-parade, within the said City, and for Fixing the Amounts to be charged for Admission to and for the use of the same or of any part thereof

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy, order as follows:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In this By-law-

In this By-law—
Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender and number is expressly provided.
"Premises" shall mean and include the whole of the land bounded by Alexandra-parade, Napier-street, Cecil-street, and Young-street, enclosed for bath purposes, and all erections thereon.
"Officer in Charge" shall mean and include any officer or attendant in charge of the baths, or any portion thereof for the time being.

GENERAL RULES.

2. Every person shall-

Every person shall—

(a) before being admitted to any bath obtain from the authorized money-taker a cheek ticket authorizing entry thereto, and shall deliver up such cheek ticket to the attendant;
(b) while waiting for admission to any slipper bath, remain only in such portion of the premises as shall be set apart as a waiting-room for intending bathers, and shall not be admitted to any other part excepting that for which he or she shall have obtained a check ticket;
(c) exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any bath or bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, and shall not, by cutting or writing thereon or otherwise, deface the walls, fittings, or any portion of the buildings.

No person shall—

3. No person shall—

(a) without lawful excuse, climb, or attempt to climb, over the walls or fences, or enter, or attempt to enter, any bath or any portion of the premises, except as herein provided; or

- (b) climb, or remain upon any roof, fence, or other portion of the buildings without the consent of the officer in charge; or
- (c) by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any bath which shall be occupied by any other person, or enter, or attempt to enter, any bath before any person who, by priority of payment, shall be entitled to use such bath, or use any bath of a higher class than that for which he shall have obtained a check ticket;
- (d) interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person, or intrude upon the privacy of any other person using any swimming bath or slipper bath, or occupying any dressing room, closet, box, or compartment appurtenant to the baths, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the premises when required to do so by the officer in charge; or
- (e) enter or remain on the premises whilst in a state of intoxication, or use any indecent or offensive language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner; or
- (f) use any bath while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, or use any swimming bath whilst in an uncleanly condition, or without first effectively using soap in the cleansing showers; or
- (g) use soap in any swimming bath, or use any sub-stance or preparation therein whereby the water in such bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (h) enter any swimming bath unless wearing a proper bathing trunk or bathing gown; or
- (i) carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, bathing gown, or other article supplied for use in the baths, or fail or neglect to return such articles to the atten-dant on leaving the baths; or
- (k) wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water in any bath, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing trunk, or bathing gown, or any bath, bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or any furniture or article therein; or
- (!) smoke in any portion of the premises, except in places set apart for that purpose; or
- (m) spit in any swimming bath, or on the pavement around such bath, or on the floors, walls, or any portion of the buildings, or elsewhere, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose; or
 - loiter, or remain without reasonable excuse, in or about the main entrance, or in any passage or corridor; or
- (a) remain upon the premises for a longer period than forty-five minutes, unless such person shall, upon demand being made by the officer in charge, again pay the sum named in this By-law for original admission; or
- (2) carelessly or negligently break, or injure, or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, valve, pipe, works, engine or machinery, or with any bath or any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any bath, bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment; or
- (q) without the written consent of the Mayor, offer any article for sale upon the premises, or bring upon the premises any intoxicating liquors; or
- (r) cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain upon the premises; or
- (s) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person em-ployed at the baths.
- 4. No man, or boy above eight years old, shall enter or use any bath which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of women, or any separate passage or approach thereto: and no woman or girl shall enter or use any bath which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of men, or any separate passage or approach thereto.
- 5. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any part of the premises, shall immediately deliver the same to the officer in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and

any person claiming such article, upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership thereof, and giving a receipt therefor, may receive such article.

6. No person employed at the baths, other than a duly authorized money-taker, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for admission or for the hire or use of any articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the officer in charge. in charge.

7. Notwithstanding the sale of any tickets the Council may temporarily close the baths for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes, without incurring any liability to the holders thereof.

8. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the officer in charge may refuse any person admission to the premises.

PENALTY.

o. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this Hy-law shall for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings.

- D. Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Butgesses of the Borough of Coburg order as follows:—
1. In the erection of the internal or external walls, roofs, floors, ceilings, or any part of any building to be creeted, no unsound material shall be used. The surveyor shall be the sole judge as to soundness of materials.

shall be the sole judge as to soundness or materials.

2. No building which has been removed as a whole or in part, whether from without the borough or from another part of the same, shall be erected on land within the Borough without the consent of the Council. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of or removal of any building within the boundary of the land in the same possession on which it stands, always provided that such alteration or removal is carried on in strict conformity with the general provisions of the building regulation. building regulation.

- 3. The internal walls of all wooden buildings shall be properly framed with studs and plates, and covered with lath and plater, tongued and grooved wood, steel plates, or any other similar lining which has been approved by the surveyor. The outside walls shall be similarly framed with sufficient studs and plates and covered with sound new boards or material approved by the surveyor. The surveyor shall be the sole judge as to the necessary sizes of studs and plates, but no studs or plates shall be of a less thickness than 1½ inches.

 4. Nothing contained in the building regulation shall
- 4. Nothing contained in the building regulation shall prevent sheds covered as to their external walls with galvanized iron from being erected on the side boundaries of properties, provided that such sheds shall not have their external walls within four (4) feet of any existing wooden building. Provided also that should the surveyor consider that the erection of any shed is detrimental to adjacent property he shall have power to refuse permission to erect such sheds.
- 5. Any hoarding erected for advertising or other purposes shall be erected under the supervision of the surveyor, who shall require complete plans of the construction of such hoarding to be submitted to him before the same is erected, and further shall have power to insist on such additional strengthening as he may deem necessary in the interests of public safety. The surveyor shall also have power to prevent the erection of any hoarding within a distance from the street frontage equal to the height of the said hoarding should he consider that the position of the hoarding necessitates this requirement being observed.

 6. Before the erection of any building or hoarding is commenced there shall be submitted a plan of the same showing clearly all of the buildings, sheds, hoardings, or other structures which it is proposed to erect, and the distance from boundaries of the same, and there shall also be submitted a tracing or exact copy of the plan, such copy to be retained by the surveyor for office use.

 7. Upon the certificate, in writing, by the surveyor that any building, erection, or hoarding is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or insanitary state as to be dangerous to licalth or safety, or is not being erected in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, the Council shall cause

to be served on the owner of such building, erection, hoarding, a notice to pull down or remove the said build-ing, erection, or hoarding, within any period which the said Council may consider sufficient, such period, how-ever, to be not less than three (3) days from the date on which the notice shall be served.

8. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any building, erection, or hoarding, the said Council shall have power immediately on the expiration of the period herein mentioned to pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and further shall have power to sell the material of such building, erection, or hoarding, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down or removing such building, erection, or hoarding, and shall pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

9. The following fees shall be payable for the sundry services hereunder set forth, and such fees shall be paid to the borough treasurer before the performance of any act for which any such fee is payable :--
