PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c. &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of certain Land reserved as a Site for Gaol purposes in the Parish of Sandhurst and to authorize the Reservation of part of such Land as a Site for the purposes of the Bendigo Continuation School."

"An Act to provide for the closing of portions of certain Streets in the Borough of Castlemaine and to authorize the Permanent Reservation of such portions and the granting thereof as a site of Public Recreation."

"An Act to further amend the *Poisons Act 1890*."

"An Act to amend the *Railway Funds Act 1907*."

"An Act relating to the Surplus Revenue of the Financial Year ended on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nine and to certain unexpended balances under prior Surplus Revenue Acts."

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW No. 5.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law for the year 1910 in respect of such Urban District :—

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land, but in no case shall a rate, of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

(b) For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

(c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings.

(d) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1910, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1910.

(e) Such person as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW FOR 1910.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law :—

The rates and charges herein specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1910, and the 1st day of July, 1910 :—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being thereof, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

3. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings in the pound of the annual municipal valuation thereof.

4. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

5. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering of such building, the same to be paid before the pipes are connected.

6. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1910.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

(a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).

(b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1910, and the first day of July, 1910, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 24,000 gallons per annum.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1910.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

2. For all lands and tenements within the Trust district of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

3. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Seymour.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1910.

5. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:—For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year, and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made, in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house-yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for any half-year shall be 12,000 gallons.

7. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for any half-year 10,000 gallons.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1910, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1910, and such rates shall be payable on the first day of July, 1910.

The charges for water shall be payable quarterly, or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied

to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONS OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900 APPLICABLE TO THE ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS FOR THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR, AND ALTERATIONS TO BE READ AS MADE THEREIN FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUCH APPLICATION.

The following provisions, with the necessary alterations thereof, as shown or indicated, of the *Voting by Post Act* shall apply to the election of Municipal Councillors for the Shire of Seymour.

Section 2 shall apply, omitting all the words after the word "of" where it appears the second time in the first line down to the word "therein" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "a Municipal Council"; inserting after the word "vacant" in the fourth line the words "or not less than six days before the day appointed for holding the annual election"; and omitting the words "the *Government Gazette* and unless otherwise prescribed in two Melbourne daily newspapers and also in" in the fifth and sixth lines; omitting the words "any province or" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting the words "Member or members" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors"; omitting all the words after the word "effect" in the tenth line.

BOROUGH OF KOROIT.

By-Law No. 11.

A By-Law of the Borough of Koroit, made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eleven (11) for regulating the traffic of Motor Cars, Motor Cycles, Automobiles and similar machines.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act, 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Koroit order as follows:—

1. The expression "machine" in this By-law shall mean and include any motor bicycle, motor tricycle, motor car, motor cycle, motor vehicle, automobile, or other vehicle driven or worked by steam, electricity, or other mechanical or motive power.

2. No person shall drive ride or impel a machine upon or along any footway made or set apart for the use of pedestrians.

3. Every person who drives rides or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine and so constructed and placed so as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides drives or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the carriage-way and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage-way he shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell, whistle, or horn.

5. Every person driving riding or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle animal or foot passenger and shall give warning of his or her approach as in the last section preceding.

6. In every case where a person riding driving or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden and where such horse or other beast of burden may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed or may cease to be under the control of the person in charge of same the person riding driving or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue so dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person riding driving or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than ten (10) miles per hour or part thereof upon or along any of the streets or public places within the Borough of Koroit.

8. No person shall ride drive or impel a machine on a public highway recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public having a regard to all the circumstances of the case including the nature condition and use of the highway and to the amount of traffic which usually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on the highway.

9. Any police constable may apprehend without warrant the driver or person in charge of any machine who commits an offence under the last preceding section number eight (8) within his view if such driver or person refuses to give his name and address.

10. A person riding driving or impelling a machine or in charge thereof shall in any case if an accident occurs to any person whether on foot or on horseback or in a vehicle or to any horse or vehicle in charge of any person owing to the presence of a machine on the road stop and if required give his name and address and also the name and address of the owner of the machine.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Borough of Koroit.
