WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Water Act 1905* it is enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have first been advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister (if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with) shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to,

and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council together with any recommendation as to the granting of the application, or as to any alteration or addition he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may by Order in Council constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks.
- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed.
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the Waterworks District of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality the council whereof, or the councillors of any riding whereof, were applicants for the construction of such waterworks.
- (d) Subject to the provisions of the said Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the Waterworks District, as the case may be.
- (e) Assign a corporate name to the Waterworks Trust.
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the said Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case, the Governor in Council may think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a Waterworks District is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such riding or ridings to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with any other person or persons not exceeding three in number, the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the Colac Riding of the Shire of Colac for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Colac with water, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ALTERATION OF PORT RULES REGARDING EXPLOSIVES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf contained in Part II. of the *Marine Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1165), hereby repeal clauses 4 and 43 of the Rules regarding Explosives made by Proclamation dated the 24th day of August, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st September, 1909, page 4087, and having reference to the Anchorage at the Port of Phillip for ships and lighters with explosives on board, and in lieu thereof substitute the following Rules respectively, viz. :—

4. No ship with explosives on board shall, except as hereinafter provided for, go alongside any wharf or jetty within any Port to which this Part applies, or be or anchor otherwise than as follows :—

At the Port of Phillip For ships with Explosives on board not exceeding Two hundred (200) tons in weight :—

Westward of an imaginary line bearing north-east to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse and southward of an imaginary line bearing north 47 degrees west to the outer extremity of the Truganini Jetty, and exceeding a distance of one mile from the shore.

For ships with Explosives on board exceeding Two hundred (200) tons in weight :—

Within a radius of half-a-mile from a point distant three-and-a-half miles southward of Point Cook Buoy on an imaginary line bearing north 39 degrees 30 minutes east to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse.

At the Port of Portland Eastward of an imaginary line bearing south to Observatory Point, and exceeding a distance of three-quarter of a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Port Fairy Eastward of an imaginary line bearing south-east to the eastern end of Griffith Island.

At the Port of Warrnambool Outside of an imaginary line bearing south to the seaward end of the Warrnambool Breakwater.

43. No powder lighter having explosives on board shall go alongside any wharf in the Port of Port Phillip without permission, in writing, from the Port Officer, or anchor otherwise than as follows :—

Westward of an imaginary line bearing north-east to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse, and southward of an imaginary line bearing north 47 degrees west to the outer extremity of the Truganini Jetty, and exceeding a distance of one mile from the shore, provided that powder lighters attending on ships with explosives on board exceeding Two hundred (200) tons in weight may be or anchor within a radius of half-a-mile from a point distant three-and-a-half miles southward of Point Cook Buoy on an imaginary line bearing north 39 degrees 30 minutes east to the Point

Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse. Provided further that this Rule shall not apply to the loading, unloading, or conveyance of—

(a) Explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th Class (ammunition), viz. :—

Safety cartridges for small arms.

Percussion caps.

Railway fog signals.

Safety fuse for blasting.

(b) The following explosives belonging to the 2nd Division of the 7th Class (fireworks), viz., squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rocket or signal rocket), maroons, stars, lances, wheels, and roman candles.

(c) Explosives on His Majesty's ships.

(d) Other explosives, and in such quantities as may from time to time be approved of by the Minister.

BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Corio, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers thereof, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 6:—

This by-law shall apply to all that part of the Shire of Corio known as North Geelong, bounded on the east by Corio Bay, and on the south by Victoria-street, and on the west by a one-chain road running north and south between Crown allotments 90 and 78, parish of Moorparanyal, and on the north by Cowies Creek.

From and after the coming into force of this by-law no person shall contract for the removal of night-soil from premises within the part of the Corio Shire to which this by-law applies except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the Council.

No unauthorized person shall touch, handle, or interfere with night-soil or pans. Any previously existing system of night-soil pans is hereby abolished, and only such pans as the Council may from time to time provide shall be used.

At least once each week, or at such times as the Council may direct, the pans in use shall be closed by a tight-fitting lid by the Council's employees or contractors, and removed in the daytime in a suitable cart, and a clean pan left in place of the one removed.

Such occupiers of houses as, in the opinion of the Council, require more than one pan shall, if ordered, provide the necessary accommodation in the way of approved closets for the reception of such extra pans as the Council may deem necessary for the number of persons on the premises.

Every householder or occupier shall pay the Council such sum for the services rendered, and for the supply of pans, as the Council may from time to time order. Such charge shall be an annual charge to each occupier or householder for each pan supplied and attended to, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against the *Health Act 1890*, and punishable in accordance with same.
