SHIRE OF DONALD.—BY-J.AW No. 10 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Donald, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, 253, and 259 of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 10, for regulating the removal of night-soil and the description of pans for night-soil to be used in the Town of Donald, also for rescinding portion of By-law No. 1 of the Local Board of Health.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald make the following By-law:—

- 1. That By-law No. 1, made by the Council of the 1. That By-law No. 1, made by the Council of the Shire of Donald under the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, so far as it relates to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, be and is hereby repealed, except as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.
- 2. The By-law shall come into force on the first day of October, 1909, after its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and after its publication in the Government
- Gazette.

 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township of Donald, bounded as follows:—Commencing at south-west angle of allotment 4, section 10, town of Donald, parish of Banyenong, and proceeding north-easterly by boundary of the said allotment and production thereof to crossing on railway known as Gath's; thence in a northerly direction by 3-chain road to the north-east corner of allotment 7, section 7, town of Donald, parish of Banyenong; thence westerly by the north boundary of the said allotment to the Richardson River; thence by the said river in a southerly direction to the commencing point.

 4. The Council may exempt any premises within the
- 4. The Council may exempt any premises within the aforesaid boundaries from the operation of this By-law. 5. That the present system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.
- 6. That from and after the By-law coming into force
- 6. That from and after the By-law coming into force every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service, such pans to be constructed of such materials. size, and design as the said Council may approve, and to have tight-fitting lids similarly approved for use during the removal of the night-soil therein.

 7. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of the night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

 8. That a pan cleansed by efficient means, approved of by the Council, shall be left in place of the one removed.

 9. Every closet within the municipality shall consist of

noved.

9. Every closet within the municipality shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide proper ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

To. The night-soil removed shall be rendered inoffensive by being trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the Council.

II. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner what-soever.

soever.

12. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of night-soil from their respective premises in any other manner than is herein provided, except in cases

any other manner than is herein provided, except in cases of exemption.

13. Occupiers of premises in the aforesaid boundaries shall obtain and use such a number of pans and lids as aforesaid, as may be necessary for use on their premises, and shall permit the officers of the Council, and all workmen and servants and contractors employed by it, to have access' to and upon their premises during such time as the Council may direct for the purpose of performing the necessary service in connexion with the removal of night-soil therefrom.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises which may be inspected by the Council over all premises which may be inspected by the Council over all premises which may be inspected by the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five

pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or con-tinued.

By-law No. 8.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham and Woodend, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Acts and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law :-

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Newham and Woodend.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall hereafter on or before the first day of February in each year register himself with the Council in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is—

- (1) Not more than five, a fee of Two shillings and
- sixpence.
 (2) More than five, but not more than ten, a fee of
- (2) More than hve, but not more than ten, a ree of Five shillings.
 (3) More than len, but not more than twenty, a fee of Ten shillings.
 (4) More than twenty, but not more than thirty, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
 (5) Over thirty cows, a fee of Twenty shillings.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BERRIWILLOCK CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Berriwillock Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :---

r. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m.

to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave,

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written ap-

proval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed

for the burial.

made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same. 13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees. 14. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year. 15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees. 16. - *2. Second-class Certificates or First-class Certificates, as the case may be, will be issued to candidates who complete the prescribed course of training, and pass the prescribed examinations and teaching tests, and comply with the conditions indicated below.

 3. Candidates at the commencement of their training course shall be at least seventeen years of age; they shall have passed the Junior Public examination or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or shall have passed in the literary work of the Second-class Certificate or some higher examination of the Victorian Education Department, or hold some other qualification of approved equivalent value.

 4. Candidates employed in State schools must possess
- 4. Candidates employed in State schools must possess the following literary qualification prescribed under Act No. 2006, Second Schedule, for teachers of the Sixth Class, viz., a Licence to Teach or a Second-class Certificate, or approved equivalent, or must have passed in the literary work for a First-class Certificate.
- 5. In the case of teachers employed in State schools, candidates for a Second or for a First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will not be eligible for examination unless they furnish satisfactory evidence that they have had regular teaching practice, under approved supervision, in the infant classes in a State school or other approved school, for a period of one, year in the case of candidates for a Second-class Certificate, and for a period of two years in the case of candidates for a First-class Certificate, and for a formal period of two years in the case of candidates for a First-class Certificate, and for a formal period of two years in the case of candidates for a First-class Certificate.
- 6. Candidates other than teachers employed in State schools will not be eligible for examination unless they have fulfilled the following conditions as to course of training laid down by the Teachers and Schools Registration Board—

(a) The course shall be for two years in a training institution recognised by the Board; but special students, such as graduates of the University, or persons holding certificates entitling them to registration as primary or secondary teachers, may be allowed to complete the course in one year.
(b) The standard of training and examination shall be that of the Infant Teacher's Certificate or Kindergarten Certificate of the Education Department, and shall include at least in one year the English Literature set for the Senior Public examination pass for that year. This lastnamed subject need not be taken at a training institution.

institution.
(c) In the first year of training, the candidate shall, as a rule, observe or teach all the forenoon in a kindergarten, and shall attend lectures in the afternoon. In the second year, the candidate shall also learn to teach the sub-primary classes above the kindergarten.

7. At the examination for either the Second-class or the First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate, candidates will be allowed to present themselves for any number of the prescribed subjects, and will be given credit for those subjects in which they pass. Candidates will not, however, be permitted to present themselves for examination in the subjects prescribed for the First-class Infant

Teacher's Certificate until they have passed in all the subjects (except practical teaching and infant-school management) prescribed for the Second-class Infant Teacher's Certificate.

8. Either certificate may be withheld if the Director, on the report of the examiner or examiners, is of opinion that the candidate does not possess sufficient experience of, and practical acquaintance with, infant or kindergarten school work, and, in the case of teachers employed in State schools, no First-class Infant Teacher's Certificate will be issued until the candidate has successfully conducted or taught in an infant department for not less than two years. than two years.

9. Unless otherwise determined by notice in the Educa-tion Gazette, examinations in the written work for the Infant or Kindergarten Teacher's Certificate will be held annually in November or December, and in the practical tests in September or October.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE TOWN OF COLAC FOR THE USE OF THE POLWARTH AND SOUTH GRENVILLE PASTORAL, AGRICULTURAL, AND HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY, NOW CALLED THE COLAC AND DISTRICT PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, KNOWN AS THE COLAC SHOW GROUNDS.

A person who shall be a defaulter in any engagements he enters into with the Committee of Management, and who shall fail to make good the sum in which he is in default immediately upon demand by the Committee of Management, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
- 15. Any person who has been "warned off" by any Show Society or Association shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.
- 16. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve and Grand Stand on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, fêtes, or sports shall be as follows:--

Tenders for sup 1 by a forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft pryable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within tendrys to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.


