1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1910 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

(a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).

(b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge the shall not be less than Five, shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gal-

(e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (1x.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1x.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1x.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1910, and the firs

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1910.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

- 3. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Seymour.
- 4. For every steam boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1910.
- 5. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:

  —For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year, and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made, in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house-yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.
- 6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for any half-year shall be 12,000 gallons.
- 7. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for any halfyear 10,000 gallons.
- 8. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1910, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1910, and such rates shall be payable on the first day of July, 1910:

The charges for water shall be payable quarterly, or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "rate-payer"; omitting the words "province or district" in payer"; omitting the words" province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality": omitting the word "wno" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and!" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality." 2. No person shall drive ride or impel a machine upon or along any foetway made or set apart for the use of pedestrisms.

3. Every person who drives rides or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine and so constructed and placed so as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides drives or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the carriageway and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or foot pas-enger proceeding or standing on the street or carriageway he shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell, whistle, or horn.

5. Every person driving riding or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle animal or foot pasenger and shall give warning of his or her approach as in the last section preceding.

6. In every case where a person riding driving or impelling an machine shall not may care to be under the control of the person in charge of same the person iding driving or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue so dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall ride drive or impel a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than ten (10) miles per hour or part thereof upon or along any of the streets or public places within the Borough of Kr

address.

10. A person riding driving or impelling a machine or in charge thereof shall in any case if an accident occurs to any person whether on foot or on horseback or in a vehicle or to any person whether on foot or on horseback or in a vehicle or to any person whether on the road stop and if required give his name and address and also the name and address of the owner of the machine

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Borough of Koroit.
